SUBJECT : Historical Monuments

TO : All Commanders

Today we are fighting in a country which has contributed a great deal to our cultural inheritance, a country rich in monuments which by their creation helped and now in their old age illustrate the growth of the civilization which is ours. We are bound to respect those monuments so far as war allows.

If we have to choose between destroying a famous building and sacrificing our own men, then our men's lives count infinitely more and the buildings must go. But the choice is not always so clear-cut as that. In many cases the monuments can be spared without any detriment to operational needs. Nothing can stand against the argument of military necessity. That is an accepted principle. But the phrase "military necessity" is sometimes used where it would be more truthful to speak of military convenience or even of personal convenience. I do not want it to cloak slackness or indifference.

It is a responsibility of higher commanders to determine through A.M.G. Officers the locations of historical monuments whether they be immediately ahead of our front lines or in areas occupied by us. This information passed to lower echelons through normal channels places the responsibility on all Commanders of complying with the spirit of this letter.

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Regional Directorate of P.S. for Sicily
Regulations re Constitution and Functioning of
Inter-Provincial Offices of P.S.

TO: CC.MR., Questori, Prefects

In accordance with dispositions of the Allied Government re constitution of Inter-Provincial Offices of P.S. the following are communicated to you to serve as guides by which to ensure the regular functioning of the services.

The principal purpose behind the formation of the offices is to combat recent serious criminal manifestations which have alarmed the public; it is aimed particularly at organized crime, cattle stealing and those of inter-provincial character. Hence, the chief characteristic of these offices will be mobility in order thus to effectively meet criminal methods in all forms.

The seats of the offices will be: Gerleone, Martino, Paterno, Mistretta, Alcamo, Castelvetrano, Sciacca, Canicatti, Riesi, Mussomeli, Leonforte, Vittoria, Palazzolo Acreide.

By seat is meant the address of the office and it does not necessarily mean that the Functionary will be always present there. The jurisdiction of each inter-provincial office is not rigid. Functionaries must carry out their activities when necessary even in communes outside their jurisdiction by making an arrangement with the Director of the other inter-provincial office.

Whenever experience counsels modifications in jurisdiction of the offices, the heads of the offices are authorized to submit concrete proposals which will be duly considered.

The Functionary directing an inter-provincial office must by means of constant close observation, acquaint himself with the environment and conditions in his area, so that he may have a clear understanding of every anti-social and criminal manifestation and know how to meet it.

In order that this Regional Directorate may be in a position to follow the various crime manifestations, and

be mobilized in order thus to effectively meet criminals in all forms.

The seats of the offices will be: Carleone, Partinico, Vetrolo, Mistrretta, Alcamo, Castelvetro, Sciacca, Canicatti, Riesi, Muzzoneli, Leonforte, Vittoria, Palazzolo Acreide.

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Whenever experience counsels modifications in jurisdiction of the offices, the heads of the offices are authorized to submit concrete proposals which will be duly considered.

The Functionary directing an inter-provincial office must by means of constant close observation, acquaint himself with the environment and conditions in his area, so that he may have a clear understanding of every anti-social and criminal manifestation and know how to meet it.

In order that this Regional Directorate may be in a position to follow the various crime manifestations, and that the inter-provincial offices may intervene quickly and effectively, the detached offices of F.B. and the C.C. are, as follows, by quickest means available, notify the nearest inter-provincial office and this Regional Directorate, of all serious crimes (murder, robbery, cattle thefts, blackmail, kidnapping for extortions, thefts of the more serious kind, serious fires of suspicious origin, injury to property, loss (by swarming of criminals).

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For preventive purposes large and frequent services of watch and patrols should be set up in the country districts, particularly in the more remote spots and in those in which there is heavy agricultural traffic. The inter-provincial offices will regulate and integrate these patrols.

This Regional Directorate has power to request of the Governor the execution of special services in particular zones of the respective Provinces or the detachment of personnel from other Provinces for the time necessary to meet a particular emergency.

Each inter-provincial office shall be made up of 30 men, picked primarily from among non-commissioned officers, divided as follows:

- 14 P.S. Agents, 4 of whom armed with automatic rifles, 4 on horses, 2 motorcyclists.
- 2 P.S. Agents auto-drivers.
- 14 CC Agents of whom, armed as above, 6 mounted, 6 bicyclists.
- 1 truck to transport persons
- 1 light car
- 16 bicycles
- 6 horses for CC, RR.
- 750 kg. gasoline monthly, 30 kg. oil, 6 kg. benzine, 6 kg. of rags for cars.
- Each office to have, besides its premises, 1 car, 1 stable, telephone, typewriter, field glasses.

The Governor, in accordance with previous orders, will provide for the immediate detachment of necessary personnel including Auxiliary Director - for the communes chosen as seats of inter-provincial offices in their respective jurisdictions.

Similarly, the Superior CC, R. Command will provide for the same with respect to CC, RR.

The heads of the Inter-Provincial Offices are charged with the setting up of the office, occupying, if possible, the premises of the suppressed P.S. sectors, or other suitable

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Similarly, the Superior CC.R. Command will provide for the same with respect to CC.RR.

The heads of the Inter-Provincial Offices are charged with the setting up of the office, occupying, if possible, the premises of the suppressed P.S. sectors, or other suitable quarters, notifying this office of the amount to be paid as rent. Instructions will be issued re furnishings, etc.

As for vehicles and horses, where these cannot be furnished by the Questure, the head of the Inter-Provincial Office will proceed to requisition under a decree of the Prefect, likewise for Superior CC.RR. Command with respect to CC.RR.

