2. There is in fact an issuing officer by the name of A.A. VALENTINE, who is a Captain in the U.S. Army and who was competent to issue such a pass. The stamping is similar to the one used on all occasions by the Civil Affairs Officer when authenticating documents.
3. The alleged forged pass was the type regularly in use in the area of CEF Fifth Army on 11th July, 1944. It was in loose form and was not numbered. There was only a small supply in stock and further issues were printed in Siena.
4. Passes to the rear areas were issued rather freely to clear the area of refugees, and the bindaco was permitted to screen 100 applicants per day and to issue one-way passes, which, however, were signed by an assistant CAO in the name of Captain Valentine. The passes were numbered daily and particulars entered in a register.
5. The initials under the signature "VALENTINE, C.W." indicate that the pass was signed by Major (then Captain) CLYDE WARREN. Major Warren has examined the pass and has stated that while he cannot recall the reasons why the pass was issued, it appears genuine.

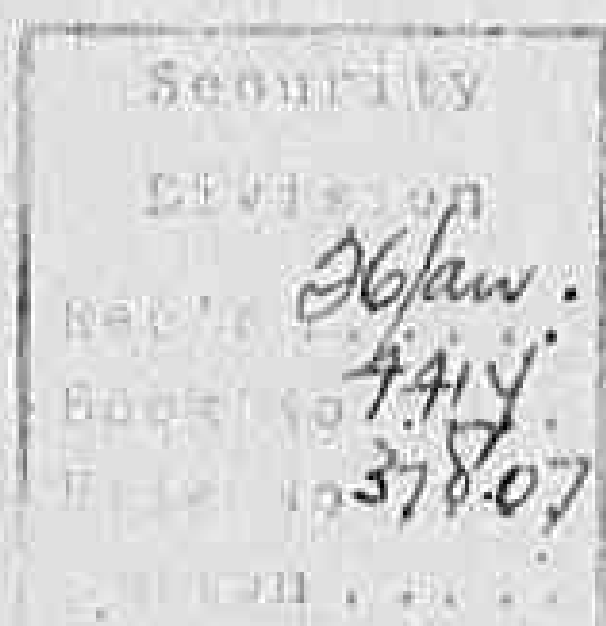

 4. This form of tri-lingual pass was devised for the Corps Expeditionnaire Francais in March, 1944, as such was necessary for their S.M. and M.Ps. When the supply of books of passes was not available they printed loose forms locally due to an emergency.
 5. A few of the original books were found in use in Florence in the early stages of occupation but their use was discontinued.

2. In reply to paragraph 2 letter of Public Safety Sub-Commission, Security Division, dated 15 January 1945, have to advise the following:

a. The pass in use in the area of CEF Fifth Army on 11 July 1944 was the type enclosed with basic communication.

b. Captain E. A. Valentine was competent to issue such pass on that date being the Assistant CAO of Siena.

c. No counterfoil of Pass Number 34 was kept, however, there should be on file in the records at Siena complete information in a Registry kept by the Provincial Public Safety Officer.

d. Reasons for the issue of the pass are not known at this time.

e. An explanation of the procedure for the issuance of passes in effect during the time of occupation of Siena by the CEF is in order:

- (1) The type of pass in question was not in pad form but was in loose form and was unnumbered. As only a small supply was in stock, additional supplies were printed in Siena on orders of the CAO approved by SM.
- (2) Passes to the rear were rather freely issued to clear the area of refugees from the South, and the Sindaco was permitted to screen 100 applicants per day and issue one-way passes to those going south. The passes, however, were signed by an assistant CAO in the name of Captain Valentine after an explanation on each application, the initials of the issuing officer being shown immediately below the signature.  - (3) It will be noted that the initials appearing under "Valentine" are "GW", which indicates that the pass was signed by Major (then captain) Clyde Warren. Major Warren has examined this pass and while he states that he cannot recall this particular pass it appears genuine.

