CONTROL OF MOVEMENT
(Civilian and Italian Armed Forces)

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1. Introduction.

In the interests of security a wide and effective system of control of civilian movement must be maintained. The instructions contained herein must be strictly followed by all concerned at all times.

Each Sub-Commission and Section at Headquarters will appoint an officer to deal with questions relating to the issue of passes which arise within the Sub-Commission or Section. (As to the issue of passes, see paras. 5 (a) (vi) and (vii), and 7 (b)).

Travel into the Army Zone is prohibited unless such travel is approved by the Senior Civil Affairs Officers, Allied Military Government, Armies or the Regional Commissioners concerned.

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1. Introduction.

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In general, the issue of passes will be a public safety responsibility. Passes improperly issued must be impounded and forwarded to Headquarters Allied Commission with covering reports.

2. Definitions.

Three zones and two dividing lines effect civilian travel in Italy as defined in Sub-paragraphs (a) to (c) below (see also Appendix "A").

(a) Army Zone. The territory which lies forward of the Rear Army Security Control Line will, for the purposes of this memorandum, be described as the "Army Zone".

(b) Rear Army Security Control Line. The line of demarcation between the Army Zone and the Restricted Zone. Special posters are exhibited on all roads which cross the line. A 24 hour system of control is maintained. This control is a military responsibility.

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(c) Restricted Zone. The territory which lies between the Rear Army Control Line and the Restricted Line, and such other territory as may be declared to be a Restricted Zone.

(d) Restricted Line. The line of demarcation between the Restricted Zone and the Free Zone.

(e) Free Zone. The territory not included within the Army Zone or the Restricted Zone.

Circulation is free on the islands of Elba, Sicily and Sardinia, but civilians travelling between the islands and between the islands and the mainland must be in possession of movement passes (See para. 5 (c)).

3. Details concerning the Rear Army Security Control Line and Restricted Line, and other territorial boundaries mentioned in this Memorandum, are given in Appendix "A". They are also shown diagrammatically in Appendix "B". Details of the Rear Army Security Control and Restricted Lines must be published locally as may be necessary. This will be an Allied Military Government responsibility in Allied Military Government territory, and an Italian Government responsibility in the territory under control.

4. Enforcement Orders.

The restrictions relating to civilian movement will be enforced by means of the following orders which will be issued by Allied Military Government and the Italian Government as indicated below :-

(a) Allied Military Government Territory.

(i) Army Zone - Proclamation No. 1 or such other Special orders as may be issued.

(ii) Restricted Zone - General Order No. 24 (Revised)

(iii) Elba - Orders issued by Prefetto.

(b) Italian Government Territory.

Movement between Sicily, Sardinia and Mainland.

Orders issued by the Prefetti on the instructions of the Ministry of Interior.

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(b) Italian Government Territory.

Movement between Sicily, Sardinia and Mainland.

Orders issued by the Prefetti on the instructions of the Ministry of Interior.

5. Restrictions and Authority for issue of Passes.

(a) Army Zone and Rear Army Security Control Line.

- (i) Civilians are forbidden to travel more than specified distances from their place of residence, or enter or leave the zone, unless in possession of a pass issued by the Senior Civil Affairs Officer, Allied Military Government, Fifth or Eighth Army. When, however, a province within the Army Zone has been handed over to Regional Control, the competent authority to issue a pass is the Regional Commissioner concerned and not the Senior Civil Affairs Officer, Allied Military Government, Fifth or Eighth Army.

- (ii) Applications for entry into the Army Zone should be referred by Regional Commissioners and Senior Civil Affairs Officers to G-2 (CI)/CSJ(t) Army for checking against security records. For movement out of the Army Zone or between points within the Army Zone the security

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check should be carried out by the nearest CIC

- (iii) Civilians resident outside the zone who wish to cross the control line into the Army Zone will make application for passes to the Questura or Allied Military Government/Allied Commission office at the point of departure.
- (iv) Regional Commissioners will refer all applications which originate in Allied Military Government territory direct to the Senior Civil Affairs Officer or Regional Commissioner concerned within the Zone for his approval (See preceding sub-paragraphs).
- (v) In Italian Government territory, Questors will submit recommended applications to the Ministry of Interior, Direzione Generale della Pubblica Sicurezza, who, if satisfied that the journeys will directly benefit the war effort, will forward such applications to Headquarters Allied Commission for onward transmission to Senior Civil Affairs Officer/Regional Commissioner concerned.
- (vi) Applications for passes which originate in Headquarters Allied Commission will be submitted through Sections, or, in the case of Independent Sub-Commissions, by the Sub-Commission concerned, to Public Safety Sub-Commission who will be responsible for such applications being transmitted in a proper form to the Senior Civil Affairs Officer/Regional Commissioner.
- (vii) Applications will be accompanied by completed standard passes which, if approved, will be signed by the Senior Civil Affairs Officer/Regional Commissioner and returned to office of origin. The passes will be completed by the Ministry of Interior, or in the case of Headquarters Allied Commission, by the Sub-Commission concerned. Passes of passes may be held by Sections and Independent Sub-Commissions for this purpose.
- (viii) Documents in Italian will not be transmitted unless accompanied by a translation.
- (ix) The issue of passes will be strictly limited to those cases in which the journeys will directly benefit the