Office expenses, informers fund, etc., this Directorate will provide necessary funds as soon as A.I.G. makes funds available.

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The P.S. Agents & CO. RR. to be assigned to Inter-Provincial Offices must be picked men, young and capable, and preferably with experience in this field, and those who, having the requisites, volunteer.

Personnel to be paid, in addition to other wages, an indemnity to be established by A.M.G.

This Directorate reserves power to confirm the assignments of Functionaries to Inter-Provincial Offices and to provide for substitution if necessary.

In case a detached P.S. office is located at the Inter-Provincial seat, the head of the Inter-Provincial Office - until further provision - shall also be head of the local P.S. office. He must, however, concentrate on active services which must always take precedence over all other services of an administrative nature.

To provide for eventual lack of personnel, plans are under way for exams and recruiting.

In performing duties the personnel must have as sole aim the prosecution of crime and the strict observance of Regulations and Laws, without reference to social conditions or party affiliations. Only thus can that liberty of action which is the guarantee of success be assured, and every distrust by the public be dispelled.

The conduct of personnel must be above reproach and must serve as an example. No indulgence will be granted in this respect. All other exertions are superfluous.

The people are hopefully waiting for the return of tranquillity. It is an undertaking involving our honor.

(1) The following copy of a memorandum issued by Dr. V. Medica, Director of Public Security, addressed to Questori of Sicily is reproduced for your information.

"Subject; Public Order
To ; Questori of Sicily, for information of Prefects & CC.RR.

The general situation created in recent months in Sicily is becoming particularly delicate and must be studied in all its aspects in order to forestall eventual demonstrations accompanied by violence as have recently occurred in some communes.

The primary causes contributing towards aggravation of the situation may be summarized and reduced to 4 problems interconnected with each other; unemployment, food, political situation, public safety.

Unemployment appears in the industrial field - particularly mining, work having slowed down and often ceased due to scarcity of prime materials and breakdown of exchange of products because of interrupted transportation and communications. Turbulent and interested elements could make use of these classes of unemployed with aim of creating serious difficulties in the general situation.

Connected with this grave problem which cannot be overlooked is the problem of food, which because of the extreme scarcity and consequent very high cost of foods of prime necessity, has brought a serious economic upset among the various social classes, particularly in the more needy and fixed-income classes.

With respect to unemployment, projects are under study looking to a solution of the situation through a possible rise in employment. The solution of food problem is also under study.

And in this connection the recent pay increases aim to better the economic conditions of the various classes, pending the adoption of other measures which will effectively lessen if not solve, the food problem.

The police, however, must not look lightly upon the gravity of this situation from which serious consequences could result. Therefore, public spirit must be frequently controlled in order to forestall and when necessary, repress quickly all demonstrations, which might assume alarming proportions should they degenerate into acts of violence.

Police action should also be directed against those who notoriously run the black market and those who openly charge prices higher than those in Allied price lists.

With respect to the political situation it is noted that after the collapse following the occupation and the fall of Fascism the people have turned to the various political parties which, founded on democratic bases, are organizing and tend to develop looking forward to eventual political elections.

It must be said, however, that the Sicilian public in general does not have a high cultural level nor an adequate political preparation and hence could easily be led astray by mischief makers and opportunists who could use them as instruments in their own selfish interests.

In the political field the police must keep aloof from any partisanship. In this delicate field the only duty of the police is to be always on the alert so that any manifestation of political character will not assume such proportions as to constitute a danger to public order. In such cases the police must intervene adopting measures necessary to bring about public order.

The Public Safety problem directly and specifically interests the police which must out-do itself in order to give once again to the people that tranquility necessary for carrying on in daily life.

The criminal phenomena of recent times, particularly the boldness of the criminals, have created a state of real concern in the people such as to require energetic and urgent measures to prevent further developments in a situation which, closely connected with unemployment and food, could result in a collapse requiring no great imagination to picture.

Police in this field must work in a spirit of sacrifice, remembering also that the institution of inter-provincial offices, aims to integrate the work of the Questure.

Hence it is necessary to institute frequent patrols and "combing" groups in the country districts, working simultaneously among the contiguous provinces, controlling the more

Hence it is necessary to institute frequent patrols and "combing" groups in the country districts, working simultaneously among the contiguous provinces, controlling the more dangerous farm areas and especially those farthest from inhabited areas and the mine areas.

Accordingly, until otherwise provided the Inter-Provincial Offices are directly dependent on Questore of proper jurisdiction, the Questore in organizing the services of inter-provincial nature will reach prior agreement with a contiguous Questori, furnishing this Directorate with a

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scheme of the organization of the services.

The P.C. personnel must win the trust and respect of people, acting energetically when occasion required, so as to avoid falling into excesses, abuses, or worse, arbitrary actions.

The safe guarding of public order and the prosecution of crime must be the constant care of all personnel, assuming the strict observance of proclamations, laws and regulations without regard to social conditions, party politics or without concern for public order, always suiting their conduct to their delicate task.

Only thus can the police have that liberty of action which is the sine qua non without which it cannot perform its duties of vigilance over and maintenance of public order.

In this way we hope to meet and cope with the situation bearing in mind that up to no criminal activities are carried on by relatively few elements and if immobilized by simultaneous and energetic police action, the public safety situation would rapidly improve;

Such results will be easier of achievement in view of the better economic status of personnel and the indemnities to be paid those in inter-provincial service.

