2. All persons falling within the arrestable categories as herein-after defined, will be taken into custody as soon as they are identified.

b. Persons who hold or have held in the past any of the ranks specified in Schedule II or any superior rank in the same organization and women (except where otherwise specified) who hold or have held an equivalent rank in a corresponding women's organization.

3. The provisions of paragraph 2 above will also apply to persons, who while acting as agents either of the NSDAP or of the German Government, hold or have held in German occupied territory any rank or appointment (whatever its official designation) which is of equal status with any of those listed therein.

5. Persons not in an arrestable category who are considered to constitute as individuals, a danger to security will be taken into custody at the discretion of Counter Intelligence.

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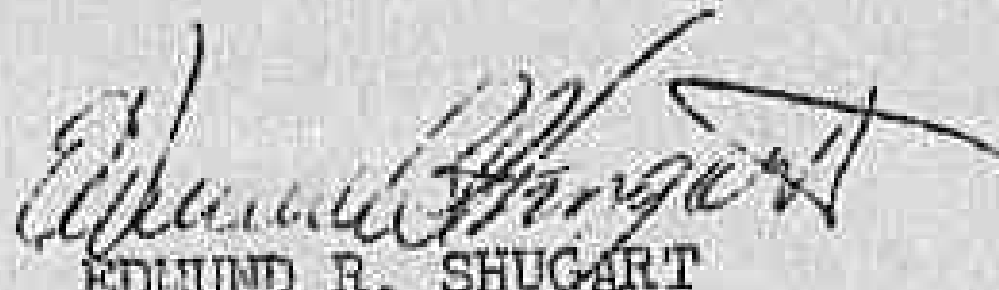

6. Counter Intelligence is responsible for taking into custody persons in the arrestable categories, but will be assisted in that task wherever possible by Provost, Public Safety and other agencies which find such persons in the course of their duties. Where arrests are made by agencies other than CI, the local CI staff will be informed at once.

7. This directive does not affect the definition of "recalcitrants", as set out in current AFHQ directives on the treatment of surrendered enemy personnel in ITALY.

1. Period Covered. The period covered is that of active operations and the following static period before the assumption of responsibility by the Control Commission/Council.

2. Considerations.

a. The principal displaced persons security problem for the Allied Forces, during the period of active operations, is the infiltration of enemy agents through the Allied lines in the guise of displaced persons. During this period the screening of displaced persons will be the responsibility of Counter Intelligence staffs under present arrangements and Counter Intelligence staffs will be responsible for the necessary measures.

b. During the second period the main security problem will be the prevention of the escape of persons on the Counter Intelligence Wanted List and war criminals posing as displaced persons. All other security problems relating to Allied Displaced Persons will be the responsibility of the respective Allied National authorities. Counter Intelligence personnel will render assistance where necessary.

c. The paramount consideration is the speedy repatriation of Allied Nationals through assembly centres. It is, therefore, the policy of the Supreme Allied Commander that the detailed Security Control of Allied displaced persons should be carried out in the main at the reception centres in their own countries.

3. Procedure at the Assembly Centres for Allied National Displaced Persons

a. Registration

- (1) Allied Force Registration Record (DF2) will be completed in duplicate in respect of each displaced person by a Registrar, where possible of his own nationality.
- (2) A copy of the Assembly Centre Registration Card (DF3) - which is compiled from the DF2 - will be submitted by the Assembly Center Director to the CI Travel Control Section at Army/Allied Commission Headquarters in respect of each displaced person who has been registered.

b. Verification

- (1) It will be the responsibility of the appropriate Allied Liaison Officer for repatriation, using the Df2 and any additional information he can obtain to verify the nationality claimed by the displaced person. Any inconsistencies in a displaced person's statements will be reported to the Allied Liaison Officer for further investigation. The Allied Liaison Officer will immediately notify the Assembly Centre Director in any case where he has doubts about the bona fides of a displaced person.
- (2) In order to reduce the numbers of enemy or ex-enemy displaced persons who are subsequently discovered at reception centres in Allied countries and are thereby required to be returned to detention camps in AUSTRIA, Assembly Centre directors will obtain local security clearance by the submission of a complete nominal roll to the local CI representative for endorsement before a given group leaves an assembly centre for a destination outside AUSTRIA. This check to be made against Wanted Persons Lists should be left as late as conveniently possible before departure, in order that full advantage may be taken of all verification of bona fides previously carried out by the Allied Liaison Officer concerned.