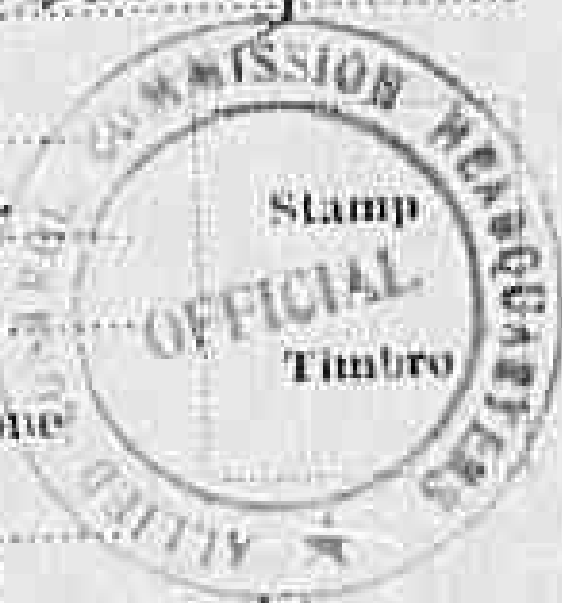

Subject : Wagner Elisabetta of Annibale and of Kolb Maria
born in Monsee di Baviera on the 15 January 1908.

With reference to the above mentioned note, we inform you that subject became an Italian citizen through marriage, and that during the Nazi domination she was very friendly with German officers who came to her house, and with whom, it is said, that she had intimate relations. Taking advantage of the above said friendships she clandestinely traded in luxury clothing which these German officers procured for her. She has been seen several times in the police office at via Tasso, and had relations of unknown character with two officers of the SS, called Klemens and Schulz, to whom she in vain recommended the life of Lieutenant Rodriguez of the Carabinieri Corps.

It hasn't been possible to find out anything about her supposed relations with Lieutenant Koch whom she denies having known.

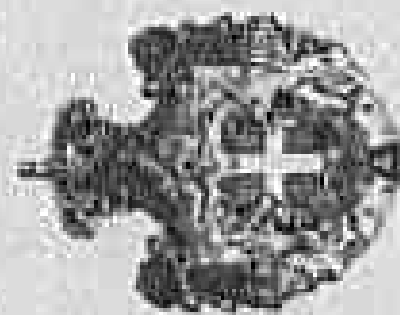

We beg you to please let us know what your Commission will decide on the case of the above mentioned, below is a copy of the letter sent to us from the Prefettura of Ragusa:

"The above mentioned Benedictine Priest, asks to be authorized to be transferred to Rome, to the College of S.Anselmo, -Ostiense- Via Porta Lavernale n. 19, Casa Madre dei PP.Benedetini.

On the 29 June 1943, Pröll came with the German troops from Germany as a soldier in the sanitary corp. He was placed at the Airport of Comiso. On the 11 July he was wounded during an air-raid and brought to the Hospital of Santa Croce, Ragusa.

After the occupation of the Allies, Pröll being a priest was authorized by the Allied Military Authorities to remain at liberty, on condition that he did not leave Ragusa and outside no further than 10 Kilometers.

The priest has kept his word and nothing can be said against him. He lives on the masses he celebrates and on the subsidy given him by the local church. He lives in the Parish of SS.Salvatore.

He is furnished with a resident permit n.1, released by this Questura on the 7 January 1944, as well as the authorization to remain at liberty from the Officer of the Allied Forces attached to Civilian Affairs, dated 22.7.1944.

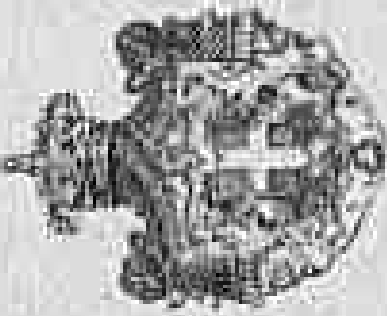

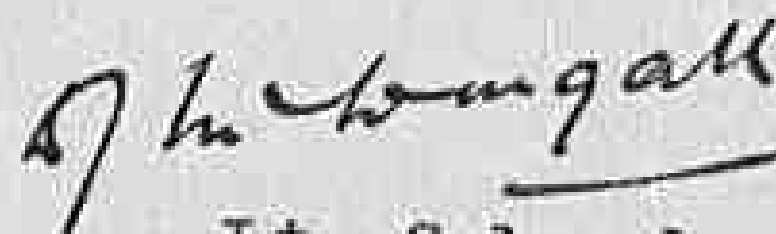

SUBJECT: Evacuation of Personnel from Roumania and Bulgaria.

