A new anti-Soviet and anti-Communist propaganda campaign seems to have been initiated by the Chief of the Italian Police Dr. Ferrari by his issue of a circular letter to the Questori of the various provinces, reading as follows:

"We have received trustworthy reports that in Italy a clandestine organisation named "Troika" has been constituted whose members are Russian, Yugoslav and Italian citizens, with the purpose to commit acts of terrorism against Allied troops as well as against Italians and foreigners known as anti-communists and opponents of Tito. The organisation is composed of nuclei, each consisting of three men. Hundred such nuclei exist in Milan, 100 in Torino, 50 in Ancona and 50 in Bologna. Another 50 are to be organised in Naples shortly. All of them are under the command of the Soviet Colonel Lebedijeff, one of the chiefs of OZNA who is staying in Rome at present. Recently a number of "Troika" members have landed between Bari and Manfredonia. At the moment of action the nuclei will be reinforced by 280,000 well-armed extremists. - You are asked to carry out thorough investigations."

"Unita", the organ of the Communist Party, asks whether this letter is to be regarded as a manifestation of bureaucratic idiocy or a symptom that there are currents operative bent on using the police as an instrument for irresponsible anti-fascist provocations.

Obviously the Chief of the Italian Police was not retained by any inhibition from making himself and his minister of the Interior the general laughing-stock. Had he cared to remember that the Troika organisation was created in Yugoslavia by the traitor Mihajlovich for fighting communism, he would probably have refrained from putting into circulation such a lamentably stupid message.

We are not interested in Rovelli and Miani's imprisonment. 2. An American Educator

"It is useless protesting with me, as scholarly established order is directly connected with Italian state's authorities ... As an American educator, if I were a director of your schools, I would have soon stopped the strike. I will examine most calmly these agitations ... If students don't go to school, it is an easy thing for me to close down two or three classes ... I don't grant students the right to strike, as in no democratic country are students allowed to..."

Capt. Simoni addressed a group of students with these sentences; they were asking explanations about measures taken by AMG's Education section with regard to strikers of Technical schools. These are sentences which do not denote a "free" and "democratic" mind, which, we guessed, an American educator would possess.

1. In Routine Reports by this Sec general remarks have often been made on Communist organization and methods in trying to occupy key positions for exerting their influence on the country's internal affairs.

2. The attached is a translation of a report by a usually well informed source giving more particular instances of this tendency.

REPORT

As a result of a system common in communist organisation, the Party also in Italy controls and is quick in placing and forming cells (also composed of one person who must obey superior orders blindly) in the most important and interesting offices in order to follow with greater care those who direct policy in the various departments social, economic and repressive. Such posts it is understood are entrusted to persons of proven communist faith who act with absolute certainty feeling behind them the support of the Party.

The names are given of persons who as a result of difficult but reliable enquiries are found to be members of the communist party and destined to receive in such cells:

Emigration board of F.S.

1. Gaudice DAVIDO.

This man is said to have left the Emigration Board in 1947 still there and occupies room N. 7. According to official announcements he was to have been replaced by Dott. RAO, who is actually employed. However in practice one must always consult DAVIDO in matters of emigration, to whom interested parties are sent by office employees.

DAVIDO despite the denials of the various papers, some time ago on the occasion of the arrest of the SCAMPIAS, was one of the ablest men of the Roman Communist Federation.

From a reliable source: He has made himself thoroughly unpopular through his factions. Small, grim and physically repugnant, he is blindly trusted by the party.

Judge RAO in any case is a humble tool in the hands of his predecessor as regards those emigration cases of interest to the communist party.

Commission for Emigration of F.S.

President: GIOIA - Press Grela
The source is said to be an important member

of the Roman Communist Federation.

He has two posts. He was transferred from Cassino to Rome and appointed to presido over the bankruptcy section of the Tribunal. This post he holds at present. After the resignation of the prefect BUCCONI as a result of differences with Mr. GAMBETTA, then holder and factionist, he was straightforwardly appointed to the post. Today he is master of the Commission.

To conclude our examination of the Emigration Commission and to denote briefly from detailed observation the persistence of the communist party in placing its men in key posts, we quote the following example. Dott. ~~Giuseppe~~ Luigi, a high placed official in the Communist Federation, who formerly was secretary to Mr. CIRIOLO when, months ago the latter was replaced, was recalled to the Communist Federation (VIA Marziale). After some time spent as a magistrate he was sent to the investigation office of the Procura del Re of Rome (one of the most important legal posts in the Capital).

Obviously such a member of the party has the greatest influence in legal proceedings investigating investigation (an influence steady, unobtrusive, weighty and un-



According to a member of the Communist party, in the Organization for recruitment of dwellings, control is in the hands of a female party member who is careful to assign houses as much as possible to party members.

Communist elements or their advocates do in fact occupy the majority of buildings of persons who have gone North especially in the better quarters and in via Veneto.

But above all the position of the party is dominant in labor organizations.

It is worthy of note how such workers' and employees' organization may respect to the C.G.L. (Confederazione Generale Italiana del Lavoro) whose controller is one, MARCHIORO, a well known communist. Almost all the officials are party members and in the various organizations other elements control the situation.

Thus the party can provoke disturbances as it thinks fit, and of late also among clerks, the most disaffected and conscientious class of workers.

The danger in this situation is obvious in that this can draw the country into confusion at will, as they do in practice with the object spreading nervousness and apprehension and embarrassing the Allies especially (so far as I know).

In this matter reports will be made as other communist organizations to keep points are reported.

It is learnt from a communist party member that during certain socialist meetings held in Rome, the Communists have advised that in Spring or at least in the next few months, popular agitations against unemployment and bad conditions will be manifested.

The meetings according to place but it is believed that they are a propaganda and incitement by the party for the masses.

Other communists speak of Russian and Italian Communism both in Italy.

It is also current that the Protestant Christian Churches will be incorporated in the Catholic Church which will make big concessions and reforms among others the marriage of priests. This is not confirmed and it is said to be direct propaganda to put new ideas in people's heads and discredit the traditions of the Catholic Church to confuse the thinking of the masses and bring them into accepting other ideas on the Russian independent Church.



Ulteriori informazioni ci dicono che la Caproni Taliedo ha i seguenti organi operai:

Commissione Interna di Fabbrica costituita da 7-8 operai in buona parte comunisti. Il presidente è attualmente in carcere in seguito ai provvedimenti della M.P. per la benzina e le armi trovate nella sede del P.C. presso la Caproni. Due elezioni, tra i quali un certo Merli (operaio) sono latitanti e ricercati. Tale Merli è elemento bieco e pericoloso, conosciuto bene per la sua attività poco edificante in questo periodo post 25 Aprile.

