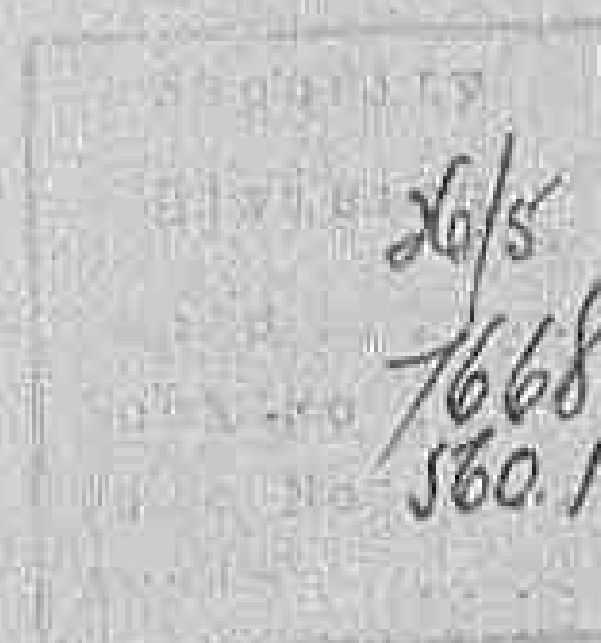

Questo fu sempre lo scopo prefissosi da mio figlio durante il tempo in cui fu in contatto per ordine ricevuto e per dovere di ufficio con i tedeschi. Infatti egli, a seguito di denunce, di requisizioni, di furti, e di grassazioni da parte degli invasori, per la sua opera persuasiva ed energica, poté ottenere ordine di rilascio e di derequisizione ovvero di indennizzo.

Infine con opportuni e tempestivi avvisi e consigli mise vari possessori di autoveicoli in condizioni di occultare le macchine per salvare dalle requisizioni e per non consegnarle ai tedeschi.

Il Capo della Provincia Clonini Visenti prima di partire per l'Italia invitò mio figlio a seguirlo, ma egli declinò l'invito adducendo che aveva la coscienza tranquilla e che non avendo a rimproverare nulla avrebbe continuato il proprio lavoro e contatto con il governo alleato per il bene della Patria.

Per quello che ho avuto l'onore di esporre e che resta ampiamente

It is a father who is talking to you, it is a son of Cassino, symbol of the tragedy of Italy, who comes to plead for a just cause. He has just lost through the brutality of the Germans his dear wife. And his son who was an officer of the 1924 class, who lived with him in hiding till the liberators arrived he has had to see taken away from him and placed in a concentration camp. His son was captured by the Germans near Cassino on the 9 April 1944 and manaced to being shot for being a deserter. He was brought to the North of Italy, where at the process he showed that he was not aware of the new dispositions, he was therefore freed but was compelled to enter the republican army, after a few months he managed to escape but in crossing the lines he was taken by the American troops. His address at the concentration camp is: "Sergente Asp. Line MARSIGLIA - Matricola (I.C.46)028 H. U.S. P.W.E. 326-Naples". My son is waiting to be released so that he can fight and vindicate the death of his beloved mother. The father begs Your Highness to please intervene for him.

