SUBJECT : Internment of Civilian in N. Italy

TO : V.P. Civil Affairs Section

1. There is no objection to the course proposed by I (b) so far as Public Safety Sub Commission is concerned.

2. The question of internment of GCRK has already been taken up with AFHQ and the present method of dealing with them by means of their own screening centres, which will be established in all Legion Hq. in the North, is considered adequate.

3. The same applied to GdFF, whose epuration proceedings have eliminated those who are undesirable, but as a general rule, GdFF have kept apart from politics, and need not be considered sufficiently dangerous to warrant special treatment.

4. The Agenti di Pubblica Sicurezza have given no trouble in the South, generally speaking, but on the other hand have been extremely helpful as a law enforcing body. I think they can be dealt with on the same lines as private individuals, and interned if the circumstances warrant it.

5. As regards OVRA agents, I feel that they could be included in Class "C" as probably internable, but subject to local investigation. This would no doubt be done in any case, but it might be advisable to include them in "C" ~~in case~~ to ensure that their existence is not overlooked.

3. The same applied to GOLF, whose operation proceedings have eliminated those who are undesirable, but as a general rule, GOLF have kept apart from politics, and need not be considered sufficiently dangerous to warrant special treatment.
4. The Agenti di Pubblica Sicurezza have given no trouble in the South, generally speaking, but on the other hand have been extremely helpful as a law enforcing body. I think they can be dealt with on the same lines as private individuals, and interned if the circumstances warrant it.
5. As regards OVRA agents, I feel that they could be included in Class "C" as probably internable, but subject to local investigation. This would no doubt be done in any case, but it might be advisable to include them in "C" ~~in case~~ to ensure that their existence is not overlooked.
6. as the Security Division of the Hq. will probably continue its function of assisting in the reviews of internees, it is strongly urged that the arrest reports which accompany the internees contain sufficient detail to be of use in the reviewing. What are considered adequate grounds during the advance of an army may not be sufficient at a later date when things have changed, and it has been found very difficult owing to movement of intelligence agencies to obtain information subsequently.

EXECUTIVE MEMORANDUM)

NUMBER 67 (REVISED))

POLICY -

TREATMENT OF ITALIAN OFFICIALS ENCOUNTERED IN ADVANCE NORTHWARDS.

See #34- Memo File

- 1 This revised Executive Memorandum No 67 is issued in the light of experience gained in the working of the original Memorandum No 67 of 5 July 1944, which is hereby cancelled. The policy and the principle of operation remain the same.
- 2 Our object is to remove from territory, immediately on liberation, all leading fascists from important posts, especially those collaborationists put in office by the Republican Fascist Government. This Memorandum is intended as a guide for such an initial purge.
It will be followed by a more detailed purge under CG 35 and ultimately by the procedure under DM 159 and ascending decrees and therefore this Directive is not concerned with minor posts or minor fascist officials; they can be dealt with later. The Allies must create a sound impression by quickly removing the leading fascists from the important posts.
- 3 Many officials will have been placed in office by the Republican Fascist Government; others will have taken the oath of allegiance to the Fascist Government; on the other hand, others will be career officials who have considered it their duty to stick to their posts in the interests of the civil administration; others, again, (it is understood from reliable reports) have remained at their posts at great peril and have refused to take the oath of allegiance. Wholesale dismissals are, therefore, to be avoided as much injustice may be done quite apart from rendering it difficult to carry on the administration.
It is safe to assume that the worst fascists will be removed by GIs before arrival of the Allies; the remainder of those in office will be dealt with in accordance with this directive.
- 4 Two lists attached to the original memorandum have been brought up-to-date and set out in a more convenient form.
Appendix 'A' to this Memorandum contains a list of important Italian governmental and ministerial offices which should be cleaned of fascist personnel as quickly as possible. Other officials of lower rank who are unimportant and too numerous to be dealt with at this stage should not be considered.
Appendix 'B' contains a list of newly fascist offices and serves as a guide to the type of fascist party members who are particularly obnoxious.
- 5 These two lists will normally be used together. Thus if it is found that a person who occupied one of the offices in Appendix 'A' and also has had one of the party affiliations contained in Appendix 'B' he should be removed at once.
- 6 If there is any doubt as to the fascist background of any person holding an office included in Appendix 'A' he may be required to complete a Scheda Personale. The Provincial Commissioner may, if he considers it desirable, consult the Prefect or GIM on any particular case. No attention will be paid to anonymous denunciations.
- 7 Persons suspended under this Memorandum, except those mentioned in paragraphs 8 and 9, will be paid on the same basis as persons suspended under DL 159. Temporary

employees, whether employed on a day-to-day basis or on a fixed term basis, e.g. 6 months, will, however, be dismissed.