c. Disposition of Suspects (Detention). The following categories will be reported at once by the Centre Director to the appropriate military headquarters:

- (1) Those found to be enemy, or ex-enemy nationals. The military commander will make arrangements for their removal to detention camps and for the safeguarding of any documentary evidence.
- (2) Displaced persons suspected on strong prima facie evidence of active collaboration with the enemy or of anti-Allied activities or of the assumption of a false nationality or identity. The military commander will decide whether arrangements shall be made for their removal from the centre or arrange for supervision and detention until such time as they can be handed over to the appropriate Allied authorities, who will be responsible for the method of repatriation and necessary security measures in each case under the supervision of counter intelligence personnel.

d. Disposition of Suspects (Repatriation). If there are grounds for suspicion against a displaced person and it is established that he does not come under either category c (1) or (2) above, the letter "S" will be placed by the Allied Liaison Officer in the upper right hand corner of the Df2 card and after his name on all copies of the nominal roll which are in possession of the Group leader. Brief particulars of the reason for suspicion will also be entered in

space 24 of the DP2 card. He will then be evacuated in the normal manner for ultimate disposition at the reception centre in the Allied country concerned.

e. Doubtful Cases. Assembly centre directors may request the assistance of counter intelligence personnel (including any personnel who may be made available from the Allied Security Services) to advise in difficult cases. They will, however, avoid burdening military commanders with cases of minor importance.

f. Special Cases. US, British and British Commonwealth (including British Indian) Nationals, and neutrals and stateless persons will be dealt with in accordance with instructions issued by this headquarters.

4. Procedure at Assembly Centres for Enemy and Ex-enemy Displaced Persons

a. Wherever possible this category of displaced persons will be billeted on the Austrian population. Where necessary, military commanders will require the Austrian authorities to organize assembly centres for them, which may be established as detention camps.

b. Military commanders will supervise the Austrian authorities in the registration of these persons.

c. Security screening of these categories and the necessary security measures will be the responsibility of military commanders and will be carried out by counter intelligence personnel in conjunction with Public Safety Officers. War criminals and those on the counter intelligence wanted list will be removed to detention camps.

5. Procedure at Reception Centres in Allied Countries

a. The Allied security services will be responsible for all security measures undertaken at the reception centres in the Allied country concerned, including:

- (1) Interrogation of suspects and wanted persons
- (2) Comparison of lists of displaced persons arriving at reception centres with lists of wanted persons and suspects
- (3) The collecting for censorship of letters and other documents carried by displaced persons.

b. The Allied Security service of the nation concerned will be responsible for the final disposition of suspects and wanted persons. Any enemy nationals who have been overlooked and are discovered at this stage will be returned to be dealt with as laid down in paragraph 3 c (1).

6. Frontier Control

a. In the case of displaced persons arriving at frontiers under controlled repatriation procedure, the Group Leader of each party will surrender one copy of the complete nominal roll in respect of his group to the US or British

CI Frontier Control authorities on the AUSTRIAN border.

8. Displaced persons arriving at frontiers without proper documentation will be sent to the nearest assembly centre for processing after examination by counter-intelligence personnel.

SUBJECT: CI/Security Instruction (Austria) No. 3 - Travel to and from Austria
 TO: All Concerned

Travel to and from Austria (zones occupied by American or British Forces) will be severely restricted and regulated in four phases.

1. First Phase - from the date of surrender or occupation of the whole or part of the territory concerned to the date when a skeleton form of CI Travel Control has been established. During this period:

a. The frontier zone will be occupied by tactical units with the object of "sealing" the borders as they existed at 31 December 1937.

b. The frontier will be closed to all travellers (including Kleiner Grenzverkehr - Frontaliers) not forming part of the Allied Forces of occupation.

c. CIC/CI Control personnel will take up posts on the frontier.

d. Forward CI Travel Control Office will be set up at HQ Occupying Force in the American and British Zones respectively, and machinery for occupation and disposition of applications for authorization to cross the frontier will be prepared.

e. Travel to Austria will only be permitted to the following:

- (1) US and British military personnel on duty. When travelling as individuals, military personnel must be in possession of regular travel orders.
- (2) Holders of Allied Force Permits endorsed "Valid for entry to Austria only" and issued by G-2 (CI) Section, this headquarters, or other authority designated by that office. Allied Force Permits at this stage will be issued "for entry only" unless exceptional circumstances are present and to individuals whose proposed journey is of immediate operational importance.

f. Travel from Austria will only be permitted to the following:

- (1) US and British military personnel on duty. When travelling as individuals they must be in possession of regular travel orders.

