With an expression of thankfulness for the attention you may deem to give this request, I am

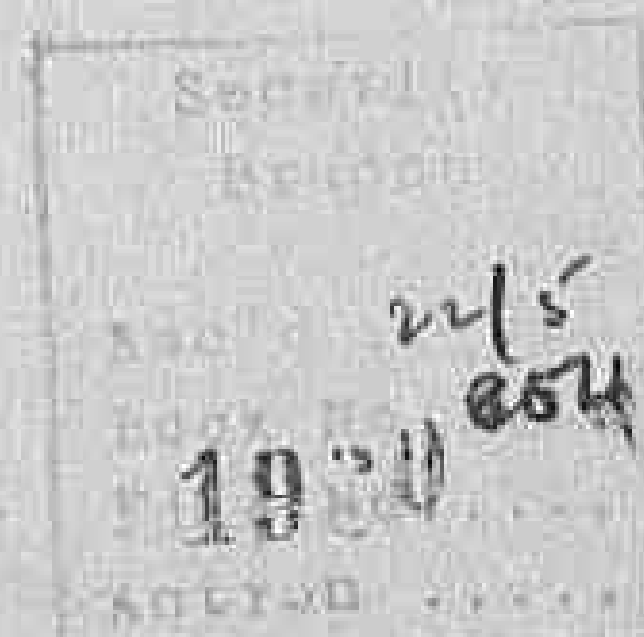

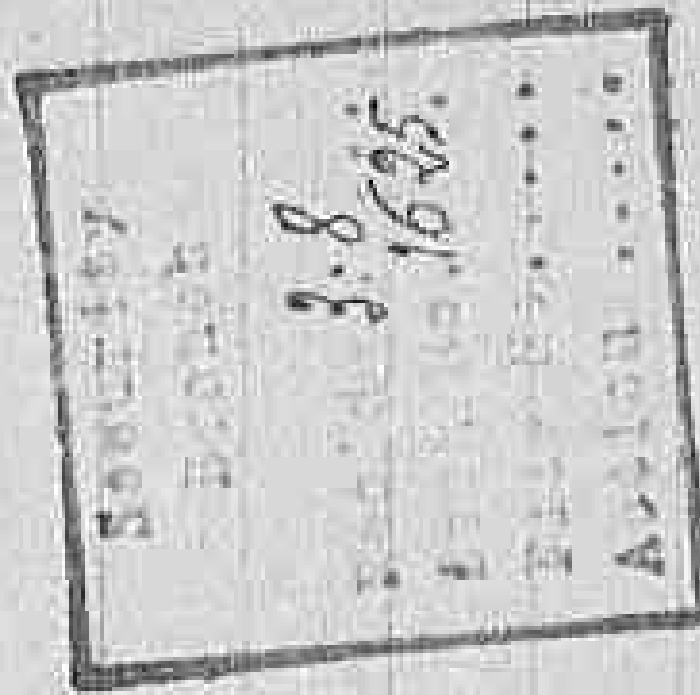

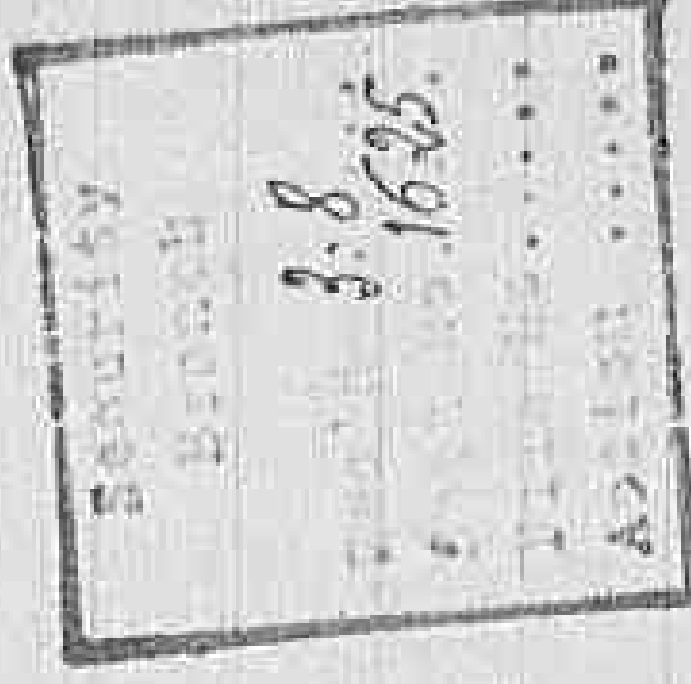

Dichiarazione

Dichiero essere a mia conoscenza che il dott. Ferdinand Siebert, già lettore di lingua tedesca presso la nostra Università negli anni 1929-1943, dopo aver terminata la sua "Habilitationsschrift" - domandò nel 1936 di essere ammesso all'esame di libera docenza in Storia Moderna presso l'Università di Freiburg i.Br.: malgrado il giudizio favorevole del prof. Gerhard Ritter, ordinario della materia, e malgrado il parere favorevole della Facoltà, la domanda non poté essere aver corso per l'opposizione della Direzione del Partito Nazionalsocialista, la quale negò il "nulla osta" con la motivazione che il dr. Siebert era notoriamente cattolico.

Analogo esito negativo ebbe anche un ulteriore tentativo di ottenere la libera docenza presso l'Università di Monaco: il "nulla osta" venne nuovamente negato.

Ich bestätige auf Wunsch, dass Herr Dr. Ferdinand Siebert aus Rom hier in Freiburg vergeblich versucht hat, sich 1942 bei unserer Fakultät als Dozent zu habilitieren. Die vorgelegte wissenschaftliche Arbeit wurde von der Fakultät als wissenschaftlich wohlgeeignet betrachtet, die Habilitation aber deshalb abgelehnt, weil seine politische Haltung den damaligen Machthabern der nationalsozialistischen Partei als unzuverlässig erschien und seine katholische Konfessionszugehörigkeit als politische Belastung für eine Habilitation in Freiburg betrachtet wurde. Ich musste ihn daher abweisen. Über seine spätere politische Entwicklung ist mir nichts bekannt, meine persönlichen Aussprachen mit ihm betrafen nur wissenschaftliche Fragen.

Traduzione:

