1. Attached hereto papers in reference to the apprehension and interrogation of Ruy Bias BIAGI, confessed enemy agent.
2. It is requested that subject be brought to trial as soon as practicable.

3. For security reasons it is considered that the trial should be held in Camera.

4. It is further requested that the President of the Court advise the accused at the opening of the Court, that in the event he is acquitted, he will nevertheless be interned immediately after the trial as he is considered a danger to Allied security.

5. All witnesses are available and may be contacted through this office. Biagi is confined in the Santa Teresa Prison, Florence.

Subject: PIAGGI Luigi (Alleged Enemy Agent)

To: A.C. of S., O-2(CI), HQ Fifth Army.

1. In order to prove a case of Espionage against Subject before a General Allied Military Court it will be necessary to call the following witnesses, from whom statements have been taken - copies attached.
 2. (a) GIACCHERINI Guido, a Baker of Via delle Porcellane, No. 11, Florence, a partisan.
 - (b) ASTORINA Alfredo, Maresciallo of Public Security.
 - (c) Capt. John C. Fairweather, No. 3, SCI Unit.
 - (d) Capt. B.E. Droyfus, Provincial Legal Officer, Siena.
(no statement taken from this Officer)
 3. The story commences on the 25th August 1944, in Via Pallazzo, Florence, when Subject was arrested by a number of Partisans and a Maresciallo of Public Security. The witness GIACCHERINI was one of the Partisans and the Maresciallo of Public Security is ASTORINA.
 4. The Subject was originally arrested by these people for having been a Republican Fascist, but shortly after the arrest was made information was received that Subject was an enemy agent. As a result of this information, Subject was handed over to SCI to whom he eventually confessed that he was an enemy agent.
 5. The first two witnesses can say very little more than is mentioned above, but the third witness--Capt. Fairweather--tells the story that really matters.
 6. It will be seen from the statement of Capt. Fairweather, that Subject was brought to his office at the Excelsior Hotel during the afternoon of 25th August 1944, by the witness ASTORINA.
 7. I have not been able to ascertain whether the Subject heard ASTORINA say to Capt. Fairweather why he had been brought to the latter's office, but Capt. Fairweather took him to his room and interrogated him.
 8. When Subject was searched, amongst other things in his possession, was a copy of an arrest report showing he had been arrested on the 5th August 1944, at Siena, and charged with travelling without a permit.

9. The details of the interrogation are shown in Capt. Fairweather's statement, and they are briefly that Subject at first denied being an enemy agent, but later admitted that he was.

10. It will be seen that Subject admitted he had crossed into Allied Territory on or about the 12th July 1944, with instructions to proceed to Anzio and collect information respecting the Port. He should have returned to the German lines in ten days.

11. Subject admits having travelled as far south as Rome, but no farther, and says that when arrested he was on his way to Pistoia--his home town--to join his family, and had no intention of returning to the Germans.

12. It is difficult to accept this story because Capt Dreyfus from whom no statement has been taken, will say that on the 17th August 1944, Subject appeared before his Court charged with travelling without a permit.

13. Subject stated on his arrest for the offence of travelling without a permit, as shown on the arrest Report found in his possession, that he was running away from the Germans to save himself being deported to Germany. As Subject had then been in custody since 5th August 1944, he was discharged.

14. No instructions were given to Subject when he was discharged but he made an entry in the hotel register that his destination was Rome, and evidence can be called to this effect should it be deemed necessary.

15. The next we hear of Subject is 25th August 1944, when he was arrested in Florence.

16. Under these circumstances, I suggest the Subject be arraigned before a General Allied Military Court, charged with Espionage on the 25th, 1944, in Florence.

DECLARATION

The undersigned, Maresciallo di P.S. Auxiliary ASTORINA Alfredo in the service of 3rd. Company of the FLORENCE Police declares as follows : -

At the end of the fighting for the liberation of the city, I was assigned to the Patriot Office of the CHRISTIAN DEMOCRATS to direct police operations.

After having carried various arrests, I had drawn to my attention by the patriot BRUNETTI Bruno, a certain BIAGI alias di Giulio berza at PISSOLA, cadet of 10th. MAS PIOTILLA, correspondent of the newspaper 'TRIPPO MOSTRO', who had accused and denounced partisans. A rabid Fascist Republican, he reviled, in his articles, the youths who fought for the freedom of the Fatherland, or at least, he tried to discredit them.

