SUBJECT : Irregular Movement of Russians and Yugo Slavs

TO : Executive Commissioner

1. With reference to Para 2(a) of PR/ESO/111.1 of 25 Sept. 1945 from Piemonte Region, such persons will not leave their Rome Hq., without an AC travel order, authorized by AFHQ giving details of places to be visited and the reason for the journey. Failure to produce these orders deprives the person concerned to all facilities, i.e., rations, petrol, requisitioned accommodation, etc and he must be ordered to return to Rome and the matter reported to AC.

2. With reference to Para 2 (b), this section is not competent to express an opinion on the movement of Soviet and Yugoslav military personnel who are not members of their official missions. Non military personnel are of course subject to Italian law, they must be registered as foreigners and any infraction of the law should be dealt with by AMG or the Italian Authorities. Such persons can claim no privileges or benefits other than those possessed by Italian nationals.

TO : Establishment Section (Attention: Adjutant) (2)
 Civil Affairs Section (Attention: D.P. & R. S/C) (2)
 Liaison Division, Hq. AC

1. In accordance with instructions from AFHQ, travel within any part of Italy for personnel of the following organizations will not be performed except on the granting of specific authority by AFHQ:

- a. Office of Soviet Representative to the Allied Commission.
- b. Soviet Delegation to the Advisory Council for Italy.
- c. Yugoslav Delegation to the Advisory Council for Italy.
- d. Soviet Military Mission (also known as Displaced Persons and Refugee Mission and as Repatriation Mission).
- e. Yugoslav Repatriation Office.

2. a. Any movement out of Rome of any personnel of the above-named organizations will be subject to travel orders issued by the Adjutant, Allied Commission.

b. These travel orders must be based on AFHQ approval and will specify such approval by citing AFHQ reference and date.

c. The travel orders will also specify purpose of journey, the itinerary and the names of personnel travelling, as well as the expected times of departure and return. The orders will also contain a definite time limit.

3. Requests for travel orders affecting the organizations mentioned in paragraph one above will be made to the Adjutant's Office by the following offices of this Headquarters:

- a. Liaison Division, Office of the Executive Commissioner, for

- a. Office of Soviet Representative to the Allied Commission.
- b. Soviet Delegation to the Advisory Council for Italy.
- c. Yugoslav Delegation to the Advisory Council for Italy.
- d. Soviet Military Mission (also known as Displaced Persons and Refugee Mission and as Repatriation Mission).
- e. Yugoslav Repatriation Office.

2. e. Any movement out of Rome of any personnel of the above-named organizations will be subject to travel orders issued by the Adjutant, Allied Commission.

b. These travel orders must be based on AFHQ approval and will specify such approval by citing AFHQ reference and date.

c. The travel orders will also specify purpose of journey, the itinerary and the names of personnel travelling, as well as the expected times of departure and return. The orders will also contain a definite time limit.

3. Requests for travel orders affecting the organizations mentioned in paragraph one above will be made to the Adjutant's Office by the following offices of this Headquarters:

- a. Liaison Division, Office of the Executive Commissioner, for personnel of the Office of the Soviet Representative to the Allied Commission.
- b. Liaison Division, Office of the Executive Commissioner, for personnel of the Soviet Delegation to the Advisory Council for Italy.
- c. Liaison Division, Office of the Executive Commissioner, for personnel of the Yugoslav Delegation of the Advisory Council for Italy.
- d. Displaced Persons and Repatriation Subcommittee for personnel of the Soviet Military Mission (also known as Displaced Persons and Refugee Mission and as Repatriation Mission).
- e. Displaced Persons and Repatriation Subcommittee for personnel of the Yugoslav Repatriation Office.