Consiglio di Gestione costituito da un membro di ogni partito: il P.C. era riuscito fino a pochi giorni fa a tenere in seggio due rappresentanti anzichè uno. Tale Consiglio di Gestione si riunisce con i dirigenti della Ditta (Pasquini - Zuccardini - Rocca - Roia) quasi ogni giorno e fa controlli piuttosto severi in ogni attività aziendale. In generale si compone di persone di discreto buon senso.

Comitato di Epurazione ne è a capo l'ex operaio Antarelli (P.C.) tipo assolutamente da eliminare: ha carattere falso ed untuoso; compie la sua missione tartassando ogni impiegato per partito preso. È noto per i suoi atti di barbarie nei giorni 26-30 aprile, quale ad esempio quello di finire di uccidere un impiegato a calci sulla testa: tale impiegato era stato condannato a morte dal Tribunale Caproni assieme ad altri undici che, rinchiusi in un sotterraneo della ditta, vennero da lui (a capo di altri) massacrati e poi buttati lungo le mura del cimitero di Linate. Fra gli assassinati vi era pure un ingegnere per niente colpevole di illegalità fasciste: solo 3-4 erano colpevoli di tale reato. Solo rancori personali ed accuse di eccessiva rigidità di lavoro portarono alla morte di altri 7-8. L'Antarelli compie la sua opera di epurazione coadiuvato da due giovinastri finti ai suoi ordini. Egli è anche a capo delle guardie, con i risultati di onestà che si possono prevedere. Ad esempio egli ordina la perquisizione degli impiegati all'uscita ed un ingegnere è stato fatto da lui licenziare in tronco perchè nella sua borsa è stato trovato un pezzetto di plexiglas: tale ingegnere, capo della manutenzione, è persona di massima stima, era però rigido e scrupoloso con gli operai.

Ho conferma che Caproni è sostenuto dai fedeli capronisti, ed un suo ritorno sarebbe accettabile in generale, meno che dai comunisti che cercano di ostacolarlo in ogni modo.

CIRCULAR CONCERNING THE MILITARY WORKTO ALL PROVINCIAL FEDERATIONS

Dear fellows:

I want to point out to your attention the problems concerning Armed Forces, Police, A.M.P.I., War veterans and Prisoners Associations. From reports concerning your activity, it appears that these problems are scarcely considered to be important and almost nothing is being done in order to face and solve them.

You must remember that the Army must be democratized as well as the Police, that the AMPI is preminently formed by Partisans belonging to our Party and that most of the Prisoners are farmers and workers. All these men, if not properly guided, are liable to be misguided and cheated by Reactionary Elements.

1) ARMY

Although the campaign for the voluntary enlistment was a great success, we cannot stop intensifying our activity in every branch of the Army, as i.e. the Labour Battallions, the depots and Storage Groups.

The initial difficulties caused by the unavoidable contests between veterans and new enlisted men, were overcome owing to the activity displayed by our fellows in their Combat Groups. But it is not enough: a new democratic conscience has to be formed among the soldiers. They must understand that the Army is nothing but a part of the folk, that its interests are the same as the interests of the folk.

Same intense democratic propaganda must be done among the Officers. All our Federations shall take contact with fellows belonging to Army Departments, supplying them with booklets and other propaganda material. Above all relations between soldiers and civilians must be hearty and frequent: meetings and dances shall be especially fit to this aim.

2) NAVY Same action has to be held in the Navy, only we must remember that:

- 1) The Navy did not disaggregate after the armistice
- 2) Navy Officers are often Monarchists
- 3) Sailors are generally obedient to their Officers
- 4) In the Navy there are no volunteers.

All Federations in the territory of which war ships are placed, shall deeply examine the situation in order to find out in which way to influence the local sailors.

3) AIR FORCE

Also in this branch propaganda has to be done, although the effective force of the Air F. is very small.

4) POLICE FORCES

The problem concerning the Police Forces including the 50.000 Carabinieri in force in the liberated Italy, is especially important and urgent.

The Police must be convinced that it can be of great help in the moral political and material reconstruction of the country. The present situation is especially favourable to a proper propaganda among the Police Forces: f.i. the e-purification, the economical situation and other claims are all points to be examined and discussed upon.

The biggest obstacle against this co-operation is the almost general opinion of our fellows that the police and the Carabinieri are the natural enemies of the folk. The experience of the 1st world war taught us, not to overlook the importance of the Police Forces, which can be of great help. Of course our fellows have to change their conduct towards the Carabinieri, stopping insulting them and considering them friends and co-operators. We learn that in some districts relations between us and Police Forces are most hearty: often Carabinieri took part to demonstrations for the epurations and backed strikes made by workers. On the other hand we learn that in some other districts incidents take place between us and Carabinieri, mostly owing to the despite and enmity shown by our fellow s against them.

In the future, all our struggles shall be headed to the attainment of a true co-operation with the Police Forces: in each Federation, in each Section a member shall be charged with the activity among Police Forces, which this way shall learn to know and appreciate the Communists and their democratic attitude.

In particular our newspaper must develop propaganda in this sense, pointing out and praising the Police operations made against Fascists, criminals and the Black Market, and backing the Police claims for epuration, increase of allotments etc. This way, our newspapers shall become popular also among the Police. Shortly, our watchword must be: "Police with the folk".

5) FIGHTING SOLDIERS ORGANIZATIONS.

They are: the "Associazione Nazionale Combattenti", the "Opera Nazionale Combattenti" and the "Associazione Nazionale Mutilati e Invalidi di guerra". These associations, which

^{former} typical Fascist, are still partly in the hand of reactionary elements. They are very important, because of the fact that all war veterans are members of them; and are charged with the whole activity for the assistance and aid of the fighting troops and of the former prisoners.

During the past, no Communist Federation seemed to understand the importance of these organizations: on the contrary, it must be one of our aims to get the Direction of them. This is not difficult, for presently the Provincial C.L.N. are appointing provincial Commissaries to the temporary Direction of said organizations: we must take care that Communists get appointed.

Besides, all our fellows must become members of the various associations, in order to have the majority when the new Directors shall be elected. We must absolutely avoid that the fighting troops get severed from the folk; this happened after the 1st world war with the well-known consequences.

