4. This Sub Commission deals only with persons interned on security grounds at camps under the control of G-2, AFHQ.

5. It is requested that this matter be brought to the attention of the Director, WMD and IPW Sub Commission.

The undersigned denounces Miss Orietta Romiti from Rome, to your Command as an Active collaborator of the German S.S. first at the Command of Tagliacozzo and then up North.

At present the a/m Girl is a camp of Carinara at H.U.S.P.W.E. - 91 G.43.73.66 Averga (Naples)

The follow<sup>ing</sup> are the facts:

From the end of September 1943, thousands of allied prisoners were passing through the Simbruini mountains, and precisely through Filettino & Meta of Civitella Roveto, to whom the population gave effectuous assistance.

In April 1944 an Italian parachuter who identified himself as Bruno Castellani under the command of the Allied Command established himself at Filettino to receive and give help to the Prisoners.

When the German S.S. found this out Castellani was captured and in order to save his life he denounced all his collaborators and prisoners who were living in that Area. Consequently many prisoners (Allied), citizens of Filettino and my sons Maria and Bruno Durante, of 26 & 24 years old respectively, were captured. They were all brought to Tagliacozzo (Aquila) where they were for a very long time and very insistentlly tortured, by the German S.S. Castellani was acting as an accuser and Romiti as an interpreter.

The behaviour of the Latter was boldly hostile towards the prisoners. At the end of May 1944, when the Germans, on account of the Allied advance, retired towards North, Romiti wanted to follow the German S.S., which she abandoned after the complete defeat of the Germans.

I therefore ask that this pseudo girl be denounced to the Italian authority as German S.S. collaborator, and that she be closed in an Italian jail. From her disposition you could be able to find out the true identity of Castellani, of the German S.S. and of all their numerous collaborators?

Romiti can be a precious informant. The undersigned knows the Romiti Family's address here in Rome.

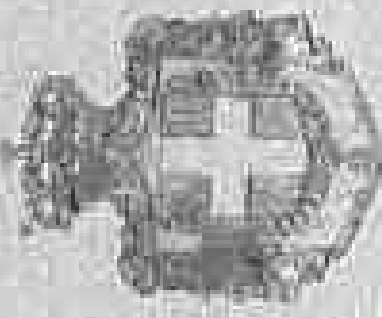

1. Certain confusion appears to exist as to the status of neo-fascist military personnel who have been taken into custody by the Italian authorities or who may be apprehended in the future by either Allied or Italian authorities. It has been suggested that those personnel are entitled to treatment as prisoners of war, and in this connection reference has been made to APOG directive 44-303-6/111 GBI-O of 6 March 1945.

2. In order to clarify the position certain questions were addressed to APOG and this latter is quoted upon the sheets received. APOG has stated that the problem has been referred for final decision to the Combined Chiefs of Staff and the text of this letter was accordingly subject to any further instructions which may be issued hereafter by the Combined Chiefs of Staff.

3. In September 1944 the Italian Government agrees that Italian neo-fascists, in addition and organized under the provisions of International Law, captured by the Allies, should be treated as prisoners of war in accordance with the Geneva Convention in the same manner as German prisoners of war. The term "neo-fascists" included all Italian fascists who fought for the Republic Italian Government since the Italian capitulation.

4. From the point of view of the Italian Government the purpose of this agreement was, undoubtedly, to secure reciprocity of treatment for members of the (officially) Italian Army when captured by the Germans. It would seem to follow from this agreement that the Italian Government would not now seek to prosecute "neo-fascists" on the sole ground that, by fighting on the side of the Germans, they are guilty of treachery or collaboration with the Germans.

5. It is no part of this agreement that neo-fascists personnel are now either at large or in Italian custody should be taken into Allied custody or control, on the contrary, they should be left in Italian custody and the Italian authorities should institute original proceedings against them if they should be allowed to remain subject to trial or other disposition in accordance with Italian law. In this connection, however, it may be desirable to draw to the attention of the Italian Courts the existence of the agreement of September 1944 in indicating that such proceedings should not be instituted solely on the ground of fighting with the neo-fascist forces.

6. It follows from the above that such neo-fascists have already been removed from Italian custody to prisoners of war or concentration camps and the Italian authorities desire to try them for serious crimes (and not

The term "neo-fascists" includes all Italian fascists who fought for the Repubblica Italiana Government since the Italian armistice.

4. From the point of view of the Italian Government the purpose of this agreement was, undoubtedly, to secure responsibility of treatment for violators of the (official) Italian Army when captured by the Germans. It would seem to follow from this agreement that the Italian Government should not seek to prosecute neo-fascists on the sole ground that, by fighting on the side of the Germans, they are guilty of treason or collaboration with the Germans.

5. It is no part of this agreement that neo-fascist personnel who are not either at large or in Italian custody should be taken into Allied custody or control, on the contrary, they should be left in Italian custody and the Italian authorities desire to initiate criminal proceedings against them they should be allowed to remain subject to trial or other disposition in accordance with Italian law. In this connection, however, it may be desirable to draw to the attention of the Italian Courts the violation of the agreement of September 1944 in indicating that such proceedings should not be instituted solely on the ground of fighting with the neo-fascist forces.

6. It follows from the above that where such neo-fascists have already been removed from Italian custody to prisoners of war or concentration camps and the Italian authorities desire to try them for serious crimes (and not solely on account of their neo-fascist status) they should be handed back to the Italian authorities for trial.

7. It is accordingly requested that the military authorities issue the necessary orders to prevent the further removal from Italian prisons of neo-fascist personnel now prisoners of war, and to enable any such personnel who have already been removed and are required for trial as above, to be returned.