4. Requests for travel will be subject to approval by the Liaison Division or Displaced Persons & Repatriation Subcommittee as appropriate before reference is made to AFHQ for authority.
5. AFHQ are issuing instructions to Districts and Areas to the effect that rations, POL, authorization of billets and other travel facilities will not be available without travel orders. RCs and LCs will conform.
6. Requests to AFHQ for travel orders will be made to G-1(3), AFHQ, with a copy to G-5.
7. These instructions are to be carefully observed.

SUBJECT : Travel from Switzerland to Italy

TO : See Distribution List

1. Reference is made to the following letters relating to travel between Switzerland and Italy, copies to you.

- (a) AC/14080/21/PS, Travel from Switzerland to Italy, dated 14 June, 1945, which states that civilians entering Italy from Switzerland must be in possession of Allied Force Permits.
- (b) AC/14012/2/PS, Travel of Civilians from and to Italy, dated 7 August, 1945, which states that Allied systems of control are still in operation for the control of travel into Italy.

2. With regard to travel from Italy to Switzerland and return, AFAC has advised this Headquarters that the following system has been instituted :-

- (a) Swiss and Italian nationals domiciled in Italy who produce to the Travel Control Agents at Chiasso or Domodossola valid passports or valid visas for entry into Switzerland will be permitted to leave Italy, and return to this country without Allied Force Permits provided the re-entry into Italy is made within the time limits imposed by the Control Agents and endorsed upon the passports.

Italy, dated 14 June, 1945, which states that civilians entering Italy from Switzerland must be in possession of Allied Force Permits.

- (b) AC/14048/C/PS Travel of Civilians from and to Italy, dated 7 August, 1945, which states that Allied systems of control are still in operation for the control of travel into Italy.

2. With regard to travel from Italy to Switzerland and return, AFHQ has advised this Headquarters that the following system has been instituted:

- (a) Swiss and Italian nationals domiciled in Italy who produce to the Travel Control Agents at Chiasso or Domodossola valid passports or valid visas for entry into Switzerland will be permitted to leave Italy, and return to this country without Allied Force Permits provided the re-entry into Italy is made within the time limits imposed by the Control Agents and endorsed upon the passports.

- (b) The time limits imposed by the Control Agents during which re-entry may be made into Italy from Switzerland without Allied Force Permits will be:-

- (i) Holders of Swiss Passports
Periods not exceeding three months.
- (ii) Holders of Italian Passports
Periods not exceeding three months or the periods of validity of the Swiss visas which ever are the shorter.
- (c) Passports will also be endorsed to show the crossing points at which re-entry into Italy must be made.

