1. With reference to the above named Italian at present held in custody by instructions of A.C. of S. G-2 A.F.H.2. as a suspected enemy agent:-

2. Enquiries regarding this case have now been completed but the facts elicited do not show that he did any overt act or that he had any intention of carrying out espionage on behalf of the Germans.

3. As will be seen from S.C.I. Unit "2" Interrogation Report JRX-264 of 1 September 1944, ARTOM admitted having been left behind by the Germans in CHIETI, after Allied Occupation in July, 1944, with instructions to operate a wireless transmitter.

4. He said, however, that he left CHIETI on 16 July 1944 and came to Rome, where he remained up to the time of his arrest. He stated that the electric current was turned on in CHIETI on the day when he left. Therefore he could not have operated his transmitter prior to that time. He also maintained that he had left the transmitter in a disassembled condition in a room which he had offered to a British Captain prior to leaving for Rome.

5. Enquiries were therefore instituted in CHIETI to verify the above mentioned statements, particularly to check what was the condition of the transmitter when found and as to whether ARTOM had at any time returned to CHIETI since 16 July 1944.

6. Attached to this report is a copy of a statement made by Sergeant G.A. BLANCH FLOWER, 1401813, 409 P.S. Section who carried out enquiries and search in CHIETI, regarding ARTOM. The sergeant's statement shows that ARTOM's story to S.C.I. "2" Unit was substantially true.

7. In the first place, the wireless set, although the component parts appeared in good condition, was not assembled. As is known, the usual practice of German Intelligence, was to have the set assembled by a German wireless expert and then tested for communication with Berlin or elsewhere.

2. Enquiries regarding this case have now been completed but the facts elicited do not show that he did any overt act or that he had any intention of carrying out espionage on behalf of the Germans.

3. As will be seen from S.C.I. Unit "Z" Interrogation Record JRX-264 of 1 September 1944, ARCOM admitted having been left behind by the Germans in CHIETI, after Allied Occupation in July, 1944, with instructions to operate a wireless transmitter.

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6. Attached to this report is a copy of a statement made by Sergeant G.A. BLANCH FLOWER, 1464813, 409 P.S. Section who carried out enquiries and search in CHIETI, regarding ARCOM. The sergeant's statement shows that ARCOM's story to S.C.I. "Z" Unit was substantially true.

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7. In the first place, the wireless set, although the component parts appeared in good condition, was not assembled. As is known, the usual practice of German Intelligence, was to have the set assembled by a German wireless expert and then tested for communication with Berlin or elsewhere. It is perhaps doubtful whether ARCOM would have been capable of assembling the set. Also, the transmitter was found in a suitcase in the care of his landlady and was kept in a spare room with no real attempt at concealment.

8. Further, enquiries gave no indication that he had at any time returned to CHIETI, and enquiries in Rome tend to confirm that he has remained here throughout the time since leaving CHIETI on 16 July 1944. Also, his room at CHIETI had been occupied from 15 July 1944 up to the time of Sgt. BLANCH FLOWER's enquiries by Captain J.B. SEYMUR, Canadian A.M.C. Officer.

9. In view of the results of enquiries as above there does seem to be a great deal of doubt as to whether LWPC intended to work for the Germans if he had not been arrested. The general indications are that he did not intend to do so, and, in any case, it is fairly certain that no Court would convict him on the facts shown.

10. It is therefore recommended that no prosecution be undertaken but that he be interned as a danger to military security, in view of his previous connection with German Intelligence.

3. On 1 September 1944, I interviewed Captain SEGUIN, Jules Fernand, a Canadian A.M.G.O.T. Agriculture Officer, who took over the apartment occupied by ARTOM on 15 July '44. I did not ask him whether ARTOM offered him his room or not, and he did not volunteer a statement on this point. The point cannot be verified except by Captain SEGUIN. Captain SEGUIN made a statement to me that ARTOM had requested a written permission signed by Captain SEGUIN to travel on W.D. transport to Rome. Captain SEGUIN refused to give such a permission.

4. I made exhaustive enquiries to ascertain whether ARTOM Emilio returned to CHIETI after 16 July, 1944 but no evidence was found to support this.

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OGGETTO: Arresto di ARTOM Emilio, agente del servizio spionistico germanico.

