My husband, resident of Vestri with his family, a Municipal employe, was accused by a stranger, who had personal hatred against him, and brought to Padula (Salerno),



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Interpreting the unanimous feelings of the Employees of the Excise Tax Bureaus of the Province of Bari, some time ago I reported to this Commission against the ex-fascist hierarch Avv. Nicola Nardilli - Director of the Excise Bureau at Bari, Central Inspector, Manager of Istituto Nazionale Gestione Imposte Consumo - Lictor Band - Member of the Federal Commission of Discipline of the fascist party up to the 25th. July 1943 - Federal Inspector of ex Service-men - Provincial Trustee of the Public Employ - Centurion of the Militia - "Commendatore" for fascist merits.

The misdeeds of this gentleman and the abuses committed during the fascist period are well known to those who, by ill-luck, had the misfortune of being in his employ, and I hope that by now this Commission, besides having collected proofs through memorandums submitted, is convinced of it.

However, some strange events which are taking place are prompting me again to revert to the Nardilli case, even if this is superfluous as far as I am concerned, so that while assuming formal engagement to acquaint immediately the High Commissioner for the National Expurgation and ALL the Parties with some strange delay occurring in the trial, I reject ^{from} ~~since~~ now ^{of} every responsibility for all that which INEVITABLY will happen as a result of Nardilli remaining in office.

I repeat that the above is stated and said in the name of all the employees.

A few days ago, one of the racketeers, recently reported against in a memorandum addressed to this Commission, grouped round the halcyon personality of Nardilli, a Belvisio onofrio, FOLLOWING INSTRUCTIONS SPECIFICALLY RECEIVED, circulated among the ^{employees} ~~depending~~ personnel of the Bari management a sheet of paper full of hatred and of poisonous invectives against somebody (NO NAME WAS STATED ON THE SHEET OF PAPER) for the campaign he was conducting against Comm. Nardilli.

In addition, the statement ended praising Nardilli (just as during the fascist rule) as being honest, capable and a straightforward official.

So much so that after having secured a few signatures by injunction (I definitely say BY INJECTION) one of the employees, named DE NICCOLO' in flatly refusing to sign, asked Belviso against whom were the invectives directed and he retorted as follows: " I do not know the name, but it will be written in the space left in blank, upstairs in the Management Office, after the signatures have been collected."

The sheet of paper is the same as was pre-announced by Nardilli (as a strong protest) in the statement he intended having signed by the internal Commission of the Bari Management and which originated a strong protest from it, which was already sent to this Commission, and the name that should have been inserted after the signatures was MINE.

As will be seen, in tracing the matter back, we always find Nardilli, the all-important Nardilli who superintends and carries out foul maneuvering with the only purpose of appearing before this Commission as a saint.

At this stage, while leaving to others the task of establishing the seriousness of the action, I am posing the following questions: How long will this comedy last?

Why the racketeer Pompeo Saponaro keeps on saying that this Commission is all in favor of Nardilli and that it will ABSOLUTELY save him?

Why Dr. Francesco Vitucci has recently stated to the employee De Nicola that Nardilli will be discriminated, ^{against} INEVITABLY, only discriminated ^{against}?

Gentlemen of the Commission:

Nardilli is making use of licit and illicit weapons to gain his ends; among the illicit weapons there are 4 of his loyal employees:

1. Inspector Domenico De Marco - who never worked in his life and who with Nardilli has always done and does what he pleases.
2. Accountant Pompeo Saponaro - typical specimen of a coward and rascal who is rewarded with extreme bonuses for his good services... ..to Nardilli. He is very much hated by the personnel. A true, genuine Scarpia !
3. Controller: Salvatore d'Aloia = He is at present Nardilli's Secretary = ex trustee of a fascist Regional Group, whose wife was ~~Terzine~~ Federal Inspector up to the 25th. July 1943. He gets extra bonuses in exchange for his devotion.
4. ^{Checker} Reviser: Belviso Onofrio = the same as far as bonuses are concerned - who instead of working for the benefit of the Company and for his own dignity, carries on in the Office theatre activity (with the connivance of Nardilli) and to the general scandalization of all the staff.

