1. We are informed by the Security Division, Public Safety Administration of the A.C.C., that inquiries by the C.I.S. with the aim of securing evidence and witnesses for the prosecution of VERONICO have proved fruitless.

2. It is therefore our decision that VERONICO Jaigi will be released from 371 P.F. Camp to his home, since he is considered to be of no danger to our security.

1. Reference is made to letter AAI/1479/3/GSI(b) of 31st July 44.
2. The above named was sent to 371 P.O.W. Camp on 14 Jun 44 having been arrested by 11 Odn F.S.S. on 31 May 44 at Pontecorvo, Frosinone. The arrest slip stated: -

"MELOCARO Luigi, arrested by 11 Odn F.S.S. on 31 May 44 at PONTECORVO (Prov.FROSINONE). This man was imprisoned for theft and later escaped. He killed a man named SANTA PIETRO Benedetto. GERMANS were using him as an informant gathering information on hidden stores etc. which the civilians were endeavouring to hide."
3. Enquiries have been made by the Carabinieri and a copy of their reply (attached) shows that there is no possibility of obtaining witnesses to warrant charging MELOCARO with any offence.
4. In these circumstances, therefore, it is suggested that he be released.

SUBJECT: MELOCCARO Massimo Luigi
ALL'ACC. = FIUGGI.

The a/m MELOCCARO born in Pontecorvo, plundered, during German occupation, many houses devastated by bombing. That happened about January 1944. SANTOPIETRO Benedette, who helped him with the looting, was found murdered the first days of February.

The Allied Police, together with Finance Guard GIORDANO Vincenzo and Vice Brigadier CC.RR. CERQUETTA Pietro, proceeded to arrest MELOCCARO, who was brought to Allied Command for being questioned. The original record of said questioning is still in the hands of the Allied Police.

It was however impossible to obtain from further investigations such elements which might prove that MELOCCARO murdered Santopietro.

The lack of any concrete evidence renders therefore impossible to try the a/m Meleccaro

Il nominato MELOCCARO Massimo Luigi fu Giovanni Battista e di Paolozzi Maria Giuseppe, nato il 30/10/1910 a Pontecorvo, durante il periodo dell'occupazione tedesca, e cioè verso la fine di gennaio 1944, si aggirava per l'abitato e campagna di Pontecorvo commettendo saccheggi nelle case devastate dai bombardamenti. A lui si era uniti il Santopietro Benedetto, il quale, verso i primi del mese di febbraio, fu trovato ucciso.

Successivamente la polizia alleata, con l'ausilio dell'appuntato della R. Guardia di Finanza Vincenzo e del Vice Brigadiere dei cc.rr. Cerquetta Pietro, procedettero all'arresto del Meloccare. Dalla stessa Polizia Alleata, venne tradotto al comando alleato ove venne redatto il relativo verbale d'arresto. Questo venne firmato dalla stessa Polizia Alleata, dai predetti graduati e dal Sindaco di Pontecorvo Dott. DUMANO Ernesto.

Il verbale in originale rimase nelle mani della Polizia Alleata. Dalle indagini successivamente esperite non è stato possibile raccogliere elementi o testimonianze per accertare chi sia stato l'autore dell'uccisione del Santopietro.

Pertanto, allo stato delle cose, non vi sono elementi di prova tali per poter portare in giudizio il Meloccare in oggetto.

1. The a/n, home address Via Placido 44, ATINA, Frosinone Province, was arrested by 2nd S.S. Div. P.S.D. on the 1 June 44, age 53, a Timber Merchant, is now detained at this Camp. Arrest Report states, "The above Italian, who was commandante of M.V.S.N. at ATINA, and a Recruit of the year 1923, held the rank of Ten. Col. M.V.S.N. and Major in Carabinieri. Documents found when his house was searched included a complete list of members of the Milizia in Atina, Balotano-Castello, St. Lin, Vallelusa, Vallarotonda, Valverdi, Capulatio, Pietriscio, Villa Latina, San Biagio, Cardito. This list was handed to 10 Corps P.S.D. other docs found are att. and photograph. 2. Four rifles, two hand grenades (1 in) and a considerable quantity of ammo was found in an attic in AMATO's house. Although he had been seen reading proclamations he stated he had not seen any prosa. re arms."