It is necessary, however, that the lazy, inefficient, and those physically inept be eliminated. Quarters are requested to send this Directorate a list of said persons in order that Directorate may provide for their immediate discharge. No departure from this rule can be permitted.

Only by diligent and intensive work on part of personnel can success be achieved."

Subject:- Office of Director of Special Prosecutions.

To :- R.C.I.Os (thru RCACs) Regions I and II.

6th December 1943.

1. In order to achieve uniformity in prosecution and, as far as possible, uniformity in the imposition of punishments for all crimes deemed directly to affect special interests of the Allied Military Government, there has been established within the Legal Sub-Commission, this Headquarters, the Office of the Director of Special Prosecutions, Legal Sub-Commission.

2. The function of the office of the Director of Special Prosecutions is to supervise and, wherever necessary, to assist in or conduct all prosecutions, within the occupied territory, of crimes within the category described in paragraph 1.

3. Crimes within the category described in paragraph 1 are :-

- (a) All criminal acts of any kind or nature whatever, that are committed with the purpose or intent of aiding or assisting the enemies of the United Nations or of interfering with the operations of the Allied Forces.
- (b) All criminal acts which tend to bring about a substantial interference with the operations of the Allied Forces within the occupied territory, irrespective of the specific interest with which they are committed.
- (c) All acts of organized or mass violence or terrorism or of organized or mass resistance or opposition to the Allied Military Government or other lawfully constituted government or its representatives or agents.
- (d) Violation of Article V of Proclamation No. 7 of July 1943.
- (e) All violations of applicable laws, decrees, Proclamations, orders and regulations (hereinafter referred to as "black market cases") which constitute :-
 - (1) a diversion of essential commodities from legal channels by hoarding, transportation or sale through other than legal means;

(4) ... in unlawful purchase or sale of such commodities at prices

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- (b) All criminal acts which tend to bring about a substantial interference with the operations of the Allied Forces within the occupied territory, irrespective of the specific interest with which they are committed.
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- (d) Violation of Article V of Proclamation No. 7 of July 1943.
- (e) All violations of applicable laws, decrees, Proclamations, orders and regulations (hereinafter referred to as "black market laws") which constitute :-
 - (i) a diversion of essential commodities from legal channels by hoarding, transportation or sale through other than legal means;
 - (ii) an unlawful purchase or sale of such commodities at prices in excess of legally prescribed maximums.
- (f) All other substantial violations which in the judgment of the C.A.C., Legal Officer or C.A.P.O. having jurisdiction thereof are of such a nature or extent as to fall within the category described in paragraph 1.
 - (a) however cases of the kinds mentioned in paragraph 1, sub-para. (a), (b), (c), (d) and (f), or major black market cases arise, it shall be the duty of the C.A.C., C.A.P.O. or Legal Officer having jurisdiction :-
 - (a) to report the case immediately through Regional Headquarters to the Director of Special Prosecutions;
 - (b) whenever practicable in view of existing communication and transportation difficulties, to withhold prosecution of the offenders until advice is received from the Director of Special Prosecutions through Regional Headquarters to proceed with the prosecution.

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(e) Establishment of roof blocks and the use of such other special investigative devices as may be warranted by conditions obtaining in any particular locality.

10. Communications from Regional Headquarters will be transmitted to the Legal Sub-Commission for the office of the Director of Special Prosecutions.

- (g) All acts of organized or mass violence or terrorism or of organized or mass resistance or opposition to the Allied Military Government or other lawfully constituted government or its representatives or agents.
- (h) Violation of Article V of Proclamation No. 7 of July 1943.
- (i) All violations of applicable laws, decrees, Proclamations, orders and regulations (hereinafter referred to as "black market cases") which constitute :-
- (1) a diversion of essential commodities from legal channels by hoarding, transportation or sale through other than legal means;
 - (ii) an unlawful purchase or sale of such commodities at prices in excess of legally prescribed maximum.
- (j) All other substantial violations which in the judgment of the C.A.P.O., Legal Officer or C.A.P.O. having jurisdiction thereof are of such a nature or extent as to fall within the category described in paragraph i.
4. ⁷⁶¹ Whenever cases of the kinds mentioned in paragraphs (e), (f), (g), (h) and (i), or for black market cases arise, it shall be the duty of the C.A.P.O., C.A.P.O., or Legal Officer having jurisdiction :-
- (a) to report the case immediately through Regional Headquarters to the Director of Special Prosecutions;
 - (b) whenever practicable in view of existing communication and transportation difficulties, to withhold prosecution of the offenders until advice is received from the Director of Special Prosecutions through Regional Headquarters to proceed with the prosecution.

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(c) To give all such cases special preferred and expeditious treatment, including to the maximum extent possible special investigative attention to make certain that all available evidence of the offence has been secured and all available individuals involved in the offence have been discovered and apprehended.

5. It shall be the duty of each Regional Headquarters to forward as soon as practicable all reports of the type described in paragraph 4 hereof to the Director of Special Prosecutions and, in any event, to render such assistance to the investigation and prosecution of offences so reported as the Regional Chief Legal Officer deems necessary.

Where, however, in view of the nature of the case so reported and the state of transportation and communication facilities, it is not deemed practicable to withhold prosecution until advice is received from the Director of Special Prosecutions, it shall be the duty of Regional Headquarters to take all necessary steps to ensure prosecution of the case in accordance with the policy defined in this directive.

6. All prosecutions for crimes that affect the interests of A.M.G. as defined in para. 3 hereof shall be brought before A.M. Courts.

