## MEMORANDUM

11/9/44

At 10 am 11th September 1944 a meeting was held between  
Lt Col Fothergill (Displaced Persons)  
Maj. Reakes (RC & MD)  
" Duncoll (Refugees)  
" Harvey Security Branch & Public Safety.

AFHQ

It was agreed that the memorandum (S) needed considerable classification. The object seemed to be to clear the North African camps of Italian civilians. It was agreed Maj. Reakes should write to AFHQ, asking for further information on:-

- a) Status of persons on arrival in Italy - either internees or freed persons; in the latter case they would be as refugees.
- b) Number of persons likely to be moved.
- c) Would it be possible to use 371 Camp as a temporary shelter pending some screening.
- d) Who does the screening in Italy. (Refugees Section)
- e) Will Italian Government see to distribution here.

It was realised this was probably the first step in a world wide repatriation scheme and considerable thought would be necessary before actual steps could be adopted to implement the general policy set out in the letter.

ii. refugees in provinces of MESSELIA, CAYALA, TURKEY,  
SYRIA north of west line through town ~~TOBAGUS~~  
other west of line inclusive TURKEY to inclusive SCIACCA,  
provinces without restrictions: ASPIRANT, (less SCIACCA),  
PACCA, CALABRIA, TURKEY, SICILY, SYRACUSE

SUBJECT : Quota for dispatch to Region 1, 2 and 3.  
Period March - April.

TO : O.C. Italian Refugee Branch, Region 3. A.C.C.

1. The numbers to be sent to Reg. 2. subsequent to 11th March, are to be limited to 12500.

2. If possible, only half of this number is to be from this side, leaving the other half for refugees from 8 Army. This can be done by holding the maximum numbers in camps here pending commencement of evacuation to Region 3. The latter will receive:



3. Region 1. should also be ready to take:

4. Should the numbers from 8 Army Area, mentioned in para. 2 be smaller than expected, the total (up to 12500) will be sent to Region 2 as arranged, although their movement may continue after the end of March.
