A search of his residence and of his person revealed nothing incriminating.

The undersigned, Public Security officers and detectives attached to the Allied Commission, Public Safety Sub Commission, Security Division, on order of the a/n Sub Commission have effected a search of the house of LODRINI, Ugo, son of late Germano and of POVEROMO Elena, born in Rome (according to LODRINI in New York) on the 16th of January 1926, student.

They have found and seized a closed letter addressed by the a/n to Mr. Antonio ROVERANO, via Vettor Pisani 4, Lido di Venezia, an open letter addressed to LODRINI Ugo, the signature of which is illegible, beginning with the following words: "Tobacconist shop - 5-4/4-5 Via Tusculana. Dear Hugo, I am near your house. I should like to come and talk with you...", a sheet with the name and descriptions typewritten of a certain Alfredo COCCIADIFERRO, son of late Antonio, nine copies of a photograph, a typewritten paper addressed to "PIRELLI Concern - Milan" signed by Alfredo COCCIADIFERRO* VIA Carlo Roma 2.

The search has been effected in presence of LODRINI's brother-in-law, PICCIONI Marcello, son of late Filippo and of BASSI Rosalba, born in Ancona on the 20th Of January 1919, technical of the wireless, as LODRINI was absent.

Before the undersigned, Officer of Public Security, Mr. ANTINORI Alberto has appeared, son of late Antonio and of MASI Vittoria, born in Rome on the 21st of July, 1898, proxy for the firm "Antonio Antinori", domiciled at 80 Lungotevere Flaminio, who has declared as follows:

"We are six brothers, all sharers of the "Antonio Antinori" skins and book-binding firm. Each of us owned a car, but, owing to the war, only two have been left, and both without tires. The owner of the former is my brother Aristide, that of the latter Aldo ANTINORI. As, owing, to commercial necessity, we need at least one efficient car, about a week ago, I drew up an application to the Allied Commission - War Scraps Department, in order to obtain 5 or 6 tires for the "Lancia-Augusta", owned by my brother Aristide.

"I gave my application to Mr. LODRINI, domiciled at 1 via Villa Fiorello in Rome, who forwarded it to the Allied Commission, and took steps with the concerned Office. I entrusted the a/n with the forwarding of my application, as I was engaged for my work in the firm. I do not know whether LODRINI has actually forwarded or not my application, since I have neither met him again, nor learnt any news from him. Therefore I do not know whether the tires have been allotted or refused.

"No compensation has been promised by me to LODRINI, not LODRINI has requested anything from me. Moreover I did not promise anybody else compensation for the allotment of seven tires, not has anyone advanced any proposal of this kind. At any rate I should have probably rewarded LODRINI spontaneously, in case he had got the tires for me.

"I wish to point out that one car "Alfa-Romeo" owned by my brother Alfredo ANTINORI, who is joint-owner of the a/n firm, was requisitioned by the British War-Navy and is at present time in Southern Italy".

and agricultural purposes, I engaged myself to take steps with friends in order to obtain the a/m tires. I suppose that Mr. Alberto ANTINORI himself forwarded a regular application to the Allied Commission asking for 4 or 5 tires. As I do not know anybody in the a/m office, I applied to Mrs. GODOY, wife of the Consul of Chile, living in Rome, at via Clodia, and asked her to take steps with regard to a request of tires, without giving her further details. I asked her, since once she had taken steps for a request of one tire drawn up by myself, with someone acquainted with Lieut. DEVEIL, who is supposed to work for the Allied Commission. I knew Mrs. GODOY a few months ago, through respective friends.

"The a/n lady let me know that for the moment it was impossible to obtain tires, but she promised that she would take steps subsequently, only for reasons of friendship and without any compensation. I want to point out that I neither gave her the name of ANTINORI, nor showed the a/m application.

"I had the intention of helping Mr. ANTINORI's request, and getting the tires through regular channels, in order to form a closer friendship with him, and subsequently borrow sometimes his car. I neither asked ANTINORI for any reward, nor tried to corrupt anyone on behalf of ANTINORI himself. As a proof of our honest intentions I can affirm that the application drawn up by ANTINORI was torn up by myself, as it had not satisfied the Allied requests, and as Mrs. GODOY had informed me that for the moment it was impossible to obtain the tires.

"I suppose that in my behaviour with regard to this matter there is nothing irregular. I imagine that groundless rumours spread about the steps I have taken, may be justified by the fact that I have innocently shown off with my friends and relatives.

"I have nothing to add."

Nei primi giorni del decorso mese di Settembre, tale ALBANESE Armando di Gennaro e fu Bentivoglio Giulia, nato a Roma il 20/8/1903, abitante in Via Gavinana N.4, venuto a conoscenza che un permesso di circolazione per un autoveicolo, da lui ottenuto tramite alcune persone, non era valido perchè chi glielo aveva rimesso non era autorizzato a farlo, denunciava il fatto a questa Squadra Mobile.

Specificava che, per intercessione di un certo VENTIMIGLIA, casualmente conosciuto, ebbe ad incontrarsi con tale COFRANCESCO Edoardo, il quale si sarebbe dichiarato ben disposto ad aderire alla di lui richiesta e presi i necessari estremi, dopo appena tre giorni gli consegnava un permesso di circolazione per cui richiedeva la somma di lire quarantamila.
