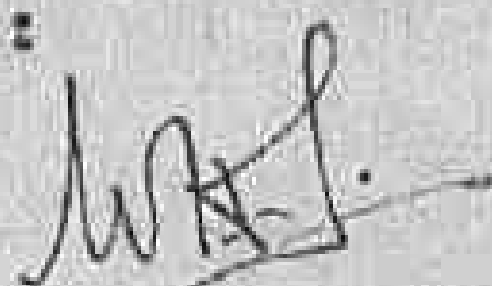

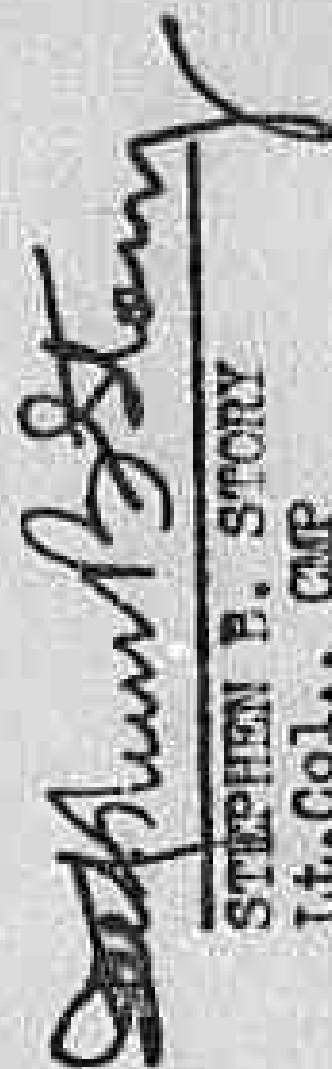

1. I wonder if you would be so kind as to get my TO/WE straightened out for me. The matter has been in suspense for some time and it is personally unsatisfactory.

2. Originally Fine Arts was planned to be a branch of the Education Sub-Commission, but Generale JORDI, SCHUBERT and STOFFER agreed that it should be made a separate Sub-Commission.

3. The planned TO/WE for combined Education and Fine Arts (Appendix 3 to I.B. No 12 of 12 Oct 47) has been shown to be inadequate and this number of officers is, in fact necessary for Education alone.

4. It seems now, in view of the fact that Education and Fine Arts are combined in the Italian Government, that these sub-commissions will have to be re-combined. In this event, the Fine Arts Officers should be added to the 6 officers required for Education.

5. I attach the proposed TO/WE for Education alone (in which, in view of the change of Director from A to B, I have changed one Major from B to A), for reference, and I should be grateful if this could be forward with effect from the date when the sub-commissions were established.

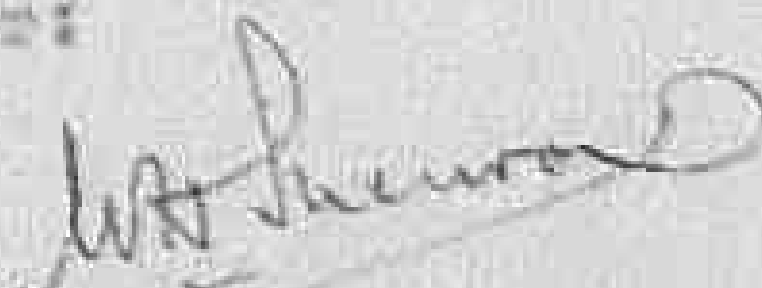

Dear General,

(Name) I was very surprised this afternoon to meet Lt. Col., T.V. SMITH in Palermo who says he is on his way to London to take over the Educational appointment which I understood you had ear-marked for me.

When, last week, I spoke to your staff about this possibility, I was told that Col., SMITH had not been asked for and that you would do your own choosing and that I was your choice.

I have spoken frankly with Col. SMITH and we are agreed that he wishes to remain in Italy and I wish to go to the new work of A.M.G. for Germany. He is good enough to suggest that if you send for me he will be prepared to work under me as here. Personally I feel that this is wasting his talents which could be admirably exploited under A.G.C. in Italy.

You will realize how unsatisfactory the situation has become as a result of this sudden posting of Col. SMITH before you have had a chance to send for me. Therefore, if you can send me a signal as soon as possible confirming your intention of calling for me I should be obliged. Until I have it I can neither plan effectively for Germany or Italy.

Herewith I am enclosing a copy of a letter sent to you on 8th December 1943 in case you have not yet received it which sets out my plans for Germany.

Dear Lord RUSSELL,

To my surprise Lt. Colonel T.V. SMITH arrived here yesterday to say that he was on his way to London. He gave me your message of help for which I am grateful. A week ago General MOSHERY told me in no uncertain terms that he was taking me to London for this appointment in view of my work here and also my German experience. I pointed out that there was a rumour that Colonel SMITH was being sent for and he told me to discount it as he had no intention of listening to rumours.

