

Question: Were you ever a member of the Dutch Nazi Party?

Answer: Yes. From 1933 till end of 1935.

Remarks: When after a long absence I came back in Holland in 1933 I found my country in a very desolate condition. As in many other countries of Europe at that moment, the parties of the extreme left were gaining ground and trying to take over into their own hands the power of the weakened government. In order to do something against these evils which were in my opinion a disgrace for my country I joined with some other friends a party which had as a device the following three points:
Absolute loyalty to the royal family; strong opposition against all left parties. Rising of the national feeling, strong army and Navy.

The actual commander of the fighting Dutch troops in western Europe, Lieutenant-Colonel de Ruyter van Steveninck was among those who were in the party with me.

When after two years I saw that the above mentioned service were merely a pretense to introduce Nazi-propaganda and place themselves into my country, I left this party at the end of 1935. Soon afterwards I went abroad to work and up to now never came back to Holland, except at my Father's death, for a couple of weeks (June '38). I am willing to swear that this statement is true. Question: Did you ever have a position in the Dutch regular Army?

Answer: No, neither in the regular army, nor in the reserves.

Details: In 1930 I joined a volunteer the motor-corps-section of the "Zaan - Wester" a semi official military institution.

Volunteers serving in this corps could obtain freedom-of-service

~~or~~ military training and some ranks as in the army, such as corporal, sergeant, etc. When called under the arm of the department, they were allowed to count their time in the same rank. As I served two years as a volunteer I relied on the basis of this voluntary service to get a catch-up commission. This was refused, but my government let me know, through our negotiation in Rome, that there was no objection for my taking a similar position.

Answer; I never got such an order.

When I entered the service of the Region IV on the 21st of June 1964, I was told to go in charge under the orders of Col. Domenico Pappalardo of the Università di Roma Brucoli in the Region. A contract for delivery was drafted and signed by Col. Pappalardo before my arrival in the A.C. My work consisted in supervising the private firms which had obtained a contract and to see that they carried out the obligation. Firms were paid of the amount of money they had to put as a guarantee in the bank as well as the statements of experts who had valued the work. 

He is said to have belonged before the war to the Dutch Nazi party (N.S.B.) and to have stolen the cash of his local party branch in Hilversum. He married Selma van Booven born in Hilversum (19 Dec. 1904). They have one ten year old child.

Subject left Holland before this war and travelled with his family and parents in law in Central and South Europe. In Austria he called himself Comte de Vries. At the outbreak of the war he got in financial difficulties and tried to get financial support from Nazi Germany by actions and connections

which was refused on above mentioned grounds. He turned up again in Flushing where he has been professionally employed in the Engineering and Transportation Department of the D.C.C. In order to carry on with his job he tried to get a commission in the Royal Netherlands Army, which request has been rejected.