(vi) Applications for passes which originate in Headquarters Allied Commission will be submitted through Sections, or, in the case of Independent Sub-Commissions, by the Sub-Commission concerned, to Public Safety Sub-Commission who will be responsible for such applications being transmitted in a proper form to the Senior Civil Affairs Officer/Regional Commissioner.

(vii) Applications will be accompanied by completed standard passes which, if approved, will be signed by the Senior Civil Affairs Officer/Regional Commissioner and returned to office of origin. The passes will be completed by the Ministry of Interior, or in the case of Headquarters Allied Commission by the Sub-Commission concerned. Books of passes may be sold by Sections and Independent Sub-Commissions for this purpose.

(viii) Documents in Italian will not be transmitted unless accompanied by a translation.

(ix) The issue of passes will be strictly limited to those cases in which the journeys will directly benefit the Allied cause and applications must not be forwarded to Senior Civil Affairs Officers/Regional Commissioners except in such cases.

(x) Where, in cases of extreme urgency, the procedure outlined in Sub-paragraph (a) (ii) would be impracticable owing to the time factor, the passes may be issued at the point of departure providing prior approval is obtained from the Senior Civil Affairs Officer or Regional Commissioner concerned by signal or telephone. In such cases details of the issue of such passes will be forwarded immediately to the Senior Civil Affairs Officer/Regional Commissioner of the area of destination. The back of every such pass issued will bear the following endorsement:

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"I certify that prior approval for the issue of this pass was obtained from On and details of the pass have been forwarded to Senior Civil Affairs Officer/Regional Commander concerned in accordance with Executive Memorandum No. 77.

(xi) When the Senior Civil Affairs Officer, Fifth or Eighth Army, requests the presence of a civilian in Army Zone, the Sub-Commission dealing with this matter will apply for a movement of civilian pass to Public Safety who, before issue of a pass, will obtain from the Adjutant a permit for the civilian to travel by W.D. transport.

(xii) Allied Naval, Military and Air Force officers on the staff of the Allied Commission who wish to visit the Army Zone will obtain clearance from the Senior Civil Affairs Officer of Fifth or Eighth Army as the case may be.

(xiii) The validity of passes to enter the Army Zone will not be extended except by Public Safety Officers, Allied Military Government/ Allied Commission.

(xiv) The headquarters of Allied Military Organizations employing civilians who are required to enter the Army Zone in order to perform their duties may, if they prefer, make applications for passes for such civilians direct to Public Safety Sub-Commission of the Allied Commission.

(b) Restricted Zone and Restricted Line.

(i) No civilian may travel from one province to another or cross the Restricted Line unless in possession of a pass.

(ii) The issue of passes will be limited to persons who show good and sufficient reasons why they wish to travel, whether on official matters, business or family grounds. Passes will not be issued to places in Allied Military Government territory for political purposes.

of Fifth or Eighth Army as the case may be.

(xiii) The validity of passes to enter the Army Zone will not be extended except by Public Safety Officers, Allied Military Government/ Allied Commission.

(xiv) The Headquarters of Allied Military Organizations employing civilians who are required to enter the Army Zone in order to perform their duties may, if they prefer, make applications for passes for such civilians direct to Public Safety Sub-Commission of the Allied Commission.

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(ii) The issue of passes will be limited to persons who show good and sufficient reasons why they wish to travel, whether on official matters, business or family grounds. Passes will not be issued to places in Allied Military Government territory for political purposes.

(iii) In Allied Military Government territory, South of the Rear Army Security Control Line, Regional Commissioners may authorize specified officers of the Quarters to issue passes as may be required, but they are responsible for ensuring that these instructions are fully understood by the officers concerned.

(iv) In Italian Government territory, passes to places South of the Rear Army Security Control Line will be issued by the Quarters at the point of departure.

(v) Passes will not be issued to points within 10 km to the South of the Rear Army Security Control Line, where there is any reason to suppose that the applicant intends to make a further application to enter the Army Zone when he arrives at his destination, unless good grounds exist for entering the Army Zone in which case the application will be made in the first instance for the standard movement of civilian pass.

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(vi) Public Safety Sub-Commission will ensure that the Ministry of the Interior makes these instructions known to all questors and that the Ministry takes steps to ensure that passes are only issued in accordance with them.

(c) Restriction of travel between Elba, Sicily, Sardinia and the Mainland.

Passes may be issued as under subparagraph (b).

(i) Commune of Naples.

