TO : The Fresidency of the Council of Ministers.

1. It has come to the attention of Allied Worde Headquarters that various interested departments of the Italian Government are making application to the Eritish or U.S. Esbassies for the handover of Germans in Allied custody who are accused of War Crises against Italian Mationals.

2. It is therefore desired that the various Italian Coverment officials concerned be advised that whenever they desire the handover of a Cerman in Allied oustody, who is alleged to have committed War Crimes against Italian Mationals they submit such request to Allied Coverasion (Attention: Security Sub-Division) with evidence showing the existence of a prime facio case against the individual wanted, in addition to any request which may have been submitted to the United Nations War Crimes Commission. Such requests should not be sent to the British or United States Esbassies as Allied Coverission is the proper agency with which to communicate.