Recommendation, "Subject to further interrogation and depending on 8th Army Policy".

2. It would appear from the Arrest Report that the a/n committed a definite offense against the A. G. Proclamations, we should like your recommendations as to disposal, no term of internment is shown on the Arrest Report.

1. Security Branch AGO have forwarded to this in a copy of your letter 21/317 dated 2 Jun 44 concerning the above.

2. As these men were originally accused to civil crimes an endeavour has been made to trace the original statements of evidence made by 11 Cdn P.S.S., G.I. and Guardia di Finanza, PORTUGO (now PRIZIBIE) so that a prosecution can be brought.

3. These statements cannot now be traced. It has therefore been decided that PORTO Antonio should be released, as he has already been confined for a period of 2 months.

4. The crime alleged to have been committed by MELGARO Inigi, is however of a more serious nature. The details given on the arrest form are as follows.

MELGARO Inigi, arrested by 11 Cdn P.S.S. on 31 May 44 at PORTUGO (now PRIZIBIE). This man was imprisoned for theft and later escaped. He killed a man named SAURA PIETRO Benedetto. G.I. were using him as an informant gathering information on hidden stores etc. which the civilians were endeavouring to hide.

5. The most serious element in the above is that of the alleged killing. It is therefore suggested that you communicate in the first instance with the appropriate Public Safety Division who should be asked to make enquiries in PORTUGO with a view to establishing whether or not sufficient evidence or witnesses can now be found in order to bring this man to trial. If this is so, will you please arrange for his disposal to the appropriate authority.

6. If, however, it seems that no prosecution can be brought, it is suggested that MELGARO be released subject to any restrictions that the Public Safety Division may think fit to impose.

2. It is suggested that the proper procedure would now be for 3 District to deliver these men to the custody of the Italian authorities at Grosinone and inform the Provincial Police Officer, 1.1.1. at the time of delivery.

3. It is pointed out that the statements of the C.4.P.2. and Guardia Finanza and of the 11 Cdn. P. are not necessary the prisoners. These statements seem to have gone astray between 326 and 3.1 P.2. Camps.

4. It is requested that you issue instructions to the parties concerned as it would be worse than useless to turn over these prisoners to the Provincial Police Officer at Grosinone without the necessary evidence.

1. The a/n internees arrived at this Camp on 14 Jun 44 from 325 P.W. Camp.

2. The reason for arrest as given on Arrest Form is as follows:-

(a) SELOCARO Luigi - Arrested by 11 Cdn. FSS on 31 May 44 at PONTECORVO, Grosinone.

"This man was imprisoned for theft and later escaped. He killed a man named SANTA PIETRO Benedetto. Germans were using him as an informant gathering information on hidden stores to which the civilians were endeavouring to hide. Statement by C.C.RR and Guardia Finanza attached. This man should be turned over to SCAPO (Grosinone Prov) as there are no jail facilities in these small towns, all being wrecked".

Recommendation - Trial by AMG Court.

(b) POMPEI Antonio - Arrested by 11 Cdn. FSS on 31 May 44 at PONTECORVO, Grosinone.

"Statement attached by C.C.RR and Guardia Finanza that the above collaborated with the Germans and looted houses after evacuation of town. No jail facilities at present in forward area for holding in jail pending trial as all jails have been demolished".

Recommendation - For AMG trial and sentence.

3. The statements referred to above are not at this Camp.

4. It is requested that instructions be forwarded regarding the disposal of these internees.

1. With reference to your letter of the 8th, and 18th June 44, careful study has been made of the case of IRACE Camillo, but in spite of his present state of health, G.S.I.(b) A.A.I. appear to still consider both him and his son Guiseppe who is also detained a potential source of danger to our military security if released, and it is not considered that any useful purpose would be served in re-opening the case. Especially in the light of recent policy communications. They are both recommended for internment for the duration of hostilities.

2. In the case of MARCIANO Armando the documents have also been carefully studied. C.I.C. have recommended his internment for the duration of hostilities, and their recommendation is backed by a very complete report of his activities. The Reviewing board are of the opinion that nothing can be done to obtain this man's release unless some really strong counter information can be produced supported by creditable witnesses.