7. The procedure described in para. 4 hereof shall be followed in all cases of any nature whatsoever, if it seems likely that the prosecution is to be brought before a General A. M. Court. The duties of Regional Headquarters with respect to such cases shall be as set forth in para. 5 hereof.

8. Major black market cases as distinguished from other black market cases are subject to the procedure set forth in para. 4 hereof. No hard and fast rule can be laid down defining a major black market case. Illustrative of the type of case falling into this category are the following types of cases. There are examples only for they by no means exhaust the category :-

- (a) Violations which are the result of the operation of any organized group, ring or conspiracy;
- (b) Violations which involve a breach of trust such as violations by law enforcement officers or other public officials charged with the suppression of black market practices or with the administration of supplies or rationing;
- (c) Violations whose extent is such as to indicate a black market operation on a major scale.

9. Success of the current drive against black market cases is of especial interest to the A.M.G. Hence the greatest emphasis should be laid upon the prosecution and investigation of major cases. Other black market cases should also be the subject of an intensive law enforcement drive by C.I.Os, Legal Officers and C.M.F.Os. The greatest available concentration of time, effort and resources should be made when this type of violation. The steps

The greatest available concentration of time, effort and enforcement personnel should be made upon this type of violation. The steps to be taken in pursuance of this policy will depend on a large extent upon the resourcefulness of the C.A.O., Legal Officer or C.A.P.O. having jurisdiction and his knowledge of local conditions. The following measures, however, should be put into effect whenever they are applicable:-

- (a) Imposition of uniform punishments for this type of violation within the limits set forth in the directive of the Chief Judicial Officer on the subject;
- (b) A special effort to discover and apprehend major violators, suppliers, transporters of grain on a large scale and individuals connected with organized black market activity;
- (c) In connection with the above a policy of leniency to minor offenders who aid the enforcement authorities by giving information concerning their sources of supply, their confederates, or other matters;
- (d) Dissemination by whatever means available of publicity as to cases actually tried, the names of the offenders and the punishments imposed.

- (e) Establishment of road blocks and the use of such other special investigative devices as may be warranted by conditions obtaining in any particular locality.
10. Communications from Regional Headquarters will be transmitted to the Legal Sub-Commission for the office of the Director of Special Prosecutions.

SUBJECT: General Wage and Salary Increase.
To : Executive Council

29 Oct. 43.

1. In accordance with your instruction, the following wage proposal is submitted as a temporary measure to be applied Island Wide pending conclusion of a more exhaustive study and analysis now under consideration:

a. Government Agencies. Employees of permanent and temporary status of the State, Provinces, Communes, Enti Para-Statale, and Public Institutions and Agencies (Aziende) which are administered by any of the foregoing governmental units shall receive a "temporary cost of living bonus" which shall be calculated on the base of present total salaries (base plus ordinary and extraordinary indemnities which normally represent an integral part of their total salary) as indicated in the attached table. Increases shall become effective 1 November 43.

b. Private Employers. Private employers are permitted to grant increases in both salaries and wages which shall not exceed the percentages indicated in the attached table. The table increases shall be applied to salaries and wages fixed by Collective Labor Contracts effective as of 1 Sept. 42. However, in the case of the cities of Palermo, Catania and Messina the percentage increases shall be based upon the contract wage plus the indemnity of Presenza. The above increases shall in no way affect or be affected by the Assegni Familiari.

- (1) Increases in salaries and wages received by employees since 1 Sept. 42 shall be deducted from any increase granted as a result of this proposal.
- (2) Increases in salaries and wages received by employees since 1 Sept. 42 which exceed the amount of increase granted by this proposal shall not be effected thereby.

2. The increases authorized under 1 (a) above shall be granted to persons now receiving pensions in accordance with the schedule in attached table.

3. Any disputes which arise between employer and employee or employees under Section 1 (b) above shall be adjusted in accordance with the machinery provided in A:M:G: General Order No. 8.

4. This proposal does not apply to persons directly employed by branches of the Allied Armed Forces or by contractors rendering service to said forces.

A complaint has reached this office alleging that an AMGOT Civil Affairs officer had issued written authority to certain Italians, who were in the process of forming a Bomb Disposal Group, authorizing them to make use of certain supplies located in a U.S. Army Ordnance Dump. This act was wholly unauthorized.
2. Too much emphasis cannot be laid upon the necessity for cooperation with other units of the Allied Armies.
3. Each C.A.O., or other AMGOT official, before he takes any steps which might effect other Army units, should consider carefully what effect his action is likely to have on that Army unit. Before the action is taken, the necessary contact should be made to insure that no misunderstanding will result.
4. It is requested that all AMGOT personnel in your province be advised of the contents of this memorandum.

3. Draft passes back to Legal Division. If revision required it is now done in consultation between division of origin and Legal Division, as well as with other interested divisions.
4. Corrected draft after receiving any further approval necessary from Legal Division, passes to printer.
5. Printer submits galley proof to Legal Division who check until accurate proof received.
6. Final proof is sent by Legal Division to Division of origin for signature as finally approved, before prints are made.
7. Legal Division then signs approval also and passes back final proof for printing with notation of number of copies required and priority.
8. Printer delivers completed order to Legal Division.
9. Legal Division supervises distribution to all regions including four copies to each division and staff officer and four to Central Registry.
10. Legal Division maintains brief register indicating: Division of Origin, number and subject of publication, date of inception, date of final printing, and dates of distribution.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR ALLOCATION AND ASSIGNMENT
OF CAPTURED ENEMY MATERIEL

1. Circular Number 50, this headquarters, cs, is rescinded. The following instructions outline the organization and prescribe in general the procedure to be followed in the allocation and assignment of serviceable and repairable captured materiel and supplies.