- 8 Lists of persons suspended under this Memorandum, specifying the offices from which they have been removed, will be submitted to HQ AG for attention of the appropriate Sub-Commission or where this is appropriate to the Civil Affairs Section.

- 9 In addition to the foregoing, all Italian administrative organizations whose continued existence is inconsistent with the sovereign rights of the Italian National Government, or which have been abolished by decrees thereof, are deemed no longer to exist: the holders of offices in such organizations will probably have fled, but if any such are found purporting to hold any office or to exercise any executive functions in connection therewith they will be removed from office.

Such bodies include:

- a) All Ministries and Departments of the Republican Fascist Government;
 - b) National, Federal, Provincial and Communal organizations of the fascist party; of the Chamber of Fasci and of Corporations; of Fascist Syndicates and Federations;
 - c) The Fascist Militia, the National Republican Guard and OVRA;
 - d) Presidi, Vice Presidi and Rettorati of Provinces; Consulta of Communes;
 - e) the Tribunali Speciali, the Tribunali Straordinari Provinciali and the "Presele" Court of Cassation.
- 10 Officials (as well as any other persons) regarded as potentially dangerous will in addition to suspension be taken into custody immediately. They may be interned or on the request of the Italian Govt to AG be handed over to the custody of that Government. Whenever a person is interned a report will forthwith be made to HQ AG.
- 11 It is emphasized that in carrying out the important duty of guiding the country of fascists nothing herein is intended to prejudice the right of SCAGs and PCs to dismiss and/or intern individuals at their discretion without reference to their present official position or past fascist office.
- 12 SCAGs and PCs have discretion in most exceptional cases to retain as a purely temporary expedient a fascist in office where the immediate administration of any locality renders this essential and no local replacement can be found. In all such cases the work of the individual should be closely supervised and a decision should be made at once for a replacement to the appropriate Sub-Commission. In the North, however, it should seldom, if ever, be necessary to exercise this discretion.

On Nov. 1st 1943 the chief of the movement section of Sapri, where I was sent on service by order of the Head of the Delegation of Cosenza, invited me to re-enter Reggio Cal. because in those days all offices were transferred from Tropea to Reggio Cal. On Nov. 5th 1943 I presented myself to the Movement Section giving particulars and documents referring to my administrative position for regulations. In such occasion I also gave in my removal forms with receipts asking for the relative re-imbursement. This routine handed personally to the Chief of this Office, Dott. Massa, was sent on to the Superior Office with a regular questionnaire. Personally I could not follow the definition of the question, but later, through the Military Command of this camp I persisted in the claim of same for being due to me before the date in which I was removed from the Administration exclusively for being a "Squadrista". My wife is still awaiting the wages & indemnities which all my colleagues have already received & therefore I ask for such payments because my family is in need and could not await for my liberation for the definition of the wage question which is otherwise clear through documentations. Besides the indemnities already mentioned I had also asked for a reward of nativity due for the birth of my daughter Concetta Rita on Jan. 15th 1944, at which date, the old disposition was still in force with the result that up to the month of March, such rewards were still paid. The documents, to obtain the reward mentioned above, were forwarded to above Compartimental Office Reggio Cal. which Office in turn sent same to Salerno where in those days was stationed the General Direction. Up to this day my wife is still awaiting for the relative money order alongside with other payments. From this Camp I have already sent, with permission of the Command, two requests for my wife to collect the wages from May 1st 1944 onwards just as other inmates are receiving. Of these there are employees of the same Railway Administration and others belonging to different Administrations all more or less in the same condition as myself. Why should there be two weights and two measures as in my case, after serving in the Administration for 28 years with honour? Meantime I justly express the wish that my practice in pendency should be settled, thus giving my wife the opportunity to collect in my name. With thanks - Your truly.