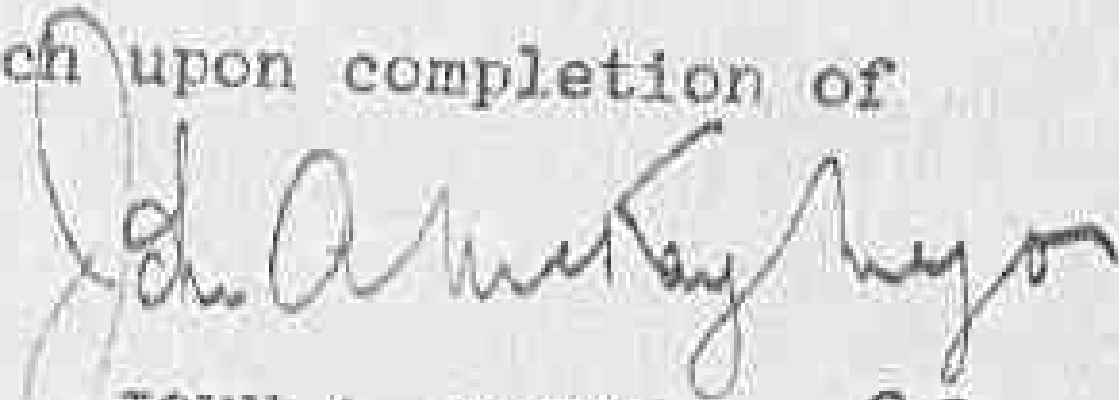

1. Ref your Memo of 2 June 44 respecting petition for release of a/n internee.

2. Little information was available at this Camp and further information has now been supplied by HQ 2 District.

3. Extracts from the reports are given below:

(a) Lived in USA for 20 years to 1920. Has restaurant on Coney Island, belonged to famous New York "Black Hand Gang" was caught and sentenced by U.S. authorities but escaped and returned to Italy. Arrested in Italy in 1920 for violence and jailed; in 1921 for unauthorised possession of arms and resisting arrest; 1922 for assault; in 1925 for shooting and assault and unlawful possession of arms. In 1932 he was sentenced for "graft" whilst holding a public appointment. Joined P.N.F. 1922, was nominated "squadristi" for his Fascist merits and collaboration with the party in 1940. Is now head of local black market. Is very anti-British and a known Fascist, is also a reputed receiver of stolen goods. His part in an anti-British incident is mentioned in XSY/1/4. 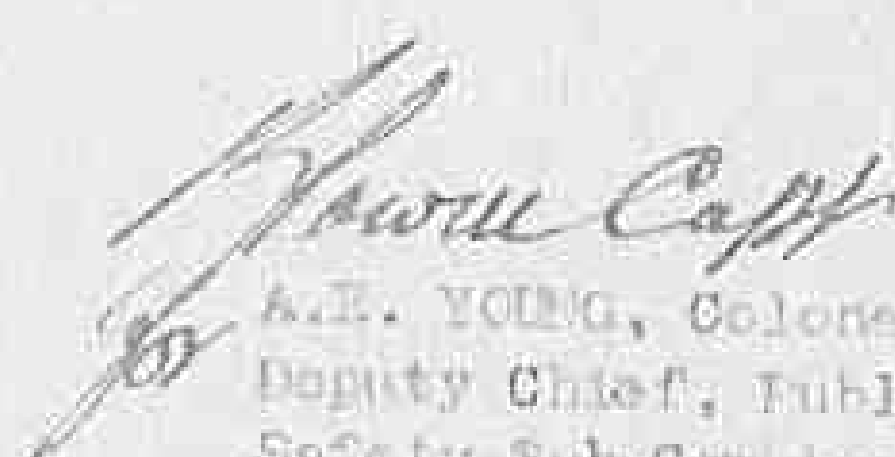

My dear Mr. Reber,

I should appreciate it if you would be kind enough to submit the following case to the Headquarters of the Allied Control Commission to which it is probably already known.

When the Allied entered Naples, two of my compatriots, the brothers Renato and Carlo G u g g e n h e i m, were arrested. As far as I am informed, Renato Guggenheim has been transferred to the concentration camp of Aversa while his brother Carlo has been allowed to live at home on the condition to report weekly to the American Police. He is however not allowed to go after his profession and is therefore hindered to earn his life.

As concerns Renato Guggenheim, it seems that he was interrogated the last time on April 4th and that there was some question of releasing him off the camp. It does not appear however that a decision has been taken in this case up to now.