Freedom of movement exists between the Commune of Naples and the surrounding Italian Government territory, subject of course to the general instructions contained in this memorandum. The Questors, Naples, will submit applications for travel into the Army Zone to the Ministry of the Interior (See sub Paragraph (a) (v)).

6. Refugees.

Passes must not be issued to refugees except when coordinated with the Regions concerned, or in accordance with policy laid down by Displaced Persons & Repatriation Sub-Commission.

7. Passes.

(a) Form of Pass.

The standard Movement of Civilian pass (yellow form with blue duplicate) will be used. No other form of pass is permitted with the exception of the authorization mentioned in para 8 below. (The colour of the pass may vary slightly from time to time owing to difficulties in obtaining yellow paper).

(b) Instructions as to the issue of passes.

It is necessary that uniformity shall be observed in the wording of facilities granted and therefore the following instructions will be strictly followed :-

(i) All passes must be signed by an officer who will be responsible for them being fully and properly completed, and issued in accordance with relevant instructions. Facsimile signature stamps will not be used.

(ii) Passes should be typewritten or written in ink. In-

7. Passes.(a) Form of Pass.

The standard Movement of Civilian pass (yellow form with blue duplicate) will be used. No other form of pass is permitted with the exception of the authorization mentioned in para 6 below. (The colour of the pass may vary slightly from time to time owing to difficulties in obtaining yellow paper).

(b) Instructions as to the issue of passes.

It is necessary that uniformity shall be observed in the wording of facilities granted and therefore the following instructions will be strictly followed :-

(i) All passes must be signed by an officer who will be responsible for them being fully and properly completed, and issued in accordance with relevant instructions. Facsimile signature stamp will not be used.

(ii) Passes should be typewritten or written in ink. Indelible pencil may be used but the use of blacklead pencils is forbidden.

(iii) The holder's FULL name, address and identity card number must be shown.

(iv) Separate passes must be issued in respect of each person, except in the case of organized parties of refugees (para 6); in which case one pass may be issued with a nominal roll giving, name, address and identity card number attached. Such roll will bear the office stamp and the signature of the issuing officer.

(v). In authorizing travel to a Provincial capital, the name of the capital will be followed by the word "city", eg, Florence City, Pisa City, in order that the pass may not be used for travel in other parts of the province.

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- (vi) The precise nature of the journey must be clearly defined.
- (vii) Particulars of motor vehicles will not be recorded on passes unless circulating permits covering the use of the vehicles and motor fuel ration coupons have been issued for the journeys in question.
- (viii) The validity of passes shall not exceed the minimum time required to complete the proposed journeys and to transact the business of the holders. In the case of travel into the Army Zone, passes will be made out for one specific journey and will not be made out for indefinite periods.
- (ix) All amendments (i.e., with regard to routes, validity, etc.), will be made by way of endorsements on the back of the pass. The endorsement will be worded simply and clearly so that no question of ambiguity arises. The office of issue must be informed of any endorsements.

3. Issue of Passes in Special Cases.

(a) Officials of the Central Italian Government travelling on Duty.

- (1) Applications for passes will be made to the Ministry of Interior (Direzione Generale della Pubblica Sicurezza), who will issue passes to places SOUTH of the Rear Army Security Control Line.

- (ii) Applications for passes to places in the Army Zone will be referred by the Ministry of Interior to Public Safety Sub-Commission. Applications will be accompanied by completed standard passes as provided in para 5 (vii).

(b) Special passes for Ministers of the Central Italian Government.

Standard passes for Ministers of the Central Italian Government will be prepared by the Ministry of Interior who will forward them (with duplicates) to Public Safety Sub-Commission. The passes will cover movement anywhere south of the Rear Army Security Control Line. They will be valid for a period of three months from 1 January 1945 to 31 December 1945.

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(b) Special Passes for Ministers of the Central Italian Government.

Standard passes for Ministers of the Central Italian Government will be prepared by the Ministry of Interior who will forward them (with duplicates) to Public Safety Sub-Commission. The passes will cover movement anywhere south of the Rear Army Security Control Line. They will be valid for a period of three months, expiring 31 March, 30 June, 30 September and 31 December and will bear the following endorsement on the back :

" S..... (Name and title of holder) is hereby authorized to proceed to any part of Italy to the rear of the Rear Army Security Control Line. He should be given every facility and courtesy."

The passes will be signed by Public Safety who will forward them to Allied Forces Headquarters, G-2 Section, for counter signatures.

(c) Italian Armed Forces.

- (1) When in uniform and on duty.

Members of the Italian Armed Forces when travelling in uniform on duty must be in possession of proper movement orders (Foglio di Viaggio) and identity documents. If such personnel are travelling in a group a nominal roll will be attached to the movement order. Movement of civilian passes will not be necessary, but, in the case

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of movement into the Army Zone the movement orders must be countersigned by the General Staff (Br) or any General Staff Section (US), or as indicated below :-

Land Forces.