TO : All Concerned.

1. The increase in travel of persons from Bulgaria and Roumania to Italy, makes it necessary to introduce a uniform procedure for requests to travel.
2. The travel concerned falls outside the problem of dealing with displaced persons, who may be moved in bodies under SHAEF and AFHQ arrangements.
3. In order that the movement of individual travellers may be accomplished in an orderly manner and without risk to the security of operations, the following procedure will be adopted in the future. It should be borne in mind that it is not the intention to encourage the travel of a large number of persons travelling individually and for personal reasons.
4. The entire responsibility for moving personnel by air in approved cases will be that of MAAF.
5. With the exceptions noted in paragraph 8 and Allied service personnel on duty, all persons entering Italy from Roumania and Bulgaria, must in future be in possession of an Allied Force permit (specimen attached at Appendix 'A') endorsed for entry into Italy.
6. Unless otherwise endorsed permits will be valid for a return journey.
7. Permits will be issued by the Allied Commission in the country concerned, which will be regarded as acting (for this purpose) as the agent of the Supreme Allied Commander, Mediterranean.
8. The following persons will not require Allied Force permits to enter Italy, but will be required to satisfy the Commission concerned that the proposed journey is on sufficiently urgent official business.
 - a. Diplomatic and Consular officials.
 - b. British and United States nationals employed and paid by the following governmental agencies:

- (1) UNRRA
- (2) Office of War Information.
- (3) Psychological Warfare Branch.
- (4) War Shipping Administration.
- (5) Ministry of War Transport.

- (6) Any of the Service Ministries in the United States or United Kingdom, providing they are in possession of Service identity cards, eg, technicians in possession of AGO cards, who are assigned to this theater.

c. British and United States War Correspondents accredited to this headquarters.

9. Applications for permits in the form attached at Appendix "B" will be made to the senior British or United States member of the Commission who will co-ordinate with the senior Soviet representative in appropriate cases. He will satisfy himself that:

- a. There is no local security objection to the applicant.
- b. There is no local objection from the political point of view.
- c. The proposed journey is necessary to the war effort.

10. All applications will be referred to the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, this headquarters, except in the categories where permits may be issued without reference, viz:

Officials in the employment of and paid by the Governments of the United States, Great Britain, the Soviet Union, France, Belgium, Holland, Norway, Poland and Czecho-slovakia, and China.

11. Duplicate copy of the application form will be forwarded to the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, this headquarters, in the case of:

- a. All applications referred.
- b. All permits granted without reference.

12. Where special information of security or political interest arises in the case of an application, such information should be forwarded with the application.

13. Cases of urgency may be dealt with by cable, but application forms should be forwarded in order to complete this headquarters records.

14. The above procedure will not apply to evacuations on a large scale, which may be arranged in agreement with this headquarters (G-5 & G-2 Sections).

15. Persons who are exempted under paragraph 8 from the requirement of a permit will be cleared with this headquarters by cable before dispatch.

16. On a permit or cable authority being granted, air priority will be recommended by Allied Commission concerned, and notification in the form of travel orders for the applicant will be sent to formations as MAAF may designate.

1. Letter, this headquarters, AG 371.2/191 GEG-O, dated 10 November 1944, subject: "Evacuation of Personnel from Roumania and Bulgaria", (not to all addressees) is rescinded.

2. Effective this date, Allied Force Permits (Specimen as Inclosure 1) will be required by all persons entering Italy from the Soviet Union, Yugoslavia, Roumania, Bulgaria, Albania and Greece with the exceptions noted in paragraph 3 below.

