Christian Democrats held an all-province (Florence) meeting on February 11th. Opening the meeting the President of the Provisional Committee of Management of the Party proposed a collection in aid of the patriots in memory of Doctor Mattei (one of the leading members of the party), who died on February 10th. After the election of Avv. Piccioni to the chair the meeting discussed various matters concerning provincial committees. A letter from the C.T.L.N. was read in which the various political parties were invited to submit nominations for local committees should appoint six members to give specific help to the C.C.R.M. in suppressing the Black Market. The work of the Tuscan Delegation at the recent Naples Congress of the C.G.I.L. was unanimously approved. The meeting took note of the appointment of Sig. Martini, President of the Provisional Committee of Management, to the post of Ambassador to Brazil. Sig. Martini, who was congratulated on his appointment, then spoke on the two main problems of the moment: the one negative, namely reconstruction of the ruins and the redressing of injustice within the framework of epuration; the other positive which consisted in the re-modelling of society through the transition from the capitalistic economy of yesterday to the labour economy of tomorrow.

The new members of the Committee of the Christian Democrats held their first meeting immediately afterwards and elected Renato Branzi as Provincial Secretary. Avv. Francesco Berti and Avv. Attilio Piccioni were re-appointed as representatives on the Party on the C.T.L.N.

Movimento Comunista Cristiano There has recently arrived in Rome padre Angelo D'ALESSIO, a priest and a professor of philosophy and theology, whose address is given as Via Cesare Rossariol 69, NAPLES. Padre D'ALESSIO is reported to be the head of the Movimento Comunista Cristiano and is alleged to have been suspended from his priestly functions on account of his past political activities. He is stated to have had talks with representatives of the Partito Comunista and when these produced no satisfactory result he is reported to have made contact with the heads of the Movimento Comunista and the Movimento Partigliano, by whom he was well-received and invited to organize the activities and propaganda of these bodies in the NAPLES area.

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
