BLANCHINI Vittorio. Ten or Sotto/Ten.

Probably an alias. Fascist Republican Navy.

Height 1.60 cms.; age 24-25; very heavily built; athletic type; black straight hair, combed straight back; uses much perfumed brillantino; large mouth; large black eyebrows; broad dark face; medium black moustache; dark eyes. Wearing maroon-coloured suit; light olive-green windbreaker with zipper, attached hood with drawstrings; hatless. Likes to sketch and draw. Speaks English; had been in England in Italian Navy before the war. Sings. Comes from GENOVA. Said to be rich.

Now believed to be on mission in A.O.T.

"TOTO".

Was Sgt. in Italian Army at VERONA June 44.

Age 21; height 1.75 m.; thinly built; cleanshaven; very straight black hair combed straight back; very dark complexion; black eyes; regular features; face covered with black warts. Wears tan-coloured mackintosh, low maroon shoes, sewn with white leather; hatless. From TARANTO.

Formerly photographer at NAPLES.

Born at FLORENCE but lives at a town near BRISCOLA. Had been on a mission to FLORENCE and BAGNI di LUCCA. Returned in Oct 44, in possession of a partisan travel permit and some occupational currency. Believed to be about to go on another mission. Last seen at PARIS in Nov 44.

"GABRIELLO" Giuseppe.

Now stated to be aged 17. Wearing a checked light-coloured topcoat, dark blue suit with lines, blue scarf round neck, low black shoes. Born at PADOVA, and still lives there.

Now stated to be aged 17. Wearing a checked light-coloured topcoat, dark blue suit with lines, blue scarf round neck, low black shoes. Born at PADOVA, and still lives there.

FRANCO. Nickname "PORTOVENTRE".

See our GBI-389.704/1 dated 18 Nov 44.

Was in "X" Flotilla IKS at LA SPEZIA, where he was born. Was wearing a new dark grey jacket, a pair of pants "a la Zouave", black high German shoes, no topcoat. Last seen at PAREL about 22 Oct 44, leaving on mission with - CARLO.

CARLO.

See our GBI-389.704/1 dated 18 Nov 44.

Was born at LA SPEZIA. Father a Maresciallo in "X" Flotilla IKS at LA SPEZIA. May himself have been in "X" Flotilla IKS.

Was wearing coffee-coloured jacket, grey pants, baggy in rear, with a silk patch on inside of the crotch, pockets worn and sewn, a small light blue jacket with zipper.

Last seen PAREL about 22 Oct 44, leaving on a mission with 2 FRANCO.

SORCI, Giuseppe.

Age 18; height 1.50 m.; medium build; brown hair.
It is thought possible that he may be identical with "G. AFFINIO" Giuseppe. (See above).

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Guiao.

Stated that he had been on one previous mission, was captured by partisans, but escaped.

Age 32; height 1.65 m.; robust; dark complexion; brown hair; brown eyes; light brown suit; Italian military shoes. Last seen PARMA 2 Nov 44.

La Dana Nera.

Mistress of MONTI Mario. May possibly be used on espionage missions.

Age 18; height 1.70 m. with high heels; variously described as being a natural blonde and dark haired; small painted mouth; well-made; two rings on left finger, one with stone; said to speak English, French, German, Spanish and Italian.

LE BLASO Maya.

Friend of MONTI Mario. May be prostitute. May possibly be sent on missions.

Age 16; height 1.60 m.; thin; brown hair and eyes; thin face; lives at PARMA.

DE BLASO Olga.

Sister of Maya, and engaged to MONTI Mario. May be employed by G.I.S.

Age 18; height 1.62 m.; medium build; peroxide blonde; round broad face; lives in PARMA with sister.

ROCCIOLOI Settimio.

Recruiter and pupil at PARMA espionage school.

Age 32; height 1.70 m.; robust; light brown hair; blue eyes, round face.

Age 24-25; height 1.65 m.; black thick curly hair that stands up; dark eyes; small moustache; plump, with fatish face; fine features; born in ROME.

SAPIENZA Giuseppe.

See our B.389.704/1 dated 29 Oct 44.

Destined for PALERMO or VENICE. Was to join an already existing sabotage group, and to work on the instructions of this group. Trained at CAMPALTO.