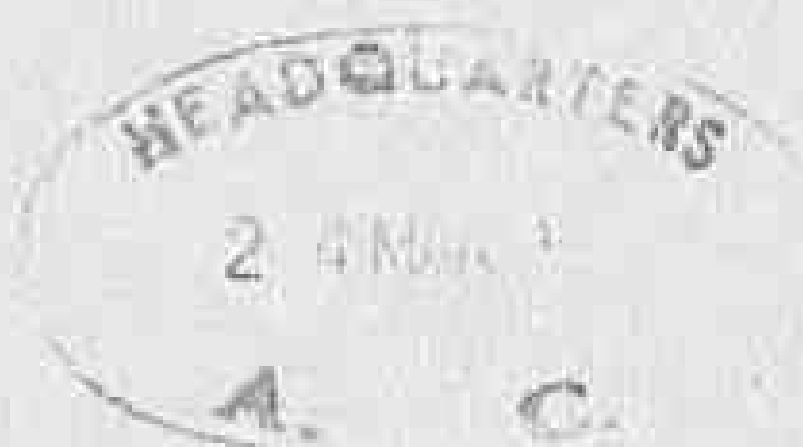

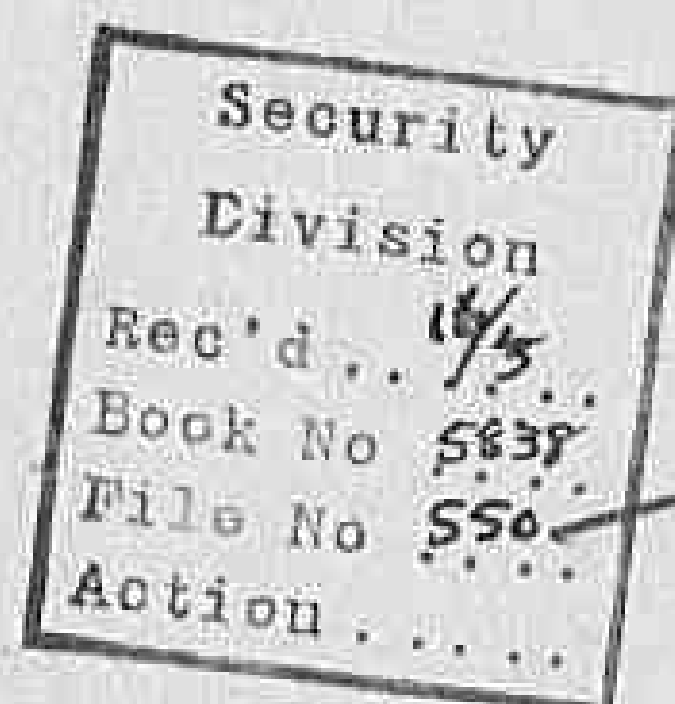

TRANSLATION

TO THE ALLIED CONTROL COMMISSION FOR THE CAMPANIA

N A P L E S

The undersigned GIOVAGNOLI Dino of the late Antonio of Riccione (Forlì) aged 43, in confinement at Morra de Sanctis, prov. of Avellino since 25 October 1944 after first having been imprisoned for 15 days in the jail of Avellino and for the same amount of days at Poggioreale (Naples), begs to implore the Allied Control Commission to allow him to return to his birth-place and to his family which is composed of 4 women who are in Riccione, via Adriatica 59. He hopes that you will listen to his desperate cry because he is innocent of the accusation made against him. He does not know for what reason he has been punished as he has never dealt in politics, but has always worked honestly and with seriousness. Perhaps there is a reason, and that is the malicious tongues of a few persons who envied my work and my happy family life, and playing on the identity of two names - Toti and Tot - have convinced the Allied Authority of something that is not true, in order to ruin me. Please judge for yourself, in basis of the witnesses which can be interrogated, and when you see that what I have stated is true, have the generosity and the goodness to render me justice, and punish the persons who really deserve to be punished.

Please listen: In the month of April 1944, the administration of the G.I.L. of Milano charged the Geometer TAUSANI of Pesaro to demolish the asylum "Enrico Toti" of Riccione. The mentioned Geometer accepted the charge and came to me asking me to help him as assistant, as well as giving me the charge for the recovery of the materials which could still be used. The enthusiasm I put in the charge given me was badly seen by the labourers who wanted to take the material away for themselves so that they could sell same, they therefore tormented me and denounced me to the Allied troops under the accusation of having given my services to the organisation "Tot" which was German, and which was accomplishing works on the fortification of that same zone in the same period. I was therefore sent to the concentration camp of Tosi (Ancona) the 13 September 1944. At first I could not justify myself but when I managed to do so, I was believed and let free from the camp and was given over to the Italian military authorities who instead of sending me home or keep me near my home sent me instead to concentration camp of Afragola (Naples) on the 16 October 1944, rendering it impossible for me to show further my innocence. As I have already stated before, that is about my being sent to

jail and then confined to Morra de Santis, there is no need to repeat.