2. ORGANIZATION. a. The responsibility for the assignment of serviceable and repairable captured enemy materiel and supplies and the maintenance of necessary records pertaining to such materiel and supplies is placed upon a new sub-section of the Quartermaster Section, this headquarters, to be known as the "Captured Enemy Materiel Executive Committee" (C.E.M.E.C.), (previously called the Battlefield Clearance Section).

b. Liaison Sections (C.E.M.E.C.) representing the C.E.M.E.C. of this headquarters will be attached to army group headquarters (army headquarters when operating independently) in areas which enemy materiel and supplies are captured. This headquarters will designate subsidiary C.E.M.E.C. Sections for attachment to subordinate areas. In American areas these subsidiary sections will be under the jurisdiction of the headquarters of the area. In British areas they will be Executive "Service" Sections working under the directions of the area headquarters concerned.

c. In view of the Allied aspect of the duties assigned to the C.E.M.E.C., the Liaison Sections should consist of an equal number of representatives of the armies concerned.

d. The instructions contained herein are not to be interpreted in any way as relieving commanding generals of armies and areas of their responsibility for collecting, sorting, classifying, safeguarding, evacuating, etc., captured enemy materiel and supplies in accordance with existing instructions, to specified parks, dumps, etc.

3. DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES.

a. G-3 (Org), this headquarters,

- (1) Formulates and assigns priorities for captured materiel and supplies.

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(2) Processes all communications with higher authorities.

b. Quartermaster, this headquarters - C.E.M.E.C.,

- (1) Is the channel of communication between this headquarters and the Liaison Sections in subordinate headquarters.
- (2) Formulates policies for the operation and control of Liaison Sections (C.E.M.E.C.) at subordinate headquarters.
- (3) Calls for, receives, and collates all reports from Liaison Sections (C.E.M.E.C.) at subordinate headquarters.
- (4) Lists separately serviceable and repairable materiel and obtains allocation instructions from G-3 (Org).
- (5) Receives all demands for allocation of captured materiel and supplies and processes such demands to G-3 (Org) for allocation instructions.
- (6) Issues disposition instructions based on G-3 allocations.

c. Liaison Sections (C.E.M.E.C.) at army group headquarters or independent army headquarters,

- (1) Are the channels of communication between C.E.M.E.C., Quartermaster Section, this headquarters, and such subsidiary sections as may be established at subordinate headquarters.
- (2) Controls subsidiary sections at subordinate headquarters.
- (3) Calls for, receives, and collates all reports from subsidiary sections.
- (4) Renders reports called for by higher authorities.
- (5) Forwards to this headquarters (C.E.M.E.C.) lists of captured materiel and supplies. These lists will, as far as is practicable, differentiate between serviceable and repairable materiel and will normally be prepared by the special staff or service section concerned. The lists will be supplemented by lists prepared by the Liaison Section (C.E.M.E.C.) in the event of it not being possible to obtain a picture by any other means.
- (6) Obtains and processes disposal orders on serviceable and repairable materiel and supplies upon instructions from C.E.M.E.C., Quartermaster Section, this headquarters. (For

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disposal of salvage (British) or unserviceable materiel (U.S.) see paragraph 4 below).

d. Liaison Sections (C.E.M.E.C.) at subordinate areas,

- (1) Advises and cooperates with Special Staff (U.S. Areas) or Service (British Areas) on matters pertaining to the collection, classification, cataloging, and recording of captured materiel and supplies.
- (2) Makes inspections, as directed by headquarters to which they are assigned, of dumps or parks containing captured materiel and supplies to determine whether instructions for collection, protection, sorting, classification, and safeguarding are being followed.
- (3) Renders reports called for by higher authorities.

e. Joint Re-Armament Committee (JRC),

- (1) Receives lists of serviceable and repairable materiel and supplies from C.E.M.E.C., Quartermaster Section, this headquarters.
- (2) Recommends to G-3 (Org) the allocation of serviceable materiel and supplies that can be accepted for Joint Re-Armament.

4. PROCEDURE FOR COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL OF SALVAGE (BRITISH DEFINITION) AND UNSERVICEABLE MATERIEL OR SCRAP (U.S. EQUIVALENT). This will continue under normal procedure. The basic documents in the case of United States forces are Circulars Numbers 22 and 70, Headquarters NATOUSA, cs.

5. DEMANDS FOR CAPTURED ENEMY MATERIEL. These will be addressed to C.E.M.E.C., Quartermaster Section, this headquarters.

6. REMOVAL OF MATERIEL OR SUPPLIES. When any agency or supply service is allocated captured enemy materiel or supplies, it must assume the responsibility for identifying materiel or supplies for which they have approved allocation instructions and to arrange for their removal from the area, park, or dump in which located and for their preparation for shipment within the theater or to destinations outside the theater.

1. In AUGOT/2036/P of 29 September 1943, it was emphasized that Italian Provincial and Communal Officials should at once commence the task of preparing their budgets (Bilancio di Previsioni) for the 1944 fiscal year. This urgent request was based on the desire to institute effective control of funds being advanced by ASFA throughout the Occupied Territory and also to direct the attention of Italian officials to the need for developing tax revenues to meet deficits which may arise in Provincial or Communal budgets.