8. In certain cases in which persons have been brought to trial before the Italian courts have claimed to be outside the jurisdiction of those courts by virtue of their prisoner of war status. In such cases the court should be informed that the question is a matter solely of Italian law, to which perhaps the agreement mentioned in paragraph 5 may have some relevance, and that the Allies have no cause to intervene.

9. It is however possible that among the neo-fascists in Italian custody there may be found Italians who are liable as war criminals by the United Nations War Crimes Commission. If any such case comes to light this Commission should be informed forthwith.

10. So far as concerns neo-fascist personnel who are still at large and have not yet been taken into custody by either Allied or Italian authorities, there is no obligation on the Allies to arrest or intern, or to take them prisoners of war. The decision as to the action to be taken concerning them must be the responsibility of the Italian Government, subject always to the right of the Allies to require, even in Italian Government Territory, that such personnel be taken into custody and handed over to the Allies for internment on security grounds.

All high ranking officers of the neo-fascist navy, army and air forces will be arrested, if still at large, and handed over to the Allies for internment.

SUBJECT : Disposal of Present and Former Members of the Republican  
Fascist Armed Forces Captured by the Allies.

TO : All Concerned.

1. In accordance with the policy approved by the combined Chiefs of Staff, all Italians serving in the Republican Fascist Armed Forces who fall into the hands of the Allies, either during operations or behind our lines, wearing either uniform or a fixed distinctive emblem within the terms of the Hague Convention respecting the Laws and Customs of War on Land, will be treated as enemy prisoners of war.
2. This policy applies not only to personnel of the Republican Fascist Army, Navy and Air Force, but also to such forces as "The Black Brigades" (Brigate Nere) and "National Republican Guard" (Guardia Nazionale Repubblicana) with the exception that members of the GNR drawn from the CC.NN. (Carabinieri Regia) will be treated in accordance with paragraph 3 (a) below.
3. Italians who are encountered in the course of our advance will be disposed of as military classes:
  - a. Members of the enemy armed forces in uniform. These will be disposed of as military prisoners of war.
  - b. Men etc, although unarmed and in civilian clothes are found on investigation to have been members of the enemy armed forces at the time they were over run. These will also be disposed of as military prisoners of war.
  - c. Civilians - including those who are able to prove that, either by dismissal or desertion, they have already ceased to be members of the enemy armed forces at the time they were over run. These will only be arrested if they are considered to be a danger to security in which case they will be disposed of as civilian internees.
4. CC.NN. personnel will normally be instructed to report to the nearest Allied Public Safety Officer, who will arrange for them to proceed to the appropriate CC.NN. Reception Centre where they will be screened. These centres are at present located at ROME (for officers) and FLORENCE (for enlisted men). Any information which VEF/CIC may obtain concerning such members which would assist the screening officers at the reception centres in deciding how to deal with them, should be passed to the nearest Public Safety Officer. If no Public Safety Officer is readily available, it would be of assistance to him if such CC.NN. personnel were dispatched to the reception centre concerned. CC.NN. personnel will only be arrested if positive information is obtained indicating that they will probably present a danger to Allied security if left at liberty. In that case they will be disposed of as military prisoners of war.

In accordance with the policy approved by the combined Chiefs of Staff, all Italians serving in the Repubblica Fascist Armed Forces who fall into the hands of the Allies, either during operations or behind our lines, wearing either uniform or a fixed distinctive emblem visible in the terms of the Hague Convention respecting the laws and Customs of war on land, will be treated as enemy prisoners of war.

2. This policy applies not only to personnel of the Republican Fascist Army, Navy and Air Force, but also to such forces as "The Black Brigades" (Brigate Nere) and "National Republican Guard" (Guardia Nazionale Repubblicana) with the exception that members of the GNR (Gruppo from the G.A.R. (Carabinieri Regio) will be treated in accordance with paragraph 1 (d) below.

3. Italians who are encountered in the course of our advance will be disposed of as military prisoners.

a. Members of the enemy armed forces in uniform. These will be disposed of as military prisoners of war.

b. Men who, although unarmed and in civilian clothes are found on investigation to have been members of the enemy armed forces at the time when they were over run. These will also be disposed of as military prisoners of war.

c. Civilians - including those who are able to prove that, either by dismissal or desertion, they had already ceased to be members of the enemy armed forces at the time they were over run. These will only be treated if they are considered to be a danger to security in which case they will be disposed of as civilian internees.

4. G.A.R. personnel will normally be instructed to report to the nearest Air Public Safety Officer, who will arrange for them to proceed to the appropriate G.A.R. reception centre where they will be accommodated. These centres are at present located at 1001 (for officers) and 1002 (for enlisted men). Any information which JSP/CID may obtain concerning such members which would assist his subordinate officers at the reception centres in deciding how to deal with them, should be passed to the nearest Public Safety Officer. If no Public Safety Officer is readily available, it would be of assistance to AIC if such G.A.R. personnel were accompanied to the reception centre concerned. G.A.R. personnel will only be arrested if positive information is obtained indicating that they will probably present a danger to Allied security if left at liberty. In that case they will be disposed of as military prisoners of war.

5. In order to ensure that such persons who have the status of military prisoners of war are not mistaken for civilian internees, even though they may be wearing civilian clothes, it is imperative that their escort should be provided with a central roll of all prisoners of war in civilian clothes stating they are to be treated as prisoners of war because they have been identified as members of the enemy armed forces and adding when possible the unit or organization to which they belonged. This document should be clearly distinguishable from the arrest report used for civilian internees.