Colonel SMITH is as anxious to remain in Italy as I am to be away from the present situation. He has been good enough to say that if he cannot be returned to Italy and if I am sent for he will serve under me as he has done here. This is typical of his generous attitude throughout; but I really feel some attempt should be made to return him to Italy as he is peculiarly fitted to deal with the situation now developing and I am not and wish to have no truck with it. Naturally, if he cannot be returned to Italy, I should be delighted to have him as my deputy.

The attached is the plan I have sent to General MOSHERY for our new educational work and I feel it will meet with your approval as it is based upon our experience and the work developed originally under your direction.

I am extremely anxious to get to London to start this work and I should like to have at least SUMMERS with me from the start.

Owing to the confusion which has arisen through Colonel SMITH's posting I should be glad if you and General MOSHERY could arrange to have a signal sent as soon as possible to say whether I am to come to take over education or not. Until then I am not able to plan effectively for the field I am interested in or the present in which I am becoming rapidly less interested.

As it may be necessary to convince posting departments of my fitness I am attaching a brief account of my North European experience.

I hope that you will succeed with General MOSHERY in getting me transferred - and I shall be ever deeply grateful to you for it.

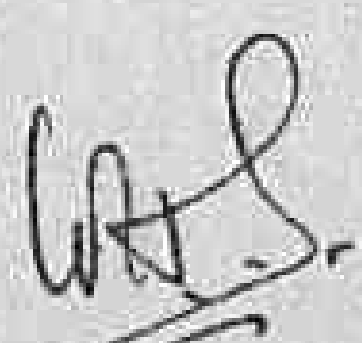

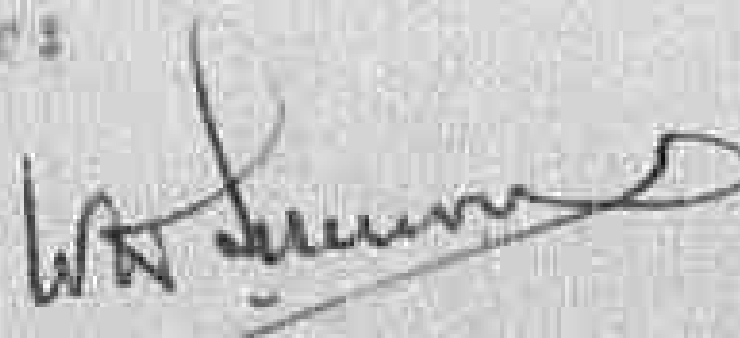

1. On 3 November 1943 I wrote to General MacSherry at his request, setting out the establishment I required for Education. This arose out of a conference with General Joyce, General MacSherry and General Holmes in which they ~~had~~ agreed to the separation of Fine Arts, Monuments and Archives from Education.
2. When writing that letter I was unaware of the ^{tentative} establishment as worked out at Inzi Ozyon, I was therefore unable to compare their plan with my requirements.
3. The Inzi Ozyon plan allowed 8 Officers for both Education and Fine Arts; I estimated a requirement of 11 Officers for Education alone.
4. Experience has made it clear that it is impossible to furnish the Fine Arts staff out of Education, and that ~~the existing requirements of Education alone are 8 Officers~~. It is essential that the 8 Officers planned by Inzi Ozyon must be ~~Education~~ allotted to Education; a separate establishment being allotted to Fine Arts.
5. There is another aspect of the case which ~~must~~ should not be overlooked. The Press, Congress, and Parliament are greatly interested in Education which they consider ^{as} the principal means of achieving our Peace aims. They would, therefore, certainly regard adversely any ~~such~~ severe scaling down of the Educational Establishment, with its consequent effect upon

the efficient carrying out of the important work ^{to} which this Sub-Commission is committed.

7. A small readjustment is also necessary as between the TO and the WE. It has been agreed by General Joyce and General McHenry that I am the Director of the Sub-Commission, and this is wholly agreeable to Lt. Col. T. V. Smith. It will therefore be necessary to delete the Colonel's appointment from the T.O. ^{sum} and add it to the WE ^{Index} ~~to balance the~~ ~~the British Major's appointment~~. The balance may be restored by deleting one Major's appointment from the WE and adding one Major to the TO.

8. I realize that it may ~~be difficult~~ ^{not be easy}, in view of the maximum number of Officers allowed on the TO/WE, to ~~be~~ allot the above requirements. ~~not be difficult~~ If, therefore, it is absolutely essential to allot a smaller number, the appointments which can best be spared are one, or in extremity, ~~two of the~~ ^{two of the} British, the American Major's appointments. As I understand that all the Regional appointments ~~are~~ so far made are American (see attached) ~~and so the balance would still be correctly weighted towards the American side~~.