3. All concerned are reminded that persons travelling to places outside Italy do not require travel orders unless

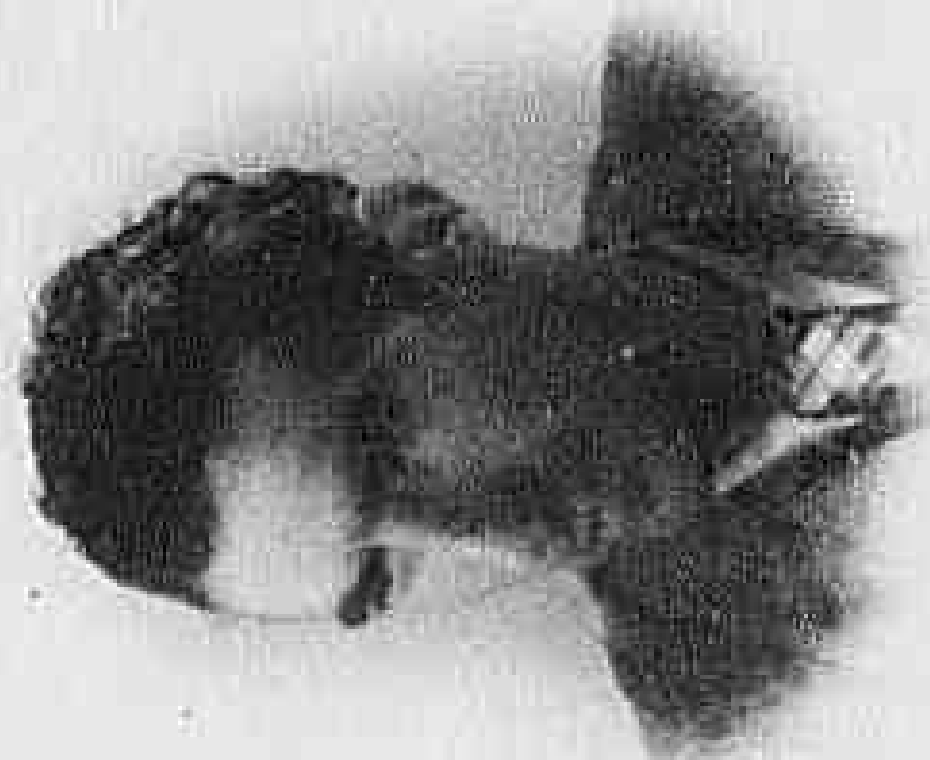

TO : Director Public Safety Sub Commission
(Att'n. Major BALLANCE)

1. Reference your letter August 18 requesting copies of my letter dated August 7 to AFHQ.
2. The correspondence in question was a private letter sent by me to Major BENNET and there are therefore no copies in our files which I can submit to your section.
3. According to your request however I will outline the different points stated in the a/m letter.
4. I told Major BENNET about a discussion I had with our mutual friend Dr. SULZER of the Swiss Legation and about his views and reactions and the new AFHQ regulations for leaving and entering Italy to and from Switzerland.
5. I pointed out that many Swiss people have decided not to go to Switzerland to see their families because they are afraid that re-entry into Italy might prove very difficult and the great delay would be harmful to their business or occupations here.
6. I pointed out that if all the people crossing into Switzerland would have to re-apply personally in Bern for re-entry into Italy it would be very hard, if not impossible, for the Allied Force Permit Officer to handle the great volume of additional work.
7. So I suggested to Major BENNET that perhaps it would be possible and preferable to let the C.I.C. agents in Chiosso suggest the Subjects on their own.

2. The correspondence in question was a private letter sent by me to Major BENNET and there are therefore no copies in our files which I can submit to your section.
3. According to your request however I will outline the different points stated in the a/m letter.
4. I told Major BENNET about a discussion I had with our mutual friend Dr. SULZER of the Swiss Legation and about his views and reactions and the new APHQ regulations for leaving and entering Italy to and from Switzerland.
5. I pointed out that many Swiss people have decided not to go to Switzerland to see their families because they are afraid that re-entry into Italy might prove very difficult and the great delay would be harmful to their business or occupations here.
6. I pointed out that if all the people crossing into Switzerland would have to re-apply personally in Berne for re-entry into Italy it would be very hard, if not impossible, for the Allied Force Permit Officer to handle the great volume of additional work.
7. So I suggested to Major BENNET that perhaps it would be possible and preferable to let the C.I.C. agents in Chiasso question the Subjects on their exit and issue a return visa in the form of a stamp on the passport after the traveller has proved residence in Italy.
8. I further stated that in my opinion the C.I.C. agents might be better equipped and trained to question the Subjects and discover any unfavourable evidence besides relieving the Allied Force Permit Officer in Switzerland of a very difficult job.
9. To my letter to Major BENNET I attached a note from Dr. SULZER explaining the Swiss Government's ruling that no visa can be issued to a foreign national unless re-entry to the Subject's own country is guaranteed, which, of course, would make travel for Italians into Switzerland, under the new regulations, almost impossible.

Port Security Instruction (Italy) No. 715SUBJECT: Travel by civilians from Italy to the U.S., British and
French Zones of Occupation in Germany

TO: All Concerned

1. For the purpose of this instruction, the term "civilians" covers all persons not authorized to hold a recognized U.S., British (including Dominion), French or Allied Naval, Military or Air Force Identity Document.

