1. The total number of civilian Internees now held at this camp is, 1,712, of these 127 are females. Released up to date now total 2,3401.

2. The total number of cases reviewed last month was 38 of these 22 were still considered a security danger and their release was not recommended.

3. Intakes still continue at a reduced figure and during the month there were only 9 new arrivals, all from Rome area Command.

4. Collection of Internees by the Italian Government has now been accelerated slightly, eight have collected during the past month and sixteen more are now awaiting collection.

5. No further information has been received respecting the disposal of HUNSTHOFER Johann, subject of letter, GBI.389.463/10, from G-2 AFHQ. addressed to Security Division, Allied Commission on 1 Feb 45, asking that this monk who has perverted sexual tendencies be taken to a suitable Italian institution for a mental case of this type. It would be appreciated if enquiry be made into this matter.

6. There has been no matters of importance during the past month, and only one visitor of importance that was DR RIVI, of the Swiss Embassy respecting the welfare of the German Internees, has the representative of the Protecting Power. He expressed his satisfaction with the conduct of the camp.

7. During the past month thirteen German Nationals have been released, all persons of long residence in Italy. They will be under supervision of the Italian authorities with a residential condition.

2. The total number of cases reviewed since the camp was commenced in Jan 44, now exceeds 3,000. During the past month the number of cases reviewed was 78, these were mostly Duration cases, the number of period cases (where persons are interned with a recommendation for review at the expiration of a set period) are now much reduced in number. This is of course directly due to the drop in intakes. During the last month intakes were less than twenty.
3. Until the rear Army control line advances no large scale releases can be anticipated that once the line is advanced beyond Florence there are about 150 persons for release.
4. Difficulty is still being experienced with the slowness of Italian Authorities in the collection of internees for whom AFHQ have authorised release to stand trial. Approximately twenty five cases are still outstanding and awaiting collection.
5. The new system of the Commandant and the Reviewing Officer sitting together as a Board is proceeding satisfactorily, and all the cases reviewed during this month have been dealt with under the new procedure.

1. There are now detained the Camp, 1762 Civilian Internees, of these 132 are females. The total number of releases to date now total 2,208, which figure is inclusive of persons transferred as ordinary P.W.s and 158 Internees transferred as members of the G.M.R. for treatment as P.W.s.
2. Intakes still continue at a low figure, of 19 recent arrivals 17 were wrongly routed having been arrested in forward areas should have proceeded to "R" Internee Camp, C.W.F.
3. AFHQ are now accelerating the handing over of Political internees to the Italian Government, three have been handed over this week and ten more cases are pending. There is still a long time lag between the authority being received from AFHQ and the actual collection by the Italian Authorities, this is a matter that could be investigated by Security Division.
4. Italian authorities wishing to interrogate Internees is another point under notice at the moment, the procedure of applying first to Security Division who in turn apply to AFHQ. It appears to have escaped the notice of many Italian Departments particularly the C.C.R.R.
5. Under the new Comendant Lt. Col. N.I. Cariss the Camp is now well under way with its own documentation of Internees, the Reviewing Officer having been relieved of this task, and in future the Reviewing Board (Commandant and Reviewing Officer) will sit and review together.

2. Intakes are still at a low figure, for the past month only about 30 persons have been received, 23 sent from Eighth Army area in error, and they should have been sent to "B" Civilian Internee Camp, C.M.F.

3; During the month several new directives have been received, one important one being that setting out the procedure with regard to the handing over of Civilian Internees to the Italian Government for the various disciplinary Committees.

4. Since the receipt of the new directive respecting the internment of German Nationals , a number of cases have been reviewed and so far Nine women and two men have been released. Further cases are pending and will be dealt with in due course.

5. During the month Capt.L.R. Davidson (Italian Speaking) has been posted to the Camp, and is undertaking the duties of Intelligence Officer and in due course the documentation of Internees. This is relieving the Reviewing Officer of a **00004** considerable amount of work, and will leave much more time for reviewing of cases of internees who have been in internment for long periods.

6. There is still one member of the CC.R.E. in internment who does not appear of any great security importance, but AFHQ have directed he shall be held until such time as the Italian Authorities make application for him. His name is LOCCI Raimondo, formerly Maresciallo of PALATA.

1. There are now detained in this Camp, 2,006 Civilian Internees, of these 137 are females. The number of releases up to date (including persons transferred as ordinary P.W.s) now total I, 858.

2. In takes still remain at a reduced figure, due to the opening of No. 2 Internee Camp, who are taking all Internees arrested by Armies in the forward area.

3. During the past month only one intake of any size has arrived, that was sixty seven internees forwarded from Bari, 207 P.W.Camp, and St Andrews were they had been held for some weeks apparently in error. These cases have been investigated, and 27 of the Internees (who were interned prior to the 16 Oct 44, have re-directed to No.2 Internee in accordance with the directions of AFHQ.

4. Public Safety of the Lazio Umbria Region are still laggardly in the collection of the four OVR personnel, authority for the transfer to the Italian authorities was given on the 21 Oct 44, by AFHQ. vide B-389.450/2-E, but so far we are still holding them, a reminder has been sent to the Region concerned.

5. No releases of important personalities have taken place though several releases of Public Sicurezza personnel arrested on the authority of A.I.G. Rome have now been released. Which confirms the opinion formed that these arrests were hurried and not properly investigated. It is hoped that this will not be repeated on future occasions, it reflects badly on A.I.G.

6. Only one outstanding visitor to the Camp, this month Capt.E.M.Roberts, G.S.O.3. of 3 District H.Q. has paid a visit, and a number of problems have been discussed, particularly with reference to the lack of information forwarded from Districts respecting persons Interned. 2 District particularly were previously very lacking in this respect.