3. The exceptions are:

a. Diplomatic and consular officials of the United Nations, including United States or British employees of the State Department and Foreign Office.

b. United States and British service personnel travelling on duty.

c. Allied service personnel in formed bodies engaged in operations.

d. Crews of Allied aircraft.

e. British and United States nationals employed and paid by the following governmental agencies:

- (1) USERRA
- (2) Office of War Information
- (3) Psychological Warfare Branch
- (4) War Shipping Administration
- (5) Ministry of War Transport
- (6) Any of the Service Ministries in the United States or United Kingdom providing they are in possession of United States or British Service Identity Cards, e.g. technicians in possession of AGO cards, who are assigned to this theater.

f. British and United States War Correspondents accredited to Allied Force Headquarters

g. Bona fide merchant seamen sailing in Allied or co-belligerent merchant ships who are properly signed on as members of the crew.

10. Persons other than American and British military personnel who are exempted under paragraph 3 above from the requirements of a permit, will be cleared with this headquarters by cable before dispatch. American and British military personnel however, may travel without telegraphic clearance.

11. No part of this procedure absolves the applicant from the necessary passports, documents of identity, visas, exit permits or laissez-passers required by the regulations of the country concerned.

12. Persons, other than the exempted categories, who arrive in Italy by sea or air without Allied Force Permits are liable to detention and subsequent deportation to the country from which they started their journey.

13. The requirement of permits may be waived from time to time in the case of large parties of displaced persons, but only after prior concurrence of this headquarters.

14. Supplies of forms and permits will be sent under separate cover by this headquarters to the appropriate authorities.

1. By direction of Colonel Poletti this Division ceases active operation in the field of Movement Control and becomes an advisory unit as of this date.
2. In the organization of Ente Nazionale Autotrasporti di Cosa (E.N.A.C.) a Control Office is provided which will function as a counterpart of this Division. Eng. Saul Greco is the head of that Control Office with offices in the Ministry of Communications Building, located in Piazza Greco Rossa. Telephone installation is not completed at present.
3. From this date all application for civilian road transport should be made directly to Ufficio Trasporti di Roma (U.T.R.) by the person, organization or Division using the transport and paying for it. Time is lost rather than saved if a Division submits a request for transport on behalf of a civilian organization. When the request is unusual or out of the ordinary it would be well for the Division concerned to endorse the request and explain the need or urgency of it.
4. A certain amount of paper work and record keeping is necessary for the Control Office to properly function. Therefore, emergency requests should be restricted to honest emergencies and not include lack of foresight in getting application filed in reasonable time.

4. It is not understood why a former Consul should be entitled to represent Chileans and the Swiss Consul has doubt of Ramognini's credentials.
5. In all events the road situation is such that only an extremely urgent case should be entertained.
6. Corps will require to countersign any permit due to the place being in so forward an area and if applicant can show good reasons why he should, delay will be occasioned in getting the necessary authority.

1. With reference to the attached report concerning a pass issued by Capt. Mackenzie who was working at the time at this Headquarters.

2. His reply is attached. He insists that the permit was merely a permission to circulate, and not an authority to carry wine. This I consider is logical as the permit is distinctly headed "movement of civilians". The purpose of the journey has to be stated on the form, but it no more eliminates the necessity for obtaining any other permit which is necessary, than the possession of an Alcoholic Beverage Permit would give him the power to travel or be out after curfew without the necessity of having a "movement of civilians pass"

3. Captain Mackenzie has been cautioned against the indiscriminate issuing of passes, and as he is no longer attached to this HQ. no further trouble is anticipated.

1. Referring to letter dated 10th October, 1944 on the above subject I have to state that the permit was signed by me, but was made out in the handwriting of my then interpreter "Ugo Sabette" who may be able to remember the conditions.

2. This permit was issued merely as an authority to circulate and not as a permit to transport wine or any other article. The reason of its issue, as is specifically asked on the permit under the heading of "For the purpose of" is the transportation of wine, but it was made absolutely clear that a permit from the Alcoholic Beverages Section was also necessary before wine could be transported.

3. As the date of the issue of a Beverages Permit was in doubt the Circulation Permit was made out until "Revocation" and would necessarily be limited by the date period stated on the Wine Permit.

4. Until this correspondence came to hand I was unaware of the misuse of these Circulation Permits, as I believed that the Road Blocks would not allow transport to pass without the proper authorisations.