6) PRISONERS OF WAR

More than one million of former prisoners shall soon return to their homes. We are informed that especially the prisoners interned in Aegypt, Kenia and North Afrika are still under the influence of the "ascist Party. They were mostly captured before the break-down of the Fascists, and thus dont know yet the terrible situation of our country caused by their Party. Instigators by reactionary elements, some of them are developing Fascist Propaganda among their fellow prisoners.

We must remember that the phisical conditions of the prisoners shall be very bad when they reach Italy: especially as far as former internees in Germany are concerned. The problem of the aid to prisoners must be especially taken care of: prisoners must find a warm and kind reception, they must be welcome and helped by our associations. Above all they must be convinced that all Italy's missfortunes were caused by Fascists and Germans.

Accordingly all our Sections must take provisions in order to prepare parcels containing clothing, soap and cigarettes and everything we can collect. Also prisoners families must be eventually helped.

The "ALTO COMMISSARIATO DEI REDUCI" (high Commissariate for War veterans) has already been formed. It was provided by the Government with 30 Milliards Lire; we must take care that this sum may get equally shared among the Associations of Fighting Troops. On the other hand, we must see that all the families of prisoners and fighting troops became members of our "Committees of former Prisoners", which are being formed. That shall be in the future of great importance for our Party.

7) A.N.P.I.

All our Federations must take great care of the A.N.P.I. which shall be charged with the whole assistance and aid of the Partisans. Said A.N.P.I. shall become a very important Association, for all Italian Partisans shall be members of it. Thus all our fellows Partisans, which are still not members of the A.N.P.I. must become it at the earliest. Furtherly the Directors of this Association, which are mostly members of our Party, shall forward a report concerning their activity to the C.L.N. in order to get an acknowledgement of their work.

Said Section shall be directed by a member of the Federal Committee with the co-operation of other fellows, the number of which shall change in accordance with the importance of the Section.

As announced in the newspapers, meetings sponsored by the Socialist and Communist Parties for the Constituent Assembly will be held on Sunday, 14 October.

In Rome the meeting sponsored by the Communist and Socialist Federation will take place at 1000 hours in the "Stadio di Domiziano sul Palatino". Many rumours have been referred to this office with regard to the above meeting. Some say that this public manifestation will assume the aspect of a potential demonstration of strength, as it is reported that all the participants will wear a special uniform. Others affirm that the a/m parties will use the strength at their disposal to impose their will on the Government. Some sources have reported that this preordained public meeting may offer the incentive to assault the gaols and invade religious buildings in Rome, even those which enjoy extra-territorial rights, to eliminate the fascists detained in gaols or hidden in such buildings.

Some others consider the above date and the meeting itself as the first signs of a new March on Rome, while others report that the meetings will be held with an absolute respect of law and order.

A state of political tension undoubtedly does exist in the country; maximum intelligence and circumspection is necessary in order to be on the alert and prepared for any eventuality and in order that the respect of law and order may be enforced with due objectivity, according to the principle, lately enunciated, by virtue of which the Police Forces are politically neutral. In order that the services may be sufficiently prepared for the circumstance, it is necessary that the most careful and accurate investigations be carried out to verify the truth of the above reports, and that the maximum impulse may be given to the information services in order that the orientation of public opinion in all sectors regarding the meeting may be known.

In particular, I refer to the Director of the Political Branch, so that with the increased means at his disposal he may intensify his services and keep me informed of any emergency.

In proceeding with the investigations, it should be borne in mind that the date of 28 October, anniversary of the March on Rome and the Advent of Fascism, is fast approaching.

Vigilance should therefore be intensified in respect of the most notorious elements of the past Regime, and added watchfulness is required for Government buildings and all other objectives that may be made the targets of irresponsible acts by those addicted to violence, mentally unbalanced tendentially opposed to democratic forms of Government.

Vigilance should also be intensified by means of diurnal and nocturnal patrols, with searches and investigations in respect of those persons who arouse suspicions.

Nothing must be overlooked in order that public order be continued to be maintained, and therefore any information that may have any connection or affiliation to public order and security, must be immediately reported in order that appropriate measures can be taken in time.

The addressees are therefore requested to be very watchful, to dispose of their services or observation and signals in order to be prepared for any eventuality, and in order that the Police may be up to the standard of its institutional finalities, especially during this troubled period in the life of our country.

I. Reference this office monthly report for Oct. 1945, paragraph 12.

2. Further enquiries have been made as to the activities of the Communist party in Bologna Province, and the following report is drawn from a number of sources believed to be reliable.

3. Bologna, city and province, is divided into "cells" on the usual Communist pattern, each one independent of the others, and having separate leaders and headquarters.

4. The city of Bologna has six such cells, and its leaders are charged with the duty of organizing and maintaining contact with all "useful" elements of the former Brigata G.A.P.

5. These elements, mostly young men between the ages of 18 and 25, born and brought up under fascism to believe that brute force and violence are symbolic of good citizenship, are those who in the first months after the occupation of this province, murdered some six hundred persons in cold blood and kidnapped many others whose fate is as yet unknown.

6. These form the "shock" troops of the Communist party, and are controlled by men with brains.

7. In the event that the party decides to resort to violence to gain its ends, plans are already prepared and each cell has certain objectives to carry out.

8. Here it may be added that the cells described

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7. In the event that the party decides to resort to violence to gain its ends, plans are already prepared and each cell has certain objectives to carry out.

8. Here it may be added that the cells described above do not merely cover geographical areas, but have smaller branches and organisations in every industrial plant and all public works - railways, transport, communications etc.

9. The objectives to be gained at once are as follows:-

(a) The removal of all persons known to be contrary to the Communist party or who from their position, public or professional, are considered likely to be. Such categories include army officers, particularly Carabinieri; police officials; priests;

persons who have occupied public offices, or who may have in any way some influence over the mass of the population; chiefs of former partisan groups who are known to be anti-Communist or even without definite political views of any kind.

The details of these lists are believed to be largely the work of "Jacopo" (Dott. Uucchi), as stated in monthly report for Oct.

(b) Seizure of the broadcasting station, post and telegraph offices, road and rail transport. As mentioned above, each of these organisations has already a nucleus ready to take possession when called upon. As regards the railways, the organization of the "Poli zia Ferroviaria", dependent as far as can be ascertained from Rome, and locally the responsibility of the Compartimento for the WHOLE of ITALIA, appears to be entirely recruited from former Partisan - and therefore Communist - elements.