2. In order to institute similar controls over current expenditures, revenues and deficits of Provinces and Communes, centralize the authorization of advances and expedite the posting of advances on ASFA's books to the proper accounts, it is now directed that a Monthly Budget (Form C.R.O.7) and a Request for Advance (Form C.R.O.8) be prepared by the appropriate Provincial or Communal officials in consultation with C.A.Os., P.Os., and R.Os., to the extent that the latter are available.

3. These monthly budgets will be prepared on Form C.R.O.7, and applications for advances made on Form C.R.O.8. Enclosed are copies of a letter in Italian, which should be distributed by you to the officials concerned. An English translation is given in Appendix "A".

4. The communal monthly budgets will be considered by the C.A.O. for the district concerned who will then pass the forms as early as possible and without waiting for all communes to the S.C.A.O. Provincial monthly budgets will be sent direct to the S.C.A.O. of the province.

5. Revenue Officers or in their absence Finance Officers will examine the budgets of communes and provinces and in the cases of communes will consult the Prefect and have the forms C.R.O.7 Commune signed by him.

They will then make their recommendations to the S.C.A.O. who will in turn forward his recommendation to the Finance Division. One copy of the form C.R.O.7 will be retained by the P.O. or P.O. Attention is again drawn to the fact that copies of the 'Bilancio di Previsioni' for all communes are available for reference at the Prefettura. These recommendations should be forwarded daily as received and should all reach Regional AMCOT H.Q. by the 22nd of the month succeeding that for which the advance is required.

They will then make their recommendations to the S.C.A.O. who will in turn forward his recommendation to the Finance Division. One copy of the form C.R.O.7 will be retained by the R.O. or F.O. Attention is again drawn to the fact that copies of the 'Bilancio di Previsione' for all communes are available for reference at the Prefettura. These recommendations should be forwarded daily as received and should all reach Regional AGOOF H.Q. by the 22nd of the month preceding that for which the advance is required.

6. The C.R.O. of the Finance Division at Regional H.Q. will approve the necessary advances and pass the form C.R.O.8 to A.M.F.A. for payment. The C.R.O. will retain for investigation and checking the form C.R.O.7.

7. As soon as an advance has been approved by the C.R.O., A.M.F.A. will forward to the S.C.A.O., for distribution, a cheque for the amount of each advance within his Province. These cheques will be accompanied by Vouchers for Advances to Communes, etc. (Form P/12) made out in triplicate. Before the cheques are turned over to the payees, the receipt formula on each copy of Form P/12 must be signed by at least two officials of the Commune or Province, and the Communal or Provincial seal or stamp should be affixed; the certificates of payment on the duplicates and triplicates must also be completed. The triplicates of Form P/12 will be retained by the S.C.A.O. as evidence that the cheques have been duly delivered and the originals and duplicates will be sent at the earliest possible moment through official channels direct to A.M.F.A. at Regional A.M.C.O.T. Headquarters.

2. These instructions are effective commencing with the month of December 1943, and no variances will be made direct by S.C.A.Os., F.Os., or C.A.Os. after 1st December 1943.

A separate instruction is being issued as to the procedure to be followed in making advances to the Italian National Government and to State Institutions.

3. The returns required under AMOT/2077/E dated 5.Sep.43, para. 10, (a), (b), and (c), will no longer be required.

1. It is necessary :

- (a) that the temporary arrangement during the early stages of the Allied occupation under which various local officers of the Allied Military Government made advances of money to various local Italian officials for salaries, recurrent expenses, relief of destitution etc., should now cease,
- (b) that proper estimates and accounts of the Revenue and expenditure of the communes and provinces should now be prepared,
- (c) that the pre-occupation system whereby such estimates were submitted to the Prefect should be recommenced,
- (d) that communes and provinces should obtain the maximum amount of income from taxes, imposts and other sources and should review their expenses so that advances to such bodies will be reduced as much as possible,
- (e) that, before any advance is asked for, full use should be made of all available cash balances. These items will be shown on form C.R.O.8.

2. Accordingly, commencing with the month of December no further advances will be made to communes and provinces unless the following procedure is complied with :

- (a) Each Commune or Province will complete the enclosed form C.R.O.7 in duplicate for the month of December, 1943. The form will show as indicated thereon the actual income and expenditure for December 1942, and also the estimated income and expenditure for the month of December 1943. The forms C.R.O.7 will include the income and expenditure of all bodies (such as hospitals, waterworks etc.) which are normally financed through the budget of the Commune or Province concerned.
- (b) The completed forms C.R.O. 7 together with the request for an advance on form C.R.O.8 will then be sent not later than the 5th November 1943,
 - (i) in the case of Communes, to the local officer of the Allied Military Government.

- (e) that, before any advance is asked for, full use should be made of all available cash balances. These items will be shown on form C.R.O.3.

2. Accordingly, commencing with the month of December no further advances will be made to communes and provinces unless the following procedure is complied with:

- (a) Each Commune or Province will complete the enclosed form C.R.O.7 in duplicate for the month of December, 1943. The form will show as indicated therein the actual income and expenditure for December 1942, and also the estimated income and expenditure for the month of December 1943. The forms C.R.O.7 will include the income and expenditure of all bodies (such as hospitals, waterworks etc.) which are normally financed through the budget of the Commune or Province concerned.

- (b) The completed forms C.R.O. 7 together with the request for an advance on form C.R.O.8 will then be sent not later than the 5th November 1943,

(i) in the case of Communes, to the local officer of the Allied Military Government,

(ii) in the case of Provinces, to the head officer of the Allied Military Government, at the Provincial capital.

