SUBJECT: Security of Intelligence Files and Protection of Informants

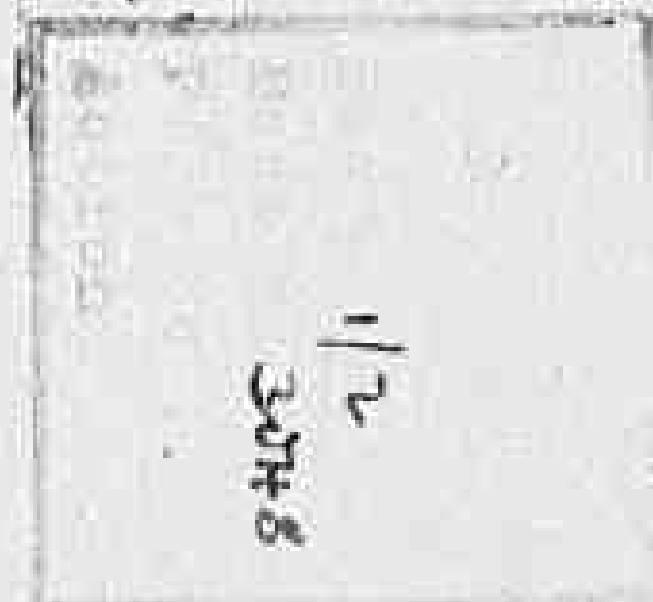

All Concerned
* * * *

1. Numerous recent incidents have been brought to the attention of the War Department involving compromise of intelligence files containing classified information relating to military personnel or civilians under military control. In several cases individuals who have been the subjects of investigations by intelligence agencies have been shown their own files or informed of the contents thereof. This practice constitutes a flagrant compromise of classified information and is in direct violation of existing orders (See letter AG 230 (11 May 42) DE-S-B-H, 13 May 1942, subject: Security of Investigations and Protection of Informants). Such incidents cause embarrassment to the War Department and to informants who have been assured that information obtained from them would be held confidential.

2. Under no circumstances will intelligence files reflecting on the loyalty of individuals be made available to the individuals concerned or to other persons who do not need the information for the performance of official duties.

3. The addressees of this letter will make such further distribution of it as is necessary to insure compliance.

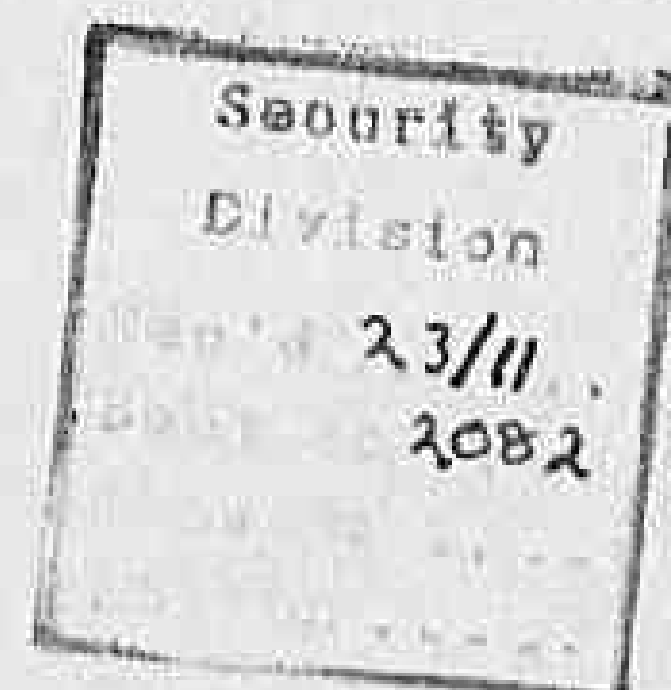

Sir;

I have to report that at TURIN on the 28th May 1945, about 1330hrs, I was on duty at the HQ Detachment 227 Provost Company C.M. Police, when I was informed by Lt. DEED (Officer i/c Detachment 227 Provost Company C.M. Police.), that Col. BRIGGS of A.M.G., would like to see me.

