SPECIAL ORDERS AND AUTHORIZATIONS FOR
OPENING AND FUNCTIONING OF SCHOOLS

Introduction. The following orders and authorizations have resulted from a conference of the Provveditori agli Studi of Sicily, and are considered by them necessary and desirable in order to open and conduct the schools successfully during the period of Military Government, except where these orders and authorizations negate, replace, or supplement existing Italian laws and regulations, all existing laws and regulations of the former Italian Government continue in full force. In general it is the policy of the Allied Military Government to avoid changes in the legal situation, the administrative organization, or the school program, except where such changes are necessary to eliminate Fascism or to make schools function in the absence of a regular ministry of Education of the Italian Government with jurisdiction over occupied territory in Italy.

In accordance with the above statement the following policies, authorizations, and orders are hereby issued and are immediately effective in all parts of Region 3.

1. TEACHERS

a. Teachers who were "vincitori" in the "concorsi" for the title of "ruolo B" in schools of the second grade, held in the spring of 1943, will, upon presentation of credentials from the Minister of Education, be given "ruolo" by the Provveditori agli Studi even though the official publication of the list of "vincitori" has not been received by the Provveditori,

b. Teachers "incaricati" employed for the school year 1943-44 will be paid for ten months, beginning December 1, 1943. Teachers employed for this school year and unable to do a full year's work because of unavailability of school buildings, will nevertheless receive ten months pay provided they have been employed by Provveditori agli Studi and taught more than half the school year.

c. The distinction between "grande sede" and "piccola sede" is suspended for the year 1943-44. Teachers may therefore be transferred from any city to any other city.

- d. When a teacher claims to have been excluded from a concorso because of anti-fascist sentiment, the Provveditore agli Studi to whom such teacher applies will proceed as follows:
- (1) He will appoint a small commission to hear the claim. This commission will report its findings to the Provveditore agli Studi as soon as possible.
 - (2) The above mentioned commission reports that the teacher was in fact deprived of the opportunity to take the concorso because of not being fascist, the Provveditore agli Studi will immediately appoint a commission to hold a concorso for this teacher and if the teacher is successful in the concorso he will be considered a "vincitore" of the last National Concours. All Provveditori agli Studi will recognize this status and those rights in making appointments and fixing salaries. A record of all such "ruoli" issued by Provveditori agli Studi must be sent promptly to the Chief of the Education Division of the region, through the Senior Civil Affairs Officer.
- e. Widows of members of the armed forces of Italy, if they have had three or more years of successful teaching experience will continue to have the right to a "ruolo" in the subject and grade for which they are qualified. Any Provveditore agli Studi to whom such a widow applies is authorized and directed as follows:
- (1) To investigate her claim, and if the claim is found to be valid, to issue a certificate of "ruolo" to the widow;
 - (2) To recognize such certificates issued by any Provveditore agli Studi and accord teachers holding them all rights and privileges of any teacher with "ruolo".
 - (3) To notify the Chief of the Education Division of the region, through the Senior Civil Affairs Officer, of the name, address and qualifications of each person to whom such a "ruolo" is issued.
- f. Provveditori agli Studi are authorized to assign to classes in the first year of the Scuola Magistrale Superiore, the Istituto Tecnico Superiore or the Istituto Scientifico Superiore any teacher having qualifications which would have authorized him to teach similar subjects in the fourth year of the corresponding inferior secondary schools. Such appointment will not, per se, in any way change the salary, status, or any of the rights or duties of the teachers concerned.
2. INSPETTORI AND SUPERINTENDENTS. The Provveditore agli Studi is authorized subject to the approval of the Senior Civil Affairs Officer and the Regional Chief of the Education Division, to appoint any person whom he considers to have the requisite ability and experience to fill

any vacancy as a School Director, Preside, or Inspector of secondary or elementary schools, even if that person has not passed the concours for such a position, provided, however, such appointments shall be temporary and shall terminate when the successful candidates of the next succeeding concourse for Directors, Presidi, or Inspectors, respectively, has been announced. Such officials shall be exempt from teaching duties and shall receive compensation equivalent to that of persons initially assuming the same office. Such compensation shall continue throughout the period of employment of these temporarily appointed officials.

3. ADMINISTRATIVE ORGANIZATION. Inferior secondary schools shall be as follows:

- a. (1) Scuola Magistrale Inferiore
(2) Istituto Tecnico Inferiore
(3) Istituto Scientifico Inferiore
(4) Ginnasio Inferiore
- b. Each of these four types of inferior secondary schools shall have courses of three years in accordance with laws in effect last year for the Scuola media Unica.
- c. Certificates of graduation from any of the four types of inferior secondary school will admit any student to any type of superior secondary school.
- d. Provveditori agli Studi are authorized to permit transfer at any time from one inferior secondary school to another, regardless of type of school, with the exception of the Scuola di avviamento Professionale.
- e. Fees for all four types of inferior secondary school (Magistrale Tecnica, Scientifica, and Ginnasio) shall be equal and shall be the same as those charged in 1942-3 for the Scuola media Unica.
- f. Superior secondary schools shall be as follows:
 - (1) Scuola Magistrale Superiore - four years
 - (2) Istituto Tecnico Superiore - five years
 - (3) Istituto Scientifico Superiore - five years
 - (4) Ginnasio Superiore - two years, and Liceo Classico - three years