Age 25-26; black curly hair; dark eyes; sallow complexion; broad features; teeth apart. An Italian born at MONTESAPONE in PALERMO. A regular army Sergeant.

TERRACIANO Nicola.

See our B.389.704/1 dated 29 Oct 44.

Was to be sent to NAPLES. Told he would be provided with a W/T set on his arrival. Pre-war occupation - chauffeur.

Age 27-28; height about 1.67 m.; slight build; black hair; dark complexion; fine features; small moustache. From NAPLES.

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The following are Italian saboteurs at present thought to be in ATHENS, but who may attempt to enter Allied Occupied Italy.

LEONCINI Fidaldo.

Age 27-28; height 1.72-3 m.; blond; wears glasses; broad shoulders; chestnut eyes; speaks good French. Born in FLORENCE. By-profession a radio technician. Has a Greek girl friend at ATHENS wireless station. May have taken Swiss nationality, as he had a friend in the Swiss Legation.

MASCHETTI Domenico.

Age 32 (?); height 1.76 m.; slight build; black hair; fine features; both thumb nails are half normal size; one thumb looks swollen as if it had received a wound; ugly; false teeth, with one or two gold ones; born in BARL. Before the war was a bank clerk in TURIN, where his wife is now living. He lives in ATHENS with a Greek mistress. Last known address: Dolvinio Street off CARILLON TRIKOUPI, but has now left.

PISSA Angelo.

Age 27-28; height 1.70 m. slim figure; dark complexion; mustache; wears glasses; prominent nose; hair black, turning white at sides. Born ATHENS, and lives with an aunt at PALIRON.

PULLA Virilio.

Subject: CURNELLI Mario, Age 28 yrs.
CONCA Domenico, age 21 yrs. (Both suspected Enemy Agents)

To: A.C. of S., G-2, (CI) Hq Fifth Army.

1. On 6 September 1944, the two Subjects were arrested at a Pensione at Pisa for being suspected Enemy Agents.
2. For some days after their arrest they denied association with the German Intelligence Service, but on 8 September 1944, at S. Giuliano prison they confessed to having been left behind by the Germans as post-occupational agents.
3. They had been supplied with a wireless set--which was later found hidden in the garden of the Pensione where they were arrested.
4. The Subject CURNELLI had been instructed to obtain information of Military Value to the Germans and the Subject CONCA was the wireless operator who would transmit it to the Germans.
5. The foregoing is a broad outline of the Case, and the following witnesses--whose evidence I will deal with in more detail later--are necessary to prove a case of Espionage against Subjects:-

STACLIANO Salvatore	a Partisan
DEVOTI Nedo	a Partisan
T/L Salvatore J. DI MARCO, ASN 36253077,	Partisan Liaison, IV Corps Partisan Office
BATTUCCI Cesare	Lt. Italian Army

T/Sgt Anthony J. TEO, ASN 32935450,	Partisan Liaison, IV Corps Partisan Office.

6. The story as told in the Statements rather overlaps so I will give it in narrative form mentioning the witnesses who can speak as to the various instances.
7. The six witnesses were operating during the early days of September 1944, at San Giuliano in the capacities shown alongside their names.
8. Information was received that there were two suspected enemy agents living at Pensione Ferrigno, No 10, Via del Castelletto, Pisa.

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9. On 6 September 1944, all the witnesses with the exception of T/Sgt Tiso, went to Pisa to trace and arrest the suspected enemy agents.

10. Arriving a short distance from the address of the suspects, the two Partisans--STAGLIANO and DEVOTI--left the car and went to the Pensione Ferrigno.

11. After about half an hour they returned to the car and reported that the two suspects were in the Pensione.

12. All five then entered the Pensione and the suspects were interrogated by Lt. Martucci, but denied being German agents.

13. The details of what actually happened in the Pensione is dealt with in the statements of the individual witnesses.

14. The two suspects were arrested and taken to San Giuliano prison, and left there in the custody of the witness BALANI Luigi.

15. What happened in the prison is dealt with in the statement of BALANI Luigi, to whom they first confessed to being enemy agents.

16. There is no doubt this confession was obtained under duress, but the rules of procedure do not bar such a statement but say that it should be corroborated in some material detail.