(c) Occupation of the Questura, the sectional P.S. offices, CC.RR. stations. As previously reported the admission of some 300 ex-partisans to the Corps of Agents of the Questura, the recruiting of "Volontari in ausilio ai Carabinieri" from the same source in each commune, and the forming of the "Pattuglie Cittadine" have a very obvious purpose. See reports dated 22 Sept. '45, AC-IG/PS/23.4 and 31 Oct. '45, AC-LG /PS/23.4-I.

(d) Occupation of barracks and other large buildings, in city and province, having useful strategic positions.

10. Among the members of the G.A.P. who would be particularly entrusted with such operations are many common criminals whose past history is known to those in control of the movement, and who maintain this control now by threat of denunciation.

II. Having served their purpose, if all goes well, these dangerous persons would themselves be eliminated by the real leaders behind the movement.

12. Ever since the date of occupation, there have been continuous

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12. Ever since the date of occupation, there have been repeated reports of clandestine formations drilling and practising in the mountains, and the sound of machine gun and light automatic fire could be heard daily in the more deserted and devastated areas during the summer months. This latter can be directly confirmed, but no proof of the former was ever forthcoming.

13. Certain individuals can be identified as being definite local leaders.

(a) BARONTINI ELIO, better known locally as "Dario".
This man was the leader of CUER - Comando Uni-
co Militare Ellisse-Romagna - at the time of the

occupation. He is a strong and active Communist. Trained in Russia, he was the commander of a unit of the International Brigade in Spain. Later he went to Abyssinia, and organized Abyssinian irregulars against the Italians. He is considered, however, to be a better Communist than soldier. Lately he has been more active in Milan, and Livorno where he is believed to have an important position (possibly Secretary) in the Camera del Lavoro. There is, too, some evidence for believing that this man has recently actually visited Russia, leaving Livorno on a Russian ship, and only returning to this country at the beginning of November. Since that date he has visited Bologna, but met very few people, as far as is known only (b), (c), (g), (j) and (k) below. He is believed to be returning to Russia again in the very near future.

- (b) DOTT. CUCCHI, better known as "Jacopo", former second in command to "Dario" when Quiller existed. A violent and dangerous type, believed to be largely responsible for the murders that took place in this province following the occupation. Then also known as "Il Boia" - the Executioner. A member of A.N.P.I. and as such travels over the whole region.
- (c) Walter NEGROSSI. Secretary of A.N.P.I. Believed to be associated with Cucchi in compiling the lists of those to be eliminated.
- (d) PACITTI, known as "Arturo", associated with NegroSSI in the Commission of A.N.P.I. Believed to be responsible for several murders and kidnappings.
- (e) A certain RICCI, also associated with (c) and (d).
- (f) DOTT. STERMINI, of the Clinica S. Orsola. An active Communist and close associate of Cucchi. S682
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- (h) BONAZZI, an associate of (g).
- (i) Mario PIAZZA, who was a well known Communist agitator in this province after World War I and has now again started to incite the "contadini" against the land proprietors.
- (j) BETTI, Communist party representative of the C.R.L.N., who has complete control over this body.
- (k) DOZZA, Sindaco of Bologna, an active and convinced Communist who gave his support to the action of a certain "servizio d'ordine" which appeared at the Communist organized meeting for the "Co-

stituente" held in Bologna, as elsewhere, on 14 Oct. '45, and reported on corres. AC-LG/FS/- 26.3 of 1 Nov. '45. This man has made every effort to enrol ex-partisans in the Vigili Urbani.

(1) Gianzulio BORGHESE, Prefetto of Bologna, a prominent Socialist but in his actions and speeches is more "leftist" than some Communists. A clever, astute individual, who like Dozza was plausible enough to win the support of A.M.G. during that period.

14. Certain particular localities in the province can be named as centres where communism is strongest and where politically inspired disturbances may be expected, e.g.:-

Budrio, Molinella, Medicina, Calliera, S. Giovanni in Persiceto, Crevalcore, Castelmaggiore, Minerbio, Marza botto, S. Giorgio di Piano, Pieve di Cento, Argelato, Ozzano Emilia, S. Benedetto Val di Sambro, Castiglione, Sasso Marconi, Sala Bolognese, S. Matteo Decima, Castel S. Pietro, Castenaso, Monterenzio, Castel d'Argile, Malcappa, and Gransolo.

15. Nothing need be said about arms and ammunition, except that it need not be doubted that more than adequate supplies of both are available if and when necessary.

16. Sufficient information has come to light in the last seven months, during the whole of which period the writer has served in Bologna Province, for it to be stated that the facts as set out above are true. Whether disorders and disturbances will actually take place or not, it is impossible to say, but there is no doubt whatever that the possibility exists, and many Italian officials, civilian and military (who after all should know something of their probability) are firmly convinced of their probability.

17. In conclusion, the situation in the province is very similar to that obtaining after World War I. Communism was rife, then as now, in the same centres and districts. As a consequence, landowners then were unable to live on their estates, and were dispossessing of them; there is of course now, no question of the landlords "dispossessing" of their properties, ~~as~~ ^{as} ~~now~~ ^{now}

A few days ago, policemen of the Political Branch of the local Questura, made an unexpected inspection in the Play House situated at 71 via della Croce, where they arrested several persons and seized a large sum of money, counters and checks.

After scrupulous inquiries by the Police, it results that the President of the Sport Club, where the gambling-house was situated, is a certain Vincenzo AMENDOLA, fu Pietro, domiciled at 34 via Monte Fiori, cousin to the present "Sottosegretario di Stato alla Presidenza del Consiglio" (Undersecretary at the Presidency of the Council), Giorgio AMENDOLA, a communist. AMENDOLA Vincenzo is now endeavouring not to be denounced by the Police to the concerned Tribunal.

It has been ascertained that Vincenzo AMENDOLA received 7000 Lires per day by the gamblers of the a/m play house.

SUBJECT : Communist Movement (Revolutionary Independent Group).

The section of the Movement in question was constituted in November 1944. Its Hqs. is situated at 36 via Cincinnato in Rome.