These are the men who, acting on orders from Nardilli, are preparing and carrying out foul schemes to the very point of subjugating the depleted mass of employees by threats of transfers and dismissals to be immediately carried out.

Therefore, all the employees are through me putting forward a formal petition to this Commission to be heard individually to give vent to their oppressed spirit, humiliated and depressed by a fascist hierarchy who SHAMEFULLY is still in office.

Gentlemen of the Commission.

In case Nardilli, through underhand tricks, should succeed in making good his defence and therefore would be discriminated ^{against} as a result of the inevitable trial,

IT MUST BE KNOWN

that ALL the staff of the Excise Bureau of the Bari province, WHO HATE HIM BITTERLY, would rise to a man and claim to the whole world that BY EVERY MEANS

JUSTICE

be done.

Avvocato Mario LINGUITI.

LINGUITI Mario, son of Ernesto and of Gaston Ottavia, born in Naples on 27th February, 1898, lives at Viale delle Acazie No. 28. He is married with one son. He has a good moral conduct and has no criminal record.

He is a retired Artillery Captain and took part in the war of 1915-1918, and was decorated with the Cross of War. He is a Knight of the Order of the Crown of Italy since 27th December, 1934. He joined the Fascist Party on 3rd March, 1926. He graduated as a lawyer and has held the following appointments:-

Federal Inspector of the Fascist Party in Naples.

Governing Commissioner of the Agricultural Syndicate of the Province of Reggio Calabria.

Member of the Agricultural and Forestry Section of the Council of the Corporation of Naples, and supervisor of the same Council.

Vice-President of the Cereal and Agricultural Section of the Province of Naples and Councillor of the Provincial Agricultural Syndicate of Naples.

Councillor for the Committee for liberated prisoners (Convicts) in Naples.

Although he was a Captain in the regular Army, in this war he was recalled and served as a Centurion in the Fascist Militia.

The above-mentioned lawyer was the organizer of the Syndicate for the Ex-service Men, who owned plots of ground in the Royal Estate at Carditello. Many years ago with the strong protection of the President of the Provincial Federation of Agriculture, Domenico RAZZA, brother of the Minister who had died in Africa, he succeeded in becoming the President of the Farm Owners Syndicate (All Ex-Service Men) of Calvi and Carditello, although he was not the owner of any of the land. The moment the Minister died he changed the name of the Syndicate to that of "Consorzio Luigi RAZZA", and also erected a monument to the dead Minister on the ground at Carditello.

In 1940, ~~MEM~~ Fabio Milone, then Federal Secretary of Naples, appointed him/of the Federation. Later on Linguiti was recalled to Inspector

active service as a Centurion of the "DICAT" (Air Defence Militia.) and was transferred to Capua. In 1941 Linguiti was appointed Federal Inspector and Fascist Secretary of the district of Capua. He worked hard to secure both these appointments ~~and~~ in order to build up a strong Fascist background, which would enable him to climb to greater heights in the Fascist Party. He is a man ready for power and money. He retained these two appointments until the day he was dismissed from the Army at Capua and sent back to continue his job as President of the Syndicate at Carditello.

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At the end of 1942 or the beginning of 1943, through Domenico RAZZA (who meanwhile had become ~~Minister~~ Ministerial Commissioner of the United Syndicate for the drainage of Campania) he obtained a promise that the above-mentioned United Syndicate would absorb his Syndicate (RAZZA Syndicate) and that he would become the Director of these new United Syndicates with a monthly salary of 11,000 lira.

The whole of the file of papers relating to this absorption was still in Rome being examined for approval in September, 1943, and the absorption has never been carried out. In spite of this Linguiti is director of the United Syndicate and President of the RAZZA Syndicate, but owing to the present circumstances (Allies in occupation) Linguiti has now changed the name ~~ENEM~~ of the RAZZA Syndicate to the old name of the Calvi and Carditello Syndicate.