Military Mission Italian Army Liaison Officers
Public Safety Sub-Commission (Carabinieri).

Naval Personnel.

Navy Sub-Commission
Flag Officer, Northern Area, Mediterranean.
Flag Officer, Taranto, Adriatic.
British Naval Officers in charge of the rank of
Captain or above.

Air Force Personnel.

Air Forces Sub-Commission.

The countersignature will be accompanied by the office stamp of the officer countersigning.

(ii) When in uniform on leave.

Personnel proceeding on leave in uniform to places south of the Rear Army Security Control Line may use leave passes (Biglietto di Licenza) in lieu of standard movement of civilian passes.

(iii) When in civilian clothes whether on duty or not.

Personnel in civilian clothes whether on duty or not are subject to the same restrictions as civilians.

(iv) Demobilization.

Demobilization papers will be regarded as proper credentials for movement South of the Rear Army Security Control Line for the onward journey home on discharge.

(v) The Italian Servizio Ministries have instructed Italian Servizio Commanders that leave will not be granted to places

The Countersignature will be accompanied by the office stamp of the officer countersigning.

(ii) When in uniform on leave.

Personnel proceeding on leave in uniform to places south of the Rear Army Security Control Line may use leave passes (Rigilietto di Licenza) in lieu of standard movement of civilian passes.

(iii) When in civilian clothes whether on duty or not.

Personnel in civilian clothes whether on duty or not are subject to the same restrictions as civilians.

(iv) Demobilization.

Demobilization papers will be regarded as proper credentials for movement South of the Rear Army Security Control Line for the original journey home on discharge.

(v) The Italian Service Ministries have instructed Italian Service Commanders that leave will not be granted to places in the Army Zone except in the case of combat troops. Standard movement passes will be issued to each individual in such cases by British Liaison Units attached to combat groups or Military Mission Italian Army Liaison Officers.

(vi) Italian Military Personnel found committing breaches of Orders relating to movement may be tried before Allied Military Courts.

(a) Italian Police Personnel. (excluding Carabinieri personnel - see 2 (5) (4) above).

Police personnel are subject to the same restrictions as military personnel.

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Individual Police Officers moving into the Army Zone on duty will be in possession of civilian movement passes. In the case of armed bodies moving into the Army Zone, the necessary orders will be obtained by Public Safety Sub-Commission.

(e) Diplomatic Corps.

Members of the Diplomatic Corps requiring passes will apply to the Ministry for Foreign Affairs who will issue passes for journeys South of the Rear Army Security Control Line.

Applications for passes to cross the Rear Army Security Control Line will be referred by the Minister for Foreign Affairs to the Ministry of Interior who will deal with such applications as in para 5 (a) (v).

(f) Vatican Officials, Knights of Malta.

Applications for passes for Vatican Officials and officials of the Sovereign Order of the Knights of Malta will be dealt with by Liaison Division, Headquarters Allied Commission, in the manner outlined in para 5.

(g) Journalists.

bona fide Italian Journalists are issued by the Public Relation Officer, Headquarters Allied Commission, with a green card "TESSERA DI RICONOSCIMENTO". This card bears an endorsement on the back to the effect that "the bearer is permitted to travel in liberated Italy to circulate after curfew and to enter official premises occupied by Allied Commission in liberated Italy. This pass does not apply to Army Areas." This tessera and endorsement will be considered to be the equivalent of the standard movement of civilian pass in the Restricted and Free Zones, but a standard pass will be required in addition to the Tessera to enter the Army Zone.

(h) Military Railway Services (IRS)

Personnel of the Italian State Railways (ISR) and Contractors under the direction of the IRS and ISR may apply

(4) Journalists.

Bona fide Italian journalists are issued by the Public Relation Officer, Headquarters Allied Commission, with a green card "TESSERA DI RICONOSCIMENTO". This card bears an endorsement on the back to the effect that "the bearer is permitted to travel in liberated Italy to circulate after curfew and to enter official premises occupied by Allied Commission in Liberated Italy. This pass does not apply to Army Areas." This tessera and endorsement will be considered to be the equivalent of the standard movement of civilian pass in the Restricted and Free Zones, but a standard pass will be required in addition to the Tessera to enter the Army Zone.

(h) Military Railway Services (MRS)

Personnel of the Italian State Railways (ISR) and Contractors under the direction of the MRS and ISR may apply for passes to the MRS who are authorized to issue standard movement passes in accordance with this Memorandum.

9. Issue of Semi-Permanent Passes.

In the case of persons living near a Provincial boundary and whose place of employment is in, or partly in, an adjoining Province or Provinces, a semi-permanent pass may be issued and such passes shall expire on 31 March, 30 June, 30 September and 31 December annually, and then become renewable upon further application. Such passes may also be issued to all persons who have sufficient reason for frequent travel between Provinces. The provision will not apply to travel into the Army Zone.