Its direction was taken over by a certain ROSSI Costantino di Luigi and fu FERRERO Mariana, born in Turin on the 6th of June 1906, domiciled in Rome at 25 Circonvallazione Appia. He is an accountant already sentenced for crimes of swindle and theft, ex political exile, idler and rambler, anti-nationalist and anti-militarist.⁴⁵

On the 27th of May 1948 he was arrested by the Squadra Mobile of the local Questura, together with other people, as suspected of theft, extortion and other crimes. In that circumstance he was responsible of the evasion of the well known nazi-fascist collaborator LULLI Leopoldo, from whom he received 200.000 Lires. Moreover, in the same time, he received a sum of 150.000 Lires by the tradesman PALOMBI Mario, owner of a bakehouse, situated at Piazza S. Maria Maggiore. This sum had been given by PALOMBI as a help for the population of the Quadraro quarter. Several thefts have been committed by the gang led by ROSSI, especially during the German occupation. ROSSI Himself admitted his guilt in one of these thefts which had been committed during the night from the 15th to the 19th of April 1945. Moreover he declared his having stole 12 pigs from The Ramazzini Hospital.

On arrest, ROSSI was found in possession of several identification cards, under different names, which, according to him, he had employed during the German occupation, in order to escape the large scale arrests, made by the Germans.

Since many of the members of the Movement are compromised in the crimes committed by ROSSI they too have been arrested by the Squadra Mobile. Consequently every activity of the movement has stopped. The other members of it not involved in the a/m crimes, have become members of other leftist parties.

This morning, as it had been announced, the Communist and Socialist Party held the meeting for the "Costituente".

Since 8 hours small groups of people have started coming from various places of Rome and trucks crowded with citizens from the Rome province and especially from the Castelli Romani.

At least 50 trucks going to the Palatine have passed through the via Appia Nuova.

At about 10 hours nearly 10,000 persons had assembled in the stadium, and more were coming.

In the meantime other groups were arriving from Porta Pia, Trastevere, from the Appio quarter, and a crowd of people with a band, red flags and placards in favour of the Costituente and Republic and against Monarchy came from Piazza della Croce Rossa, through via Nazionale.

Other placards represented the King and the Crown, beaten by a hammer and swept by brooms. Furthermore there were notices, which hinted at the resolution of the school question, at the distribution of lands amongst the peasants, at the nationalization of firms and others with the following writings "Long Live the Democratic Police" and "Carabinieri, sons of the people, are for the people".

Leaflets were thrown by the columns of people and amongst the various groups a lot of red dressed women could be noticed.

The groups coming from the province, which were the most of the crowd, raised placards of their own Communes.

4) Amedeo FRACASSI, President of the Association "Mutilati ed Invalidi del Lavoro", who after a declaration in favour of the Costituente, affirmed that the contribution given by the workmen to the war against Fascism is not less important than that of the Partisans.

5) Luigi LONGO, member of the Communist Party, who examined various economic, social, political and institutional questions. Having praised the discipline of the present meeting, he judged it as a proof of the Italian people's political maturity.

He attacked NITTI violently, charging him with the intention of undervaluing the Liberation Committees, i.e. of liking better a false pre-fascist democracy, protected by the Royal Guard, than the present true democracy.

According to the speaker, NITTI's speech has caused a prolongation of the Allied control on Italian political life. As a matter of fact The Italian Northern provincians, which have been freed with the help of the Italian partisans, are now remaining under the Allied Control instead of being given back to Italian administration on the 1st of November as agreed. And all this is caused by NITTI's speech, as he affirmed that a threat against public order is still present. However this threat does not come from the leftist parties, speaker declares, but solely by the reactionary forces, which want to stir up troubles, in order to delay as much as possible, the question of the Constituent. The leftist parties in fact want to reach their ideals in a peaceful way.

Amongst the reactionary forces, supporters of Monarchy, he pointed out the important industrialists, landlords, and all those, who, at present time, are disguising themselves under the name of "Uomini qualunque" (Men of the street). These people should be opposed by the same means employed by the Government against the Sicilian separatists.

As regards economic problem, he underlined the excessive difference between the riches and the poor in Rome; meals in restaurants are being paid for 5,000 Lires per head, whereas workers and employees are in dreadful economic conditions. Furthermore he denied the rumour, according to which, we lack funds necessary to help the workmen. In fact, he said, a quick seizure of Fascist profits could easily resolve this problem, whereas some officers of Ministers, after having drawn up this law against the Fascist profits, as lawyers have done their utmost to avoid its application.

At last he affirmed that the Italian people don't want to reach power or a great influence, but wished a possibility of working for the reconstruction of Italy in order that she might acquire a modest but dignified role amongst the other nations.

6) Federico COMANDINI, member of the Partito d'Azione, has avenged for his own party ~~the~~ its priority in the question of Monarchy, and has wished the constitution of a truly democratic Italian Republic, through the elections of the Constituent.

He has reminded the public of the harmful influence of Fascism on the people and bitterly criticized NITTI's speech, whose propaganda against the progressive parties is quite anachronist. He also revealed other oppositions against the more advanced forces, as that of General BRUNETTI, who is issuing restricted circular to dependent offices.

Then he added that the Italian people is mature for the Constituent, the elections of which will undoubtedly be held with order and legality. However he warned the public to maintain their union and to remember the constitution of Rosselli.

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Amongst the reactionary forces, supporters of Monarchy, he pointed out the important industrialists, landlords, and all those, who, at present time, are dissembling themselves under the name of "Uomini qualunque" (Men of the streets). These people should be opposed by the same means employed by the Government against the Sicilian separatists.

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Then he added that the Italian people is mature for the Constituent, the elections of which will undoubtedly be held with order and legality. However he warned the public to maintain their union, and to remember the constitution of Rossellini-Matteotti-Garibaldi brigades, in case they encounter some obstacle.

He has harshly criticized Monarchy and particularly the King, whom he called as a "small man only able to betray" and the Lieutenant he named "smiling nothingness", whom he charged with having freed his Dynasty with every responsibility, which nevertheless he shifted on the Italian people.

Lastly he pointed out the actual difference between the "Uomini Qualunqui", who are merely reactionary, and the "Uren of the street" who need assistance and help by the Government.

7) Attilio DI NAPOLI, member of the Socialist Party, has pronounced the last speech of the meeting, with a summary of the various items touched by the various speakers.

He violently attacked Monarchy and the reactionary forces urged the Government to fix a date for the constituente, that will be held without violences of illegality, but in a peaceful way and according to the laws.

He warned the public against reactionary propaganda, expressing his own wishes for the amalgamation of the Socialist and Communist parties, and added that we shall have no more Fascist & quadre d'Azione as we had in 1919-20. At any rate, in case troubles are raised against the constituente, the people will be obliged to make demonstrations and declare a civil war.