I do not know exactly of what the brothers Guggenheim are accused. It seems that the fact of keeping Renato in the camp during more than 9 months without his bringing up to trial is not consistent with the United States and British policy in matter of penal procedure and I would appreciate it very much if now that nearly nine months have elapsed since the arrest of both brothers, their case could be reexamined.

I trust that the Allied Police have the possibilities of controlling the activities of Messrs. Guggenheim even if they are allowed to return home.

For purpose of identification I join to his letter a communication which the C.I.C. Section of Naples addressed on November 5th, 1943 to M. Ernesto Guggenheim, father.

1. The Bishop of Termoli and his staff know nothing of the illicit use made by FERRETTI of the Bishop's notepaper and episcopal stamp for the preparation of the forged passes.
2. Even after skilful ecclesiastical interrogation it is still in doubt whether this man is an ordained priest or not. The Bishop is of the opinion that he is NOT but F.S.O. and Fr. PATUI tend to the view that he was in fact ordained. Certain unusual practices which he adopts when celebrating mass are explained by him as being part of the Ambrosian Rite, an unusual but valid form of mass, but his statement that he was suspended "in perpetuum" for political activity is stated by both the Bishop and Fr. PAUTI to be false beyond doubt.
3. FERRETTI is undoubtedly unbalanced, fanatical, a dabbler in dangerous political matters, irreligious and probably homosexual.
4. He explains his effort to cross the lines as being due to his desire to return to his own home and organise anti-Fascist and anti-German activity but he has no excuse to offer for forging the passes.

He admits he believes in Fascism and lamented its fall in July 1943. Was chief accountant of Intendenza di Finanza Office, Campobasso and was connected with the liquidation of Fascist funds and assets. When questioned about the distribution of L. 380,000 to Fascist officials (see file of COSTABILE) in September 1943 he claimed this was done in accordance with telegraphic and mailed instructions from Finance Minister BATOLINI (?), he showed much concern on this matter. In view of his Fascist record and actions since 25 July 43 we do not recommend his release.

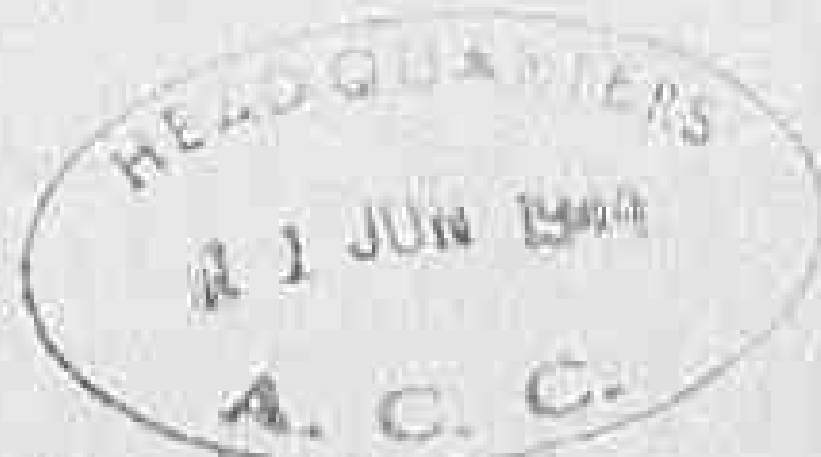

2. I think the whole position is that at Oxford FOLIGNO was very much a personality, but now he is back in his own country he is neither important nor dangerous.

1. As directed, investigations have been made concerning the bona fides of the above named from a security point of view, the following result :-

2. Foligno, who was born in Milan on 15th May, 1878 was from 1909 to 1940 Professor of Italian at Oxford University, and upon his return to Italy became the Professor of English literature at Naples University.

3. He joined the Fascist Party in 1932, but has held no office in the Party. Whilst in England he is said to have supported and been a propagandist of the Fascist party, and to have used his influence to prevent non Fascist Italians from gaining University positions. At the entry of Italy into this War, Foligno was interned, but subsequently returned to Italy with the Embassy staff.

4. Enquiries have been made of four of his former pupils who are now with the British Army in Italy, and with one exception, they refer to him as a good man who can be trusted not to indulge in anti-British propaganda or acts against the Allies. The other states that Foligno was a Fascist and supported the Fascist party.