10. Supplies of Passes.

Supplies of passes may be obtained upon application to Public Safety Sub-Commission. Questore in Allied Military Government territory will obtain supply from Regional Commissioners. In Italian Government territory from the Ministry of the Interior. (Direzione Generale della Pubblica Sicurezza).

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11. Emergency Passes issued by Military.

It has been agreed with Headquarters 15 Army Group that if a responsible Allied Military authority has occasion to employ a civilian on a particular operational or intelligence task requiring the issue of a pass, and if it is impracticable, owing to the time factor or other circumstances, for the appropriate Allied Commission/Allied Military Government pass to be obtained, the Military authority concerned may make out a temporary pass for the purpose. There will rarely be occasion for the issue of this type of authorization.

12. Issue of Travel Tickets.

Transport tickets must not be issued by the railway authorities or other travel agencies to places within the Army or Restricted Zone unless the persons applying for tickets are in possession of civilian movement passes to their intended destination. This will be a Ministry of Interior responsibility in Italian Government territory, and an Allied Military Government responsibility elsewhere.

13. Military Travel Authorisation (to travel outside Italy).

Applications for Military Travel Authorisations will be dealt with in accordance with the instruction contained in Executive Memorandum No. 61.

14. Check Posts.(a) In Allied Military Government Territory.

In the Army Zone and in territory outside that Zone administered by Allied Military Government, every effort will be made to enforce the above restrictions by means of a widespread system of "snare" check posts, which will be established for a few hours daily at irregular times and at varying points. The responsibility for arranging such checks will rest with the Military Security Authorities.

The object of these check posts will be :-

- (1) To turn back those seeking to move outside the

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and movement passed to their intended destination. This will be a Ministry of Interior responsibility in Italian Government territory, and an Allied Military Government responsibility elsewhere.

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14. Check Posts.

(a) In Allied Military Government Territory.

In the Army Zone and in territory outside that Zone administered by Allied Military Government, every effort will be made to enforce the above restrictions by means of a widespread system of "snap" check posts, which will be established for a few hours daily at irregular times and at varying points. The responsibility for arranging such checks will rest with the Military Security Authorities.

The object of these check posts will be :-

- (i) To turn back those seeking to move outside the prescribed limits without a pass.
- (ii) To take action against those who have committed serious and flagrant breaches of the regulations.
- (iii) To question or detain for investigation persons whose conduct or "story" is suspicious.

(b) Italian Government Territory.

In the territory administered by the Italian Government a similar system of "snap" check posts will be established. In this instance, however, the object will be limited to :-

- (i) Briefly questioning those passing the point with a view to discovering suspicious individuals who should be subject to further interrogation and investigation, and

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(ii) Instilling a sense of insecurity in the minds of agents or other undesirable individuals so that they may hesitate to move about or even abandon their mission.

(c) Organisation and Composition.

This system of check posts will be organized by Army, Corps, District and Base Section Headquarters and not by Allied Military Government/Allied Commission, both in Military Government and Italian Government territories.

These check posts will normally be manned by appropriate combinations, according to circumstances, of Field Security and Counter Intelligence Corps personnel, Italian Army Intelligence (Security Police), Carabinieri and Guardia di Finanza.

Every effort will be made by Allied Commission officers to ensure the fullest co-operation of the Italian Police in connection with these duties.

15. Amendments.

Any future alterations to these regulations, which are now to be considered as standard, will be issued in the form of amendments to this Memorandum.