All the speakers have warned the public to maintain discipline and order.

At 12 hours, the meeting was closed and the people returned to their offices.

Also the people who had come from the province went back to their own villages.

No accident has occurred.

WHO'S THREATENING OUR INDEPENDENCE?

With regard to a speech held by TOGLIATTI in a meeting at the Arena, affirming the necessity of defending the Italian independence, the Christian Democratic newspaper has complained, deeming not opportune his declaration in our delicate international position. And referring to the doubts advanced by the a/m newspaper that TOGLIATTI would probably not speak the same language in the meetings of the Government we can assure them that we Communists have no intention of playing double and our behaviour is just the same in front of a large public as in a restricted meeting with representatives of other nations. We should rather say that they are not the Communists who express patriotic feelings in a public speech and on the other side recommend themselves to the other nations in order to receive their assistance against the danger of bolshevism.

But, speaking truly, is our independence actually threatened? yes, it is and by those reactionary groups, who are fully represented by WITTIG's speech and who are ready to barter our liberty for a help against political forces they dislike.

And does this threat correspond to a threat coming from abroad? With regard to the United Nations, it does not. Nevertheless we know that in some countries there are reactionary groups who intend to break the union of the democratic nations and to form a western block against the Sovietic Union, in which our country should play a role, in exchange for a scarce supply of food. Is not that a real threat against our independence? As a matter of fact we depend, with regard to our economy and reconstruction on the United Nations; however, our soul, our dignity, of a wretched but courageous people, i.e. our liberty and national independence, shall never be alienated. Therefore the Minister of the Foreign Affairs must not be troubled by a declaration like that of TOGLIATTI. His doubts referring to this matter may let us suppose that his actual policy is aiming at different objects. On the contrary the a/m Minister should be worried about the calumnies which are being spread by the Christian Democratic newspaper against a big and influent nation like Russia. As a matter of fact there is a reason which provokes these calumnies, a reason however quite opposite to the question of the defence of our national independence.

As announced in the newspapers, meetings sponsored by the Socialist and Communist Parties for the Constituent Assembly will be held on Sunday, 14 October.

In Rome the meeting sponsored by the Communist and Socialist Federation will take place at 1000 hours in the "Stadio di Domiziano sul Palatino". Many rumours have been referred to this office with regard to the above meeting. Some say that this public manifestation will assume the aspect of a potential demonstration of strength, as it is reported that all the participants will wear a special uniform. Others affirm that the a/m parties will use the strength at their disposal to impose their will on the Government. Some sources have reported that this preordained public meeting may offer the incentive to assault the gaols and invade religious buildings in Rome, even those which enjoy extra-territorial rights, to eliminate the fascists detained in goals or hidden in such buildings.

Some others consider the above date and the meeting itself as the first signs of a new March on Rome, while others report that the meetings will be held with an absolute respect of law and order.

A state of political tension undoubtedly does exist in the country; maximum intelligence and circumspection is necessary in order to be on the alert and prepared for any eventuality and in order that the respect of law and order may be enforced with due objectivity, according to the principle, lately enunciated, by virtue of which the Police Forces are politically neutral. In order that the services may be sufficiently prepared for the circumstance, it is necessary that the most careful and accurate investigations be carried out to verify the truth of the above reports, and that the maximum impulse may be given to the information services in order that the orientation of public opinion in all sectors regarding the meeting may be known.

In particular, I refer to the Director of the Political Branch, so that with the increased means at his disposal he may intensify his services and keep me informed of any emergency.

In proceeding with the investigations, it should be borne in mind that the date of 28 October, anniversary of the March on Rome and the Advent of Fascism, is fast approaching.

Vigilance should therefore be intensified in respect of the most notorious elements of the past Regime, and added watchfulness is required for Government buildings and all other objectives that may be made the targets of irresponsible acts by those addicted to violence, mentally unbalanced or tendentially opposed to democratic forms of Government.

Vigilance should also be intensified by means of diurnal and nocturnal patrols, with searches and investigations in respect of those persons who arouse suspicions.

Nothing must be overlooked in order that public order be continued to be maintained, and therefore any information that may have any connection or affiliation to public order and security, must be immediately reported in order that appropriate measures can be taken in time.

The addressees are therefore requested to be very watchful, to dispose of their services or observation and signals in order to be prepared for any eventuality, and in order that the Police may be up to the standard of its institutional finalities, especially during this troubled period in the life of our country.

In fact the said military organisation has its HQ., at GENOVA and appears to be controlled by Eng. CALMPA, PIZZURRO and ARDESIO, these three have been joined by a certain EGRO, former Commander of the Mingo Division, he is a Yugoslav Subject. The leader of the armed squad in GENOVA is a certain MARIOITI Guido, a member of the 3rd International".

1. A well placed source who is known to this R.S.O.
reported the following on 7 September. The information
is given under reserve.

2. Between September 20th/25th, trouble is anticipa-
ted in the larger factories in N. Italy. The movement is
organised by the Communists and is directed against the
industrialists. The workmen, who receive their instructions
from TORINO, have been directed:

- a) to enforce a radical epuration of all personnel
responsible for the management of the firm and
- b) to bring about the socialisation of the factories.

It is alleged that the movement would be heralded
by a general strike.

3. This matter is stated to have been one of the main
subjects for discussion at a meeting to have been held
in MILANO on Friday, 7th September 1945 by the leading in-
dustrialists. Another matter was the question of the sus-
pension of 75% of their salaries to unemployed (on pay
roll) workers which, it was agreed, would be paid up to
30 September 1945. This may be the root of the trouble.

The following information has been received from a well-placed and usually reliable source in Bucharest:

The leadership of the KOMINTERN and the INOSTRANYI OTDEL (Foreign Section) of the GUGBEZ Central Command, has initiated action which has as its ultimate objective the communization of Italy. In the opinion of this group Northern Italy is thought to be the most favorable place for the establishment of a KOMINTERN operational base for Western Europe and the Mediterranean Area. This plan has the approval of the POLIT BUREAU.

On April 28, 1945, a special train passed through Bucharest, in which were some two hundred GUGBEZ agents of the "INOSTRANYI OTDEL", "OSOBEIJ OTDEL" (Special Section), "SECRETNEIJ OTDEL" (Secret Section), and of the KOMINTERN 1st, 3rd and 4th Bureaus of Moscow. This group was headed by an Italian Communist named Giuseppe RAZZA, who had as his principal assistants, Iosif ARDITTO, Nicola LEVISITTA, Primo CUPILLO and Burash LISSITTI.