17. There is no doubt about the corroboration in this case as the wireless set and code supplied to them by the Germans was found.

18. The wireless set cannot be produced in Court owing to operational reasons, but an exercise book containing a code will be produced.

19. At this stage, I cannot say how the wireless set and the exercise book were found, but enquiries are being made and I shall be able to produce this evidence at the trial.

20. I suggest the two subjects be jointly charged before a General Allied Military Court with having served the enemy as spies at Pisa on 6 September 1944.

Subject: Declaration of Partisan SPAGLIANO, Salvatore.
Address: Porcari, via Erti della Chiesa, No. 6

Around 5 Sept., my comrade NEDO Devoti and I arrived in San Giuliano coming from the Garibaldi Brigade which was located in the locality of Lucese. We met a Lt. Matteusi, whom we gave information concerning the Brigade. We met the lieutenant on the next, and he asked us whether we would like to participate on a mission in Pisa. We answered him that we would be very glad to. The mission was to locate two persons in a boarding house, who were in possession of a radio transmitter. To do that was our specialty, being a member of the "Gap". We then armed ourselves with a Beretta and a Sips handgrenade, took the vehicle and went to Pisa. When we reached Pisa, we halted 200 meters from the boarding house. The lieutenant, Sgt. Di Marco, and a Partisan stayed in the car, while my comrade and I walked toward the house. Our plan was to find a room for the night in the same hotel. After having knocked at the door, the owner appeared. He asked him whether he had a room. He told us said he would accommodate us. While talking we reached the floor above and met the daughter of the proprietor who showed us the room. While the daughter and I were looking the room over, my comrade took the owner aside. I then asked the young lady whether we were the only guests in the house, to which she replied, "No, one lady and two young men are also here." My comrade called me, and together with the owner we went into the room occupied by the two young men. The only window faced the garden. From the window the owner called the two men who were talking with a couple and two children. The man was tall and slim, about 45 years of age; the woman was short and about the same age. The children were between 9 and 12 years of age. The garden was separated from the hotel by a low wall which could easily be crossed by use of a chair and a small step-ladder. After having been introduced to the two men and having exchanged a few words, we told them that an Italian officer would like to talk to them. While my comrade stayed with them, I called the Lt., the Sgt., and the Partisan and returned to the house. While the Lt. interrogated one of the men, the other one was guarded by the Partisan outside the room. We went into the garden and finding the step-ladder, we became suspicious and thought that the transmitter might have been hidden somewhere.

We asked the man in the garden, who had seated himself, "How long have you know the two men, who, a little while ago, were talking to you?"
"For two months", he answered, "and I believe that are evacuees."
"Did they come to see you very often?"
"Yes, practically every day," was the answer.

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My comrade and I then went to inspect the rooms. After 10 minutes the lieutenant called us in, telling us to wait for the car to return. The Lt., Sgt., Partisan, and the two men had seated themselves in the vehicle. We returned the weapons to the lieutenant and went toward Piazza dei Cavalieri to wait for the vehicle, which was supposed to return within a half an hour. As a matter of fact the car arrived and picked us up. Lt. Matteucci, Maresciallo Tiso, and Sgt. Di Marco were in the car. During the trip to the Ponsacco Headquarters, where we arrived at sunset, the incident that had taken place was not mentioned. Three or four days later, the men we took at Pisa, were taken to the Ponsacco Headquarters. Several days later, two CIC officers came to Ponsacco and asked us for our names.

From that time on, we have been at the disposal of CIC and nothing of importance has taken place.