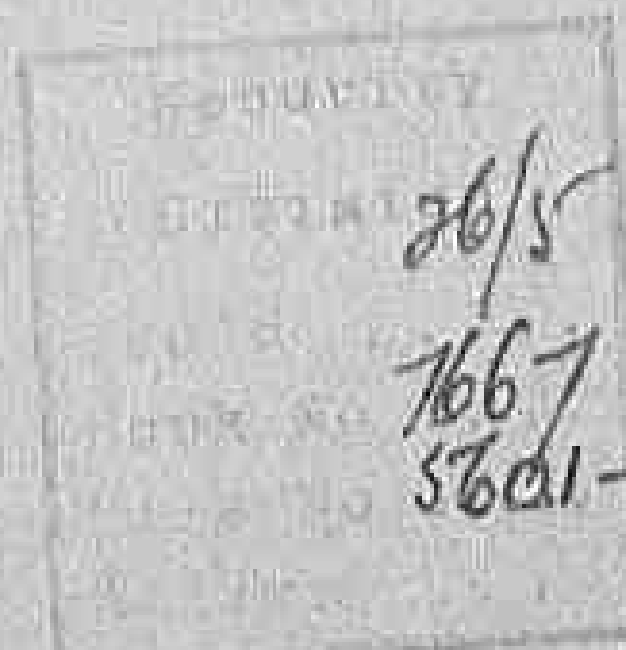

DECLARATION OF CARLO UMBERTO CECCHI

I hereby declare that on 14 September 1943, whilst in Macerata, I presented myself to Col. Filippo Spaccamela commander of the garrison with the intention of obtaining his help on behalf of Allied Prisoners held at the Camp of Sforzacosta.

Col. Spaccamela, with great spirit of patriotism, did everything in his power to help the escape of the prisoners, amongst them American pilots, even going so far as to assume all responsibility towards the Commander of the Camp himself.

The plan was to take hold of an Italian aeroplane which had been forced to land on a field near Sforzacosta, and with it and an Allied pilot as guide, reach the Anglo-American Command. The plan having failed on account of the resistance encountered from armed fascist pilots, Col. Spaccamela furnished us the means to reach the firing lines from where my commission was to cross over to the other side.

A colleague of mine by the name of GIORGIO MOLICA, a lawyer, who was with me when I contacted the Colonel, remained behind, and it appears that he was in Macerata until the 18th September 1943, that is, up to the time that the Colonel was arrested by the Germans.

Col. FILIPPO SPACCARELA of the Engineers Corps born in Novara 19 January 1897 son of the deceased Rio Spaccarela, and former commander of the garrison of Macerata, was arrested on the 16th September 1943 by the Germans and held a prisoner, first in Macerata and then in Ancona, because of his anti-fascist sentiments and also because it was proved that he had organized a resistance movement against the German garrison.

Set free towards the end of October, he did himself in the country from where he continued the propaganda against the Nazi-Fascists. He never joined the Republican Army nor did he receive wages or allowances during the period of the German occupation.

When Macerata was liberated he presented himself first to the Chieti command after which on August 1944 he went to the Ministry of War in Rome to offer his services and also to determine his status. Considered ready for duty by the Ministry of War, he was given full payment of his back salary, and then on 15 September he was sent on leave to Macerata, there to await call.

On 19 September the Police of Macerata denounced him and turned him over to the F.S.S. of Macerata where he was imprisoned for 5 months without either having been questioned or having any knowledge as to the cause of his imprisonment.

On 8 February 1945 he was removed to Jesi and from there, on 15 February, to the St. Andrews Prisoners of War Camp. A letter of his dated 8 March 1945 bears the U.S. Army P.W. censor stamp and the following identifications:

SUBJECT : Disposal of Present and Former Members of the Republican
Fascist Armed Forces Captured by the Allies.

TO : All Concerned.