The United Syndicates include six important Syndicates of the Campania, the president of these six being the ex-Ambassador Montagna, who with the arrival of the Allies has been able to use the friendship he has with General HUME, Major Ridgway Knight and Major Kennedy, (the last named being at the head of Region 3, Agriculture,) to protect ~~himself~~ Linguiti, to whom he is bound by very strong interests. Through this friendship Ambassador Montagna was able to let Linguiti keep all his appointments although many people are asking that Linguiti, because of his past, ought to be relieved of all the public appointments he still holds.

Linguiti even after Montagna has been discharged from the Cotchiere Meridionali (owing to the arrest of MOSCA, PISCITELLI and TAGIAVINI) goes on keeping his appointments.

Linguiti is a very astute and shrewd person. He is a complete opportunist and has very few scruples. He is a person upon whom no trust can be placed.

He was an enthusiastic Fascist, a plausible public speaker who can influence a crowd, and for that reason he was considered by the Fascist Party as one of the best and most well known propagandist, and for that reason he was continuously invited to hold conferences of a political character in Naples and in the provinces.

In conclusion, not only ought he to be dismissed from the appointments he holds, but internment would create a very good impression amongst the general public.

LINGUITI Mario, di Ernesto e di Coston Ottavia, nato a Napoli il 27 febbraio 1898, qui domiciliato al Viale delle Acacie n.28, ammogliato con un figlio, risulta di buona condotta in genere, senza pendenze penali.

A suo carico risulta:

- Pretore Napoli 9 marzo 1937, non doversi procedere per amnistia per mancato deposito di bilancio.

E' capitano di artiglieria di complemento in congedo. Partecipò alla guerra 1915-1918 ed e' decorato della croce di guerra. E' cavaliere nell'ordine della Corona d'Italia dal 27 dicembre 1934. Iscritto al P.N.F. dal 3 marzo 1926.

E' laureato in giurisprudenza ed ha ricoperto le seguenti cariche:

- Ispettore federale del disciolto partito fascista in Napoli;

- commissario governativo del consorzio agrario della provincia di Reggio Calabria;

- membro della sezione agricola e forestale del consiglio provinciale delle corporazioni di Napoli e revisore del consiglio stesso;

- vice presidente della sezione cereali e agricoltura della provincia di Napoli e consigliere del consorzio agrario provinciale di questa città;

- consigliere del patronato per i liberati del carcere di Napoli.

Centurione della Milizia volontaria per la difesa della patria nel 1934
~~Malgrado essere di artiglieria in questa guerra si fece richiamare alle armi come seniore della milizia.~~ *R.E.*

Il detto avvocato, organizzatore del sindacato fra i combattenti quotisti della tenuta reale di Carditello, riusci', diversi anni or sono, e con l'alta protezione dell'allora presidente della federazione provinciale dell'agricoltura, sig. Domenico RAZZA, fratello del ministro deceduto in Africa, a divenire il Presidente del Consorzio fra i quotisti (concessionari degli appezzamenti di terreno) di Calvi e Carditello pur non essendo proprietario di alcun appezzamento di terreno nella zona del Consorzio, al quale, appena deceduto il ministro Razza si affrettò a cambiare la denominazione in quello "Consorzio Luigi Razza" erigendo anche un monumento al defunto nello spazio antistante la sede del consorzio in Carditello.

Nel 1940 dal federale Milone fu nominato ispettore della federazione addetto agli uffici sindacali, e successivamente richiamato alle armi, quale centurione della DICAT, e destinato a Capua; nel giugno 1941 fu nominato ispettore federale

della zona capuana e commissario al fascio di Capua, cariche che sollecito' per crearsi una benevolenza fascista e che tenne per diversi mesi sino al giorno in cui per la qualita' di presidente del consorzio ottenne l'esonero dal servizio militare.

Alla fine del 1942 o all'inizio del 1943 il Linguiti ottenne, sempre tramite il sig. Razza Domenico, divenuto commissario ministeriale ai Consorzi Riuniti per la Bonifica della Campania, l'assorbimento da parte di detti consorzi anche del consorzio Razza e la nomina a direttore degli uffici dei consorzi riuniti con uno stipendio attuale di circa L.11mila mensili.

