the manufacture of rayon. This concern remained the sole
producer until 1918. Its production has risen from 150,000
kilograms (1918) to 150,000,000 kilograms (1939).¹During World War I, Gen. Fiumani commanded the auxiliary
vessel "Alfida" and organized the coastal defense against
submarines, constructing "posti di rifugio" on all the
Tyrrhenian Sea. For this, he was awarded a bronze medal
for Military Valor.As Captain di Corvetta, he directed the service of coastal
defense of the Ministry of the Navy, and then in the Prop-
aganda Office.After the war, he was President of the navigation companies
"Fiumani" and "Lombardi" for the utilization of the mercantile
fleet taken from Austria.¹

Source says they worked in close accord with the Fascist leaders and, through this relationship, succeeded in amassing a substantial fortune. Salvatore and Michele are doctors in Law, while Carlo only completed secondary school. They are all contractors in Rome.

SUMMARY:

The Scalera brothers are primarily building contractors, Carlo Scalera holding the presidency of a construction firm of Rome, of which his brothers are councillors. An interview source reports that they amassed a considerable fortune. Carlo has also been Councillor Delegate of the Immobiliare Meridionale corporation. Michele Scalera owns a film-manufacturing firm and is President of a stone company of Tripoli.

According to the interview source, the brothers supported Fascism and received Fascist honors. Their activity in Africa indicates cooperation with Fascist colonial policy.

SUMMARY: Sebastiani is principally known for his position as special secretary to Il Duce (reported to hold this post from at least 1940 to 1943, probably before this date also). He also has held the post of Consul General in the Fascist Militia, and in 1943 was listed as President of a Section of the Corte dei Conti.

He held positions on the board of directors of several important credit and financing concerns, among them the large insurance company, Istituto Nazionale delle Assicurazioni and the Istituto per il Credito Navale.

Family History: Luigi Quintieri, his father, founded the Bank of Calabria at Cosenza in 1910; he died in 1935. Quinto Quintieri is unmarried; lives with his mother and two unmarried sisters. Two married sisters and their families live on estates in Cosenza; one brother in Spain. Cousin of the Commissioner for Agriculture in the second Badoglio Cabinet, Luciferra.

Education and Work History

Degree in civil engineering, University of Naples.

Immediately entered business with his father, in the Bank of Calabria.

World War I, Lt. of Artillery.

He speaks English, French, Spanish, German and Russian (the last probably only slightly), and has traveled to England (extensively), France, Spain, Iceland, Norway, Germany, Austria, Hungary, Poland, Yugoslavia and the U.S.S.R. (2 months in 1934). He stated that his travel was primarily for pleasure—seeing different people, collecting books, and mountaineering.

1935, President of the Bank of Calabria, Cosenza, succeeding his father in this position. He also inherited many estates in Cosenza Province and is reputed to be one of the largest landowners in Southern Italy. He administers these estates himself, the primary culture is sheep and olives. His pre-war manner of living is described "as four months of the year in Naples, four months in Calabria, and four months traveling abroad."

World War II, served in coastal defense of Naples province; later transferred to Ministry of War in Rome, where he specialized in the recovery of Allied war material. He has the rank of Major.

Political History and Attitudes: Formal member of the Fascist Party, but kept himself quite apart from political life during the regime.

Quintieri is described as an old friend of the King and Badoglio. A monarchist, he is said to have wanted Badoglio to remain Prime Minister until the end of the war. He is close also to De Nicola and Croce, Liberal leaders, and Nolini, the head of the Christian Democrats. He professes liberal and democratic tendencies, but he has no party affiliations.

During his office as Minister of Finance in the third Badoglio Cabinet (21 April 1944 - 10 June 1944), Quintieri's financial policy was described

as follows: 1) Desire for increase of Allied imports, especially food-stuffs; 2) Desire for an Italian credit in dollars and sterling to be set aside for use immediately and after the war, to reestablish Italian purchasing power in foreign countries; 3) Project of a tax on rural income and a raise in wages of city workers, in order to bring the two groups more closely in line; 4) Desire for the dollar-sterling-lira exchange rate to be altered in favor of the lira, as he considered the present rate inflationary.

His general opinions on Italy's position (while Badoglio's Minister of Finance) were described as follows: 1) Emphasis should be placed on the revival of finished goods and luxury industries and on the tourist trade, rather than on heavy industry; 2) Italy should be given access to foreign markets; 3) In favor of a free American port in Italy, in order to balance British and Russian Mediterranean interests with Americans; 4) Belief that a Latin bloc would be impractical; 5) Fear of French civil war, as he considers that the French have a natural tendency toward civil dissension and that they will be anti-Italian; 6) Belief that Germany will be as strong as ever in 15 years, because of her industrial power, and because her enemies will not sufficiently repress her.