Io dichiaro a richiesta che il Sig. Dr. Ferdinand Siebert di Roma ha cercato invano nel 1942 di abilitarsi come docente presso la nostra Facoltà. Questo Comitato non ha elemento per stabilire che il dott. Ferdinand Siebert, qui residente, abbia mai ricoperto cariche nel NSDAP, né abbia mai fatto propaganda nazista in questa valle o altrove.

Personalmente poi lo sorvente ripete quanto già in precedenza ebbe a dichiarare, che cioè, quando nel marzo del 1944 le autorità naziste di questo paese - dove egli esercitava la professione di medico - fecero di tutto per espellerlo dalla Provincia di Bolzano, il Dr. Siebert insistette moltissimo perché ciò non avvenisse, pur non essendo legato al sottoscritto da alcuna relazione di amicizia. The undersigned Monsignor John Kyne, Vice Rector of the Irish College, Rome, hereby testifies that he knew Dr. Ferdinand Siebert in Rome where he was Professor of German Language and Literature in the University of Rome. He can state that politics were never introduced by Dr. Siebert in his lectures, in fact on more than one occasion, he heard Dr. Siebert say when asked some political question, that his job was to teach German not politics. There was never any indication that Dr. Siebert had anything to do with the SS, though of course, like all Germans with jobs at the time, he was a member of the Nazi organization; though from certain indications, the undersigned would be inclined to think he was never too fervent in the adhesion. Some confusion may have arisen between Dr. Siebert and a certain Scheibert, who arrived in Rome after Dr. Siebert had left. Schiebert was an admitted member of the SS. His job however, was to go around the ruined and abandoned churches of South Italy and with Dr. Batelli of the Vatican Archives, collect and transport to the Vatican all such objects.

Finally, from my knowledge of Dr. Siebert's character, I should be more than surprised to learn that he had the remotest connection with the less desirable activities of the SS. or any such body.