5. Enquiries have also been made of a well known anti Fascist, Professor Omodeo, the present Minister of Education, and in addition the President of the Epuration Commission in Italy. He states that Foligno was said to have been a Fascist in England, and upon his return to Italy said that England was going to lose the War. Professor referred to this as a realistic view, judged from the subject's impression of events in England before his departure, and not so much a result of political wishful thinking. His thirty years in England had given him much of the British "self depreciation" manner, and he adversely criticised the English social set up, and other things, much in the same

manner as Swift, Byron and G.B. Shaw. Professor Omodeo did not regard this as of special importance, nor did he regard him as likely to be dangerous from an Allied point of view. He added that Foligno did not feel too much at home in Italy after his long stay in England, and said that he had no knowledge of any anti-British acts or propaganda on the part of the Subject.

6. When interviewed by Lieutenant Fehr of this Branch, Foligno freely admitted that he had joined the Fascist party and concurred with their sentiments. As he was, and had been for some time, living in England, he only had a theoretical knowledge of the doctrine, and he was convinced, as an Italian, that it was the right thing for Italy. When sanctions were imposed on Italy as a result of the Abyssinian campaign, he says that he felt it very strongly, and as an Italian he adopted the Italian view point. He denied that he ever expressed any political views in class, and the only expression of opinion he did make was privately, which he felt anyone was entitled to do. Upon his return to Italy, when he saw how Fascism worked in practice, he realized that it was not the proper solution to Italy's troubles, as it was being badly administered.

7. The Questura records reveal nothing derogatory to Foligno from our point of view, in fact they have little information concerning him, and none of Fascist nature.

8. Foligno married in England a woman who was his landlady, and this has resulted in a certain amount of ostracism which both he and his wife felt very keenly. Their daughter was born in England, but has retained her Italian nationality. His wife states that she does not teach English to Allied officers, but does instruct some Italians in the English language. The daughter is employed in the Claims and Hirings Department of the office of the Town Major of Naples, and gives assistance at Courts Martial. She has discharged her duties very satisfactorily, and has given no cause for suspicion. Both these ladies are homesick for England, having left all their friends there.

9. At the age of 66, and being very deaf, with half of his life in England, I cannot regard Professor Foligno as a danger to Allied Security. He seems to have been under the theoretical spell of Fascism in its early days, and at the time of the sanctions, envisaged the return of Italy to its full former glory. The bubble having been completely exploded, I am convinced that this man would not endeavour to engineer its return. From a security point of view therefore, there seems no reason to remove him from his post.

10. Lt. Vella, of the Education Sub-Commission, has personal knowledge of the Professor and concurs in the opinion that he does not constitute a danger if he retains his chair at the Naples University.

1. Reference is made to Interior Sub-Commissioner's letter dated 5 June 1944, (Ref:- ACC/4/1/35/INT.) and your indorsement thereon dated 7 June 1944.

2. The following information dated 10 June 1944 (Evaluation B-3) has been received:-

a. Dott. Giacinto SAGGESE was a Commissioner of the Pubblica Sicurezza (not Questore) at the Questura of Naples.

b. He was a member of the P.N.F. but, it is claimed, only to enable him to remain in service with the P.S. There are indications, however, that he was in touch with anti-Fascists, expressed anti-Fascist sentiments and attended anti-Fascist meetings. Immediately following the dissolution of the P.N.F., he made contact with several anti-Fascists in the Naples area.

c. He resides at Via S. Caterina da Siena No. 39, but originates from S. Angelo del Lombardi. He is married to a school-teacher and is understood to own a certain amount of property.

d. It transpires that he is not "persona grata" with LAURICELLA who had him dismissed on the charge that he had failed to attend office in regulation uniform which was typically Fascist.

e. So far as has been ascertained, Dott. SAGGESE is professionally capable and there appears to be no doubt as to his moral integrity.

3. If further information is required, every effort will be made to get it on advice from you.

1. Reference your AM 311.5/140 U

2. Enquiry made at Naples revealed that
Mongelli had returned to Rome. Accordingly
the investigation was passed to Rome Region.

3. It has now been ascertained that Mon-
gelli did make the double journey without a
permit. The communications carried by him were
entirely of a private and commercial nature
and do not involve any breach of security.

