SUBJECT : CONSTANTINE PAPADOPOULOS - Greek Subject

TO : Displaced Persons and Repatriation S.C.

1. Reference your DPR/15/G-2(DP) dated 23 May 45.
2. The forcible repatriation of a Greek subject from Italy to Greece is undoubtedly a matter which must be taken up by the Greek authorities with the Italian authorities.
3. It does not appear that subject constitutes a military security risk to the Allied Forces in Italy.

SUBJECT: PAPADOPOULOS, Constantine, Greek Subject.

TO : Public Safety Division, A.C.
(Attn: Capt. HAYES)

1. We are submitting herewith the attached correspondence in respect of the a/m Greek National in order that you may take the appropriate action to stop this person's subversive activities in the Naples Area.

2. Hitherto, we have been unable to ascertain as to why this person was released by Security, after all the trouble he caused us in Bari last year.

3. We should like to draw your attention to the fact that our No. 1 Transit Camp at Bari has no facilities for keeping this person in detention until he is repatriated to Greece, and therefore, it would be much appreciated if you would endeavour to solve this problem.

Re: PAPADOPOULOS Constantine

1. PAPADOPOULOS Constantine, Greek national, ex-political internee, accommodated in No 1 Transit Camp, Bari, proceeded a few weeks ago to Naples with the false excuse of having to undergo a special treatment there. He is still in Naples and refuses to return to Bari inspite of the repeated intimations he received to that effect from this Mission; his address is: 9, Via Sovildi Porto, (4th floor).
2. Last October it was reported to this Mission that the a/m Greek subject was acting as an agent of anarchist propaganda among the crews of the Greek merchantships calling at the port of Bari, as well as among units of the Greek Mediterranean Training Centre, then stationed in that area. He was distributing pamphlets to the men and trying to initiate them into his subversive ideology.
3. At the order of the then head of this Mission, Lt.Comdr.J. Melissinos, he was arrested by the allied Security Authorities and put into the a/m Camp.
4. The individual in question has also taken part in the activities of a gang operating in ^{the} Bari area where its members extracted money from Italian black-marketeers by force or threat.

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3. At the order of the then head of this Mission, Lt.Comdr.J. Melissinos, he was arrested by the allied Security Authorities and put into the a/m Camp.
4. The individual in question has also taken part in the activities of a gang operating in ^{the} Bari area where its members extracted money from Italian black-marketeters by force or threat.
5. It has now been established that C.Papadopoulos initiated in Naples activities as described above, in para. 2, among groups of Greek soldiers who come to Salerno from Greece for training, as well as among the crews of Greek merchantmen calling at the port of Naples. Two Greek soldiers have deserted, apparently as a result of his pernicious propaganda.

6. This Mission, acting on orders from Col. Assimakopoulos, Military Adviser to the Greek Ambassador, copy of which is attached, would very much appreciate if you would kindly take up the matter with the appropriate Military Authorities in order that the individual in question be arrested and forced to re-enter the Bari No 1 Transit Camp where he should be put under guard, waiting repatriation.

Ref your report IIg/668 dated 15-5-45, please arrange through appropriate Allied Authorities for the immediate arrest of said Constantine PAPADOPOULOS and for his placing under custody until repatriation which should be forcibly effected in the case he may refuse to leave Italy where it appears he has instructions to carry our anarchist propaganda among the greeks.

It is understood that any assistance from Greek or Allied Authorities to him must cease.