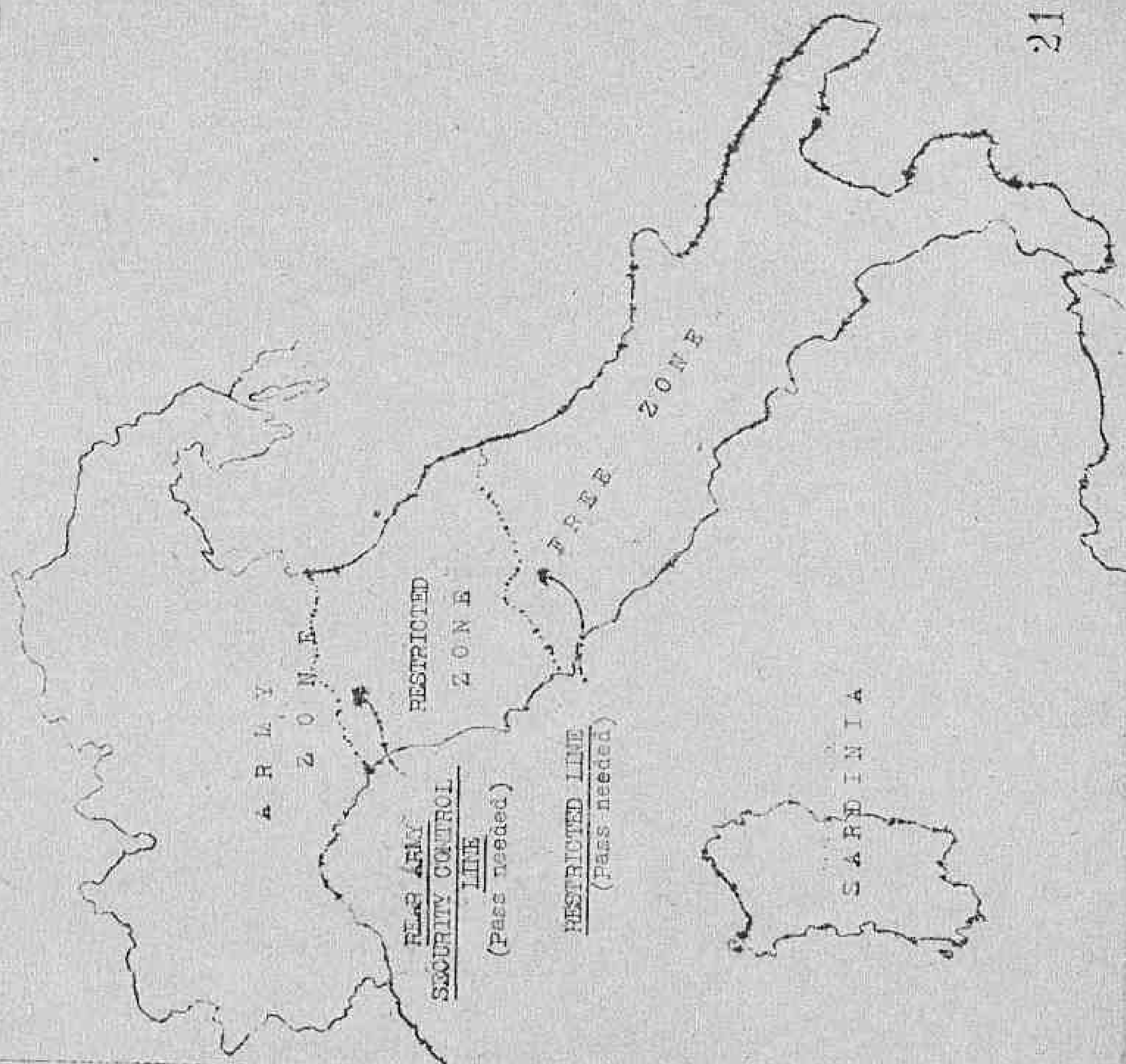

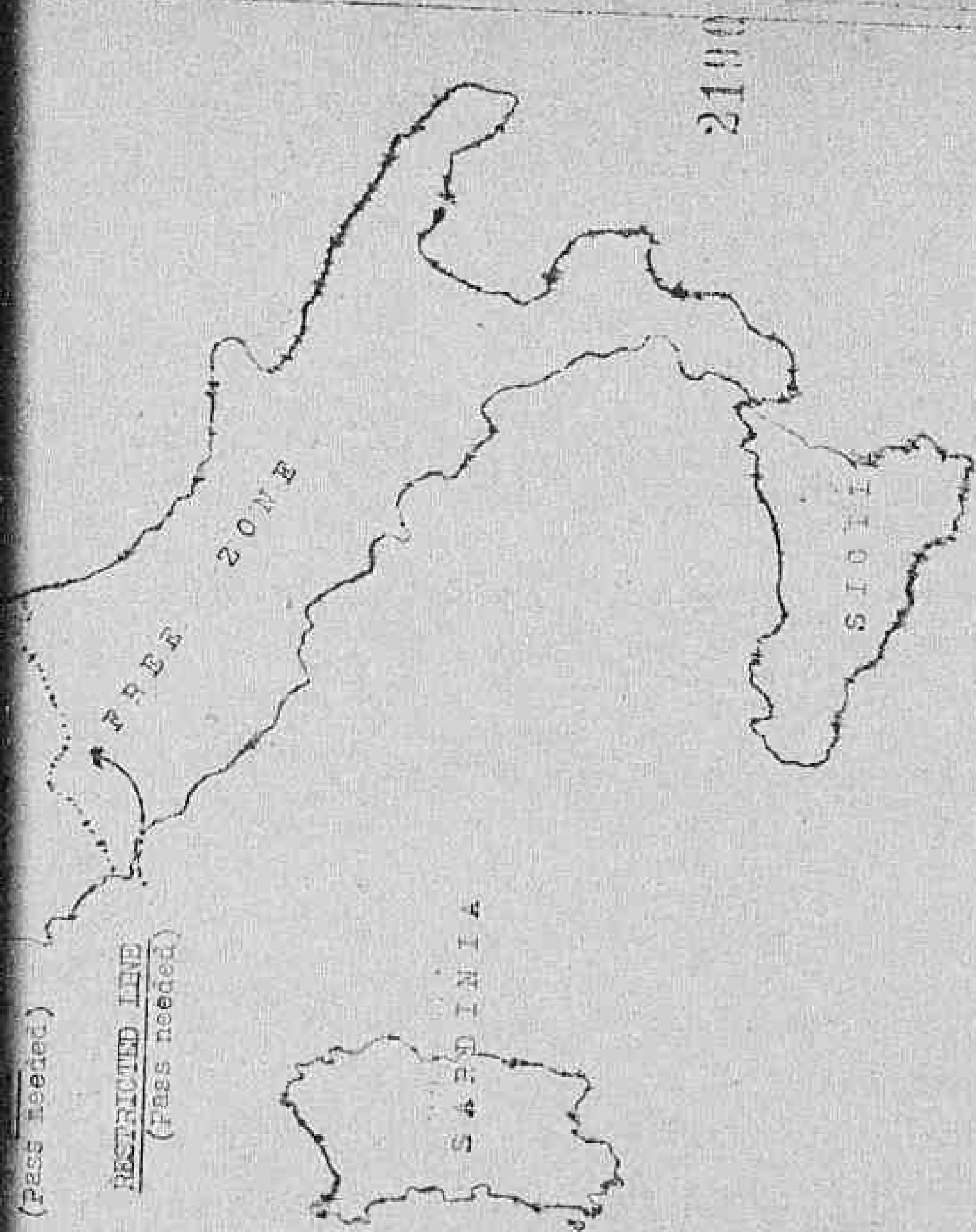

Herewith I should like to submit the case of my sister Alexandra Deym to your attention.

After the death of our father, Alexandra Nagel was naturalized American citizen at the age of five, as our mother was American born. In 1937 she married an Czechoslovakian citizen: Count Hubert Deym. From 1939 to 1944 she and her husband resided in Florence (Villa Alexandra Castello near Florence) in the villa my mother had given her.

At about the end of 1943 or the beginning of 1944 she separated from her husband intending to get a divorce as soon as possible. At the end of September or beginning of October Count Hubert Deym was arrested by the Allied Authorities and sent to a concentration camp together with his sister. The address I believe is 2 Internee Camp Neaples.

In January 1945 my sister was asked by the Allied Authorities to leave Florence, and upon her request Catania, Sicily was assigned to her as residence. She was told however, that before the end of the war she would not be permitted to leave Catania.