Accordingly, a plan of surveillance was initiated at the albergo TURISMO, where BIAGI was known to lodge. The Patriots GIAC-CHERINI Guido and BRUNETTI Bruno installed themselves in the Hotel for a night and a day while BIAGI was being sought for in the city. On the morning of the 25th. August at about 0930 hours, the patriots BRUNETTI Bruno and BETTINI Apicio saw BIAGI in the company of a friend in Via PALAZZOLO. They invited him to follow them but the friend Mario MALAGUTI intervened in his favour and tried to prevent the arrest. The patriots were therefore compelled to take both to the office of the P.S., of the D.C.

The interrogation having commenced, the hung-dog attitude of BIAGI masked an iron determination to make NO confession. Having had confirmation that BIAGI was a pupil at the school of Espionage of MILAN, and, being unaware of the existence of the office of the P.S. Section, I accompanied him under escort to the PREFETTURA to continue the interrogation in conjunction with the Military Command of the C. T. L. N.

Towards 1400 hours, on the suggestion of the Military Command, I went to the F.S. Section office where I received excellent co-operation enabling me to transport BIAGI and other individuals to the Allied HQ., who took them in charge.

Statement of Captain Faguet concerning interpretation of

My Case Study

In the afternoon of 25 August 1944, my case study was brought into the office of No. 3 U.S.L. unit, in the Superior Hotel, Paris by a U.S. Agent, UNKNOWN, 22 years.

The P.M. Agent presented the man to Major Smith, No. 3 U.S.L. unit, in my presence, as a spy carrying a U.S. or American instruction to to interrogate him. I took him to another room in the hotel.

At first FAGI declared that he had been hidden in the mountains near TUNISIA for a considerable period; had later managed to cross the Allied Lines; had then gone south to Africa but, feeling homesick, he had started back for FRANCE. At SORRENTE, he had been arrested by the Germans without a warrant and had been sentenced to 12 days detention.

As I already was in possession of information that FAGI had been given in the German school of espionage at TUNIS, I checked on my information to see if I could be mistaken. Having found my information to be correct I then returned to SORRENTE and told him he was a spy. He again denied telling any lies, continuing his denial for about 40 minutes. Finally he said that I knew the whole truth and said he was tired of the whole affair and would tell the truth.

FAGI then made the following admission. He stated that until June 1944 he was with the S. Service. He was then told to report to a certain MUSSEY in FRANCE. Mussey had him sign a declaration that he would never reveal the details of his future work. Rather than trust Mussey, he went to the School of Espionage in 32 Rue Andre Martin, LYON. The course lasted until 12 July 1944, during which period FAGI was paid a salary of 2000 lire a month.

On 12 July, FAGI was instructed to go to LYON and collect information regarding the SPY. He was to return in 40 days using the passenger "Ghezo" to cross the German Lines on his return journey. (near ROME) where he crossed the Lines on foot.

At first PLASSI declared that he had been hidden in the mountains near TURIN for a considerable period; but later agreed to cross the United Lines; and, then again, went back, pointing however, to his sentence for 21 months. At which he had been sentenced by the court for travelling without a permit and had been sentenced to 12 days detention.

As I already was in possession of information that PLASSI had been seen in the German school of Capriago at MILAN, I checked on my information to see if I could corroborate. But the found no information to be correct. I then returned to PLASSI and told him he was a liar. He again denied telling any lies, continuing his denial for about 10 minutes. Finally he said that I knew the whole truth and said he was tired of the whole affair and would tell the truth.

PLASSI then made the following statement. He stated that on 11 June 1944 he was with the S. R. A. He was then told to report to a certain station in ITALY. PLASSI had been given a declaration that he would never reveal the details of his future work. During this time he had to report to the school of espionage in 32 Via Africana, MILAN. The course lasted until 12 July 1944, during which period PLASSI was paid a salary of 9000 lire a month.

On 12 July, PLASSI was instructed to go to ANCONA and collect information regarding the port. He was to return in 10 days using the passenger "Obero" to cross the German lines on his return journey.

PLASSI was then taken in a German car to a point near S. PIEMONTE (near PISTOIA) where he crossed the lines in secret.

He then made his way to LIGURIA where he stayed for four days at the Ligurian "Tremoso" where he proceeded to LIGURIA and stayed in a inn.