2. Civilians traveling from Italy to the U.S., British or French Zones of Occupation in Germany must hold military permits issued by G-2 (CI) Section, AFHQ. The only civilians exempt from this requirement are:

a. Merchant Seamen serving as members of ships' crews, or traveling as passengers or supernumeraries in pursuit of their sea employment and holding appropriate written authority to travel as such.

b. War Correspondents accredited to the U.S., British and French Zone Headquarters in Germany.

c. Displaced persons traveling under proper authority.

3. For the time being, the military permit in use for this travel will be the Allied Expeditionary Force Permit.

2. It has been decided that the Second-Phase of travel to and from the British and American Zones of AUSTRIA shall open on 16 July 1945. It is NOT proposed to announce this fact to the public, but the measures described in para 2 of CI/Security Instruction No 3 will come into effect from that date, with certain slight alterations as given in para 3 below.

1. Lettor, this headquarters, file AG 371.2/015 GEG-O, subject as above, dated 7 November 1944 and amendments thereto dated 5 January, 27 March and 11 April 1945, are rescinded and the following substituted therefor.

2. a. The following instructions apply forthwith to travel from Italy to all destinations other than:

U.S.A.

U.K.

Malta, Gibraltar and other territories to which
British visa regulations apply

Egypt

b. Travellers to the above mentioned territories by direct means (that is, not transiting other territories on the way), who are in possession of U.S., British or Egyptian visas as applicable, may leave Italy without Military Travel Authorizations.

3. Persons leaving Italy (including Sicily and Sardinia) for destinations other than those specified in paragraph 2 above must be in possession of Military Travel Authorizations issued by G-2 (CI) Section, AFHQ, with the exception of persons listed in paragraph 4 below.

4. The exceptions are:

- a. Allied service personnel on duty.
- b. Allied Diplomats and Consular Officials.
- c. British and United States civilians employed by and travelling on duty for, the following Governmental Agencies:

- (1) UNRRA
- (2) Office of War Information

5. A person not included in paragraph 4 (of whatever nationality) wishing to leave Italian territory (including Sicily and Sardinia) should obtain application forms for Military Travel Authorization from the nearest Allied Commission Officer or from the Questura at the Capital of the Province in which he finds himself, or such other officer or agency as may be deputed. Two copies of the application form will be completed. They will be typewritten, or written in block capitals where no typewriter is available. The applicant must furnish, where photographic facilities exist, two full face and two profile photographs of passport size, which will be affixed to the two copies of the application form as indicated in the spaces provided. Where the applicants cannot provide photographs, right thumb prints will be made on the application form, in the presence of the agency accepting the application.

6. In the case of applications for diplomatic and consular officers and members of special economic or political missions, however, applications will be handled by Headquarters, Allied Commission. Photographs will not be required.

7. The agency receiving an application will satisfy itself as to the identity of the applicant and as to the reasons for his proposed journey, and will note in the first few lines of the "Remarks" section of the application form any information available locally concerning the applicant, and any comments. Otherwise, the receiving agency will indorse the Military Travel Authorization application forms "Nothing known against" ("Nulla Osta"). The agency will then fill in the items "Counter signature of Civil Affairs Officer and Office Stamp" and "Region and Province", but will leave the remaining spaces blank. The terms of this paragraph will not apply to applications under paragraph 6 above.

8. Both copies of the application form will then be forwarded by the receiving agency through Headquarters Allied Commission to G-2 (CI) AFHQ. 2272

9. G-2 (CI) AFHQ after consideration of the applications, will return one copy of the application form to the appropriate section of ALCOM with the decision as to grant or refusal, and where the application is granted will forward together with the form the appropriate Military Travel Authorization for transmission to the applicant.

10. Agencies handling applications will on no account communicate to persons whose applications have been refused the grounds for such refusal; nor will they attempt to indicate, in view of the detailed research which will be necessary in many cases, the time which may elapse before applications are decided.

