1. I had a visit yesterday from Doctor Pietro Marcatajo, your representative. He has no doubt given you a report of our conversation. As a result of that talk I am willing to have included on the Text Revision Commission a prominent educationalist whom you may care to name. As I explained to Dr. Marcatajo, it would be essential that he should be a member of the committee as an educationalist and not as an ex officio Church representative, since we are trying to keep the whole question above party interests.

After prolonged investigation it has been decided that certain of the text books in use in elementary schools may still be left in circulation if certain pages are removed. This will be cheaper than printing new books (even if we can get the paper). As very few of these books can be purchased from the booksellers, it will be necessary to buy them back from the children.

Therefore, it is suggested that we purchase back at half price (i.e. an average price of about 5 lire) all clean copies up to 10,000. The Provveditor degli studi in each province will be responsible for cutting out the necessary pages and redistributing them back to the schools. A notice to this effect can all be inserted in the press.

I have carried out an investigation of this question. In the booksellers a high proportion of the books are not merely Fascist, but anti-British and anti-American war propaganda.

If we order these books to be called in we are hardly likely to get anything more than a few of them, since they represent a large part of the stock in trade of the booksellers.

Therefore, it seems to me that we can only get these books out of circulation by either paying or giving some sort of credits for them. The current price of books is 30% above the list prices. I suggest that the booksellers should be ordered to hand them in, receiving a credit (or money) for all we receive at this current price.

The books so obtained can be pulped.

Do you agree to this method?