At 1400hrs the same day I interviewed Col. BRIGGS in his office at A.M.G. Headquarters in the VIA CORSO OPORTO, and he informed me that an Italian Officer had been there, and had asked that he and two officer had come to ask permission to convey a quantity of property belonging to PRINCE PEIDEMONTE, from TURIN to ROME, and also that the property was hidden somewhere on the outskirts of TURIN. Col. BRIGGS then asked that I make enquiries into the matter before, permission was given.

I immediately commended enquiries and interviewed Lt. BOIDO FRANCO of the 105Bde. NON POLITICAL PARTISAN PARTY, who informed me that a letter had been received from COLONEL G. LOMBARDI, CHIEF OF THE ITALIAN WAR CABINET, ROME, that a quantity of property, consisting of approximately L.3,000,000 worth of good, which was contained in Ten boxes, and which had previously been taken from the house of SAVIO, and was at the present time hidden near TURIN, be returned to ROME at the express wish of the PRINCE, and that he and 1 st Lt. MINERVINI, CARLO and 1 st Lt. PATTI, ANTONIO, both of the same PARTY were to be the escorts.

At 1500hrs the same date, I interviewed 2st Lt. MINERVINI, at the HOTEL SITEA, TURIN, and he informed me that latter had been written by Col. LOMBARDI to Capt. FRACASSI MAURIZIO, Chief of the 105 Bde., and who is also an AMERICAN SECRET SERVICE AGENT, and that he had vouched for its validity. On being further questioned Lt. MINERVINI, told me that the property was hidden at the home of a friend of his about 50 Kilometers outside of TURIN and that he would take me there providing that only myself visit the place of hiding, this request I granted.

Later the same day Lt. MINERVINI and myself proceed to the village of MINTIGLIO where I was taken to the CASTLE of the MARCHESE DI MONTIGLIO, I made myself known to him, my identity and told him the nature of my enquiries, and he informed me that the TEN boxes had previously been taken there for safe hiding until it could be returned to ROME.

He then took me to a large barn which in part of the CASTLE premises and he pointed out to me part of the wall into which the boxes had been built, but stated that he would rather not break the wall down until the time came for the immediate removal of the property, but requested that when the cavity be opened that I be on the spot, so that I may be satisfied as to what was hidden there.

I then asked for permission to view the contents of the boxes when they were excavated, but was informed that no one there had the authority to open the boxes.

I also asked that I be furnished with a list of the contents of them, but was informed that it was impossible as no one knew exactly what the contents were.

The following day the 29th May 1945, I informed Col. BRIGGS of the enquiries, and he asked that could a MILITARY GUARD be supplied for the transit of the property from TURIN to ROME, with myself as one of the escort, for this I referred him to Capt. ROBERTS D.A.P.M. HQ 151 SUB AREA, I also informed Capt. ROBERTS of the result of the enquiries.

At 1500hrs on the 29th May 1945, I contacted COLONEL HOWARD, COLD-STREAM GUARDS, who is working with the BRITISH MILITARY MISSION, and who knew of the occurrence and stated that it would be deemed very admirable if a BRITISH MILITARY GUARD could be provided.

I later informed Capt. ROBERTS D.A.P.M., as to the result of the whole enquiry.

1. Some instances have already come to my attention of AMG officers of this Region fraternizing with persons who have a bad record of collaboration with the Fascists and Nazis. No matter what temptation any AMG officer is subjected to, I wish to make it clear that no fraternization of that nature will be countenanced by me as Regional Commissioner. I am directing the Regional Security Officer to bring to my personal attention any information of any infringement and it is my intention to institute disciplinary action.

2. All officers should insist that their civilian employees pursue the same policy of not associating with persons who collaborated with the Fascists or Nazis. Any violation should be punished by immediate dismissal.

3. If any officer is in doubt as to any Italian he wishes to associate with, he can obtain the assistance of the Regional Security Officer.

SUBJECT: Security of Displaced Persons Accommodation and Reception Centers.

TO: All Concerned

1. The various Displaced Persons Accommodation and Reception Centers throughout Italy (a list of which is attached at Appendix "A") contain a number of persons of uncertain nationality and doubtful record. While these persons are normally screened secure before their entry into the Accommodation and Reception Centers, cases of security interest may develop owing to the long period of waiting and inactivity of the displaced persons, or for other reasons.