La pratica per l'assorbimento era ancora a Roma presso gli uffici competenti per l'approvazione nel settembre u/s. e quindi e' rimasta sospesa mentre il Linguiti e' contemporaneamente direttore degli uffici dei consorzi riuniti e presidente del consorzio Razza al quale si e' affrettato a ridare la vecchia denominazione di Consorzio di Calvi e Carditello.

I Consorzi Riuniti comprendono sei importanti consorzi della Campania e di essi e' commissario l'ex ambasciatore Montagna, il quale, con l'arrivo degli Alleati, si e' servito dell'amicizia contratta con il generale Hume, con il maggiore Ridgeway Knight e con il maggiore Kennedy (quest'ultimo addetto alla Sezione Agricoltura della Regione 3/a) per proteggere il Linguiti (al quale e' legato da forti interessi) e fargli conservare le sue cariche ai Consorzi malgrado che molti reclami richiedessero che il Linguiti, per il suo passato di fascista, fosse esonerato da tali uffici. Il Linguiti, anche dopo che l'ambasciatore Montagna e' stato esonerato dall'incarico alle Cotoniere Meridionali (dopo l'arresto dei signori Piscitelli e Tagliavini), continua a mantenere le cariche.

Il Linguiti e' persona molto astuta ed accorta. E' un uomo dedito completamente all'affarismo, di pochi scrupoli, sul quale non si puo' fare alcun affidamento.

Fascista entusiasta e facile parlatore egli, durante il passato Regime era considerato uno dei migliori e piu' noti propagandisti, e percio' invitato molto spesso a tenere conferenze di carattere politico a Napoli e nei diversi paesi della provincia.

Il suo esonero dalle cariche che attualmente detiene produrrebbe favorevole impressione in pubblico ed entrerebbe perfettamente nel quadro di quelle epurazioni che sono in corso.

1. In accordance with the verbal request of Lt. Col. Wilcox, herewith are our findings on the undernamed.

(a) DONADONI Dott. Mario

Age 33. Single. Secretary of Prefectural Cabinet, Naples. Has employed by Prefecture of Benevento and Foggia as Official Commissioner. After the Armistice was selected for the Prefecture at Naples. No political nor security objections.

(b) SPINATO Carlo di Luigi

Age 45. Married. Chief Accountant. Joined Fascist Party in 1933, but given seniority in 1925, because he was an ex-soldier. Now an accountant at Naples Prefecture. No political nor security objections.

Subject is late Lt. Col. Fairman, P. 115.
To: Col. A.E. Young.

1. As directed, I have obtained some details regarding the illness and death of Col. Fairman.

2. The case started to improve after a late evening walk and loss of weight in Foggia in the last few weeks.

3. He was kept with Capt J.W. Evans (A) B+88130, Flat 16 2nd B.H.R., 1st 4th Force, Foggia, (Taylor's Division 14) - after a long period of high temperature, probably due to the above.

4. He was taken to hospital in Foggia on 23rd May 1944. He was admitted to 11th General Hospital, Bradenton (Daleton) on 24th May 1944.

5. On 25th May 2" of his sputum was sent for examination (Primary Mycobacterium). He was placed on the antibiotic, seriously ill but made steady progress until 18th when he had a severe mental operation, blood transfusion, and died at 10.45 hrs on 20th May 1944.

6. A post mortem examination was held by Major Ross and the cause of death was given as:-

- (a) PNEUMO-PNEUMONIA
- (b) PNEUMOCOCCAL ENCEPHALITIS
- (c) GANGRENE OF THE LUNG.

Hospital at Foggia, from whence he was later transferred to 71st General Hospital, Barletta, suffering from pneumonia.
4. On 6th. May, 1944 he was operated on to drain fluid from the left lung, and made steady progress until 17th. May when a second operation was necessary. His condition deteriorated, and in spite of two blood transfusions, he died at 10.45 hours on 20th. May, 1944.
5. The Post Mortem examination revealed the cause of death as:
 - (a) Pleuro-pneumonia,
 - (b) bacilliemic pneumonia,
 - (c) gangrene of lung.
6. Col. Fairman is interred at Grove No. 1.7, Military P 53, Civil Cemetery, Barletta, which is situated on the main Foggia Road, about one mile outside Barletta, overlooking the sea. 1. Reference Region 3 HQ letter No. C-2/Labour/1(143) of 25 May, 1944.