4. I am not proceeding with the obvious
charge of travelling without a permit, as I
feel it would be entirely unfair to select one
individual for prosecution.

5. Unauthorized civilian traffic between
Rome and Naples has reached fantastic proportions
owing to the failure of the security services
(C.I.G.) to perform the task allotted to them.
I also understand that notices of a similar
nature have been posted in the Rome area. For
this reason I regard the prosecution of Mongel-
li as unjustified.

6. This Division is making every effort to
check this unauthorized traffic. Co-operation
of C.I.G. has proved an utter failure and I
have taken over the task of organizing check
it.

SUBJECT: Captain CURCIO.

TO : Political Section.

1. With reference to the your memorandum of 12th June, 1944, Captain Curcio was interviewed in respect to his wishing to return to Rome, and the following is his story, which cannot be disproved or confirmed by any documents in our files.

2. His full name is Rocco CURCIO, born 9th June, 1918, and is in possession of Italian passport No. 2592248. At the time of the Armistice in France he was Liaison Officer between the 4th Italian Army and the German Army in Avignon. While in this capacity he confiscated defence plans for Southern France, and these he has given to Colonel De Young, vice-Military attache, at Berne, (Thunershofse 29) Switzerland. Colonel De Young is an American, and Curcio says he offered his services to the American Forces. He was given several missions to see the partisans in Northern Italy, and to find possible spies in an Italian camp at Murat in Switzerland. He stressed that throughout he has not obtained any financial reward for his services, being satisfied with expenses.

3. He mentioned the names of General West, (B) at Berne, Mr. Farrol of Intelligence Service (B) at Geneva, who issued him with false documents, and a Mr. Johns from the American Consulate, took him to the frontier. He travelled via Milan, where he got into touch with the partisans, and reported as requested to S.I.M. He arrived in Rome on 29th May, 1944 and contacted the American Charge D'Affaires at the atican; Mr. Harold Tittman. After the fall of Rome he contacted the Supreme Command of the Italian Army, and through them arranged a permit to come to Naples. This has been confiscated, as it was quite properly issued by an officer who is known to me personally, but it has fulfilled its purpose, and it is no longer valid.

4. Captain Curcio has requested that Colonel De Young be apprized of his safe arrival in Naples.

5. It is not possible to have a permit issued for Capt. Curcio's return to Rome at this stage, but he will try again in about a week.

A Captain Curcio has recently telephoned Ambassador Kirk, United States Representative on the Advisory Council for Italy; and has said that he had arrived recently in Naples from Switzerland, via Milan and Rome. Apparently he left Switzerland some time in May.

Captain Curcio, who is not known to Mr. Kirk, gave him purported news of various American diplomatic officers in Bern, and also said that he had seen the American Charge d'Affaires at the Vatican. He apparently plans to return to Rome.

Mr. Kirk would be glad to receive, through the Political Section, any information which you may have about Captain Curcio.

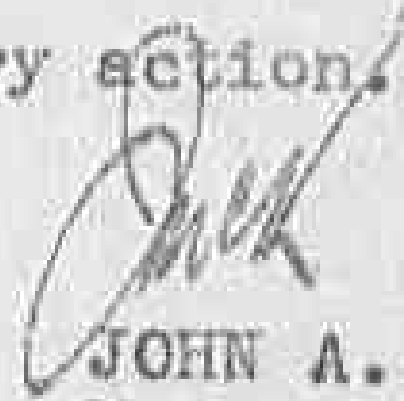

1. This H.Q. policy regarding the internment of German nationals is contained in RAI/1401/7/GSI(b) dated 8 Jul 44, copy of which is attached for convenience of reference.
2. It will be noted that in accordance with the above instruction civilians of German nationality will normally be interned as a security precaution, but that certain mitigating factors will be taken into consideration.
3. The case of SCITTELL Francesco appears to be a borderline one. It will in due course be reviewed at 371 P.W. Camp in the light of the principles laid down in the above-mentioned instruction and it is suggested that a decision on the case should be delayed until the findings of the reviewing board are received.

SUBJECT : SCHNELL Francesca.