Quintieri was the Benoni Government's tentative choice for observer at the United Nations Monetary and Financial Conference at Bretton Woods. (June 1944)

Proposed by the Benoni Government as technical representative to Washington for discussion of Italian economic and financial problems. He has stated privately that economic construction is impossible in Italy without a "huge" loan from either Britain or the United States.

Political History:

According to a report from a source (designated as "reliable" in 1943), Sessa is among those industrialists who made their fortune under Fascism and among those who are collaborating most consistently with the Germans.³

The Cairo Radio in January 1944 reports that he, with Marzetti, Tognoli and Turicelli - other leading industrialists - was accused by the Italian National Committee of Liberation of aiding the Germans with machinery and materials.⁴

An interview source also reports that he is among those who are at present collaborating with the Nazis.⁵

According to an interview source, Dott. Pirelli is not a Fascist by conviction; this source mentions that Pirelli stated he was not a Fascist, but had to join the government and support it so that he could be on the inside when it was supplanted by a democratic government. The same source stresses Pirelli's competence and power, and also his frequent trips to America.⁵

Pirelli is counted among those industrialists who supported Fascism from its beginning, by another interview source⁶ and he is also reported to be a personal friend of Mussolini.⁴

According to an Italian chemist who worked in the Pirelli Company from 1925 to
 till 1939, neither Alberto nor Piero Pirelli were ardent Fascists, but supported the Party only from 1930. The same source states that, when the

Ital an Government declared in 1935 that Italian enterprises must be placed under government control, Pirelli was against government intervention and for the independence of the large industries. It is also mentioned that most of the Directors of the Company were not particularly Fascist. A question asking applicants' religion was included in the employment blank of the Company in 1936 or 1937 (in the absence of Ugo Tagliacozzo, a Jew) and this became mandatory by government order in 1939.⁹

Pirelli had a "significant meeting" with Nicolo Zuccea, the student leader who replaced Vidussovi, when the latter was named Secretary of the Fascist Party.¹⁰

A Third interview source says that Pirelli is a respectable man (nearly all reports agree on this), and might be useful at some stage in causing disaffection among northern industrialists who, now as always, must be searching for a way to land on their feet.¹¹⁰

It was reported by the NRC in August 1943 that Pirelli's concern submitted a detailed report of peace demonstrations in northern Italy to Badoglio.¹¹

SUMMARY: Dr. Pirelli heads, with his brother, the Italian rubber industry and is one of the great industrialists of Italy, international in his influence and connected with nearly every branch of Italian manufacturing and public works. He has been President of the Associazione Fra Le Societa Italiane per Azioni for about twenty years; this position makes him the honorary head of Italian industry.

It may be assumed that Dr. Pirelli's industrial activity claimed all his attention, to the exclusion of any Fascist Party activity. The reports on his political attitude are ambiguous, indicating a tendency to serve whatever government might be in control of the country. His position on the National Council of Corporations was political, as well as professional, in nature and indicated his active support of Fascist economic policies.

he became President and administrator of Soc. Italiana
Pirelli, and still held that position in 1943.² According
to an interview source Piero runs the financial end of the
company, but is secondary to his brother, Alberto, in the
technical and management aspects.

The revenues of the Pirelli enter-prise come 50% from tires,
30% from electric wire and cable, and 20% from miscella-
neous rubber products. As a tire producer, Soc. It. Pirelli
ranks third in Europe. As a wire and cable producer it is
one of the largest in the world. Its miscellaneous rubber
products include over 400 different articles. The main
manufacturing plant, just outside of Milan, known as the **87**
Bicocca works, is the largest factory in Europe. There
are numerous other plants in Italy and other places in the
world.²

Important factories manufacturing wire and cable, tires
and rubber goods are located in England, Spain, Argentina,
and Brazil. Pirelli owns its own rubber plantations in

The Firelli Holding Company of S. A., Switzerland, is nearly all of the foreign interest of the Firelli group. Piero Pirelli joined the Fascist Party in 1932.

From the 1940 Chi E? the following information is available on the political-economic posts which he has held:

National Councillor the Chamber of Fasces and Corporations, as a member of the council of the Corporation of International Commerce, representing the industrialists; Member of the National Council of Corporations; Vice-President of the Fascist Confederation of Industrialists; as President of the National Fascist Federation of the Corporations operating Electric Communications (Federazione Nazionale Fascista Mercanti Imprese) Comunicazioni elettriche).

According to an Italian chemist who was with Soc. Italiana Pirelli from 1925 to 1939, neither Piero nor his brother, Alberto, are "ardent" fascists.