11. It should be made known to intending travellers that the Military Travel Authorization is merely an authorization to leave Italian territory and it does not authorize their entry to the country of destination, whose entry requirements must be complied with.

12. This instruction does not apply to Allied-organized parties of refugees, or repatriates, leaving Italy, Sicily and Sardinia. In the case of such refugees and repatriates a nominal roll with appropriate biographical data will be submitted by the Displaced Persons Sub-Commission ALOCM to G-2 (CI) AFHQ who will issue a block Military Travel Authorization if approved.

13. Military Travel Authorizations will be issued only to approved individuals proposing to travel for purposes which benefit the Allied War effort, and to:

a. Scholars, artists and members of the learned professions who are nationals of Italy or of one of the United Nations, if journey is approved for the purpose of free trade in knowledge and learning between the peoples of Italy and the United Nations. Ecclesiastics and journalists will not be considered in this category.

b. Officials serving at posts in the Vatican who are appointed to posts outside Italy involving permanent change of station.

c. Approved refugees and repatriates.

14. In cases where the appropriate Section of Allied Commission considers that the travel of an applicant is urgent, application may be made to G-2 (CI) AFHQ by telegram or telephone; and in the event of a favorable reply, the applicant may be authorized to proceed without being in possession of a Military Travel Authorization. G-2 (CI) AFHQ will in such cases warn the Security Control at the Italian port of exit. In such cases the application form will none-the-less be forwarded to G-2 (CI) AFHQ to complete their records.

The application forms for Military Travel Authorizations, and the Military Travel Authorizations in current use will continue to be used.

MILITARY TRAVEL AUTHORIZATIONS.

1. Every person desiring to leave Italy must before he can do so, unless he is an excepted person (see appendix A on back hereof), obtain a Military Travel Authorization (MTA).
2. No MTA shall be issued unless the journey to which it relates is of direct benefit to the Allied War effort.
3. MTAs will be completed and forwarded whenever there is a prima facie case even if it is considered probable that permission will not be granted.
4. MTAs, except in the cases of persons mentioned in para 7 below, will be completed in the presence of an officer and submitted in duplicate, they will be typewritten (but if a typewriter is not available, forms completed in block capitals will be accepted); two full cases and two profile photographs must be attached to the form in accordance with the directions therein.
5. The officer will satisfy himself that the form is correctly completed, that the applicant is in fact the person named, and that the alleged reason for the journey is true. He will enter in the remarks column any relevant information available locally, and for a journey to a country which requires a visa he will state whether or not the applicant has obtained a visa. He will add his own comments or recommendation as may be appropriate.
6. He will then obtain the endorsement of GEC/CTJ and on return of the form will countersign it, append his office stamp and transmit the form to HQ Alcon (for attention Public Safety Sub-Commission).
7. In the following cases the application forms will be prepared and forwarded as stated, instead of as above:
 - (a) Italian Diplomatic and Consular Officers and Italian members of special economic or Political Missions: by the Italian Foreign Office to PCI Sec.
 - (b) Members of the Italian Armed Forces: by the Ministry concerned to appropriate Independent Sub-Commission.
 - (c) In the case of Refugees and Veterans the form will be prepared and dealt with by the Displaced Persons and Repatriation Sub-Commission.

4. MIA's, except in the cases of persons mentioned in para 7 below, will be completed in the presence of an Officer and submitted in duplicate. They will be typewritten (but if a typewriter is not available, forms completed in block capitals will be accepted); two full face and two profile photographs must be attached to the form in accordance with the directions therein.

5. The Officer will satisfy himself that the form is correctly completed, that the applicant is in fact the person named, and that the alleged reason for the journey is true. He will enter in the remarks column any relevant information available locally, and for a journey to a country which requires a visa he will state whether or not the applicant has obtained a visa. He will add his own comments or recommendation as may be appropriate.