12 October 1944

Around 5 Sept., my comrade Stagliano Salvatore and I arrived in San Giuliano, coming from the Garibaldi Brigade (locality of Lucese). At the city hall of the town, we met the Italian Lt. Matteucci, where I told him the story and gave him information pertaining to our base. The Lt. asked us to stay in town until the following day because he might need us then. As a matter of fact, the next day the Lt. returned with a vehicle, type 1100. An American Sgt. was with him. He asked us whether we wanted to take part in a mission concerning the arrest of 2 spies in Pisa, who were in possession of a radio transmitter and were furnishing the enemy with information. He answered that we would be very glad to do it, and went to Pisa in the same vehicle. With us were 2 other persons. To be precise, Lt. Matteucci, the American Sgt., and one Partisan whose name I don't remember. Before we left, we armed ourselves with a Beretta pistol, a hand grenade each. During the trip, the Lt. gave us the exact information about the mission. We were to go to the boarding house where the spies were and ask for a room (which was an excuse) and then find out whether the two men were living there. We arrived in Pisa and walked 200 meters from the boarding house. My friend and I walked to the house after having been given the latest instructions by the Lt. We arrived at the house and knocked at the door, which a man, who was the owner, opened. He asked us in a very polite manner what we desired. We told him that we were looking for a room. He said that he had one. Then I asked him whether I could talk to him alone. In the meanwhile, a young lady appeared. He took us to another room and said, "You can talk freely in here". I asked him, "Do you have 2 young men in your house?" He answered affirmatively in a strange manner, possibly noticing the weapon in my pocket. I asked him to call the two men and tell them that a friend of theirs wanted to talk to them. The proprietor went to the window, called the two men upstairs. I introduced myself with a false name and they invited me into their room. Stagliano and myself went to their room which was furnished luxuriously and strongly perfumed. With my two hands in my pockets ready for any eventuality, I said, "We belong to a Fascist organization and have been informed of your presence here. We would like to transmit some information to the Germans over your transmitter." Upon hearing this, they were bewildered. One of them said: "I have never been interested in politics and I don't understand what you mean. We have more important things to do, that is to return to our homes which are far away." I asked them where they came from, one of them answered, "I am from Sardinia and my friend was always with me." I tried to convince them in not being afraid as we were comrades Fascists like them, but they responded, with an innocent face, that they were not Fascists nor did they participate in any political activities. Then I sent my friend Stagliano to bring Lt. Matteucci. I stayed in the room for ten minutes with the two young men, meanwhile no words of any importance were exchanged. As soon as the Lt. entered, he started to question the two, one at the time. Meanwhile we searched the other rooms. From the window, facing the garden, which was very low, we descended to the garden, there we met a man and a baby and we asked them if they knew the two young men and if they did, how long. "Two months", the response was, "they are two soldiers who escaped from the Germans, and waiting the arrival of the Allies so that they may be able to return to their homes". I in turn asked, "How do they manage to live, where do they get their money?" He responded that he knew no more

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and that he was not very interested in the man. We searched all over the garden accomplishing nothing. I left my friend in the garden to search, and ascended back up the steps to reach the owner whom I had left a while ago. I asked him in a very polite manner if I was permitted to search the apartment, and started with his luxurious living room. After the living room, another room with no results. After reaching the ninth room, always followed by the owner and his daughter, who helped me to look through the furniture, but did not have the good fortune of finding any radio transmitters. While I was searching, Lt. Matteucci called for me and all six of us left the boarding house; I mean myself, Stagliano, Lt. the partisan and the two suspects. As we were nearing the vehicle the Lt. asked for the weapons we carried and told us to wait for him in the Piazza dei Cavalieri because there wasn't room enough in the automobile. After an half hour the vehicle returned occupied by the American driver and the Lt. We got in and started for Ponsacco, where we had arrived late in the evening. At Ponsacco, we stayed for several days, and after the fourth or fifth day, we were very surprised to see the two men again whom we had detained in Pisa. They stayed at the headquarters for one or two days where they were interrogated. On this day agents of the CIC arrived and they took my name and that of my friend. Since then we have been at the disposal of the CIC trying to accomplish our duty.

Statement given by T/4 Salvatore J. Di Marco, attached to IV CORPS PARTISAN GROUP, APO 304.

On 4 Sept. 1944, during a conversation with some Partisans in Gallo, Lt. Matteucci, T/sgt. Tiso and myself learned about two suspects. We decided to be certain and asked these Partisans to check on the whereabouts of these two individuals and gather all the information they could about them.

We returned on the 6 Sept. not being able to return on the 5 Sept. as we promised. T/sgt. Tiso stayed in San Giuliano to do interrogations and Lt. Matteucci and myself, picked up in San Giuliano, Partisans Luigi, Salvatore Staglio and Medo Devoti and went to Pisa to try and locate the two suspects.