- (c) The forms C.R.O.7 in respect of communes will subsequently be discussed with the Prefect by the head officer of the A.M.G. at the Provincial capital, or by his finance representative.

3. Forms will be completed for each month subsequent to December 1943, and the same procedure followed. A form C.R.O.7 will be completed each month even if no advance is required.

4. When an advance to a commune or province has been approved by the Allied Military Government the necessary funds will be advanced to the Bank at which the communal or provincial treasury is kept for the account of such treasury. The Bank will show the advance in the treasury account as an advance from the Allied Military Financial Agency.

5. In addition to the above all communes and provinces will proceed immediately to prepare and submit in accordance with the usual procedure their 'Bilancio di Previsioni' for the year 1944. These should be prepared in full as before on the usual forms and in accordance with existing Italian law.

Subject: Attitude towards Italians.

To : All S.C.A.Os and Heads of Divisions.

1. A.F.H.Q. has issued telegraphic instructions for the guidance of all ranks in their relations with Italians. The following is a paraphrase thereof:

Since the defeat and unconditional surrender of Italy, the King of Italy has offered to help us drive the Germans out of his country. This offer has been accepted but it does not mean that Italy becomes one of the Allied nations. In view of Italy's readiness to co-operate and to give every assistance in meeting operational requirements she has been accorded the status of cobelligerent.

Allied troops must be absolutely correct in their conduct. (All demands must be made through Italian military or civil officials.) All dealings with Italians must be conducted with firmness but without being rude. The aim will be to obtain what is necessary for our operations through friendly co-operation.

Cases of non-cooperation will be reported to the (Allied Military Mission through) higher formations. Should there be any active resistance or hostile acts against our forces these will be dealt with as though committed by the enemy.

The C.in C. relies on the common sense of all ranks of the Allied Forces.

2. The above instructions are primarily for the guidance of operational troops. The portions dealing with relationships with Italian officials (enclosed in brackets) are not applicable to AMCOT procedure which will continue as at present until otherwise directed.

1. Following a recent conference at AMGOT HQ, when the subject of utilizing immediately in Sicily the services of the American and British Red Cross Societies personnel was discussed, an invitation was extended to these Societies to send representatives.

2. The first of these representatives has arrived. This gentleman, Mr. Haganan, is attached to the Public Health Division as liaison officer. Other representatives are expected at a very early date and will be posted as liaison officers to the larger of the provinces in the office of S.A.P.H.O. Every province will be covered in this way and all will later be informed which liaison officer will be responsible for each of the provinces.

3. The sphere of activities of these Red Cross Societies has been defined as including the following. The general scheme will be to confine these activities to those consistent with Red Cross policies and the whole of Red Cross activities, American, British and Italian will be coordinated at AMGOT HQ. The Red Cross will bring in such supplies as may be possible for the population requiring public care and stockpiles will be established at Palermo for use throughout the Island and on the mainland when this is possible as required by AMGOT. This activity will be coordinated with representatives of Civil Supply to obviate re-duplication.

4. Assistance is further possible in directions such as the following:

- (a) In working with the Italian Red Cross in getting the P.O.W. clearance center functioning more adequately. (Particularly in connection with foreign countries).
- (b) In providing supplies (clothing, food, medical).
- (c) In helping to register, re-locate, re-house and repatriate refugees.

1. Below are set out for your information replies on questions recently raised in connection with grain problems.

2. In fixing the standard prices for wheat in G. O. 3 it was not the intention that the checks formerly imposed for quality and specific gravity should be dispensed with. Payment should be varied in accordance with the standards laid down in the schedules in possession of the Consorzio Agrario and which formed the basis for additions to or deductions from the standard price.

3. The Finance Division has decided that, generally speaking, all taxes formerly imposed should continue to be collected. With reference to the Imposte sull'Entrata of L. 7.75 per quintal payable by the miller on wheat purchased by him, it has been agreed with that Division that the original basis on which the tax was calculated should be ignored and the tax maintained at L. 7.75 per quintal irrespective of the price of wheat.

4. It is assumed that the precaution is generally adopted that a condition precedent to the issue of milling tickets is the declaration by farmers of the amount of grain produced.

5. The costs of production of bread and pasta vary in different districts, but G. O. 3 provides for general maximum prices. The subsidy should be varied as necessary in order to keep the retail prices within the limits set.

1. In response to recent requests the following is quoted for your information:

"Protected personnel of the enemy may not be paroled. Not being Prisoners of War, there is no basis for requiring them to give their parole. The only way to control them is by giving them directions restricting their movements." (Protected personnel are Chaplains and Medical Personnel)

2. If medical personnel or chaplains captured in Sicily are residents of Sicily and are set free, they will be subject to the same Proclamations and Orders of the Allied Military Government in the same manner as all other persons in the territory.

3. Protected personnel are, until release or repatriation, a responsibility of G-1 or "A" Branch of the respective Armies, and not of AMCOT.

SUBJECT: Olive Oil

To: ALL S. G. A. Os.