- (2) Persons travelling under escort and/or in possession of a Waybill Authority issued by CI/CSI(b), Fifth or Eighth Armies.
- (3) Allied ex-prisoners of war evacuated to Italy by air and controlled under G-1 (A) and G-1 (B) arrangements.
- (4) Russian citizens moved under special arrangements.

2. Second Phase - after skeleton CI Travel Control is operating. Separate American and British CI Travel Control Offices with Fifth and Eighth Armies will move to Vienna as soon as operationally possible, having due regard to the status of the remainder of the CI organization. During this period:

a. Forward CI Travel Control Offices at Fifth and Eighth Armies' headquarters, respectively, will begin to operate and the frontier will be opened to limited traffic.

b. Frontier Guards drawn from occupational troops will:

- (1) Prevent all persons and goods not forming part of the Allied Forces from entering or leaving Austria except at authorized Frontier Control Posts.
- (2) Arrest and hand over to the nearest CI Frontier Post for examination and detention all unauthorized persons detected crossing or attempting to cross the Austrian Frontiers.

c. Travel to Austria will be extended to:

- (1) Holders of Joint Chiefs of Staff Permits issued in Washington) endorsed
) "valid for

- (2) Holders of Allied Force Permits issued by the Military Permit Office in London)
 and by SHAEF.)

During this stage, permits may be issued for entry or for entry and exit.

d. Travel from Austria will be extended to:

- (1) Holders of JCS and AF Permits endorsed for a return journey.
- (2) Holders of Military Exit Permits issued by Forward CI Travel Control.
- (3) Displaced Persons documented and moved under G-5 arrangements. Each group will carry:

- (a) 1 copy of DF 1 (Index Card) on each individual
- (b) 1 copy of the nominal roll with each Group leader for delivery to CI Frontier Control at crossing point of exit.
- (c) 1 copy of DF 2 (Registration Card) per individual endorsed with visa of country of destination. These will be held by the group leader in respect of each member of his party.
- (4) Allied ex-prisoners of war moved under G-1 (A) and G-1 (B) arrangements. Each IP (unless evacuated by air under special AAF orders) will hold a P' Identity Card issued by a P' Contact Officer or his representative.
- (5) Such other categories as may be notified by Forward CI Travel Control.

3. Third Phase - after CI Travel Control is fully established. This phase coincides broadly with the remainder of the period of control by this headquarters. During this period:

a. Frontier Guards will continue to operate as before.

b. Personnel engaged on frontier and airport control will confine themselves to travel security duties and operate under the direct command of the Travel Control Sections at Allied Commission/Army Headquarters British and US elements, respectively. Their duties, undertaken in Phase Two where possible, will include:

- (1) Manning of frontier and airport control posts.
- (2) Examination of all travellers and enforcement at the frontier or airports of travel regulations and instructions.
- (3) Making preliminary investigations into and interrogations of doubtful and undocumented travellers and persons detected attempting to cross the frontier or to leave or enter Austria illicitly by air.
- (4) Insuring suspects are sent to detention camps for further investigation.
- (5) Security Control of the movement over the Austrian border of displaced persons and Allied ex-prisoners of war.
- (6) At frontier posts making local arrangements to deal with Kleiner Grenzverkehr (Borderers).
- (7) Organizing security patrols on unauthorized routes in conjunction with the local military commander.

- (S) Advising the local military commander on the disposition of frontier guards.

c. Detailed instructions covering military entry and exit permit procedure will be issued. Civilian traffic will be kept to a minimum compatible with the interests of the Allied Administration of Austria.

4. Fourth Phase. - From the time when this headquarters starts to hand over to the Control Commission. During this period, conditions will be as in the Third Phase, except that:

a. If deemed desirable, the categories of persons who may obtain entry and exit permits will be expanded.

b. Personnel of a purged and reorganized Austrian Frontier Control organization should be available to assist in dealing with the increase in traffic.