As the war is now over and my sister has not yet been notified that she has regained her freedom, I -being in Rome- wanted to ask whether this matter could be looked into so that she might as soon as possible be in a position to solve her numerous problems that have arisen during the war, through the death of my mother in the States, her particular family situation, and which require above all the possibility to move about freely. She has a 7 year old child to look after, and the matter concerning my mother's will which must be settled personally at the U.S. Consulate in Palermo and Florence. Also it will be very important for her to have things in hand when her house in Florence will be derequisitioned as there is nobody else who could do it in stead.

Hoping very much that this case can be solved favourably, I thank you very sincerely

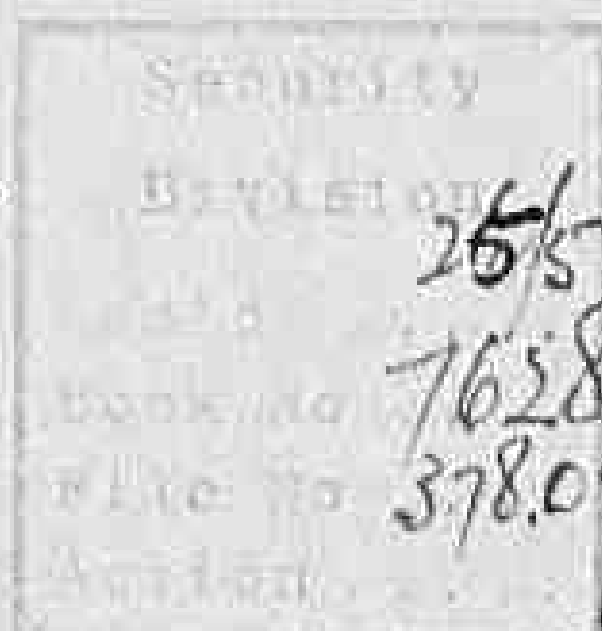

"5a. All applications will be referred to this headquarters, except in the categories where permits may be issued without reference, for example:

Officials in the employment of and paid by any of the Governments of the United Nations whose journeys appear to be in the interests of the war effort.

"b. Before issuing any permit, with or without prior reference to this headquarters, the issuing authority will satisfy himself that there is no local security or other objection to the applicant."