Summary: As head of the Soc. Italiana Pirelli, Piero Pirelli, holds a key position in Italian industry and ranks as an industrialist of international importance. The Pirelli interests manufacture rubber, electric wire and cables, and numerous rubber products. Piero's positions in the many firms listed under work history above reflect the fields of business enterprise over which the Pirelli interests have a high degree of control in Italy.

Piero Pirelli did not join the Fascist Party until 1932, ten years after it had seized power in Italy. Once having joined it, however, he accepted positions of the highest importance in the Fascist corporative state structure. As a National Councillor in the Chamber of Fasces and Corporations he held a key position in the Fascist control of Italian industrial life.

Summary:

As President or Councillor of many of the most important Italian shipping companies, De La Penne was prominent in the field of navigation.

According to the interview source, he served the Fascist regime as Deputy and with his full sympathy. There is no evidence of any other party activity.

He joined the Fascist Party early, according to the interview source, and has held Fascist offices in Milan and as Deputy and Director of the National Fascist Federation of Paper Industrialists. He was ^{made} Senator in 1939 by Mussolini. 81

He suggested that a committee of the population should be organized to assist the Ministers to deal with their concrete problems of the Allied government through the Italian Foreign Office.

Summary:

An Administrative Committee of the - 1 - has been established and is considered to be a highly influential body in Italian Government.

He was acting as a liaison to the various parties, joining it as into an advisory and is considered to be the leader of the Action Party. He is a financial expert. He was recently suggested as a liaison and unofficial representative of the Federal Government to the various agencies in Washington. Public statements of his indicate that he is opposed to the multiplicity of Allied agencies in Italy and favors a plan of organization through the Italian Foreign Office for the solution of problems arising between the Italian and Allied Governments.

decided to establish commercial relations with the Russian
Government, Dr. Marinotti was sent to Russia in a capacity
of industrialist in Milan. He returned after several months,
having accomplished the exchange of a few other Italian
manufactured products for wheat, sulphurite, and some crude
oil.

At the same time that he became Managing Director of S.p.A.
Venezie, Dr. Marinotti acquired the political position of
Vice Podesta of Milan. It is evident that his personal ambi-
tions linked him closely with Mussolini throughout the

regime. It is considered autocratic, violent and unscrupulous and is disliked by the people.

The National Committee of Liberation in Northern Italy accused him, with several other leading industrialists—Giulio Cesare, Gianluigi Sordani and Senator R. Cipollini—as aiding the Germans to raise machinery and materials; he has reported as actively assisting the Germans.

On 4 March 1944, he was arrested by the Fascist Republican Guard in Milan and charged with having advised, by possible collaboration, the government's plans with regard to the socialization of industry. Marinotti had expressed his disapproval of these plans in a memorandum to the German Ambassador and to Mussolini. The arrest was ordered by the German authorities.

It is reported that his release was obtained by General Leyers, Chief of Staff for Armaments of War, because of the necessity of his collaboration in northern Italian war production.

As Managing Director of Sella-Viscosa, Dr. Marinotti held "one of the most important industrial positions in the country." He has also been president or councillor of a number of other Milan concerns for artificial textiles.

He cooperated with the Fascist regime from the beginning. At one time, he held the office of Vice Podesta of Milan. Since the Armistice, he has been accused of active cooperation with the German seizure of Italian industry. He was arrested by the Fascists in March 1944 for having opposed the nationalization of industry, but was released by the German authorities in order that he might further collaborate.

In 1937, he tried to establish an office in New York, but failed. In 1939, the Company languished due to difficult international conditions and lack of support from the Catholic authorities.

Education and Work History :

Interview source summarizes his career as follows: Engaged with his brother in activity of mining, business and exploration for the past 25 years in Africa (region stretching from Kenya to the Anglo-Egyptian Sudan).

Worked in the formation of the Istituto Siero-Vaccinogeno Etiopico (Ethiopian Institute for Vaccine and Serum), Addis Ababa. Tullio Pastori obtained from Haile Selassie a long concession for the preparation and distribution in Ethiopia of the serum to immunize livestock against "afta epizootica" (foot disease). A similar institute had been founded in Eritrea by the Italian Government at Massawa. The Pastori company failed, despite its importance as a distributor of smallpox serum as well as serum for livestock, and the brothers disappeared. 1927

Tried to obtain from the Ethiopian Government a concession for the salt mines of Asciato, the richest plain of Africa.

The first white man to cross the Dankalia from the coast to the Bati road and thus proved that a line of communication could be established on this route. Also made a study for the opening of the Assab-Dessie road.

With the above-mentioned projects, he returned to Italy in 1929 to offer them to the Italian Government and to settle a dispute between himself and Cora, the Italian Minister at Addis Ababa. Succeeded in obtaining a passport and agreed to furnish the General Staff of the Italian Army with his vast information in preparation for the conquest.