2. In addition, cases have arisen where persons have been transferred or directed to Accommodation and Reception Centers without prior screening. This should be avoided whenever possible, but if it is unavoidable, the center should be notified that the persons are not screened.

3. A further source of anxiety, from the security standpoint, is the fact that no military guards are provided at these Accommodation and Reception Centers.

4. It is therefore important that the officers in charge of Counter Intelligence Corps detachments and Field Security Sections should be instructed to make themselves known to the Directing Staff of the Accommodation and Reception Centers in their area and should maintain contact by at least weekly visits.

5. It is pointed out that, in cases where displaced persons are judged to be a menace to the Security of the Allies if allowed to remain at liberty in an Accommodation and Reception Center, recourse may be had to the measure of internment in one or other of the Allied Civilian Internee Camps.

1. After consultation with G-2 Fifth Army, it has been decided to relieve the latter of responsibility for security and counter-intelligence in the area covered by FLORENCE COMMAND. With effect from 18 Jan 45, this responsibility will be assumed directly by this HQ. 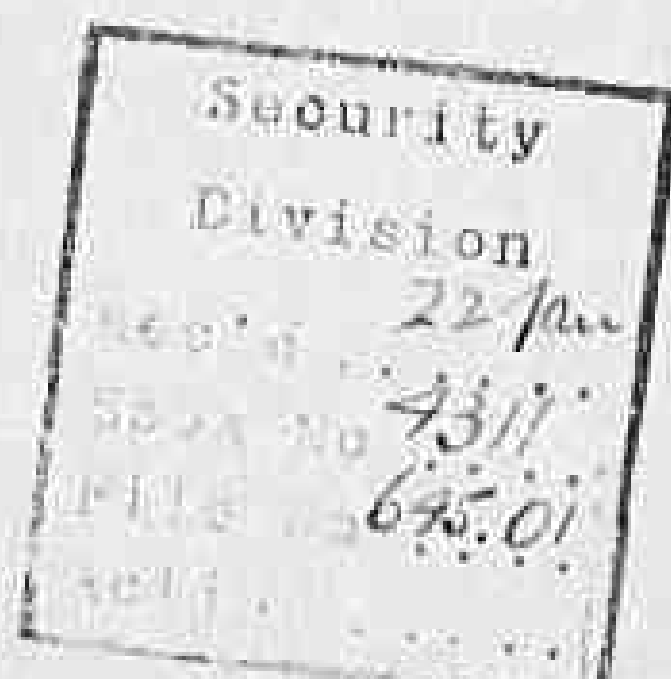
a. All Allied Security Agencies in ROME are here at the direction of AFHQ who deem their presence to be necessary.

b. This headquarters controls practically all investigational agencies and in any event all agencies are finally responsible to CG, R. A. A. C. for their reasonable conduct.

c. All agencies have been repeatedly advised of the necessity for exercising probity in the management of their duties in ROME, the religious center of the Catholic world and important world capital.

d. The security personnel operating in ROME are of high caliber and were in fact chosen to work here for that reason.

e. Full advantage is taken of the opportunities to collaborate with Italian agencies in investigations, searches, and arrests. In fact, current orders instruct that this be done except in grave emergencies.

f. The principal mission of Allied Security is to keep free from interruption the several facilities of this vital communication center. To that end they seek out those persons giving active aid to the enemy. Our security personnel make no political investigations as such, but keep to the main objective.

g. It is the considered opinion of this section that our allied security agencies perform their mission with a minimum of interference to the normal activities of the Italian people, and with a maximum of consideration, sympathy, and understanding of the Italians and their problems.

h. It would appear, therefore, since our security agencies have the same mission as our cobelligerents, expediting an early victory over the enemy, that their efforts must receive the whole hearted support of the Italian authorities.

1. Evidence continues to be received from widely divergent sources that the enemy derives valuable tactical intelligence from captured documents found on Allied prisoners of war.

2. A German Intelligence officer on the Eastern Front related recently, under interrogation, the following types of breaches which he had encountered regarding the security of documents:

- a. TOP SECRET documents were frequently found in pockets of prisoners of war, and in cars in the front lines.
- b. Notebooks containing SECRET and TOP SECRET information were found in large numbers in the possession of prisoners of war.
- c. Distribution lists on nearly all documents were one of the most valuable sources of information.