1. Il giorno 27 agosto 1944 noi DANISELLI Aldo e FICHERA Aurelio v. brig. di P.S. addetti al Commissariato di P.S. di C. Pretorio in Roma abbiamo avuto incarico dal v. Commissario agg. di P.S. Dr. D'AMATO Federico dello stesso ufficio di intrattenere di a turno nell'abitazione in Via Cernaia n.33 int.8 per attendervi l'arrivo di ARTOM Emilio, agente del servizio dello spionaggio germanico e trarlo in arresto.

2. Tale incarico c'era stato dato previo accordo preso dal Dr. D'Amato con il maggiore BERDING A.M. allora comandante dell'O.S.S. X.2.

3. Alle ore 13,45 io DANISELLI Aldo ho dato il cambio nella abitazione al mio collega FICHERA Aurelio. Sino a quel momento l'ARTOM non era ancora giunto.

4. Mi sono messo ad attenderlo nella sua camera ed alle ore 14,30 egli è entrato nell'abitazione dirigendosi verso la camera ove io l'attendevo.

5. Dopo averlo perquisito per vedere se aveva armi in dosso gli ho chiesto ove fosse l'apparecchio radio trasmittente. Al che egli si è reso subito conto di cosa si trattasse e mi ha risposto che la radio si trovava a Chieti. Dopo di che lo ho condotto nell'ufficio.

6. Dell'avvenuto arresto il Dr. D'AMATO ha subito dato notizia al maggiore BERDING comunicandogli inoltre l'indirizzo preciso di Chieti ove la radio si trovava nascosta affinché fosse provveduto per il recupero.

7. All'ARTOM sono state sequestrate all'atto del suo arresto L.19.000 in biglietti da mille, nuovi di zecca ed in serie progressiva residuo della somma avuta dai tedeschi per la missione

da svolgere. Il danaro è stato consegnato dal Dr. D'AMATO nelle mani del maggiore BERDING.

8. Il giorno stesso l'ARTOM ha fatto la sua deposizione confessando le proprie responsabilità in un verbale di interrogatorio che io DANISELLI Aldo ho raccolto e scritto a macchina controfirmandolo unitamente al Dr. D'AMATO.

9. Nel corso del giorno successivo l'ARTOM è stato accompagnato al carcere di Regina Coeli e messo a disposizione dello O.S.S. X. 2.

3. The result of the enquiries has not yet been communicated to S.C.I. Unit "2" or to Security Division, and as the question of prosecution of ARTOM depends largely on the result as above, it is requested that the matter be expedited.

SUBJECT: Prosecution of Enemy Agent - ARTON Emilio.

TO : S.C.I. "B".

1. In connection with preparation of the above-mentioned case, it is required that signed statements be obtained from the Publica Sicurezza agents who arrested ARTON on 28 August 1944, under S.C.I. "Z" instructions.
2. The statements should give date, time and place of arrest, result of search of prisoner's premises and an account of anything which he said to the agents at time of arrest or subsequently.
3. Amplification of the Interrogation report of Capt. Louis A. GEMISTY is required. It is desired to know whether the particulars supplied by ARTON were given spontaneously or whether he had at first told a different story. If so, with what facts was he confronted to cause him to change his story to the one shown in S.C.I. "B" interrogation report.

1. When ARTHUR's wireless transmitting set was found, what was its condition? Was it packed away in its component parts as stated by him, or was it found assembled ready for transmission?
2. Was the wireless transmitter found in a place of concealment or was its presence obvious to any person entering the room? Description of manner of concealment, if any.
3. Did enquiries in CHIMTZ verify time, before leaving CHIMTZ on 16 July 1944 ARTHUR had offered his room to a British Captain?
4. Did enquiries at CHIMTZ show that ARTHUR went back there at any time after he left for Rome on 16 July, 1944?

If answers to the above mentioned questions are not available from your records of what happened subsequent to S.G.I. "2" interrogation of ARTHUR, I should be glad if you would take the necessary steps, through your own channels to obtain the desired information, as this office is not in a position to undertake such enquiries in CHIMTZ.

If possible, it is requested that any reply be given in the form of statements signed by the Allied officer or other official who searched ARTHUR's address at CHIMTZ or who made the necessary enquiries there, arising out of S.G.I. "2" interrogation.

If possible, it is requested that any reply be given in the form of statements signed by the Allied officer or other official who searched ARTHUR's address at CHIENTI or who made the necessary enquiries there, advising out of B.C.I. "2" interrogation.