I therefore place all my belief that you will try to render me justice and allow me to return to my work and my family. I have faith only in you, because you protect the honest persons.

1. RESCISSION. Letter this headquarters, file AG 383.7/057 GEC-O, dated 1 December 1944, subject as above, is rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

2. STATUS AND TREATMENT.

a. It has been agreed by the Governments of the United States and Great Britain with the German and former Italian Governments that the International Prisoner of War Convention signed at Geneva on 27 July 1929 shall be considered as applicable to civilian internees insofar as its provisions can be applied to civilians.

b. The custody of civilians arrested by the British or United States authorities, or accepted by them for internment, will be a military responsibility.

3. INTERMENT.

"3 a. All internees arrested in Italy will normally be evacuated to "B" Civilian Internee Camp, Terni, (8739) for internment save that italians arrested in No. 3 District or Southern District Peninsular Base Section, may be evacuated to "A" Internee Camp, Padula, near "Sala Consilina (T 4295) in cases where it would be impracticable for administrative reasons to evacuate them to Terni".

b. The escort delivering internees to an Internee Camp will carry an "arrest slip" for each internee. The "arrest slip" will be signed by the officer in charge of the FS Section or CIC Detachment making the arrest and will show when, where, why and by whom the internee was taken into custody and will indicate how he should be disposed of.

4. COMMAND.

a. Internee Camps will be under the direct command of 1854 headquarters for general administration and of the headquarters of the district in which situated for local administration.

b. Direct communication between Commandant, Internee Camp and this headquarters is authorized on the following matters of general administration in addition to the matters specifically referred to in succeeding paragraphs of this instruction:

- (1) Welfare - assistance to internees from philanthropic organizations (including wireless, libraries and educational facilities) - (G-1(B)).
- (2) Staff - Selection and posting of British Officers and Serjeant Interpreters - (G-1(B)).
- (3) Mail and Censorship - Letters to Protecting Power or IRCC or communications with Censor Control Officers - (G-1(B)).

5. DOCUMENTATION.

a. All internees will be regarded as "temporarily detained" until the expiration of three weeks from the date of delivery to an Internee Camp, after which period an internee will only continue to be so regarded, if his release is known to be probable in the near future or if instructions to

"Documentation will be carried out on AF W 3000 immediately upon delivery of an internee to an internee Camp".

~~internee ceases to be temporarily detained.~~ Each AFW 3000 will be endorsed "CIVILIAN INTERNEE" in red ink. AFW 3000 consists of three (3) parts, each bearing a serial number and giving detailed information of prisoners of war. This form will be adapted to meet the different information required concerning an internee.

b. Part III will be completed by the internee or at his or her dictation and Parts I and II by Commandant, Internee Camp. Parts II and III will then be forwarded to GHQ, 2d Echelon (EFW Section) and Part I retained by the Camp. Should an internee be transferred to another holding Camp, Part I will be handed to the escort for delivery to the new place of internment and the date of receipt of the internee will be stamped on the reverse of the form by the receiving unit. The counterfoils in AFW 3000 books will be completed by Commandant, Internee Camp and retained by him.

c. Notification of internment to the Protecting Power will be made by FWIB, LONDON, in the same manner as for prisoners of war.

d. Casualties in respect of internees other than those temporarily detained will be reported to GHQ, 2d Echelon on AFW 3002. Internees admitted to a civilian hospital will be regarded as remaining on the strength of the Internee Camp.

e. The death of an internee will be reported by signal to AFHQ (G-2(CI)) in addition to being reported to GHQ, 2d Echelon under the provisions of sub-paragraph c above. AFW 3314 in duplicate will be rendered to GHQ, 2d Echelon as soon as possible after burial.