- c. Paragraph 6 is added to read:

"6. Permits will be issued only for journeys in furtherance of the Allied war effort, with the exception that this headquarters will consider applications referred in respect of:

a. Scholars, artists and members of the learned professions who are nationals of Italy or of one of the United Nations, if proposing to travel for the purpose of free trade in knowledge and learning between the peoples of Italy and the United Nations. Ecclesiastics and journalists will not be considered in this category.

b. Individuals wishing to enter Italy for compassionate reasons. Such travel will be kept to a minimum, and be confined to Italians and nationals of the United Nations. Only valid medical reasons, or return to domicile in Italy in order to relieve real economic hardships, will be considered under this head.

c. Individuals appointed to permanent positions in the Vatican."

1. Transmitted herewith is Movement of Civilian Pass No 642557 issued on 15 February, 1945, to RANDAZZO Luigi by the Ispettorato Generale della M.C.T.C. to enable Randazzo to travel within a radius of 400 Kms from Rome on the services of the railway.

Cases are known where soldiers have adopted or temporarily harbored minor children and have furnished them with food, clothing, shelter and transportation from one station to another. This practice is contrary to existing orders and will cease at once. If children are apprehended in the keeping of military personnel they will be returned to the proper civil authorities at the place where they joined the military personnel.

Nest camps, soldiers' clubs and billets, and other places where soldiers congregate tend to be a big attraction to children. In the vicinity of such places, Italian police are reluctant to act against children because at times soldiers are apt to constitute themselves their protectors. This mistaken kindness is not in the proper interest of troops themselves, the children, nor the future of Italy. Scheme came into force on 30 March 1945. (EXTRACT from GROS, Serial No. 13, No. 293, dated 30 March 1945). Full particulars of the scheme may be seen in the Office of the Hq Commandant. (Hq Comdt)

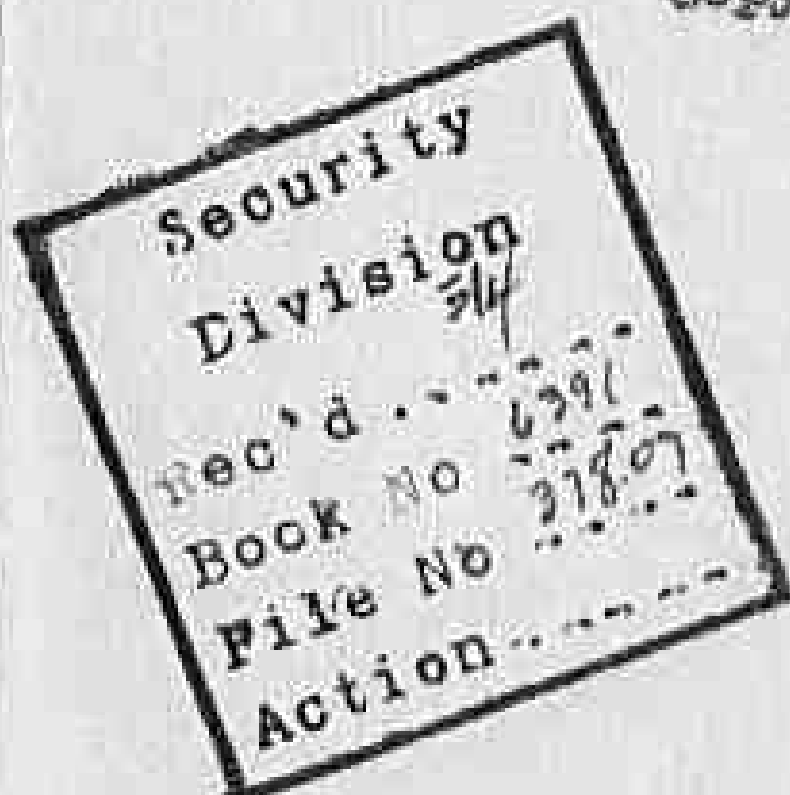

On the 22nd of January 1934 she married in Cairo Dr. Comm. GALASSI Giuseppe son of Pietro and of Martini Erminia, born in S.Biagio d'Argente on the 12th of January 1890, with who she lives at present. They have no children.

Dr. Galassi who was in Cairo the director of the "Giornale d'Oriente", has some precedents in the records of the local Questura stating that he favoured the sequester of the Deputy Giacomo Matteotti. However, in his instance of the 9th of October 1925 the Processor of the King of Rome asked not to take any measure against him because of the extinction of the penal action, and for amnesty.

After his return from Cairo Galassi has for some time been employed at the Ministry of Popular Culture. At present he is out of work.

He is an ex combatant and his inscription in the fascist party has been backdated to the 3rd of March 1925.

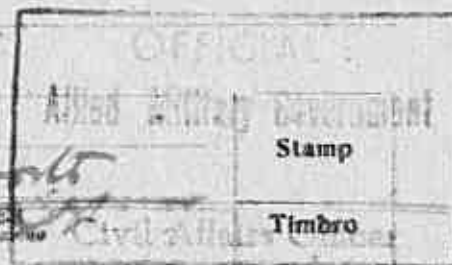