5. As a matter of travel control procedure, the beginning and ending of each phase will be decided and publicized by the Counter Intelligence Travel Control Organization for Austria.

SUBJECT: CI/Security Instruction (AUSTRIA) No. 2
Vetting/Screening of Allied Employees in AUSTRIA.

Action

1. All holders of Public Office and all persons, except serving members of the Allied Armed Forces, who are employed directly or indirectly by units, staffs or branches of formations of the Allied Forces, the Military Government, the Allied Control Commission, or associated units or agencies, and whether or not they are paid from public funds, will be subjected to Security/CI enquiry prior to employment. Examples of some of the types of persons included in this Instruction are:

a. Persons the nature of whose work may give them access to information or premises occupied by the Allied Forces, Military Government or Allied Control Administration, eg, contractors, interpreters, mess writers, clerks, etc.

b. Officials who held positions in the following grades of the German Civil Service:

The Political Civil Service	(Der Politische Dienst)
The Upper Service	(Der Gehobene Dienst)
The Higher Service	(Der Hohere Dienst)

and whose services it is desired to retain. Also officials who are later engaged in corresponding positions.

c. The only permitted exceptions to the above examples are casual or unskilled labourers whose work does not give them access to information or premises occupied by the Allied Forces, the Military Government or the Allied Control Administration. In such cases, the foreman or ganger only will be subjected to Security/CI enquiry and will be held responsible for the bona fides and conduct of the workers under his control.

d. The types mentioned above are neither exhaustive nor mutually exclusive. They are intended to indicate only the type of person who will be submitted to a Security/CI check. Doubtful cases will be referred to the nearest Field Security/CIC Headquarters.

e. When, for urgent reasons, it is desired to employ individuals in essential services, before completion of CI screening, authority must first be obtained from the local FS/CIC who may, in such exceptional cases, authorize employment provisionally pending CI clearance.

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2 May 1945 (Cont'd)

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2. Procedure.

a. All Allied units or agencies desiring to employ, or to retain in employment, any individual falling into the category outlined in paragraph 1 will make use of the FLICEBOGEN (PERSONAL QUESTIONNAIRE) FORM (Specimen at Appendix 'A') and the EMPLOYMENT CERTIFICATE FORM (Specimen at Appendix 'B'), which are obtainable at MG Public Safety and FS/CIC offices. These will be dealt with as follows:

- (1) Part I of the Questionnaire will be completed by the proposed employee under supervision of the Allied unit or agency concerned.
- (2) Part II, stating clearly the specific nature of the proposed employment, will be completed by an Allied Officer of the unit or agency.
- (3) The name, address and identity card number of the individual and the designation of the unit or agency will be entered on the Employment Certificate.
- (4) The Questionnaire, with the Employment Certificate attached, will then be forwarded to the nearest Public Safety Officer.

b. If NO objection is raised by local Security/CI and MG Public Safety authorities, the unit or agency will in due course receive from the local MG Public Safety Officer a completed Employment Certificate countersigned and stamped by the local Field Security Section or CIC Detachment. This will be handed to the employee and be retained by him for the duration of his employment. Should his employment be terminated at any time, it is the responsibility of the unit or agency employing him to withdraw the Employment Certificate and return it to the nearest MG Public Safety Officer without delay, with the notification that the individual's services have been dispensed with. Should a change be proposed in the nature of the employment, the Employment Certificate will similarly first be forwarded to the nearest MG ISO together with details of the proposed new employment. It will be endorsed and returned.

c. Should there be OBJECTION to the employment of an individual, the unit or agency will be notified to this effect by the MG ISO. In such cases the individual will in NO circumstances be employed. The reason for rejection of the application will NOT be communicated to the person concerned.

3. All units and agencies will bear in mind that the issue of an Employment Certificate countersigned by PSS/CIC does not guarantee the security reliability of the holder. It is an indication that there is no present known objection to his employment in the capacity shown. All employees are subject to immediate dismissal should adverse information concerning them come to light at any time.

4. The above Instructions will be strictly obeyed by all Allied units, Staffs and Agencies in the US and British Zones of AUSTRIA, including the US and British portions of the Quadripartite Zone of VIENNA.