I stayed in the vehicle while the three Partisans went into a "Pensione" where the two suspects were to be found.

Approx 4 hour later Luigi came out and said that they had located the two suspects. Lt. Matteucci, and myself went into the Pensione, to the room where the two suspects were living.

I stayed in their room while Lt. Matteucci interrogated first one and then the other. They denied everything.

This took approx 2 hours, we then took them to the S. Giuliano Jail house and left them in the care of Partisan Luigi.

We returned the 8 Sept. not being able to return on the 7 Sept. The two suspects were willing to talk and admitted that they had a radio transmitter, but that they never used it.

I stayed in S. Giuliano for interrogation of Partisans and civilians for Military Information while Lt. Matteucci, Sgt. Tiso and Luigi went to Pisa. That night I was picked up by Lt. Matteucci and Sgt. Tiso and also in the vehicle were the two suspect and Partisans Salvatore, Staglio and Medo Devoti.

On our way to Fossano (IV CORPS PARTISAN LIAISON CP) we stopped in Pisa at the apartment of the two agents, and everyone but me went to the room to pick up two overcoats for the agents. We then proceed to Fossano.

Subject: Statement of Lt. Matteucci Cesare.
Address: Attached to IV Corps, Hq. Partisan Liaison Office AND 304 US Army

During the interrogation of elements in the town of Gello, San Giuliano locality, I can come to the conclusion that two young men, guests of Signor Ferrigno, were suspects of spy activities.

From these elements, I also had been informed that during the night, while a German round up was in operation, one of the, carrying a heavy valise, after showing his papers, was immediately released.

Through previous information, I knew of the presence of agents in the area of Pisa, paid by the Germans, so I decided to search for the two. Consequently, I sent two young men from San Giuliano to Pisa, at Via del Castellotto No. 10, the Ferrigno boarding house, where the suspects were quartered.

They reported to me that the two suspects were still living at the boarding house. I went first to investigate the house. This house afforded good hiding, and eventual escape was made possible through the system of gardens connected together from placed leaning ladders.

I took the following measures: I sent the two Partisans, Tagliano Salvatore and Edo Devoti, to the boarding house to ask the owner for a room in order to get a lead on the suspects. A third Partisan, Luigi Salani of San Giuliano, guarded the entrance. I and Sgt. Di Marco controlled the road. Twenty minutes later, one of the Partisans called me. I entered the room where the two suspects were. I interrogated one at the time, they denied all accusations. Through their answers, my suspicions were confirmed. I am familiar with the instructions given by the German agents, to always precisely deny. The only way to make them confess was to scare them. Consequently, I took them to San Giuliano and placed them in the hands of the Partisans to make them confess.

When I returned to San Giuliano, there were prepared to talk and in the presence Sgt. Tiso Antonio and myself they declared that they had a radio transmitting and receiving station with code. We found the radio transmitting and receiving station hidden in the garden. I took the two to my headquarters at Ronsecco. The following morning, they were turned over to the G.I.C.

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12 October 1944

Statement given by SALANI, Luigi
Residence: Via Nicolini No. 29 San Giuliano Terme (Pisa).

On about the 8 September 1944 Lt. Matteucci came to me and asked me if I wanted to take part in the capture of two German agents. I said I would and we left S. Giuliano with an automobile and went to Pisa where the two men lived. At this time there were two other Partisans with Lt. Matteucci. When we arrived near where the two men were staying (Via del Castellotto No. 10 Pensione Ferrigno), it was decided that two of us would enter the building while the others would remain outside as guards.

I remained outside as guard while the two Partisans entered the building. According to the plans made before reaching the place, they were to ask for lodging and then ask if there were two men living in the building. The two Partisans were to pose as friends of the two men and would like to see them.

One of the Partisans came out of the building and called us saying that they had found the two men and the other Partisan had them under guard. At this time Lt. Matteucci, an American soldier and I entered the building and went up to the room where the two men were. The two Partisans began searching the house. Lt. Matteucci and the American soldier remained in the room while I took the two men, one at a time, out of the room. Lt. Matteucci at this time was interrogating the men. Lt. Matteucci told me that the two men had denied everything. At this time it was decided that the two Partisans remain in Pisa and we would take the two men to S. Giuliano Terme. We did this and took the men to the S. Giuliano jail. The keys of the jail were in my possession. Lt. Matteucci and the American soldier left me in charge of the two men and Lt. Matteucci told me that I should do everything possible to make the two men talk.