1. In accordance with the policy approved by the Combined Chiefs of Staff, all Italians serving in the Republican Fascist Armed Forces who fall into the hands of the Allies, either during operations or behind our Lines, wearing either uniform or a fixed distinctive emblem within the terms of the Hague Convention respecting the Laws and Customs of War on Land, will be treated as enemy prisoners of war.
2. This policy applies not only to personnel of the Republican Fascist Army, Navy and Air Force, but also to such forces as "The Black Brigades" (Brigate Nere) and "National Republican Guard" (Guardia Nazionale Repubblicana) with the exception that members of the CNR drawn from the CC.RR. (Carabinieri Reale) will be treated in accordance with paragraph 3 (d) below.
3. Italians who are encountered in the course of our advance will fall into one of the following classes :
 - a. Members of the enemy armed forces in uniform. These will be disposed of as military prisoners of war.
 - b. Men who, although unarmed and in civilian clothes are found on investigation to have been members of the enemy armed forces at the time when they were over run. These will also be disposed of as military prisoners of war.
 - c. Civilians - including those who are able to prove that, either by dismissal or desertion, they had already ceased to be members of the enemy armed forces at the time they were over run. These will only be arrested if they are considered to be a danger to security in which case they will be disposed of as civilian internees. 2687
 - d. CC.RR. personnel will normally be instructed to report to the nearest AMG Public Safety Officer, who will arrange for them to proceed to the appropriate CC.RR. reception centre where they will be screened. These centres are at present located at ROME (for officers) and FLORENCE (for enlisted men). Any information which FSP/CIC may obtain concerning such members which would assist the screening officers at the reception centres in deciding how to deal with them, should be passed to the nearest Public Safety Officer. If no Public Safety Officer is readily available, it would be of assistance to AMG if such CC.RR. personnel were despatched to the reception centre concerned. CC.RR. personnel will only be arrested if positive information is obtained indicating that they will probably present a danger to Allied security if left at liberty. In that case they will be disposed of as military prisoners of war.

4. In order to ensure that such persons who have the status of military prisoner of war are not mistaken for civilian internees, even though they may be wearing civilian clothes, it is important that their escort should be provided with a nominal roll of all prisoners of war in civilian clothes stating they they are to be treated as prisoners of war because they have been identified as members of the enemy armed forces and adding when possible, the unit or organization to which they belonged. This document should be clearly distinguishable from the arrest report used for civilian internees.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE ALLIED COMMISSION

SUBJECT : Interned Patriot Niccolo' PASSERIN D'ENTREVES.

The Ministry for Foreign Affairs earnestly wish to interest the Allied Commission in the case of Sergeant Niccolo' PASSERIN D'ENTREVES, who now finds himself in a Southern Italy concentration camp (probably at Aversa) controlled by the Allies.

Before September 8th, 1943 Sergeant Passerin was a Cadet in the R. Academy of Artillery at Lucca.

A few days after the Armistice, escaping capture by the Germans, he took refuge with his family at Pistoia, remaining there some months in hiding. Subsequently, however he answered a call to arms made by the fascist authorities with the firm intention of passing the lines at the first favourable opportunity and in order to avoid, should he fail to present himself, relations against his father.

In the first days of December 1944 a partisan, who had managed to pass the lines, reported that Sergeant Passerin had joined the patriots operating in the zone of La Spezia.

Subsequently, according to information received by some relations of him at Florence, it appears that Sergeant Passerin, having crossed the lines had been interned at Sandicci and thence forwarded to a concentration camp in Southern Italy.

In consideration of the fact that Sergeant Passerin was compelled to join the Republican Army under threat of grave reprisals against his father that he subsequently deserted to the Partisans and crossed the lines into liberated Italy, that his family is very favourably known as one of patriotic and traditional royalist, the Ministry for Foreign Affairs warmly request the Allied Commission to interest the competent Military Authorities in releasing Niccolo' Passerin d'Entreves as soon as possible.

The Ministry for Foreign Affairs thank the Allied Commission for those steps which they will see fit to take in the matter.

In September 1943 he was in Greece. He has been captured
by the Germans and brought to Germany from where he returned
to Italy, through France; and in order to be able to return
to Italy he pledged allegiance to the Fascist republic. Sent
home he asked to be again taken in service at Florence, and
this for familiar necessities and so as not to be obliged
to hide himself (difficult in a village). In May 1944, he
abandoned the Republic. In June he lost his house following
bombardment as well as his father and sister who had been
seriously injured during the bombardment of Leccio.
At the end of August called by the National Liberation Com-
mittee for the purpose of explaining his activity as officer
of the Fascist Republic, he was handed over to the Allies
for screening.
Therefore he was sent to the concentration camp 209 (Frogola)
with the promise that within roughly a fortnight, the investi-
gation would be finished. But he is still waiting.
The a/m is an honest person, and can certainly do any harm
neither to the Allies nor to others.
Called for this control, he immediately complied with the order
not suspecting that there could be any accusation in his
regard.
Certainly somebody for personal reasons has tried to damage
him.
In his village he is really loved and appreciated and all ho-
nest persons are worried about his permanence in the concen-
tration camp, inasmuch as they cannot find in his activity
anything reproachable neither in regard of Italian interests,
nor in regard of those of the Allied forces.
His wife is teacher in the school of Leccio, and everybody
appreciates her greatly.