5. During the period of my duties in Rome I issued some 12,000 circulation permits, and with the exception of very few which required other authorisations from different branches, all were issued for a period of 14 days only. As far as I am aware no other permits issued on "Revocation" are in existence.

1. Following are additional instructions to CACs in Eighth Army area in connection with Civilian Movement passes, and they will be inserted as sub-Paras 8, I, and 2, to para 6 of this HQ Directive 04/67 dated 11 September 44, No. 75 on CACs Directive file; -

(a) All passes for civilian movement to destinations outside Eighth Army area, overlaid or by new, after completion, will be sent to the nearest PS Section for vetting.

The procedure is as follows:-

Such passes will be detached in batches or as convenient by and Messenger to the nearest PS Section, and the applicant will be instructed to report to the PS Section personally to collect the pass after it has been stamped by them.

In those cases where there is no PS Section within convenient walking distance of the CAC, the pass will be endorsed:

"This pass not valid for travel outside Army area until stamped and initialed by PS Section at _____"

The pass may then be handed to the applicant who will be instructed to take it to the designated PS Section.

Semi permanent passes issued at points within 5 km NORTH of the Near Army Security Control Line for distances not exceeding 5 km SOUTH of it will not be subject to stamping by PS Section, but the provisions of sub para (f) will apply.

(f) Each Monday and Friday (or more frequently, if PS request and CAC agree), CACs will send to the nearest PS Section a nominal roll of persons to whom passes have been issued for travel over 10 km or current, but in the case of current those of a semi-permanent character ONLY will be included.

The procedure is as follows:-

Such passes will be despatched in batches or as convenient by messenger to the nearest FS Section, and the applicant will be instructed to report to the FS Section personally to collect the pass after it has been stamped by them.

In those cases where there is no FS Section within convenient walking distance of the CAO the pass will be endorsed:

"This pass not valid for travel outside Army Area until stamped and initialled by FS Section at -----"

The pass may then be handed to the applicant who will be instructed to take it to the designated FS Section.

Semi permanent passes issued at points within 5 km NORTH of the Rear Army Security Control Line for distances not exceeding 5 km SOUTH of it will not be subject to stamping by FS Section, but the provisions of sub para (f) will apply.

(f) Each Monday and Friday (or more frequently, if FS request and CAO agrees), CAOs will send to the nearest FS Section a nominal roll of persons to whom passes have been issued for travel over 10 km or curfew, but in the case of curfew those of a semi-permanent character ONLY will be included.

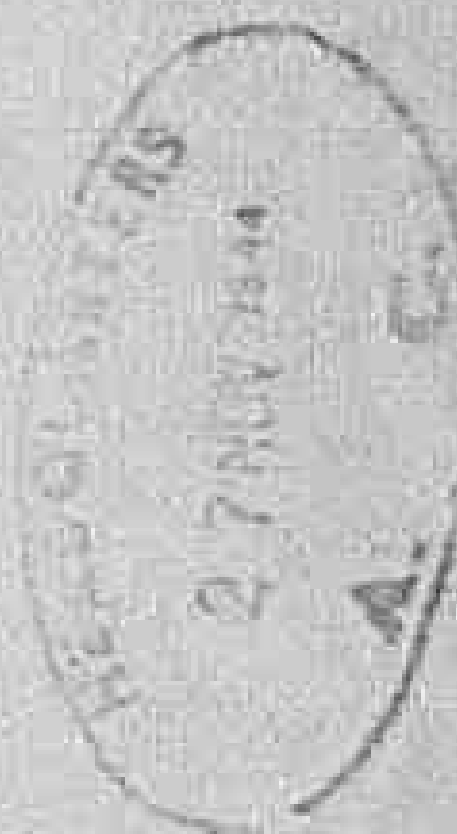

SUBJECT. CONTROL OF MOVEMENT. (Civilians)

TO. The Director, Public Safety Sub-Commission, HQ, ACC.

1. From my own observations and information received, it is quite clear that the Regulation controlling the movement of civilians (Proc.No.I., Art. 5., Para. 46.) is being very easily evaded by any person who has the slightest inclination to do so.

2. Owing to the lack of control generally, and the inefficient manner in which the existing 'road blocks' are operated, those who desire to travel about the country do so without any trouble.