After about an hour I entered the cell where the two men were kept and I told them that I already knew who they were, that death was ugly, and that if they confessed they would only receive about 8 to 10 months of jail and then they would be sent home. In spite of what I told them they kept on saying that they did not know anything and that they were innocent. At this time I left the men in the cell. After about another hour I returned to the cell and I took a radio tube with me telling them that it was taken from their radio-transmitter which they had hidden. At first they both denied everything but later the smaller of the two men began to walk nervously and began saying that he had something to say but that he would say it to Lt. Matteucci in the morning. I told them that they could tell me everything and that I would tell the Lieutenant. At this time they told me that they had a radio-transmitter buried. I asked them why they had not told me this before. They said that they were afraid that they would get shot.

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Later Lt. Matteucci returned and I told him that the two men had confessed that they were German agents; and that they had a radio-transmitter. At this time Lt. Matteucci, an American soldier and I went to the place where the two men had been staying and searched for the radio-transmitter. We did not find it and therefore we returned to get the two men to show us where it was hidden. Lt. Matteucci, two American soldiers and another Partisan took the two men from my charge and went to look for the radio-transmitter. At this time I did not go with them and I did not see the two men afterwards.

Subject: T/Sgt. Anthony J. Tiso Report of two Enemy Agents, apprehended in Pisa, the first part of September 1944.

To: C.I.C. Detachment Fifth Army

On the 4 September 1944, Lt. Matteucci (Italian Army), T/4 Salvatore J. Di Marco and myself, were interrogating civilians and Partisans in Gello (C-128595) for military information. We asked also, if they knew of any persons whom they had reason to suspect of being enemy agents. They replied that there were two in Pisa, so we told them to find out and be certain of all the details and that we would return to gather all the information concerning these suspects.

We returned the afternoon of the 6 Sept. not being able to come on the 5 Sept., due to work elsewhere. I stayed in G. Giuliano (C-134703) interrogating Partisans for military information while Lt. Matteucci and Sgt. Di Marco left to see what had taken place concerning the two suspects.

After two or three hours Lt. Matteucci and Sgt. Di Marco returned with the two suspects and it was decided that it was best (to make them talk, they denied everything) to put them in the San Giuliano Jail and under guard of a partisan named Luigi.

We returned two days later, 8 Sept. and as soon as we opened the jail door the two suspects told Lt. Matteucci and myself that they would tell everything.

They said they possessed a radio receiver and transmitter, and that they had been sent by the Germans.

Immediately after this statement Lt. Matteucci, Luigi and myself went to their apartment to get all the documents, and find the radio transmitter. Luigi cited the fact that the Partisans in his area needed some clothing and took the same from the suspects room.

Not finding the radio, we went back to the jail, and took the two enemy agents with us, back to their apartment. They dug up the radio, which was buried in the garden, immediately in back of the house.

With the documents, the radio, and the two enemy agents, we returned to our HQ. (IV CORPS PARTISAN OFFICE) which was then located in Ponsacco. They were kept under guard and on the morning of 9 Sept. C.I.C. was called.

The C.I.C. Fifth Army Detachment, that same afternoon picked up the two suspects, the radio transmitter, plus the documents.

To: Judge Advocate, Fifth Army, A.P.O. #464, U. S. Army.

1. Attached hereto papers in reference to the apprehension and interrogation of Ugo LENCIONI, confessed enemy agent.

2. It is requested that subject be brought to trial as soon as practicable.

3. For security reasons it is considered that the trial should be held in Caserta.

4. It is further requested that the President of the Court advise the accused at the opening of the Court, that in the event he is acquitted, he will nevertheless be interned immediately after the trial as he is considered a danger to Allied security.

5. All witnesses are available and may be contacted through this office. LENCIONI is confined in the Santa Teresa Prison, Florence.

SUBJECT: RENCIANI, Ugo, Age 35. (Suspected Enemy Agent).