To Major Richardson, Regional Public Safety Officer, Southern Sector.

There are now detained in this Camp, I, 979 Civilian Internees, of these 130 are females. The number of releases up to date now total, I, 742.

2. Internes are still at a reduced figure, this is apparently due to the slowing up of the advance of armies, and also the opening up of the new No. 2 Internee Camp, though from information received the new Camp has not assumed any importance in the Internee situation. The numbers held there at present are in the region of 150 persons, and of these 19 are females. It would appear that 371 P.W.Camp, is regarded as the primary Camp for holding Internees of high security danger and of top political importance.

3. The standard of arrests remains about the same, with a marked increase in the amount of documentation supplied, though 19 persons did arrive without Arrests Reports in the past week. This matter has been referred to the Camp concerned and AFHQ.

4. AFHQ are taking a very keen interest in the Camp, which is much in contrast with A.I.I., who did not appear to be able to keep contact with AFHQ to the same degree.

5. During the month no releases of political importance have been made. The matter of the A.I.G. Rome arrests, has been satisfactorily settled, due principally to the untiring efforts of Major Coxhead of A.I.G. Rome. One of the principals ANTONIO Raffaele has been handed over to the Italian Government for trial by the Liberation Committee, several others are being investigated, and it appears that a number of the arrests were of first importance.

6. One visitor of importance to the Camp, during the month, a Colonel of the Russian Army DVAL JAKOVLEV, attached to the inter-Alied Commission, making enquiries respecting any RUSSIAN nationals held at the Camp. None are held officially, one female was seen by him, ODZNOVA Vittoria, (PIGNATI-TI case) but according to Camp records she is an ITALIAN National.



There is still a long time lag between the authority being received from AFHQ and the actual collection by the Italian Authorities, this is a matter that could be investigated by Security Division.
4. Italian authorities wishing to interrogate Internees is another point under notice at the moment, the procedure of applying first to Security Division who in turn apply to AFHQ. It appears to have escaped the notice of many Italian Departments particularly the CC.RR.



I. There are now detained in this Camp, 2,006 Civilian Internees, of these 137 are females. The number of releases up to date (including persons transferred as ordinary P.W.s) now total L. 868.

2. Inakes still remain at a reduced figure, due to the opening of No. 2 Internee Camp, who are taking all Internees arrested by Armies in the forward area.

3. During the past month only one intake of any size has arrived, that was sixty seven internees forwarded from Bari, 207 P.W.Camp, and St Andrews were they had been held for some weeks apparently in error. These cases have been investigated, and 27 of the Internees who were interned prior to the 15 Oct 44, have re-directed to No.2 Internee in accordance with the directions of AFHQ.

4. Public Safety of the Lazio Umbria Region are still laggardly in the collection of the four OVRA personnel, authority for the transfer to the Italian authorities was given on the 21 Oct 44, by AFHQ. vide D-389.450/2-E, but so far we are still holding them, a reminder has been sent to the Region concerned.

5. No releases of important personalities have taken place though several releases of Public Sicurezza personnel arrested on the authority of A.M.G. Rome have now been released. Which confirms the opinion formed that these arrests were hurried and not properly investigated. It is hoped that this will not be repeated on future occasions, it reflects badly on A.M.G.

6. Only one outstanding visitor to the Camp, this month Capt.E.H.Roberts, G.S.O.3. of 3 District H.Q. has paid a visit, and a number of problems have been discussed, particularly with reference to the lack of information forwarded from Districts respecting persons Interned. 2 District particularly were previously very lacking in this respect.

1. There are now detained in this Camp, T, 975 civilian Internees, of these T30 are females. The number of releases up to date now total, T, 742.

2. Internes are still at a reduced figure, this is apparently due to the slowings up of the advance of times, and also the opening up of the new No. 2 Internee Camp, though from information received the new Camp has not assumed any importance in the Internee situation. The numbers held there at present are in the region of T50 persons, and of these T9 are females. It would appear that 371 P.W.Camp, is regarded as the primary Camp for holding Internees of high security danger and of top political importance.
3. The standard of arrests remains about the same, with a marked increase in the amount of documentation supplied, though T9 persons did arrive without Arrests Reports in the past week. This matter has been referred to the Camp concerned and WHQ.
4. APHQ are taking a very keen interest in the Camp, which is such in contrast with AAI, who did not appear to be able to keep contact with affairs to the same degree.
5. During the month no releases of political importance have been made. The matter of the A.S.G. None arrests, has been satisfactorily settled, due principally to the untiring efforts of Major Coxhead of A.S.G. Rome. One of the principals ALIMARIO Raffaele has been handed over to the Italian Government for trial by the Apparition Committee, several others are being investigated, and it appears that a number of the arrests were of first importance.
6. One visitor of importance to the Camp, during the month, a Colonel of the Russian Army PAVEL JAKOVLEV, attached to the International Commission, making inquiries respecting any RUSSIAN nationals held at the Camp. None are held officially, one female was seen by him, OZINOV Vitoria, (MIGATELLI case) but according to Camp records she is an ITALIAN National.

It would appear that 371 P.W.Camp, is regarded as the primary Camp for holding internees of high security danger and of top political importance.

None-suits, has been satisfactorily settled, due principally to the untiring efforts of Major Coxhead of A.G. Rome. One of the principals ALFONSO Raffaele has been handed over to the Italian Government for trial by the Liberation Committee, several others are being investigated, and it appears that a number of the arrests were of first importance.