3. I would point out that the 'road blocks' appear to be operated only during the hours of daylight and finish at sunset each evening, with few exceptions when only Italian personnel is used.

4. It needs no words from me to point out the seriousness of this position from a purely SECURITY point of view.

5. I have dealt with many Espionage prosecutions, and the number of spies who admit in Court that they have travelled in Allied Occupied Italy on Allied Military Vehicles whilst carrying out their mission for the Germans, is more than

of civilians (free movement) very easily evaded by any person who has the slightest inclination to do so.

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3. I would point out that the 'road blocks' appear to be operated only during the hours of daylight and finish at curfew each evening, with few exceptions when only Italian personnel is used.

4. It needs no words from me to point out the seriousness of this position from a purely SECURITY point of view.

5. I have dealt with many Espionage prosecutions, and the number of spies who admit in Court that they have travelled in Allied Occupied Italy on Allied Military Vehicles whilst carrying out their mission for the Germans, is more than disturbing.

6. There is also the Black Market angle to be considered which is so undermining the economical position of Allied Occupied Italy.

7. A tighter and more efficient control would at least make it more difficult for this clandestine movement of civilian traffic, and undoubtedly stop quite a lot of it.

8. I will first of all ^{deal} with the situation in it's broad sense and make the following suggestions - for consideration - as a means of tightening up the general control of movement of civilians.

9. When a civilian is arrested and charged with having contravened Proclamation No. 1; Art. 5., Para. 45., (travelling more than 10Km without the necessary permit) the civilian is placed in a local prison, and ultimately appears before a Summary Allied Military Court, and dealt with in accordance with the evidence produced.

Summary

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10. There does not appear to be any general system or procedure for checking the story told by the prisoner, unless he is a 'local' and only travelling locally. Even then it appears to be left to the initiative of the various Italian Police Agencies available on the spot. It needs no words of mine to point out that initiative is not one of the strongest points of the Italian Police Agencies as a whole, at the present time.

11. The position is, that after having been arrested and dealt with by a Court, the civilian is set at liberty and in most cases proceeds to contravene the same regulation again.

12. I have ascertained that in certain instances 'permits to travel' have been issued when the prisoner is released, but no check is made to ensure that the person arrives at the place he has given as his destination.

13. I submit that this system is open to abuse in the simplest manner, and in fact enables a person to travel anywhere by altering the permit - which we know only too well the Italians will do if given the opportunity.

14. In an endeavour to have some unified control system I submit the following scheme.

15. Whenever a person is arrested for travelling without a permit of any kind - not necessarily that it only be a contravention of the 10 Km regulation - he should be placed under close arrest and not refused until enquiries have been made to check his story.

16. The person should be taken in front of a Summary Allied Military Court as soon as possible, not left in prison for as long as twelve days before having been taken before a Court, as I know happened in one case.

17. If the case is proved, the Court should bear in mind when passing sentence, that every possible enquiry ²⁰⁹³ to be made before the prisoner can be released. In all cases

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I4. In an endeavour to have some unified control system I submit the following scheme.

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I6. The person should be taken in front of a Summary Allied Military Court as soon as possible, not left in prison for as long as twelve days before having been taken before a Court, as I know happened in one case.

I7. If the case is proved, the Court should bear in mind when passing sentence, that every possible enquiry ^{to} be made before the prisoner can be released. In all cases where the enquiries will take longer than before the rising of the Court, a remand in custody or a sentence of imprisonment should be imposed.

I8. In writing paragraph I7, I do so fully aware that we cannot tell a Court what to do, but I have spoken to Col. Behrens, The Director of the Legal Sub-Commission; who agrees with me as to the seriousness of the matter, and has promised full co-operation from his Sub-Commission. In fact he asked that this Sub-Commission submit it's recommendations to him on the matter.

I9. When the Court has passed sentence, the CO/RR on duty at the Court should fill out a Form in quadruplicate, setting out all the particulars of the prisoner as follow:-

Full name and address.

Identity Card number.

Date of arrest.

Result of Court proceedings.

Where prisoner had come from.