2. As regards the inscription of Subject in the Fascist Party, as will be appreciated, it was not possible to enter for examinations without being so inscribed.

3. Subject's promotion in the Istituto di Previdenza Sociale was by competitive examination open also to his colleagues.

4. As regards his seniority in the Party, the following is the true story and it contradicts any suggestion that seniority was obtained through Fascist sympathies, Fascist convictions or bribery. In 1929, Subject completed his military service as a Carabinieri at the Royal Palace in Rome and wished to obtain employment in the Archives Office of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. For this purpose, inscription in the Party was necessary, it being the law that no person could obtain State employment without being so inscribed. Subject therefore attempted to have himself inscribed in the Party in Rome, but was unsuccessful because new inscriptions into the Party were blocked in that year. Subject therefore went back to his home town, Salerno, and had himself inscribed in the Party on the grounds that in 1922 (at the age of 15 years) he had been an Avanti-Guardista (a type of Boy Scout). He then got the job in the Archives Office.

5. I suggest that in taking this action, Subject did only what a person of common sense would do to get himself a job after his term of three years in the Army and there is decidedly no evidence of bribery, opportunism nor strong Fascist sympathies.

6. Subject was never a Squasista.

1. Reference is made to your verbal inquiry on 24 May 1944 regarding Subject.
2. Your attention is drawn to page 51 of the "Ruoli di Anzianita' del Personale" Situazione al 31 Dicembre 1941, (aggiornata all'8 aprile 1942) in which you will observe that Dott. Silvio CAMPIONE is quoted as "P.M.F. Ant. 28-10-1922: n.5, p.23.
3. As you will appreciate, the above quoted reference book is official and Dott. Silvio CAMPIONE is listed therein (N. d'ordine 88) as a "Segretario (Grade VII)".
4. Irrespective of any other information which may be available, I am of the opinion that, although, as you suggested, he was born on 1 April 1907 and therefore was only 15 at the time of the March on Rome, the fact that he received (or obtained) seniority in his Fascist membership as of 1922, suggests one of two things; either that his Fascist sympathies were very strong and he received his seniority in recognition of his services to Fascism, or that he contrived to obtain such seniority through his Fascist connections, or possibly-although there is no tangible evidence, through bribery of one kind or another. In either case, he would appear to have been an opportunist and doubtless used his seniority for his own purpose.
5. In this connection, an official report from the Questura dated 8 May 1944 states, that amongst other things, he contrived to obtain the seniority and the squadrist classification through Fascist gerarchi. This is borne out by para 2.
6. I have no doubt that Dott. CAMPIONE will submit many reasons to justify the fact that he was so inscribed but the fact remains that under Regional Order of 1 January 1944, No. 1, he was and is liable to dismissal.
7. Meanwhile, independent investigations are being made but it would seem to be quite clear that any action that may have been taken was based on perfectly legitimate grounds.

In answer to your No. SC. 768 of 26th ulto and further to our letters Nos. 519/FO and 494/FO of 21st and 7th August, respectively: From an examination of the above ex-Majors' dossier, the following fundamental points appear:

1. (a) Active (Permanent) Service Colonel of M.V.S.M., Milmart Section, he virtually ceased to belong to this Corps of 8.12.43 date it was disbanded in accordance with Law No. 16/B of 6.12.43, published on the Official Gazette on 8.12.43:

From 17th. November GARGANO had been appointed to Marinarmi for the recovery of I.R.N. materials, and when Milmart was disbanded he was charged too with supervising the ex Milmart Offices and Cooperating with the new Royal Corps of Maritime Defense Gunners, which was to absorb ex-Milmart Personnel, as provided for by Law.