The above-named are all well-trained Communists of Italian-Jewish descent who fled from Italy to USSR in the period from 1923 to 1938. They are expected to arrive in Yugoslavia and there will install themselves at Zara, Fiume, Trieste and Ljubljana. From these places the individual members of the group expect to enter Northern Italy gradually -- naturally depending on the vigilance of the Allied authorities there.

Colonel MAHALOV, principal GUGBEZ agent formerly in Rome, is now in Milan where the KOMINTERN Offices for Italy will be located.

Oswaldo CARAGACCI, an Italian KOMINTERN agent who reportedly is one of the best agents trained for Communist revolutionary activity in Italy, passed through Bucharest on his way to Fiume, 2 May 1945.

In accordance with the above referred letter we notify
you of the following information given by the Frosinone
Prefecture about the subject:

"Inquiries of the CC.RR. with regard to the application
of CICINI TULLO, showed groundless CICINI'S declaration that
80.000 Lires had been sent to the Palliano Commune in favour
of the refugees.

The truth is that on the 9th of June 1945 this Commune
received 200.000 Lires for people who had afforded an expense
not higher than 50.000 Lires for the rebuilding of their
houses damaged by the war.

Accordingly the Mayor appointed a Commission, which
he presided over, assisted by the engineer CARDONE Nicola of
the Civil Engineering, and entrusted it with the control of
estimations and reparations already accomplished.

So far they confirmed ten estimations for the amount
of 198.000 Lires, which are being paid in favour of the
people concerned by the Collector's Office of the Commune.

CICINI is not amongst the beneficiaries, since,
according to the present dispositions, all reparations
to buildings estimated more than 150.000 Lires must be
afforded by the people concerned, and only after a test,
the Civil Engineering will take steps in favour of the
reimbursement of the due sums.

Past winter thirty six bales of second-hand clothes
arrived in Palliano for the needy people.

The Mayor appointed a Commission of thirty six members **21**,
chosen amongst the various parties and associations, and
entrusted them with this task, though he remained apart.

On application of the people concerned, after a
choice and control, the parcels have been distributed.
Beneficiaries' names and allotments have been duly registered.

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
Situation of the Province, especially injured by the war, individual examinations of the citizens' positions would necessarily criticize by those who have not been satisfied by the small helps, which are unsufficient for all the needy people.

Finally it is true that MASETTI Adele, a fanatic Communist, had promised parcels to some women, provided they became members of the Communist Party. This promise however was made solely in order to increase membership of her party. Some women were actually allured.

At any rate the a/n MASETTI could not exert any influence on the allotment of the parcels, which was practically effected according to the above mentioned system.

PALIANO 30 MAY 1945

The undersigned Ciciri Tullio states that:

On 4 June 1944 owing to an air raid I lost the following properties: two shops in Via Cavour, a house in Via Cavour and another in Viale S. Anna. The damage is calculated at about 800,000 lire.

In October last the Head of the Province sent to our Community 200,000 lire to be distributed among the people whose houses had been bombed, but none of us ever saw that money and nobody knows where it has gone. Later on, parcels of clothes have been sent from U.S. for us. But also the parcels took another direction, as some of the members of the committee, not satisfied with one parcel, sent in several relatives to collect more. One of the prominent members of the P.C.I. (Italian Communist Party) answered to people enquiring: "If you want the parcels and other facilities come alone with us and become a member of the communist party."

I apply to your Command to have the necessary steps taken with regard to the money and the parcels, as I have found out that the Italian authorities agree with our Sindaco.

I hope you will give my request the due consideration, and I thank in advance.

It has been ascertained the existence in Rome of a Section P. (Political) of the Roman Office of the Comintern. According to the instructions issued by said office all persons who have convicted of cooperation and who are actually in contact with the Party will be given tasks of political and military intelligence and sabotage against the middle class (borghesia) which is classified as "fascist" in all its expressions. All fill a form which bears a number corresponding to the name of the new member. Every section which, as a matter of fact, is given the most unpleasant tasks, is thus turned, after the Lenin's tactic, into a real school of Political Police. These Sections-school are already operating in all the jails in Italy and are in contact with their head through the persons attached to A.C. or through lawyers appointed by the party. Repented fascists are also allowed to participate. Just as a test (and the atmosphere is a very suitable one) alarming rumors on the inner and foreign situation, on mass-executions of fascists and their families, on the King being arrested by communist gangs are spread and made worse.

The task of the agents is to prepare that way the people's spirit in accordance with the scheduled events: that is to canalize the mass towards a certain orientation and to collect notes on comments and anticipations by the hostile fields.

These Schools-section shall be turned by the Communist Govt. into "UPI", the former Political Investigation Office of the Militia, and shall be the helping hands of the Red Army. The office P. in contact with the members of the a/n organisation is in charge also of propaganda. The propaganda which is to be carried out is actually being carried out first of all against the "Allied Army" slave of the Anglo-Saxon Capitalism, of whom Italy, with the Russian proletarian's help shall get rid for the last big fight of redemption.

TRANSLATION OF THE ATTACHED REPORT IS AS FOLLOWS:

COMMUNIST ACTIVITIES IN ITALY DURING THE ALLIED OCCUPATION

As has been announced in the newspapers, there took place in ROME a meeting between the Socialists and the Communists, which resulted in the fusion of the two parties.

So says the press, but the truth is different.

The meeting was of a secret nature, and they were there to be told the orders which Stalin had sent through BLANGHIL, who arrived some time ago in Italy after having crossed the lines - or so the party papers say.

These orders were that the Communist-Socialists should activate a revolution as soon as the Italian Government took power in ROME, in such a way as to face the Allies with an accomplished fact, demanded and executed by the free Italians, who, according to the Atlantic Charter, have the right to chose the government they want.

This revolution is to take place in two phases:-

First - in the form of a request for a daily allowance to be given to the workers and employees for the high cost of living. (It is to be pointed out that this is the first time that they speak of employees, and it must not be forgotten that there have been previous articles which declared that the middle class would have to march together with the proletariat).

Second - the occupation of the factories and the "aziende". This was part of the request made by the workers to the Government as part of their claims, at the same time that they requested the allowance for the high cost of living. This second phase will be accomplished in one of two ways; either the Government will concede to their requests, or the workers will present the Government, and the Allies, with an accomplished fact.