6. RETURNS. Commandants of Internee Camps will render the following returns:

a. A daily return on AFW 3487 to GHQ, 2d Echelon giving the strength by nationalities at 1200 hrs each day of all internees in respect of whom documentation of AFW 3000 has been carried out.

b. A weekly return by signal to AFHQ (G-1(Br)) and to district and area of sub-area headquarters of the number of internees of each sex by nationalities held at 0700 hrs on Monday of each week.

c. A monthly return to AFHQ (G-2(CI)):

(1) Of the results of all reviews and

(2) Of all releases.

d. A monthly return to AFHQ (G-1(B)) of officers on the strength of the Camp Administrative Staff, showing personal number, rank, name, regiment and appointment held.

7. PERSONAL EFFECTS AND IMPOUNDED CURRENCY.

a. Internees, on arrest, will be permitted to pack and take with them a bag or suitcase of personal effects, spare clothing etc., which they may require during their period of internment.

b. Contents of the bag will be checked before departure to ensure that there are not included any arms, files or such articles (except money) as could be of assistance to the internee in escaping or could be used as weapons.

c. The bag and contents (other than money) will remain in possession of the internee while in Camp. All money will be impounded on delivery of the internee to the Camp, a receipt being issued to the internee, a duplicate of which will be deposited with the impounded money.

d. In the event of the death of an internee, his or her personal effects will be disposed of in one of the following manners:

(1) If the deceased was of Italian nationality and the next of kin is resident in Allied Occupied ITALY, personal effects and any impounded currency held on his or her account will be forwarded to Headquarters, Allied Commission for onward transmission to the appropriate Italian authorities.

(2) In all other cases, personal effects and impounded currency will be forwarded to GHQ, 2d Echelon with two copies of AFW 3190 and, in the case of an internee temporarily detained, particulars of nationality and of the name and address of his or her next of kin.

8. DISCIPLINE. "Regulations for the Maintenance of Discipline among Prisoners of War 1939" will apply to internees.

9. RELEASE.

a. Civilians are only interned in cases where it is considered that they would present a security threat to the Allied cause if they remain at large. Therefore, whether the interning authority recommends internment for the duration or not, their release will be authorized where the security threat no longer exists.

b. Under no circumstances will internment be regarded as a punishment and no release will be recommended or granted merely on the ground that the internee has been confined for a long time.

c. Instructions will from time to time be issued by AFHQ (G-2(CI)) as to the constitution of the reviewing authorities at Internment Camps and as to the principles by which those authorities should be guided in considering the cases of the internees.

d. The following procedure will be adopted for releases:

(1) Where the interning authority has expressly stated that the case of the internee will be reviewed after a specific period, the reviewing officers at the Camp will consider the case. If release is recommended as a result of the review, the Commandant will forward to G-2 ROME AREA, G-2 Peninsular Base Section, GSI Number 1 District, GSI Number 2 District and GSI Number 3 District of their information a list containing the names of any internees whom it is intended to release to their territory during the following week and also the address to which it is intended they should return. If the district or base section concerned has recently received information indicating that the internee would constitute a positive threat to Allied security if released, the Commandant should be informed forthwith (and a copy sent to AFHQ (G-2(CI))). In the absence of such indication being received within eight days of the despatch of the above mentioned list of names, the Commandant may authorize release. Persons whose homes lie to the north of the Rear Army Security Control Line at the date of the review, will, in the absence of specific authority, only be released if they undertake to reside at a named address to the south of the line.

(2) Where a person has been interned for the "duration of the war" or where the period specified by the interning authority has not expired, the case may be reviewed either at the discretion of the reviewing officer or on the instructions of either the interning authority or AFHQ (G-2(CI)).

The recommendations of the Commandant will be submitted to AFHQ (G-2(CI)) and will include statements from the reviewing officer and, where relevant, from the medical officer. Copies of the recommendation will be sent either to G-2 ROME AREA, G-2 Peninsular Base Section, GSI Number 1 District, GSI Number 2 District or GSI Number 3 District according to the place of residence to which the internee would go if released. Authority for the release of persons in these categories may only be given by AFHQ (G-2(CI)).

- (3) All releases of internees other than those temporarily detained will be reported to GHQ 2d Echelon or AF W3CC2.

10. HANDING OVER OF INTERNEES TO ITALIAN AUTHORITIES. Internees may in certain circumstances be handed over on the authority of AFHQ (G-2(CI)) to the Italian authorities for trial or for the purpose of giving evidence. In any such case a receipt will be obtained in the form shown at Appendix "A" and retained by the Commandant of the camp.