3. As an example of 2 a, the German Intelligence officer recalled finding a TOP SECRET Order of Battle document on a lieutenant shortly before the breakthrough at AVRAUCHES (base of Cherbourg peninsula), giving the complete regrouping of Allied forces in that sector. The comment which he received from the lieutenant was: "Well, you cannot keep all this in your head".

4. Carelessness and breaches of security as illustrated by paragraphs 2 a and b above must be eradicated by constant training and strict security discipline. As a general rule all documents, whether private or official, will be considered to contain matter of interest to the enemy. Commanders will ensure that the following are collected from troops before going into action or on patrol: letters, official documents, diaries, memoranda, marked maps, notebooks, photographs and other private papers.

5. Regarding paragraph 2 c above, attention has already been drawn to the danger of wide distribution lists in letter, this headquarters, file AG 461-5 GBI-AGM, dated 21 January 1944, subject: "Security Danger of Wide Distribution Lists". Commanders will ensure that, whenever possible, one of the two alternative expedients enumerated in the letter referred to is adopted, and that when it is essential to show a wide distribution, the document is properly classified and handled accordingly.

SUBJECT: Security of Telephone Conversations.

1. An analysis of the subjects of telephone conversations for the two month period ending 31 October 1944, indicated security is being violated in that the conversations included information as to:

- a. Date, time group, reference numbers and plain text of many highly classified messages (violation of cryptographic security).
- b. Movement of troops and convoys with dates of departure and arrival and origin and destinations.
- c. Critical supply situation such as ammunition and gasoline requirements for armies in this theater and in France.
- d. Replacement and casualty situation in theater and requirements for additional personnel.
- e. Plans for various operations.
- f. Arrival and plans for military missions.
- g. Discussion of political developments.
- h. Movement of high ranking officers, officials and diplomats.

2. Violations of security committed in telephone conversations during the past month are of a more serious nature than those of the preceding period.

3. In all telephone conversations the operational necessity for a security violation must be carefully weighed. There may be occasions when operations will be unduly hampered by rigid adherence to security precautions.

4. Also in view of the fact that it must be assumed the conversing parties are familiar with the background of the material being discussed it should be sufficient in most cases to refer merely to reference number and paragraph rather than quote the entire message or even extracts of messages.

SUBJECT: Accommodations in NW ITALY for Intelligence Agencies.

TO : Engineer, Fifth Army.

1. It is anticipated that various intelligence agencies will be operating in Northwest ITALY and will require offices, mess and billets in the centers of population. Such agencies normally enter towns and cities with this HQ which maintain them during the first few days. Thereafter some agencies desire to establish a semi-permanent office in the locality while others come and go or depart entirely. It is at this time, when each agency commences operating on its own, that details of accommodation become a major problem for them, as well as for your office, and indirectly this HQ.

2. Experience has shown that the best solution is to provide a separate, small office building for agency use, similar to the building 59, Via Sicilia in Rome. Most of the agencies can be taken care of in this way. There are a few, such as CSDIG, which will require special arrangements. At the same time, billets and mess can be taken care of by permitting the indefinite use of one of the hotels operated for rest centres or transients.

3. The entire problem cannot be solved in the same manner for all groups because of the disparity of size and functions. A further difficulty arises from the fact that future plans of these agencies are not known. In an effort to clarify our future planning and to obtain some idea of our liabilities in Northwest ITALY, this HQ is inviting agencies to submit an estimate and appreciation of what they will require for their own purposes. Their replies will be consolidated and presented to your office for consideration and discussion.

Subject: Security-telephones.

To : Distribution below.

1. It must be obvious to all personnel that the telephones, and especially those which are linked up with a civilian circuit as are the instruments at this H.Q., are far from secure.

2. Secret matters should never be discussed over the telephone; confidential matters should be discussed by reference to file numbers and dates in such manner as to guard the content.