1. Olive oil and olive oil residues will be subject to control similar to that in force prior to our occupation.
2. In particular the following regulations will remain in force:
 - A. Those defining the persons who are allowed to retain olive oil and the quantity which they are permitted to retain. Arrangements should be made for the withdrawal of ration coupons in respect of these persons.
 - B. Those stipulating conditions of amass, sale, distribution, sampling and classification of oils.
 - C. Those affecting the method of rationing.
3. Crop estimate to hand at the moment indicates that production this season is likely to be satisfactory and the maximum ration should be fixed as from 1st November, 1943 at 1 liter per person per month. If subsequent information suggests that this should be decreased or could be increased, the matter will be reconsidered. In the absence, therefore, of any subsequent instructions the maximum ration for all provinces is fixed at the quantity mentioned above.
4. Prices have been amended having in mind two essential requirements
 - A. The price should be high enough to attract the crop into the ammassi.
 - B. It should not be so high as to be beyond the means of the poorer classes.

The price to the consumer of Lire 20 to Lire 22 per qll represents a 50% rise on last year's price and having regard to the anticipated increase in supplies, is expected to be sufficiently high to attract the crop to the Ammassi.

The cost per person per month at the ration fixed above will be about 14 lire. This expenditure on such an important item of diet cannot be considered excessive. It compares with 48 lire per month per person for bread and pasta at the maximum permitted ration.

5. A schedule is attached (Appendix A) showing the maximum permitted ration.

3. Crop estimate to hand at the moment indicates that production this season is likely to be satisfactory and the maximum ration should be fixed as from 1st November, 1943 at $\frac{1}{2}$ liter per person per month. If subsequent information suggests that this should be decreased or could be increased, the matter will be reconsidered. In the absence, therefore, of any subsequent instructions the maximum ration for all provinces is fixed at the quantity mentioned above.

4. Prices have been amended having in mind two essential requirements

A. The price should be high enough to attract the crop into the ammassi.

B. It should not be so high as to be beyond the means of the poorer classes.

The price to the producer of Lire 20 to Lire 22 per qli represents a 50% rise on last year's price and having regard to the anticipated increase in supplies, is expected to be sufficiently high to attract the crop to the Ammassi.

The cost per person per month at the ration fixed above will be about 14 Lire. This expenditure on such an important item of diet cannot be considered excessive. It compares with 48 lire per month per person for bread and pasta at the maximum permitted ration.

5. A schedule is attached (Appendix A) fixing prices for edible olive oil for this season's crop. It will be observed that the classification has been simplified and edible oils are now graded into 4 categories. This is regarded as a sufficient division, having in mind the fact that 80% of all oil consumed in Sicily is in the lowest grade (not exceeding 7% acidity) and almost the whole of the remainder consumed is in the next highest category.

6. Prices for non-edible olive products are attached (Appendix B).

7. The prices fixed from producer down to consumer are standard for the whole Island with the following exceptions

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- 2 -

A. The retail prices shown are those applicable to provincial capitals. Increases may be made for other communes in the province to cover additional transport costs.

B. Any tax payable by the retailer will be added to his selling price. For example, if the tax on "olio comune" was 0.5 lire per litre, the price to the consumer would be Lire 22.5 per litre in the provincial capital.

SUBJECT: Change in Equivalent Classifications.

TO: All concerned.

1. The Combined Chiefs of Staff have announced that effective 0001Z hrs., 1 October 1943, the following equivalent classifications will be effective:

2. It will be noted that a change in the definition of British SECRET has been made. British SECRET is now defined as follows: "Secret documents are documents which, although not warranting the exceptional precautions applied in dealing with MOST SECRET documents, are of such a nature that for reasons of national security they must only be disclosed to persons whose duties make it essential that they should have knowledge of them." It, as well as British MOST SECRET is now equivalent to U.S. SECRET, and will be handled accordingly.

3. No document issued and classified prior to 1 October 1943 will be reclassified because of this decision.

4. This order makes no changes in U.S. classifications as prescribed in AR 380-5.

5. Messages classified as British SECRET will be enciphered when sent by any electrical means. The attention of all originators is directed to more frequent use of the classification CONFIDENTIAL. Messages classified CONFIDENTIAL may be routed by Signals over secure wire or submarine cable channels in clear, but will always be enciphered when transmitted by wireless or wire liable to interception. British MOST SECRET as well as SECRET and U.S. SECRET should be reserved for those documents and messages requiring the highest degree of security. If the volume of traffic hitherto classified as British SECRET continues, considerable delay due to overloading of ciphers may result.

SUBJECT: Requisitioning.

TO : All members AMBOT, Palermo.

1. In order that requisitioning procedures be standardized, civilians compensated properly and the U. S. Army Claims Board enabled to arrive at a just decision, the procedure outlined below will be followed:

a. A standard requisition form (obtainable from Central Registry) should be filled out in triplicate. Original to be sent to Fiscal Section, G-4, 7th Army, duplicate to be given to owner, triplicate to be held by requisitioning officer.

b. Three requisition slips should be accompanied by a complete description of article as to what it is, condition etc.

2. In the case of vehicles the following procedure should be added:

a. After requisitioning slip is made, car should be taken with a description of vehicle form (obtainable from Central Registry) to the 3405th Ordnance Company, Fiat Works, located 1/8th of a mile West and one block North of the Hotel Excelsior on the Via Marmora. Here the form will be filled out by an inspector; car will be serviced.

b. This form will be sent to Fiscal Section, G-4, 7th Army along with the original of requisitioning form and the registration card of vehicle.

c. Car will then be taken to 6616th QM Company, Car (provisional) just Southwest of the RR station where a U. S. A. Vehicle No. will be assigned.

3. This procedure should be carried out immediately on requisitioning so its condition can be ascertained at the time of requisitioning.

4. All cars already requisitioned should be put through this procedure immediately.