(b) On 28th June last, this Ministry (Personnel Dept.) in its gradual application of the above Law 16/B, arranged for GARGANO, to return to the R. Ital. Army as from 1st July with the rank of Major, the actual return dating from 15th July as GARGANO was in Rome on duty and later convalescing.

(c) On 3rd August, in letter No. 1923 the War Ministry desobilized GARGANO as he had engaged in active politics during the Fascist Regime.

In view of the above, The Ministry, as already pointed out, does not wish to interest itself in the Officer in Question save of course in regard to his activities while attached to I.R.N.

In this respect, it must be said that GARGANO, very satisfactorily carried out his duties with Marinarmi in that he allowed I.R.N. to salvage much material from the disbanded Milmart organization.

In regard, however, to his Fascist past, it is mentioned that the Vice Chief of Allied Police in Rome has informed that GARGANO, knowing himself guilty of many acts against non-sympathisers with the ex-Fascist Party, will probably be in possession of false papers to escape and elude capture.

1. Following receipt of references and data from other sources considerable correspondence has been entered into with the Ministry of Marine on subject.

2. To date little information beyond that given in reference (b) has been received about subject's past activities. The Ministry of Marine informed us on 6 July 1944, that defascistiation proceedings were initiated against Gargano and that he was sent to the Army Reorganization Centre at Lecce on 1 July. However he was seen in Rome later in July. Further check with Ministry of Marine brought reply on 7 August that due to a postal misdirection, Gargano delayed presenting himself to the Ministry of War until 15 July when he was discharged and presumably reverted to his earlier status of retired Major in the Army.

3. We are awaiting further report from Ministry of Marine on Gargano's activities but are writing your Sub-Commission since Gargano has apparently been able to continue his activities and movements with facility until 15 July and is now under your jurisdiction. We will apprise you of any new data we receive and will be glad to place our files on subject at your disposal.

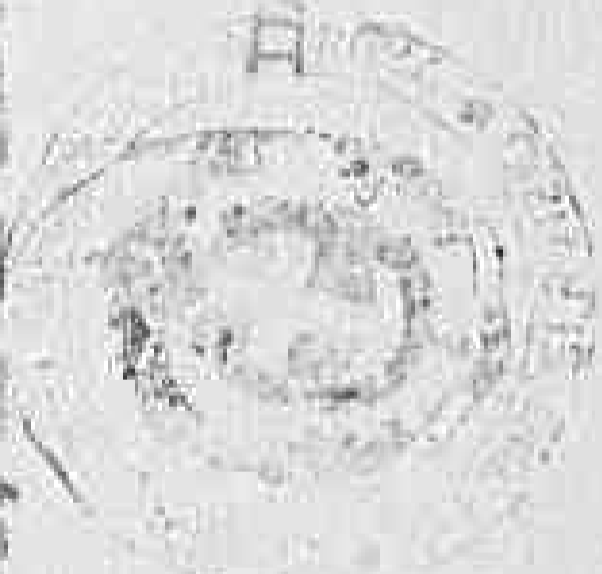

SUBJECT : GARGANO Francesco son of Paolo and Gandolfo Caterina, born on the 5/5/97 in S.Maria Palermo, living in Rome via Sanb'Aradam, I.

Francesco Gargano, wearing the uniform of Captain of Cruiser, was seen in Rome in a car numbered R.M.10016 and driven by a military of the Royal Navy.

Francesco Gargano is a "aquarista", he was consul of M.V.C.N., under chief of S.M. MILIXIA C., chief of S.M. MILPARI, director of the "Revolution Show", one of the owners of the newspaper "Tevere" and it seems that he belonged also to the "OVRA".

He started with nothing a few years ago, now he possesses a conspicuous fortune and it is not known in which way he earned it. After the 25th of July 1943 he was denounced to the Commission for illicit enrichments.

In the same period he went away from Rome to South Italy, and came back only on the 1 July 1944 having the charge to buy for two millions Lire of motor car material for the Ministry of the Navy.

He is also chief of the "Committee for the Recovery of Sicilia, Calabria, Puglia, Campania", and now he does everything in order to have also the "Lazio" put under his jurisdiction.