20. This form should be signed by the President of the Court and the Official stamp affixed. The prisoner should also sign the Form to enable his signature to be checked at his destination should it be deemed necessary. CARE SHOULD BE TAKEN THAT ALL FOUR COPIES CAN BE EASILY READ.

21. The copies of the Form should be disposed of by the

CC/RR as follow:-

- One to CC/RR at prisoner's destination.
- One to local Security Unit.
- One to the prisoner.
- One retained for local Court or Police record.

22. The prisoner should then be told that if there are no further objections to him travelling when he has served his sentence, he will be issued with a Travel Permit and upon arrival at his destination he must report to the CC/RR and hand in both his travel Permit and his copy of the Form mentioned in paragraph 19. Further, that the CC/RR at his destination will be expecting him and should he fail to arrive a search will be made for him and when caught will be dealt with more severely.

23. It will be seen from this, why it is absolutely essential to have the fullest co-operation of all the Presidents of Summary Allied Military Courts dealing with such cases, as the length of sentence will determine whether or not the system can operate successfully.

24. It will have to be remembered by the Courts that the copy of the Form referred to in paragraph 19, going to the destination, MUST reach there before the prisoner. ^{The} must also be given for the local Security Unit to interrogate the Prisoner whilst in prison; and check up on their Lists of Suspects.

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25. To carry out the next part of the scheme it will be necessary to speak to Lt. Col. W.D. Gibson, O.B.E., G.S.I.(b), AAI, who controls S.I.M., but I feel sure he will be only too pleased to help.

26. Bearing in mind there will be people who will tell lies and have no intention of proceeding to the destination they nominate to the Court, I suggest that the CC/RR at the destination circulate the person on a "Wanted List" to ALL CC/RR stations in Liberated Italy, and inform S.I.M., should the person not arrive within a week of his discharge from prison.

27. As far as clandestine travelling during the hours of darkness is concerned, it is necessary for a closer collaboration with the M.P. Units.

28. I have noticed that only on certain occasions do M.P.'s check Military Vehicles carrying civilians, and I

have heard them say on such occasions that they have been specially instructed to check on that particular day. I submit that it should be made quite clear to them that they should check at every available opportunity.

29. Whilst it is appreciated that the M.P. will not - in most cases - be able to institute proceedings against the travellers, it will not encourage this means of travel if the Italians know there is a strong possibility of being left high and dry on some mountain road, miles from civilisation.
30. I am afraid the only way to check the travelling at night is to have Allied Personnel on duty at the 'road blocks' during the hours of darkness, as the CC/RR and other Italian Police Agencies are too easily bluffed.
31. I have recently been in close contact with Major H.M. Smith, who is the O.C., SCI., Unit, at present stationed in Florence.
32. He told me that at about 0100 hrs on the 23rd. October, 1944, he was travelling on Route 2 from Rome to Florence.
33. During the hours of darkness he was surprised at the amount of civilian motor traffic he met on the road, quite obviously out after curfew. As a result he stopped at Poggibonsi where he found two CC/RR operating a 'road block'.
34. Major Smith then instructed the two CC/RR to stop the next civilian vehicle that came through.
35. The ~~next~~ ^{first} vehicle was a private motor car carrying Nuns who were travelling with AMG Permits, having been authorised to go to Florence to purchase commodities for their institution.

H.M. Smith, who is stationed in Florence.

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34. Major Smith then instructed the two CC/RR to stop the next civilian vehicle that came through.

35. The ^{first} ~~next~~ vehicle was a private motor car carrying Nuns who were travelling with AMG Permits, having been authorised to go to Florence to purchase commodities for their institution.

36. A search of the car revealed a large parcel of silk stockings, which, quite obviously, were not intended for the Nuns or their institution.

37. The next was a private motor car, and the person in charge was a man who described himself as a Yugo Slav Diplomat. This man strongly objected to being stopped, and enquiries proved why.

38. The two persons in the rear seat - a man and a woman - were both travelling without permits and Major Smith ordered the CC/RR to take them both into custody. The woman was later found to be a registered prostitute.

39. Major Smith is submitting a detailed report of this incident to this Sub-Commission.