I then asked for the name of the station in which he stated he had forgotten. When asked where it was located he said "near the station". He did not know what station. He indicated that he did not go further south than MILAN, where he stated he remained about one week.

PLASSI stated that he then returned to MILAN with the intention of returning home to TURIN. As soon as he was arrested and detained for 12 days for travelling without permit, he returned by this he at once continued his journey to TURIN.

At PLASCO he went to stay in the Liberal Pension Hotel, about at once, changed over to the pensione Antonini, where he was residing at the time of his arrest.

SUBJECT: BIAGI Ruy Blas.

With reference to the above and instructions received from GSI (b) Adv.H.Q., A.A.I., attached herewith is the original arrest report made out by the CC RR of SIENA. I obtained this from the legal branch of A.M.G., H.Q. Region VIII and gave a receipt for it.

The arrest was actually effected by V.Brig. RAPISARDA Rosario at the check point at Palazzo dei Diavoli, about 400 yds. outside the city of SIENA on the main FLORENCE road (Route 2). It has not been possible to obtain a statement from this man as he was given 40 days "Licenza convalescenza" on 4 SEP 44. He went to his home in ROME, address:

There is no evidence that he was searched at the CC RR station when arrested, but below is given a list of things removed from him when he was taken to the Carcere Giudiziario at SIENA to await his trial before A.M.G.

This does not necessarily represent all the articles of which he was in possession as prisoners are allowed to retain such things as cigarette cases etc. Whilst in prison he spent some money there on food etc. and when he left he had in his possession 4004.05 lire

When he was released from prison nothing was done with him as he was discharged by the A.M.G. court. As mentioned in my previous report, when he left the "Casa dello Studente" on 15 AUG 44 he entered his destination in the hotel register as Rome. He did not obtain a permit from A.M.G. for this journey.

With reference to the above and A.A.I. Letter L.56/266/GOI(b) dated 7 SEP 44, the subject's movements while in SIENA were as follows:-

Arrived in SIENA on the evening of 15 JUL 44, together with VANNINI Giulio di Agostino e di Degli Innocenti Marinella, born at PISTOIA 25.9.19. Both stayed at the Albergo "Tre Mori" and stated that they had come from PISTOIA.

They left together on 17 JUL 44. According to the hotel register they were going to GROUP CO.

On 5 AUG 44 BLAGI was arrested by the CC RR at SIENA at a road block approx. 400 yards outside the gates of the city on the FLORIANA road (Palazzo dei Diavoli). A copy of the arrest report made by the CC RR is attached herewith. He was put in prison and on 11 AUG 44 his case was heard in the ARD court SIENA. He was discharged as he stated that he had come from FLORIANCE, which was then in enemy hands; he was in fact arrested on the road leading from FLORIANCE.

The evening of 14 AUG 44 he stayed at the "Casa dello Studente" SIENA and left on the morning of 15 AUG 44, according to the hotel register, to go to ROMA.

Although he made this entry in the hotel register, he had previously told the Capo-Guardia at the prison in SIENA that when he left prison he was going to return to PISTOIA.

DECLARATION.

The undersigned V.Brigadiere APISSARDA Rosario of the Station of SIMI and at present on 40 days' sick leave in the Commune of AGGIUS - parish of S. ANNA AMMALATA - (jurisdiction of the Carabinieri of GUARDIA MANGANO) declares that at about 10 a.m. on the 5th August 1944 while on ~~duty~~ duty at the check point in the locality "PALAZZO DEI DIAVOLI", he proceeded to the arrest of one PIAGI RUY ALAS because he was coming from the North and had crossed the fighting line, and had no documents or identity. This arrestee on interrogation declared he had come from his home. He was immediately afterwards, accompanied by two carabinieri, taken to the Carabinieri Station of the above-mentioned city together with a report made out in triplicate on the appropriate form provided by the Allied Headquarters.

He further adds that on his return to the barracks he learned from the ~~Bar~~ Maresciallo commanding that Station that the arrestee had been taken to the local jail at the disposal of the Allied Military Authority.

Should the above mentioned report not have been traced, the copy of it in the files of the above-mentioned check point could be produced.

He is unable to furnish any other information, as the undersigned ~~Xxxxxx~~ so far has not been warned for the relative trial.