1. This woman is a German subject, aged 60, who has lived 36 years in Italy, 14 of which she spent in the home of S.E. De Nicola, Corso Umberto 36, Naples, employed as De Nicola's house-keeper.
2. De Nicola tells me that when the Allied forces arrived in Naples some eight months ago he personally went to the Questura to tell them that he had this German subject in his home and suggested that she be sent off to some small hotel in the country where she would be safe.
3. He was subsequently advised by the Questura that the American Security officials had recommended that she remain in his home. Since that day eight months ago she has never left his house night or day.
4. Yesterday British Security Police came to his home and removed Miss Schnell to a detention camp at PADULA.
5. De Nicola says that if there is any good reason why the woman should be removed to a detention camp at this time he would be the first to agree. He is convinced, however, that she is violently anti-Nazi and absolutely harmless. He feels that her removal is due to a change of security command and wishes you to know what according to his view a action such as this is a political error.
6. De Niccla asked me to ignore his personal interest in this case and bring it to your attention from the broader political aspect. He did not ask for you to intercede personally but I am sure he would be very grateful if you would.

He was made a fascist by decree in May 1926, but never held any office in the Party. ZANFRAMUNDO is regarded as unpopular with a majority of the citizens both because he is strict and because of his 20 day absence from 14 September to 3 October 1943. The people feel he deserted them during the trying days of the bombardment."

1. The a/m was arrested on 27 Nov 43 at S. Maria C.V. and recommended internment for duration.
2. A note attached to arrest slip states:-
"A criminal who tried to make profit from Fascism and since from the Allies on the strength of having been expelled from the Party (for his criminal activities). Strongly pro-German propagandist and friendly with the Germans prior to arrival of Allies. Gave false information which under interrogation he admitted was false. Accused by Director of Goal of bringing Germans to the goal to loot it. Friend of PALABUOLA. Boasted in the Gladiator that he had connections in the PWS and AMG and would have the club closed."

3. A petition was presented by his wife for his release, this contained information regarding her husband and C.I.C. Fifth Army were requested to make enquiries with view to verification.

4. C.I.C. report dated 23 May 44 is now to hand and confirms more or less the wife's statement as under:-

- (i) SALVI did assist Carabinieri to capture one German at S. Maria C.V. on 5 Oct 43;
- (ii) the goal was not looted, confirmed by late Podesta and Adolfo LOCE, Director of S. Maria Goal;
- (iii) on one occasion when grain was sold a Carabinieri was instructed to observe the sale in plain clothes and report - his report was to the effect that the sale was properly conducted.
- (iv) the Director of the Goal denies receiving L. 130,000 from SALVI and giving receipt - this is a misunderstanding by C.I.C. Agent; the Director referred to is the Director of Consorzio Agrario Provinciale di Napoli and a duplicate receipt for this amount is now in our possession at 371 P.W. Camp.

2. A note attached to arrest slip states:-

"A criminal also tried to make profit from fascism and since from the Allies on the strength of having been expelled from the Party (for his criminal activities). Strongly pro-German propagandist and friendly with the Germans prior to arrival of Allies. Gave false information which under interrogation he admitted was false. Accused by Director of Deal of bringing Germans to the goal to loot it. Friend of SALVEMIA. Boasted in the Gladiator that he had connections in the FSS and AMG and would have the club closed."

3. A petition was presented by his wife for his release, this contained information regarding her husband and C.I.C. Fifth Army were requested to make enquiries with view to verification.

4. C.I.C. report dated 23 May 44 is now to hand and confirms more or less the wife's statement as under:-

(i) SALVI did assist Garabiniere to capture one German at S.Maria G.V. on 5 Oct 43;

(ii) the goal was not looted, confirmed by late Podesta and Adolfo LOCE, Director of S.Maria goal;

(iii) on one occasion when grain was sold a Garabiniere was instructed to observe the sale in plain clothes and report - his report was to the effect that the sale was properly conducted.

(iv) the Director of the goal denies receiving L.130,000 from SALVI and giving receipt - this is a misunderstanding by C.I.C. Agent; the Director referred to is the Director of Consorzio Agrario Provinciale di Napoli and a duplicate receipt for this amount is now in our possession at 371 P.W.Camp.

5. SALVI states that in 1924 he was charged with a bankruptcy offence and sentenced to 2½ years imprisonment, he successfully appealed but was discharged from the Party. This statement cannot be confirmed here.

