SUBJECT : Handover of Germans in Allied Custody.

TO : The Presidency of the Council of Ministers.

1. It has come to the attention of Allied Force Headquarters that various interested departments of the Italian Government are making application to the British or U.S. Embassies for the handover of Germans in Allied custody who are accused of War Crimes against Italian Nationals.

2. It is therefore desired that the various Italian Government officials concerned be advised that whenever they desire the handover of a German in Allied custody, who is alleged to have committed War Crimes against Italian Nationals they submit such request to Allied Commission (Attention: Security Sub-Division) with evidence showing the existence of a prima facie case against the individual wanted, in addition to any request which may have been submitted to the United Nations War Crimes Commission. Such requests should not be sent to the British or United States Embassies as Allied Commission is the proper agency with which to communicate.

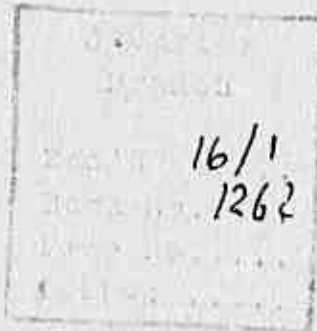

The Italian Government should also be advised that such requests should not be sent to the British or United States Embassies as Allied Commission is the proper agency with which to communicate.

3. It is also desired that upon receipt of any requests from the Italian Government for the turn over of alleged German War Criminals, such requests and accompanying papers be forwarded immediately to the Theater Judge Advocate, MTOUSA, for further appropriate action.