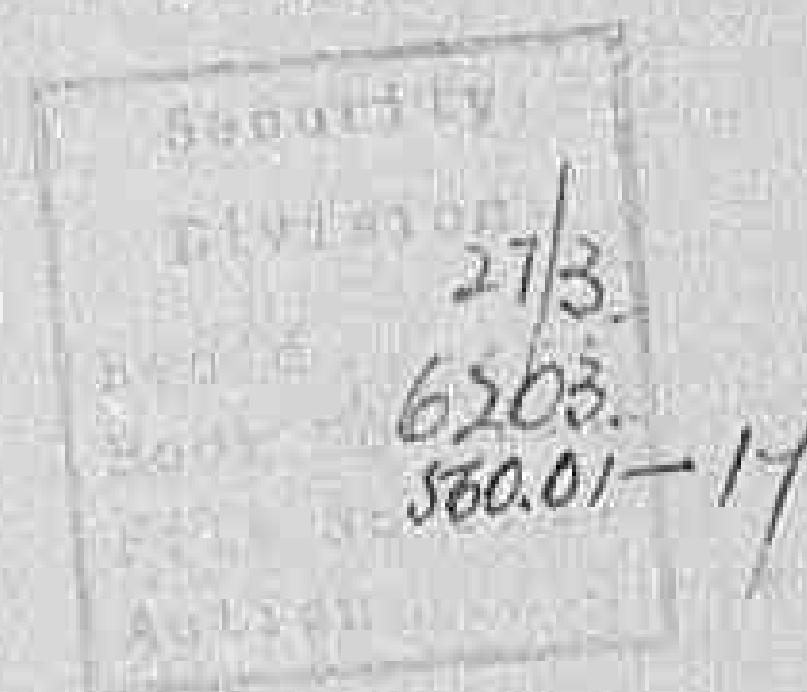

1. Letter 130 A of G-5 AFHQ seems to indicate some confusion on the part of the writer.
2. Persons interned at "A" Internee Camp Padula are not PWs. If on review they are found to have PW status they are transferred to a PW Camp, usually No. 209.
3. Internees at "A" and "R" Internee Camps, at the request of the Italian Authorities through AG may be:
 - (a) Handed over for trial (both for penal code and "Sanctions against Fascism" offences).
 - (b) Handed over to give evidence.
 - (c) Interrogated at the Camp by an accredited Italian Government representative. Unless the CC.RR. officers have been granted PW status, application may be made for them to be dealt with under one of the three readings referred to.
4. It is unlikely that AFHQ will grant permission for CC.RR. officers to be placed "at the disposition" of any authority unless this means "handing over for trial or to give evidence".

