In accordance with reference (a), the Navy Sub-Commission has requested the Ministry of Marine to take possession of, and provide security for the radio transmitting and receiving set RF 2 No. 5, which formerly was the property of the Fascist Republican Navy and which was discovered on the premises of the Societa Anonima FIMI, of Saronne.

2. Enclosure (A), which contains the technical particulars of the set, is forwarded herewith for information.

3. In view of the type of the transmitter in question and its limited range, the Navy Sub-Commission has informed the Ministry of Marine that it may be utilized by the Italian Navy as is considered appropriate by the Ministry of Marine.

Subject: Radio Transmitter.

Reply is made to your letter WSC/2970 dated 17th July, 1945.

1. Instructions have been issued for the Radio Transmitter and Receiver type R.F. 2 No.5, which was discovered at P.I.S.I. Co.Ltd. at Saronno, to be collected and held at our disposal by the I.M.S. Centre at Milan.

2. This set is a portable Italian Army type, for radiotelephony and radiotelegraphy. It comprises two casings, one containing the transmitting and receiving apparatus, the other containing the dry batteries which supply the current.

Battery Voltage :

Filament circuit : 4.5/ 4 Volts.

Mode supply : Transmission : 240/200 Volts.

" " : Reception : 190/180 Volts.

Frequency Range :

From 2752 Kcs per sec (109 m.) to 4736 Kcs per sec (70 m.)

3. In general the set in question must be considered of low performance and obsolete type in view of progress made in the field of portable sets.

RADIO TRANSMITTERS

1. We are advised by E.Q. Allied Commission, Public Safety Sub-Commission, Security Division, by letter reference SD/378. 05 dated 11th July, 1945, that the Societa' Anonima Fiml of Sarono, which is situated about halfway between Varese and Milan, is in possession of 5 transmitters which were the property of the Fascist Republican Air Force.
2. Will you please make arrangements to take over these transmitters. You should approach A.M.C. H.Q. Lombardia Region (Public Safety) and use this letter as a means of introduction.
3. The matter was reported to Lt/Col. G.T. Francis by A.M.C. Lombardia Region in a letter dated 22nd July, 1945.
4. Please advise this Sub-Commission when the matter has been completed.



2. Unless you see any reason to the contrary, might these be passed to the Mission and Sub-Commissions mentioned in para. 6 of the report for necessary action.