It results, at last, that the above mentioned is not Captain of Cruiser but only a retired Major of the Army.

In Rome, where his political proceedings are well known, his return as an officer of the Navy has provoked a great surprise. The fact that he can circulate freely and with the permission of the Allies, who perhaps are not inclined of his previous activity, gave ground to not very favourable comments.

1. The presence in Palermo a few days ago of the ex-Consigli of Fascist Militia, CARGANO FRANCESCO, was observed. He was wearing the uniform of an Italian Naval Officer. He is said to have arrived on the Italian Naval vessel "Abbazia" commanded by Admiral BOBBIERI.

2. It is reported that Cargano was in possession of a permit and other documents issued by Allied Authorities and that the object of his visit to Sicily was in connection with the salvage of material which previously belonged to the fascist coastal battery formation "Mihart".

3. Cargano is described as a rabid fascist and is alleged to have held important posts in the fascist hierarchy which enabled him to accumulate a considerable fortune. He is declared to be an intimate collaborator of Mussolini.

4. It is said that Cargano was the organizer of the fascist "Nostra della Rivoluzione" of which he became President. For two years he was a judge of the special tribunal and it is suspected that he was a member of the C.V.I.V.

5. The foregoing is communicated for any further investigation which may be considered advisable as locally Cargano's connection with the Italian Navy is thought to be suspicious and undesirable.

The Prefect's name is LI VOTI and not MICHELI as mentioned in your letter M/35/40 of 19 March '44. Sig. LI VOTI started his political career in 1921 as Vice Prefetto at Gallipoli where he functioned under the care of the famous leader of the Fascist Party, one Sturace, whose birthplace is Gallipoli.

In July 1943 when the Mussolini regime fell, LI VOTI was the Prefect of ASTI and retained his appointment owing to his friendship with Marshal Badoglio whose birthplace is ASTI.

In July 1943 LI VOTI came to Bari as Prefect.

There is evidence to show that LI VOTI was definitely anti Allies, and he showed it in different ways, as for instance on the 8th September (Armistice Day) four Italians, risking reprisals by the Germans, approached LI VOTI. These four Italians (civilians) were Altomere Matteo, Ippolito Girolamo, Sanchiute Eugenio and Cifarrelli Michele, and they requested Livoti to indicate to them in what way they could organize the army and civilians to act contrary to German interests.

Along with the Prefect Livoti, was a Colonel Giarvazzo of the Carabinieri, who was the individual responsible for the massacre of 15000 Ethiopians following an attempt on the life of Graziani at Addis Abeba.

Iivoti is a Sicilian & therefore a record of his past is not easily obtainable here, but there is a Doctor Craveri, who is at present in Naples, and he is in a position to give information about this Prefect.

Dr. Craveri is the son-in-law of Benedetto Croce, who is a well known leader in Naples.

The Vice Prefect, Bari, is a sig. Bellisario who is a very ardent Fascist & Squadrist and acts as an advisor to Iivoti.

Sig. Bellisario is also reported to be acting as liaison between Iivoti and a sig. I. Di Stefano, federale, who was Mayor of Bari town until August 1943.

In the Gazzetta del Mezzogiorno of July 1943, sig. D'Alario published an article advocating strong resistance to the Allied Forces, he was subsequently arrested at Trevisi, but after a few days was released.

It is reported that he is in hiding in Bari and through his relatives, gives directives to Livati.

The Quersone Disalvita is involved with these people and it is leading to a separate report about him as I am satisfied he is by no means pro the Allied in-terests.

Now as regards my own experience of the protest Livati, I am convinced that he is not working in the interests of the Allied and is not co-operating.

He has always shown us the greatest respect and shown willingness to do all that is asked of him, and yet I have had reports from Allied Military Operations which endorse the claim I have formed of him that Livati is not in sympathy with Allied interests and I strongly urge that he be removed from his office here as prefect of Bari. I am quite satisfied in my own mind that he is working against to our own interests and has therefore a bad influence over other officials, and his administration is not efficient.