TO: A.C. of S., G-2 (GI), Headquarters Fifth Army.

1. The facts in this case are quite simple and are that subject was sent by the German Intelligence Service to Allied occupied Italy-- according to Subject's statement--on a mission to last 2 to 4 days, to ascertain whether or not there were white or colored troops in a certain area.
2. On the ~~14th August 1944~~ he presented himself at the office of the Questura in Florence and asked for ration cards, saying he had escaped from the Germans at Modena and abandoned everything.
3. There was no objection to this request, which Subject wrote out in duplicate. One copy was retained by Questura and will be produced, the other copy was returned to Subject marked "No Objection".
4. What the Subject did immediately after that is not known except that later the same day he was arrested by Questura Agents working for 412 FSS, who were in charge at that time and taken to the office of the 412 FSS in Florence as a new arrival in the City.
5. It is the practice that all new arrivals are interrogated by FSS.
6. At the office of 412 FSS, Subject was seen by Sgt. J. C. Plank, who as a result of the interrogation decided that Subject should go to RFP for further interrogation. The reason for this being that Subject stated he was a Refugee from German Occupied Italy. No suspicion was attached to Subject at this time.
7. Subject was escorted to the Prison in Florence by a member of the Questura attached to 412 FSS, named Pellegrini. Subject told Pellegrini the Refugee story.

8. It is unfortunate for Subject that when he arrived at the Prison in Florence he was seen and spoken to by one DONATI, Decio.

9. The last named is a German agent who surrendered to the Allies after crossing the line and he had told his interrogators that Subject was about to come South on a Mission.

10. DONATI told Subject in prison that the Allied Intelligence people were expecting him (Subject) and he would undoubtedly be interrogated.

11. In addition DONATI informed No. 3 SGI Unit of the presence of Subject in the prison in Florence, as a result of which Subject was interrogated and readily confessed that he was a German Agent but denied that he intended completing his mission.

12. At the present time DONATI is not available but I hope to have him available as a witness when the Court sits.

13. Attached are the statements of the witnesses who are available and who will be called to give evidence:--

FRANCINI Giovanni, FS Agent (who will produce Subject's application for ration card)

MR. J. C. PLANK, No. 412 FSB.

BERNARDINI, Asello, FS Agent.

RAFFELLI, Rolando, FS Agent, (who will produce the signed confession of Subject).

14. I suggest Subject be arraigned before a General Allied Military Court and charged with having served the enemy as a spy in Florence on the 30th August 1944.

TRANSMISSION

"I, the undersigned, Commissario Aggiunto di 13 TRIBUNALE
GIOVANNI di Raffaele, declare that on the 30th August 1944
COMMISSIONER UGO di Zilio presented himself at my office in the
Questura, and he gave me an application in two copies asking for
the issue of ration cards for bread, "pasta" and various foods.

He told me "I have come from ROMA to escape from the
Germans and have abandoned everything".

I then wrote that there was NO objection on one of the two
copies of the application, advising him that he should present
himself at the Comune to obtain the issue of the required
ration cards.

He did NOT make any further statements.

TRANSLATION OF STATEMENT BY DONATI DECIO

I, the undersigned, DONATI Decio, son of Francesco and of MORELLINI Rosa, born at ANGHILARI on the 20th July 1922, married, living at Via del Vingone, 29, AREZZO, state as follows:

I was at Modena in the National Republican Guard and I was trying to find a means whereby I might return to my home from which I had been removed by force by my fellow soldiers at the time of the retreat and I had an opportunity to become acquainted with UGO LENCIONI one day in the month of July at the Restaurant San Marco. Lencioni was dressed in the uniform of a Sergeant-Major with a German badge, and after we had dined together I explained my circumstances to him and told him (saying that he presented himself to me as a propagandist) that if it were possible I would like to have transferred into that party in view of the considerable material advantages, but I conceal the advantages which would accrue to me from being part of that Company, that is to say, of having documents adequate to go where ever I liked and to choose the moment for crossing the lines. Without losing time he agreed, and together with two women, sent me on the same evening to Roncole, a village about 10 kilometres from Modena where both I and the women were to present ourselves to take service; but for the women it was an easy matter to remain, but for me impossible since I was sought by my Headquarters, brought back to Modena and punished.