6. The report that SALVI attended at the goal with a Garabiniere and two Germans to collect olive oil was possibly done on the instructions of his superiors and is not significant unless it is known that he freely collaborated in excess of his duties.

7. SALVI's alleged questionable official activities is a matter which should have been dealt with elsewhere and in the absence of more conclusive information cannot be regarded as a reason for his internment.

8. This man has been interned since 27 Nov 43 and from the evidence available to us, it is the opinion of the reviewing officers that he cannot now be regarded as a danger to security and his release is recommended subject to confirmation by G.S.I(b), A.A.I.

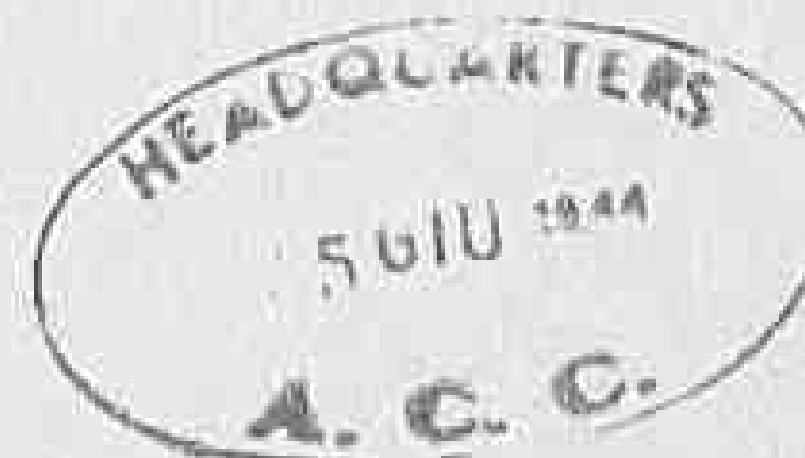

1. Reference Region 3 HQ letter No. C-2/Labour/1(143) of 25 May, 1944.

2. As regards the inscription of Subject in the Fascist Party, as will be appreciated, it was not possible to enter for examinations without being so inscribed.

3. Subject's promotion in the Istituto di Previdenza Sociale was by competitive examination open also to his colleagues.

4. As regards his seniority in the Party, the following is the true story and it contradicts any suggestion that seniority was obtained through Fascist sympathies, Fascist convictions or bribery. In 1929, Subject completed his military service as a Carabinieri at the Royal Palace in Rome and wished to obtain employment in the Archives Office of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. For this purpose, inscription in the Party was necessary, it being the law that no person could obtain State employment without being so inscribed. Subject therefore attempted to have himself inscribed in the Party in Rome, but was unsuccessful because new inscriptions into the Party were blocked in that year. Subject therefore went back to his home town, Salerno, and had himself inscribed in the Party on the grounds that in 1922 (at the age of 15 years) he had been an Avvent-Guardista (a type of Boy Scout). He then got the job in the Archives Office.

5. I suggest that in taking this action, Subject did only what a person of common sense would do to get himself a job after his term of three years in the Army and there is decidedly no evidence of bribery, opportunism nor strong Fascist sympathies.

6. Subject was never a Squadrista.

7. I have inspected documentary evidence in possession of Subject in support of the above and to the effect that he was of great service to the Allies on their landing at Salerno at the risk of his own life.

8. Subject has been very helpful to this Branch in the past and Lt. Alessandrini of Labour Division, who also knows Subject personally, states that Subject has always cooperated to the fullest extent and should not have been discharged.

9. I have known Subject personally since December, 1943 and I am quite convinced that he is a trust-worthy and very pro-Allied person.

6. Subject was never a Squadrista.

7. I have inspected documentary evidence in possession of Subject in support of the above and to the effect that he was of great value to the Allies on their landing at Salerno at the risk of his own life.

8. Subject has been very helpful to this effect in the past and Lt. Alessandrini of Labour Division, who also knows Subject personally, states that Subject has always cooperated to the fullest extent and should not have been discharged.

9. I have known Subject personally since December, 1941 and I am quite convinced that he is a trustworthy and very pre-Ally person.

10. I am satisfied that a grave injustice has been done in causing Subject's dismissal and I recommend, therefore, that a copy of this report be forwarded to the Chief, Labour Division, with the request that the man be re-appointed of Subject, without loss of pay or seniority, be favourably considered.