6. He will then obtain the endorsement of PPS/CIC and on return of the form will countersign it, append his office stamp and transmit the form to HQ Alcom (for attention Public Safety Sub-Commission).

7. In the following cases the application forms will be prepared and forwarded as stated, instead of as above

(a) Italian Diplomatic and Consular Officers and Italian members of special economic or political Missions; by the Italian Foreign Office to PCL Sec.

(b) Members of the Italian Armed Forces; by the Ministry concerned to MS/Int

1. The increase in travel of persons from Bulgaria and Roumania to Italy, makes it necessary to introduce a uniform procedure for requests to travel.
2. The travel concerned falls outside the problem of dealing with displaced persons, who may be moved in bodies under SHAEF and AFHQ arrangements.
3. In order that the movement of individual travellers may be accomplished in an orderly manner and without risk to the security of operations, the following procedure will be adopted in the future. It should be borne in mind that it is not the intention to encourage the travel of a large number of persons travelling individually and for personal reasons.
4. The entire responsibility for moving personnel by air in approved cases will be that of MAAF.
5. With the exceptions noted in paragraph 8 and Allied service personnel on duty, all persons entering Italy from Roumania and Bulgaria, must in future be in possession of an Allied Force permit (specimen attached at Appendix 'A') endorsed for entry into Italy.
6. Unless otherwise endorsed permits will be valid for a return journey.
7. Permits will be issued by the Allied Commission in the country concerned, which will be regarded as acting (for this purpose) as the agent of the Supreme Allied Commander, Mediterranean.
8. The following persons will not require Allied Force permits to enter Italy, but will be required to satisfy the Commission concerned that the proposed journey is on sufficiently urgent official business.
 - a. Diplomatic and Consular officials.
 - b. British and United States nationals employed and paid by the following governmental agencies:

- (1) UNRRA
- (2) Office of War Information.
- (3) Psychological Warfare Branch.
- (4) War Shipping Administration.
- (5) Ministry of War Transport.

- (6) Any of the Service Ministries in the United States or United Kingdom, providing they are in possession of Service identity cards, eg, technicians in possession of AGO cards, who are assigned to this theater.

c. British and United States War Correspondents accredited to this headquarters.

9. Applications for permits in the form attached at Appendix "B" will be made to the senior British or United States member of the Commission who will co-ordinate with the senior Soviet representative in appropriate cases. He will satisfy himself that:

- a. There is no local security objection to the applicant.
- b. There is no local objection from the political point of view.
- c. The proposed journey is necessary to the war effort.

10. All applications will be referred to the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, this headquarters, except in the categories where permits may be issued without reference, viz:

Officials in the employment of and paid by the Governments of the United States, Great Britain, the Soviet Union, France, Belgium, Holland, Norway, Poland and Czecho-slovakia, and China.

11. Duplicate copy of the application form will be forwarded to the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, this headquarters, in the case of:

- a. All applications referred.
- b. All permits granted without reference.

12. Where special information of security or political interest arises in the case of an application, such information should be forwarded with the application.

13. Cases of urgency may be dealt with by cable, but application forms should be forwarded in order to complete this headquarters records.

14. The above procedure will not apply to evacuations on a large scale, which may be arranged in agreement with this headquarters (G-5 & G-2 Sections).

15. Persons who are exempted under paragraph 8 from the requirement of a permit will be cleared with this headquarters by cable before dispatch.

16. On a permit or cable authority being granted, air priority will be recommended by Allied Commission concerned, and notification in the form of travel orders for the applicant will be sent to formations as MAAF may designate.

17. Air transportation will be arranged in accordance with paragraphs 4 and 16 above.

18. No part of this procedure absolves the applicant from the necessary passports, documents of identity, visas, exit permits or laissez-passers required by the regulations of the countries concerned.

19. Supplies of forms and permits will be sent under separate cover by G-2 Section to the appropriate authorities.