11. ESCAPES.

a. The escape of an internee will be reported immediately by the quickest available means (e.g. by telephone) to AFM or DAPM of area or sub-area headquarters, confirmed by signal, and will be reported by signal to AFHQ G-1 (Br) and district headquarters.

b. Reports will include name, number, description and home address of the escaped internee and address of his or her next of kin or any other address for which it is believed the escapee may be making.

c. Escapes of internees other than those temporarily detained will also be reported to GHQ 2d Echelon or AF W3CC2.

12. COURTS OF INQUIRY.

a. A Court of Inquiry will invariably be convened in any of the following cases:

- (1) Escape of an internee.
- (2) Serious injury to an internee.
- (3) Violent death of an internee.
- (4) Such other cases as may be considered by district commanders to be necessary.

b. A Copy of Proceedings of any Court of Inquiry convened under this instruction together with the opinions of the convening officer and higher authorities will be forwarded through the usual channels to AFHQ (G-1(Br)).

13. VISITS.

a. Internees other than those specified in sub-paragraph b below will be permitted to receive one visit per ~~week~~^{month} from their relatives. Each visit will be limited to two persons to each internee.

b. Internees ~~in respect of whom specific instructions are issued by higher authority~~ in respect of whom specific instructions are issued by higher authority will not be permitted to receive visitors and on visiting days will be confined to their quarters.

c. Subject to the provisions of sub-paragraph b above, internees will be permitted to receive visits from their legal advisors by appointment and with the approval of the Commandant of the Camp.

d. Authority may in certain cases be given by AFHQ (G-2(CI)) for accredited representatives of the Italian government to visit a camp for the purpose of interrogating internees.

e. All visitors of the types mentioned above will be given a warning to read, written in the appropriate language, as to the censorship regulations in force before they are conducted into the camp.

f. Except where necessary in cases falling within sub-paragraph d above, internees will not be permitted to remain for more than half an hour with their visitors, who from the time of their entry into the camp until their departure will be kept under the strictest supervision possible, in order to prevent any evasion of censorship regulations.

g. Visits for the purpose of making an inspection or of making provision for the welfare of the internees as a whole may be paid to Internee Camps by those persons (including representatives of the Protecting Power or of the International or Italian Red Cross or Clergy) to whom passes may from time to time be issued by AFHQ (G-1(Br)). Such visitors will visit camps only by appointment and will not be affected by the provisions of sub-paragraphs e and f above.

h. The full name, address and identity card number of every visitor to a camp irrespective of the purpose of his or her visit and (where applicable) the relationship of the visitor to the internee visited will be entered in a "visitors book".

14. MARRIAGES.

a. The Allied Military Authorities have no objections to marriages taking place between internees held in British Internment Camps provided that such marriages are in all respects legal and valid.

b. The absence of any objection by the Allied Authorities to such marriages is not to be construed as in any way purporting to validate a marriage otherwise illegal or invalid.

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19 February 1945

c. Such marriages do not necessarily confer any additional privileges on the parties concerned. For example, they will only be permitted to occupy married quarters in a camp subject to such quarters being available and then at the discretion of the Camp Commandant.

d. Notification of marriages will be made to the following authorities in order that the name of the woman concerned may be altered in their records:

- (1) Headquarters which authorized internment.
- (2) AFHQ (G-2(CI)).
- (3) GHQ, 2d Echelon. (only if documentation on AFHQ 3000 has previously been carried out).

15. EMPLOYMENT. No internee will be employed, except on work connected with the administration, internal arrangements and maintenance of camps, unless employment is requested by him or her in writing.

16. PAY. Internees are not entitled to pay.

17. RATIONS. Prisoner of War scale of rations (scale 30 AFHQ Ration and Fuel Scales) will be issued.

18. CLOTHING.

a. The provision of clothing and necessities is the responsibility of the internees themselves. Internees who are in need and are unable to provide their requirements from their own resources may, however, be supplied free from British stocks with such essential articles as may be required from time to time, but not in excess of the scale detailed in Table "D", Appendix VI, War Clothing Regulations, 1943. Grade three clothing will be issued.

b. Demands for clothing will be made through normal Ordnance channels.

c. All articles of clothing will be entered in an account kept by the Commandant, Internee Camp, and issues will be supported by a receipt signed by the internee.

d. (1) The Commandant of a Camp may on application issue to internees permit forms for transmission to relatives or friends, on presentation of which the Italian civil postal authorities will accept parcels of clothing and personal effects, not exceeding 5 Kg in weight, addressed to internee camps. 1851

(2) These permit forms will only be issued in cases where the clothing or effects required are considered necessary for the comfort of the applicant and where their receipt will release War Department clothing or necessities.

