1. Reference Folio 1—I telephoned you from Naples at about 1630 hours on Monday 3 June to give a preliminary report of my observation of the political elections there. You then read Folio 1 to me over the phone.

2. As instructed, I spoke to Col Pennywick, AC CIO Naples, and told him I was going to see the Prefect and refer the matter to him.

3. At about 1900 hours I saw the Prefect, Dott. Ventura, and told him of these allegations. I said we were unable to say what ordinance (if any) should be given to this story but we passed the matter on to him for such action as he might think fit to take.

4. The Prefect confirmed that a certain number of employees of the Istituto Centrale di Statistica were being sent to Naples to assist in the scrutiny and had actually arrived at the Court of Appeal. He added, however, that they had a much larger number of employees of the Comune and the courts of justice who were known and trusted and that he would speak to the First President of the Court of Appeal and arrange for these clerks from Rome to be:

- a. employed on minor duties towards the end of the proceedings, such that they would not be able to falsify any figures;
- b. employed in pairs with a local clerk who could be trusted to check their work and see that it was honestly done.

5. The Prefect then got in touch with the First President by telephone and also sent one of his officials around to see him about the matter.

I am confidentially informed that the Questura of ROME has learned from a reliable source that on 2 June 46 a group of employees of the Istituto Centrale di Statistica will attend at the Corte d'Appello del Tribunale of NAPLES to act as counters. It is claimed that all have been selected owing to their Communist tendencies, members with right wing leanings will not take part in this work. The selection has been made so it is alleged, with the aim of altering the result of the poll in favour of left wing parties.
