With reference to the above and the attached file, I have to report that I have interviewed Lt. Macdonald, the Fleet Base Security Officer, "aples, and informed him of the contents. He is making enquiries through his own sources, and also seeing what information can be obtained from C.I.C and F.S.S. regarding these men.

So far as TADDEI is concerned, a communication is being sent by Lt. Macdonald to London to see if further information can be obtained regarding TADDEI'S activities in Albania and Greece. Lt. Macdonald will inform me when he has completed his enquiry, which may take some time.

I respectfully suggest that this file be put in the pending file for the time being.

TADDEI Eugenio.

A native of Alessandria, former residence being at Brs, Province of Cunes. Was assistant General of Staff, and Chief of Officers' Section, Personnel Branch, at the Italian Naval Command, Via St. Lucia 2, H.Q. of the Commander in Chief of the Naval Department of Naples. Is a fanatical Fascist and active.

High functionary of the Fascist Party at Turin and Orta. He has carried out important missions both in Italy and abroad.

Entrusted by Minister Jacomini with the task of preparing the ground for the occupation of Albania as far back as 1932, and was in Albania until 1939. He was also naval advisor to Jacomini.

Continued his activities as an agent in Greece during 1941, but on the British authorities protestation to the Greece Government while he was at Patras, and he had to leave Greece.

1941 and 1942 was associated with Admiral Turr and remained in Toulon until 1943.

Confirmation and additional information may be obtained from an Italian Naval officer, Captain R.M. Cucinello, the brother of a political prisoner, who is employed at the present time at the above Italian Naval Command.

Information received in Rome by Italians in Albania and by personalities found within the country of Ventotene.

TO : Regional Commissioner

I. Reference the attached letter from Special Detachment G-2, X-2 Branch, dated 4 March 1944, the following confirmatory information regarding Capitano di Fregata TADDEI has been received from a reliable source (Evaluation B-2)

1. Capitano di Fregata Eugenio TADDEI, native of Alessandria, family residence being at Bra (Province of Cuneo) - Assistant Chief of Staff and Chief of the Officers' Section (Personnel Branch) at the Italian Naval Command, Via S. Lucia 2, Headquarters of the Commander-in-Chief of the Naval Department of Naples, is a fanatical and active Fascist.
2. A high functionary of the Fascist Party of Turin and an OVRA agent he has carried out important missions both in Italy and abroad.
3. TADDEI was entrusted by the Minister Jacomini with the task of preparing the ground for the occupation of Albania as far back as 1932 and was in Albania up to 1939. He was also Naval Adviser to the aforementioned Minister.
4. He continued his activities as an agent in Greece during 1941 but the British authorities protested to the Greek Government whilst he was at PATRAS, resulting in his having to leave Greece.
5. In 1941-42, he was associated with Admiral TURR and remained in Toulon up to 1943.

II. Confirmation and additional information may be obtained from an Italian Officer, Capitano C. CINELLO, brother of a political prisoner, who is employed at present at the aforesaid Italian Naval Command.

III. This Security Officer recommends that the above mentioned information, together with that contained in the attached letter, be submitted to Admiral NOISE for any action he may wish to take.