From that day I had not seen Lencioni again until about one month later that is precisely on the evening of the 20th August about 2100 hours at the Albergo Commercio where I was living. I had just finished dinner when I saw Lencioni in civilian clothes with persons whom I did not know: I greeted him and he acknowledged the greeting; after which I told him what had happened in the previous month and he told me that he was no longer a member of the same organisation but said nothing as to the reason. However, he told me that he was a member of the German Secret Service. I repeated my request and he told me that he had a job to find personnel and that he would give me an answer the next day. I introduced him to a friend of mine Alfanni Piero and another person who was introduced to me by Alfanni and then we left after having made an appointment for the following day at the Restaurant Aurora. I arrived punctually together with Alfanni and the person introduced me by a certain Bartolini Alvaro and we found Lencioni who was waiting for us. We sat down at a table and he told us that an officer working in the service which we were to undertake would sit at our table; he gave me to understand that for me to be taken on

would be more difficult because I was too young. Seeing my opportunity escape me, I begged again that I might be taken on and I promised him the sum of 1000 lire as soon as I was taken on. No sooner was the promise given than it was apparent that there would be no hindrance. After we had waited, the man we were waiting for showed up, lunched with us and we were a party of four. Everything went well and we were given an appointment for the next day at the Via Cesare Battisti at the Transport Office.

At 9-0 am on the 22nd we were all three present and we found there Leacioni, the officer of the previous evening who took our names and explained what was the service we were to carry out namely: to cross the lines, to watch the movement of troops and transport and to bring back the information recrossing the lines, a very difficult task which I would not have done for anything in the world if I did not have the motive which I mentioned above. He told us that next day the lessons would start which would last one hour at a time until one was able to recognize well the types of troops and to distinguish properly of what division or regiment the soldiers and transport belonged. He left us with an appointment for the next day and we again re-assembled on the 23rd were finally taken into the service and given a payment in advance of 1000 lire, which represented 10 days pay. We were asked for photographs to prepare the documents which Leacioni already had and we commenced the instruction which took place every day at hours fixed by this officer who was called Battisti. One day during the lesson a German officer came in, a certain Lieutenant Kraff or Kraffen, I don't exactly remember his name. For some two days I did not see Leacioni and asked Battisti about him, he answered that he had gone on a mission, I knew that he was to go because I had told me, but I was not sure that he had already gone.

On the morning of the 29th about 10-0 am, I was going to the school together with Alfanni when Battisti arrived and told us that we had to start on our mission and that there was only time to go to the albergo and pay our bill and return because there was a car waiting for us which took us to Bologna where we had a meal and then proceeded to the village of Barberino Mugello where the car left us telling us to wait and after we had waited about an hour the car came back with an officer and a soldier and we went into the office of the Feld-Gendarmerie. There we were shown a map and told where it was easiest to cross the lines and the road to follow and I was given an identity card and they took away the one prepared in Modena. Then we went forward and after passing Borgo San Lorenzo we were attacked by aircraft, we hid the car with branches and went into a field where a bomb fell and Alfanni was struck

in the head. The aircraft went away and the Marasciello who was with us took me to a Headquarters close by and left me there, Alfani I believe was taken in the car to hospital. I spent the night at the Headquarters, on the following evening I was accompanied by a motor-cyclist and went to another Headquarters and spent the night in the front lines and on the following morning crossed the lines. I presented myself to the first English troops I met and told them what I had seen; the Major in charge of this unit gave me a permit to present myself at the Pontassieve Headquarters and let me go. I went to that Headquarters and there I was arrested and taken to a concentration camp where I spent the night. On the following evening I was taken to Florence, was interrogated and brought to the prison of S. Teresa where to my great surprise I met Lencioni. I greeted him and told him that I had been interrogated and had told everything and begged him to tell everything because I wanted everything that I had said to be proved the truth. He was interrogated and I suppose that he said everything that I had said about my situation. After I had been in prison about ten days another person belonging to the German Spy Service arrived and Lencioni introduced him to me as Bartoloni Mario. I did not know him but never the less we immediately made friends and shared our food and cigarettes which were very scarce in prison, and then I left for the concentration camp and knew nothing more.