8. I am anxious to get this matter settled at ~~an~~ ^{as} early date as possible, as General McHenry has recommended Capt. Curran's transfer to Education (with the rank of Major, for which he is due) and I cannot act in this matter until I know exactly how the TO/WE stands.

Dear Colonel:

I understand from Major Raffe that his job is practically coming to an end as it has been decided to have all the Schede investigations carried out at a regional level. In another letter I have pointed out that that is impractical for university appointments.

As we have still a vacancy for an American Major on our old AMGOT establishment (which still survives) could he not fill this vacancy? We need another officer on our Headquarters staff to deal with several problems, and among these Intelligence could be placed. Then, whatever Colonel Young's arrangements might be for handling Schedes in general, Major Raffe could still carry on the intelligence work which he has been doing for this Division.

It is of overwhelming importance to get the dismissals and reappointments of university professors in hand as soon as possible and we have only been held up by shortage of staff. With Major Raffe, as an education officer, he could visit Naples, Catania, and Messina and get the work started there.

Major Raffe informs me that he was originally earmarked for our division and I am enclosing his dossier.

There seems to be strained relations between him and Colonel Young and I am afraid that as a result I shall lose the work he has been doing for me wither which I shall be in great difficulties. I also have the feeling that Col. Young does not want him.

Education, owing to its essentially long-term activity, cannot be fitted exactly into the same mould as other Divisions or Sub-Commissions.

Therefore, we wish to propose that for the time being there should be maintained the two branches just as we have them at present, with, nevertheless, the present close liaison and joint policy.

This plan would involve the following arrangement:

I The establishment which now exists for A.M.G. HQ. should continue. The Regional Directors of Education under Military Government would come under this administration.

The work and policy already pursued in this area (which has the support of Lt. Colonel T. V. SMITH) would continue.

II As regions passed under civilian control, the Directors of Education in Regions would pass under control of Lt. Colonel T. V. SMITH or A.C.C.

I The establishment which now exists for A.M.G. HQ. should continue. The Regional Directors of Education under Military Government would come under this administration.

The work and policy already pursued in this area (which has the support of Lt. Colonel T. V. SMITH) would continue.

II As regions passed under civilian control, the Directors of Education in Regions would pass under control of Lt. Colonel T. V. SMITH of A.C.C.

III Lt. Colonel T. V. SMITH should have his Headquarters with General JOYCE (as soon as there is an Italian Minister of Education functioning) since no plans can be worked out on a permanent basis without the co-operation of the Italian Minister of Education. This would give the opportunity for liaison which is badly needed.

IV At a later stage when Military Government ceases to function and civilian government replaces it, ⁹⁰⁰ thereby producing an amalgamation of these two phases of our activity, neither of us has any personal ambitions and will work readily with the other according to the direction of higher authority.

Capt. Sherwood has shown me the Establishment for the Educational Branch. It would appear that 2 Majors are shown as assistants to the Educational Adviser.

It is quite clear from only a very hasty glance through the files already accumulated that there is work here for a very large branch, and what is more, work which must be of a permanent character. Therefore, in order to cope with it, and insure continuity, I should like to suggest that these two officers be appointed as soon as possible.

I think that, on the British side, the Director of Army Education and the Controller of the Army Establishment Corps, would be prepared to find immediately an officer if requested to do so, as I was led to understand before I left London that they were anxious to give all assistance in their power, despite their chronic shortage of personnel.

From the work as I see it I should like to make the following recommendations and if you approve of it, I should like it put to the C.C.A.O.

- I There should be 2 Assistant Educational Advisers at present contemplated.
- II When AMGOT moves forward as new territory develops one of these assistants should be left behind to administer education in Sicily.

- 2 -

III A staff Captain should be appointed, who would replace the Major when he became Educational Administrator in Sicily. As a result ANGOT HQ would always have 2 assistant Educational Advisors.

IV Two warrant officers (one 1st class and the other 2nd class) should be appointed. If these were from the Army Educational Corps, two intelligent educated men, teachers and lecturers in civilian life, could be obtained. They would be invaluable. One of them could be detached to remain in Sicily when ANGOT HQ moved forward.

The personnel under III (Captain) and IV (WO's) can be obtained now as I have been informed that 3 members of my late staff at Oxford volunteered to come to ANGOT and submitted their application to Southern Command shortly after I left that appointment. I do not think that the controller of Army Education will be obstructive.

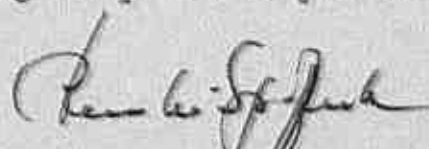