3. In particular, every care must be taken to avoid the linking of telephone exchanges with the locations of headquarters or units, i.e. if a person wishes to telephone to an Army H.Q. he should ask for the exchange concerned and should never mention place names. Thus the correct method of telephoning Rear H.Q. A.C.C. would be to ask for Fatima (Rear) without nominating the geographical position.

1. There is uncertainty as to the procedure which should be followed in respect of Italian Naval, Military and Air Force personnel serving in the co-belligerent Forces, who commit security offences, or whom it is desired to intern on security grounds.
2. As regards those who should be brought to trial for the commission of a security offence, there would appear to be several possible methods of procedure:-
 - (a) The case to be reported to the Italian Service authorities, who would deal with the person concerned either by the award of summary punishment, or by trial by court-martial, the whole matter being left entirely in the hands of the Italian authorities.
 - (b) The case to be dealt with as in (a) above, except that the Italian authorities would be instructed to notify the Allied authorities of the action taken and the sentence imposed, in order that the latter could satisfy themselves that the case had been properly handled.
 - (c) The case to be tried by Allied Military Court in respect of security offences under A.C.C. Proclamations.
 - (d) The case to be tried by Allied Court Martial in respect of security offences under Military or International law.

It is suggested that (a) be followed for minor offences, (b) for more serious offences; and (c) or (d) for major offences for which the death sentence could be imposed.

3. As regards those whom it is desired to intern on security grounds, again several possible methods of procedure appear feasible:-

- (a) The case to be reported to the Italian Service authorities, and the latter asked to intern the person concerned.
- (b) The person to be taken into custody by the Allied security authorities and placed in the Allied Internment Camp as a military POW. The Italian authorities to be advised of our intention immediately prior to its implementation.
- (c) The Italian Service authorities to be asked to discharge from the Forces the person concerned, and the latter to be interned by the Allies as a civil POW in the normal way.

(a) The case to be reported to the Italian Service authorities, who would deal with the person concerned either by the award of summary punishment, or by trial by court-martial, the whole matter being left entirely in the hands of the Italian authorities.

(b) The case to be dealt with as in (a) above, except that the Italian authorities would be instructed to notify the Allied authorities of the action taken and the sentence imposed, in order that the latter could satisfy themselves that the case had been properly handled.

(c) The case to be tried by Allied Military Court in respect of security offences under A.C.C. Proclamations.

(d) The case to be tried by Allied Court Martial in respect of security offences under Military or International law.

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(a) The case to be reported to the Italian Service authorities, and the latter asked to intern the person concerned.

(b) The person to be taken into custody by the Allied security authorities and placed in the Allied Internment Camp as a military POW. The Italian authorities to be advised of our intention immediately prior to its implementation.

(c) The Italian Service authorities to be asked to discharge from the Forces the person concerned, and the latter to be interned by the allies as a civil POW in the normal way.

It is felt that (a) would lead to much difficulty and wrangles, and it is not recommended. It is suggested that (b) or (c) should be adopted, subject to which is the more satisfactory from the legal point of view.

In cases where Italian Service personnel are considered to be some potential danger to our security, but not sufficiently so to justify their internment, it is thought that their C.O. should be informed of the case and asked to keep them under observation and to ensure their good behaviour.

4. It is requested that a ruling be given on these points.

Nothing will be passed, discussed, or published in relation to international conferences, regarding the above subjects, without the authorization from the President's executive office.

4. In the Army areas the present policy will continue to be followed, whereby security/counter-intelligence agencies are instructed to keep the local Civil Affairs Officer informed of all security action taken affecting local civilians, particularly as regards arrests, and, wherever possible, to consult the local Civil Affairs Officer before the arrest of a civil official.

5. In territory administered by the Italian Government, security arrests should be effected, whenever possible, through the Italian authorities.

- d) Ispettori Federali. (Federal Inspectors).
- e) Segretari Politici e Vice Segretari Politici. (Political Secretaries and Vice Political Secretaries).
- f) Gli Ufficiali della Milizia Volontaria Sicurezza Nazionale Ordinaria. (Officers of the ordinary National Safety Voluntary Militia).
- g) Gli Squadristi, "marcia su Roma", e "sciarpa littoria".
- h) I fascisti comunque riconosciuti colpevoli di attentati alla libertà individuale. (All Fascists found guilty of having repressed individual liberty).