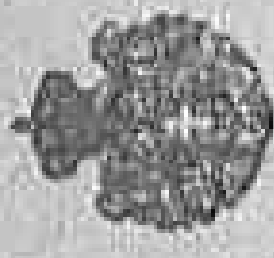

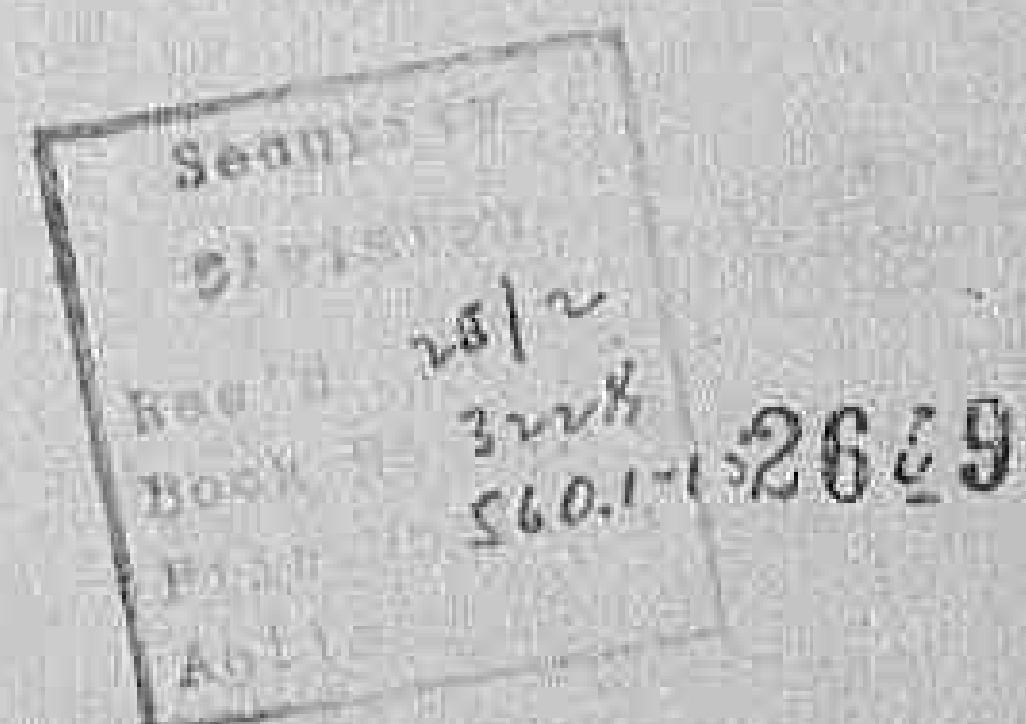

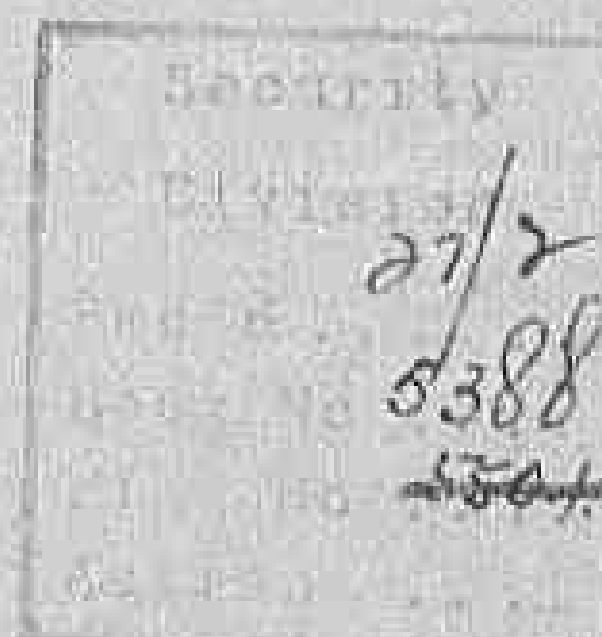

During my permanence in the prisoner of war camp n. 326 in Aversa, a certain Mr. Franz, Italian, who was acting for the German S.S., passed.

Franz declared that General Presti and General Catardi were going to be arrested on the 3 June, by the S.S., as they were considered persons who could not be trusted.

The arrest was however postponed, from the morning to the afternoon, because General Presti had been called by the Command of the Police Force by telephone at 11 a.m. to present himself to them.

The arrest was not carried out because an order had come through at midnight on the same day that the arrest was issued by the S.S. that they had to evacuate at once to the north.

Better information can be had from Franz who is interned at Padula, or to General Presti, who had the same declaration from Franz and who is in the POW camp 326 in Aversa.
