Subject: Irregular Issue of Pass

To : Director, Security Branch, A.C.C. (Main)

1. Major Drage has been seen, and admits he issued the " pass " concerned.

2. He was unable to remember any details about the man DI GRAZIE or why he issued the permit, apart from the fact that he had sent 20 or so inhabitants of the Grand Hotel similarly to Naples to return to their homes.

3. Major Drage regrets his action and is now aware of the grave security danger in the indiscriminate issuance of scraps of paper. The inclusion of the words "in the service of A.C.C." was to safeguard the bearer of the pass and any Allied driver whose vehicle he might be using. DI GRAZIE was not, however, in the service of A.C.C.

4. Major Drage was acquainted with the conditions existing in Naples, and has ceased issuing any passes or assisting civilians to travel there. He says he acted with the best of intentions to alleviate a critical situation existing in Rome.

5. I suggest that DI GRAZIE should not be issued with ~~any~~ ^{regun} pass. There never was a valid reason for leaving Rome and his return would not assist the Allied War effort.

6. In the absence of anything detrimental to DI GRAZIE, and Major Grage's belated appreciation of the danger of his conduct, I suggest no further action be taken in regard to the latter.

TO : Director, Security Branch, A.C.C. ADV. HQ.

1. I attach hereto a "pass" issued apparently by Major Drage, H.Q. Commandant, A.C.C. Advanced Headquarters and which was brought to my attention by Lt. Col. Robertson, H.Q. Commandant, this H.Q.

2. You will note that the "pass" is made out to "bearer" and there is no means of checking that the person who was in possession of the pass is identical with the person to whom this slip of paper was given by Major Drage.

3. The person from whom the "pass" was taken is a certain Gaetano DI GRAZE of 49 Via B. Buzzzi, Rome and when questioned about being "in the service of A.C.C." he stated he had never worked in his life, but that now he must try to work and that his reasons for coming to Naples were purely personal as he had heard from various people that his property in Naples had been badly damaged.

4. Fortunately, a security check has shown that there is nothing detrimental to this individual.

5. A statement is attached showing that DI GRAZE obtained the pass through a certain Baroness HEPEISON who, apparently, is well known to Major Drage. DI GRAZE said that she and he had made the acquaintance of Major Drage at the Grand Hotel where he is staying.

6. DI GRAZE, of course, now wishes to return to Rome, but I have refused to give him a permit until such time as his stay is confirmed or denied by Major Drage.

7. I leave to you the decision as to what is to be done about the irregular issue of this slip of paper.





SUBJECT : Issuance of Travel Passes - Italian Civilians.

TO : Adjutant Section
(Attn. Lt. Montant.)

1. Ref. your Adj : 210.482 of 11 July 1944.

2. To avoid complicity it is essential to keep the issue of passes to as few agencies as possible.

3. The principle passes with which we as H.Q. ACC will deal will be those for officials of the Italian Government, and this procedure is clearly set out in memorandum from Secretary General's office dated 6th May 1944.

4. Civilians should be referred to the Public Safety Office, Rome Region or Region 4, otherwise we will find more and more civilians using this Headquarters as a means of performing a duty which can easily be dealt with in Region, leaving H.Q. personnel to concentrate on matters more on a Headquarters level.

5. Directive 316/76/CA sets out when such passes should be issued.

SUBJECT: Issuance of Travel Passes - Italian Civilians

TO : Executive Officers (Colonel CLOUGH)

1. Under existing conditions, all Italian civilians wishing to leave Rome, either to return later, or permanently, are required to have passes. These passes are currently being handled in the following manner.

a. Application is made by the civilian to the Adjutant, Headquarters ACC, who, in turn, forwards the application to Security Branch, for approval.

b. Upon approval by Security Branch, the applications are returned to the Adjutant, who issues the pass.

2. In Naples, this type of police work was handled entirely by Headquarters, Region III, as it was considered a local matter.

3. As the Armies advance, and as means of communication become available for a greater volume of civilian traffic, it is anticipated that these requests, already considerable, will increase in number.

4. It is therefore recommended that consideration be given to the delegation of authority for the issuance of such travel permits to either Rome Region or Region IV, Public Safety Division.