(3) Supplies of permit forms may be obtained from Headquarters, Allied Commission (Communications Sub-Commission).

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19 February 1945 (cont'd)

19. MEDICAL.

a. Subject to the provisions of sub-paragraph b below, the authority of AFHQ (G-2(CI)) will be obtained before transfer of an internee to a civil hospital for treatment which cannot be provided in the Camp Hospital. Applications for such authority will state the name of the internee and of the hospital to which his or her transfer is applied for and will be supported by a report by the Camp Medical Officer and recommendation of ADMS.

b. Where the Commandant is advised by the Camp Medical Officer that such transfer is immediately necessary in the interests of the internee's health, he may give authority for it, but in any such case will at once inform AFHQ (G-2(CI)) stating the name of the internee and of the hospital to which he or she has been transferred and the nature of his or her complaint.

20. MAIL AND CENSORSHIP.

~~a. Internee camp will be maintained (paragraph 5) and will not be permitted to dispatch or receive any correspondence.~~

b. Regulations governing the correspondence of ~~other~~ internees are as follows:

(1) Incoming correspondence. Correspondence addressed to internees will be passed to the Prisoner of War Censorship Detachment, APO 512, US Army, who will forward it, after examination, to the Internee Camp concerned.

(2) Outgoing correspondence.

(a) Return Address. An internee will write on the back of the envelope his number, name and description together with the following return address:

"A" Civilian Internee Camp, Padula, Italy" or
"R" Civilian Internee Camp, Terni, Italy".

(b) Collection. Internees mail will be dispatched daily to the Prisoner of War Censorship Detachment.

(c) Restrictions. Correspondence of internees will be limited to two (2) letters, or one (1) letter and one (1) postcard, or two (2) postcards per week. The subject matter of letter will be limited to twenty-four (24) lines and of postcards to seven (7) lines. Prisoner of War Stationery will be used, viz., AFW 3058 - Letter Card, AFW 3494 - Post Card.

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19 February 1945 (cont'd)

- (3) Incoming Parcels. The responsibility of examining parcels addressed to internees rests with the Commandant of the Internee Camp. Parcels will be opened in the presence of the addressee. Any letters found enclosed will be forwarded to the Prisoner of War Censorship Detachment. Articles within the terms of paragraph 7 b above will be impounded and descriptions forwarded to AFHQ (G-1(Br)) who will issue instructions for disposal.

- (4) Outgoing parcels. Parcels may not be sent by internees.

21. CANTEEN SUPPLIES.

a. Internees are entitled to canteen supplies purchased through EFI on the following scale, subject to availability:

b. Supplies may be demanded under the same current conditions as for prisoners of war. When preparing strength statements care should be taken to distinguish between male and female internees.

c. Subject to the provisions of paragraph 22 below, sums accruing from NAAFI discounts will be paid into Internee Camp Welfare Funds.

d. Canteen supplies essential for personal cleanliness may be issued free to internees who are without private resources. Such items will be purchased by Camp Commandant out of Imprest Account and the receipted bills used as supporting vouchers thereto.

22. BARRACK DAMAGES.

1850

a. A proportion of sums accruing from NAAFI discounts to be fixed at the discretion of the Commandant will be retained by him to cover barrack damages which cannot be recovered from individuals or groups of individuals.

Subject : Status of Internees at "A" and "R" Camps

To : Public Safety S.C.

1. Letter 130 A of G-5 AFHQ seems to indicate some confusion on the part of the writer.

2. Persons interned at "A" Internee Camp Padula are not PWs. If on review they are found to have PW status they are transferred to a PW Camp, usually No. 209.

3. Internees at "A" and "R" Internee Camps, at the request of the Italian Authorities through AG may be:

- (a) Handed over for trial (both for penal code and "Sanctions against Fascism" offences).
- (b) Handed over to give evidence.
- (c) Interrogated at the Camp by an accredited Italian Government representative. Unless the CC.RR. officers have been granted PW status, application may be made for them to be dealt with under one of the three headings referred to.

4. It is unlikely that AFHQ will grant permission for CC.RR. officers to be placed "at the disposition" of any authority unless this means "handing over for trial or to give evidence".