The matter is so serious that the Pope, who had been informed, called immediately for Minister De Gasperi to explain what he had been doing inside the Government, that he had been unable to give warning of what was about to happen.

The only party which could give any opposition to this revolution is the Partito di Azione, but even with this party agreements had been made for strict collaboration, or even outright merging, to take place as soon as the factories had been occupied. Besides this, the government would create an advisory board of men elected by all parties (says De Gasperi), an advisory board which would serve as a consultation board for the Government in deliberations of great importance. It seems that there would be proportional representation on this board, according to the strength of the party and it is not known which and how many parties will be called upon to form it.

- 2 -

Even here, they (presumably the Communists) have studied a system by which they can have a majority with which to sanction any measure.

The maneuver of the Russians is clearly seen. While officially they promise the Allies that they will not meddle in what pertains to Italy, which should remain either an English or an American sphere of influence, underhandedly they are maneuvering to grab this sphere of influence by causing discord between the Allies, and by presenting them with an accomplished fact brought about by the will of the Italians.

Minister Toglietti has full knowledge of these facts and we received this information from one of his intimate friends, a person whom Toglietti himself says he completely trusts.

Much of this is blamed on the fact that the so-called epuration, which was anything but rational and was carried out with sectarian instincts, left many persons out in the street and these elements are now turning to Communism, which promises them a livelihood. Another serious question - and the Italian press attacks this point always more clearly - is that the Allies have not kept any of the promises which they made on the radio and in their propaganda. In fact, today in Italy there is nothing more than hunger, hunger and more hunger. No work has been begun, nothing which points to work in the immediate future; there is a complete feeling that the country is occupied and that the Allies have not liberated anyone, although they fight their own war, which is an economic war of conquest of economic markets and for economic expansion. Add to this the impressions made by La Guardia's statements and the serious repercussions thereof, and you have a clear picture of the situation, and it can easily be seen how simple it is for Russia to make realistic-sounding promises and for her to attract the backing of the masses. Everyone knows how much Russian gold has been in circulation during the past months, how the Communists have distributed money and food to their members, and how easy it is to attract hungry masses who had blindly believed a propaganda for which they had given thousands of lives, but which actually turned out to be just empty promises.

This is the situation which is developing at the moment.

From another source we learn that the order of occupation has been extended to all government offices, important private offices and all stores. There are conservative elements which fear the Allied reaction to this manifestation but they can do nothing to sway the rest of the mass.

We think that we shall be able to give the date and the hour when this action is to take place, with perhaps a few hours advance notice.

Further to previous reports on the evident policy of the PCI aiming to maintain a state of tension and discontent among the people, the PCI has now begun to organise a series of "Comizi" or popular meetings. A report on some of these meetings appeared in "L'Unita" for 30 Mar 45, page 2. These meetings, which took place in the TIBURTINO, PRENESTINA and PIETRALATA working class districts and were held in the open air, consisted of speeches by Communists and Socialists in favour of claiming from the Government more energetic epuration and the betterment of the working masses. In these districts, shops, offices and small factories stopped work for a short time so that the employees could attend. The article in "L'Unita" refers to a mobile squad of orators whose job it is to go round and hold these meetings. No incidents have so far been reported. The following is a description of a typical "Comizio":- A "Comizio" was held on Sunday, 15 Apr 45, in a cinema in the TRASTEVERE district. A director of "L'Unita", named SPANO, spoke at some length in criticism of the Government's weaknesses and of the antipathy of the clergy to the Communist Party, even though the latter desired to live in harmony with the church. A partisan from the North also addressed the meeting, admittance to which was by ticket only.

(iii) The Communist Party was not slow to take advantage of the escape of Roatta to attack the Government with accusations of corruption in high circles and there have been recent demonstrations in Frosinone, Bari, Taranto and Palermo. In the latter town, a skirmish took place between Communists and Separatists, though both these parties, are hostile to the C.C.W., who have been carrying out large scale raids of houses in Piana dei Greci (B 3724) in a general search for arms.

At Minervino (ML 7578) a Communist disturbance took place on 19 March which resulted in the death of a Carabinieri. The arrest of a prominent Communist by S.S.R. as a sequel to this incident caused a crowd of 300 persons to gather in front of the municipio to demand his release. No hostile action was taken and the crowd eventually dispersed.

It has recently been possible to obtain a report on a typical Communist meeting held in the Sec. HQ. of one of the Rome districts. This meeting was one of a regular series of propaganda talks which are called "Giornale Parlato" (news discussion). The speaker on this occasion was one of the P.C. propagandists whose name however was not announced. It is apparently a usual practice for speakers to remain anonymous and questions about their identity are not welcomed. The audience however has the right to confute the speaker and express individual opinions on matters discussed.

This particular meeting began by a talk illustrating how Mussolini upheld by Pope Pius XI, Costanzo Ciano e Marconi. The letter was referred to as "the man in England's confidence". Particular emphasis was placed on this latter connection between English finance and Mussolini via Marconi, who was accused of having sold himself to England and having constantly been surrounded by English scientists and friends.

References to Pope Pius XI were hotly contested by an elderly woman. Later a sailor got up and having related his experiences as a refugee in Russia, pointed out the differences between Italian and Russian communism. He defined the Russians between Italian and Russian communism. He defined the Russian people as a young nation free from hatred and rancor and fighting as they did because their own generals fight and die among the tops and don't remain in safe offices. The Russians, according to him, are divided into two categories: one of pseudo-Communists consisting in the working masses who are mostly convinced Communists... He asserted that in a recent speech Stalin himself had said: "Perhaps at the end of the war we shall all be Communists".

Part. iii. Further to previous notes in these reports indicating that the real policy of the P.C.I. in Italy is to undermine and corrode from within State institutions and organisations of all kinds with a view to an eventual seizure of power in the resulting confusion, the following is of interest.

During a recent conversation between an informer of this Sec and two influential members of the P.C.I. in SLAVONIA prov. about the recent incident caused by an attempt on the part of Pietro AMENDOLA, the local Commissario for Epuration, and P.C.I. members actually stated that: "The most important point for the Communists is to carry out thoroughly the epuration because this is the best instrument for disorganising the institutions of the State". They also added: "The communist idea will use any means. The disorganisation of the administration, the discontent of the people, everything can be used to further the ends of our Party". When asked why the Communists will retain members in the Govt., the reply was: "Our presence in the Govt. allows us to act with greater liberty and more effectively."