- g. Fees for the superior secondary schools will be the same as in 1942-43. The exemptions provided in the regulations of 1942-3 will continue to be granted.
4. PROGRAMS. Programs for 1943-4 for all elementary and secondary schools shall be those prepared by commissions of Italian Teachers and school officials authorized by the Education Division of the Allied Military Government and Published by authority of said Education Division. Provveditore agli Studi will be responsible for the execution of this order.
5. When a Provveditore agli Studi finds that in a commune there are a number of children desiring secondary education; that no secondary school exists in that commune; and that there is no adequate transportation available to enable children to attend an existing secondary school in a neighboring commune, the Provveditore is authorized to arrange with a secondary school in another commune to establish classes "distaccate" in the commune which needs them.
6. TEXT BOOKS
- a. Elementary schools. Only those text books authorized by the Education Division of the Allied Military Government will be used in any public or private elementary school.
- b. In all secondary schools, public and private, the text books used will be those authorized by the allied military Government. Lists of text books approved and condemned have already been issued by the Division of Education of the allied Military Government. Books not included in these lists or the supplements thereto are to be treated under two categories as follows:
- (1) Text books in Greek, Latin, Mathematics, Physical Sciences, and purely technical books in the applied sciences and arts may be approved by the Provveditore agli Studi, subject to the approval of the Senior Civil Affairs Officer, provided that a list of such approved books must be sent by the Provveditore agli Studi, through the Senior Civil Affairs Officer, to the regional Chief of the Education Division with title, author, publisher and price of each.
- (2) The Provveditore agli Studi shall send to the regional Chief of the Education Division, through the Senior Civil Affairs Officer, a sample of each other book which he wishes to have approved for use in schools under his jurisdiction, and will use such books only after receiving, in writing, the approval of the regional Chief of the Education Division.

c. PRICE OF TEXT BOOKS

- (1) No text books published prior to 1944 shall be sold or bought for a price in excess of seventy percent (70%) above the price indicated on the cover.
- (2) Text books published after December 31, 1943, shall not be sold or bought at a price above the retail price listed at the time of publication and printed thereon.
- d. NEW TEXT BOOKS. No text books shall be published except as authorized in writing by the Education Division of the Allied Military Government.

PRESA DI POSSESSO. Le soggiorni nelle scuole e le riunioni relative alle plenarie di funzionamento delle scuole sono state concordate al concordo con i provvedimenti detti studi in apposita riunione.

La manutenzione non contemplata nelle presenti disposizioni sarà regolata dalle leggi e dai regolamenti in vigore del cessato Governo Italiano.

Per quanto concerne la regolizzazione amministrativa e l'ordinamento didattico delle scuole, nell'ambito di un ministero resolare dell'Istruzione Nazionale con giurisdizione sul territorio occupato in Italia, e l'intendimento del Governo Militare Alleato di non modificare le legislazioni italiane, quando ciò non sia strettamente necessario al fine di ottimizzare il fascino e non sia richiesto dalla necessità per il funzionamento delle scuole.

Nello spirito di tale distinzione, le norme e istruzione decretate al presente Regolamento entrano immediatamente in vigore per le scuole delle regione.

II. INSEGNANTI.

- Gli insegnanti "vincitori" del concorso svolto nel primo mese del 1943, per caporedire di ruolo B delle scuole di seconda Grado, saranno nominati "di ruolo" dal Provveditore degli Studi competente, previa presentazione da parte degli interessati, delle partecipazioni di nomine avute del cessato Ministro della Duzione Nazionale e ciò, anche se non sia pervenuta, ai RR. Provveditori agli studi interessati, la pubblicazione ufficiale delle relative graduatorie.
- Gli insegnanti "vincitori" per il corrente anno scolastico serviranno per dieci mesi, a par tempo del disocene 1943. Avranno diritto alle retribuzioni, sempre non inferiori a quelli "incaricati" che per-

dimento d'istruzione nazionale con giurisdizione sul territorio occupato dall'Alleanza Alleata di non modificherà, intendimento del Governo militare Alleato di non modificare la legislazione italiana, quando sia' non sia strettamente necessario al fine di eliminare il fascino e non alle richieste delle necessità, per il funzionamento della scuola.

Nello spirito di tale dichiarazione, le norme e istruzioni secretate al presente regolamento entrano immediatamente in vigore per le scuole della regione.

- a. Gli insegnanti "vincitori" del concorso, svolto nel primo mese del 1943, per capotredre di ruolo 3 delle scuole di secondo grado, saranno nominati "ai ruoli" dal R. Provveditore degli Studi competente, previa presentazione da parte degli interessati, delle partecipazioni di nome avute dal cossato Ministro dell'Istruzione Nazionale e cioè, anche se non sia pervenuto, al R. Provveditore degli studi interessati, la pubblicazione ufficiale delle relative graduatorie.
- b. Gli insegnanti "incaricati" per il corrente anno scolastico saranno retribuiti, per dieci mesi, a pr tempo dal 19 dicembre 1943. Avranno diritto alla retribuzione, sempre per dieci mesi, anche quelli "incaricati" che per il corrente anno scolastico, non dovranno compiere per l'intero l'anno di insegnamento, per mancanza di locali, una condizione che siano etati, impiegati a prestare servizio presso il Provveditore degli studi ed abbiano insegnato per un periodo di tempo superiore all' metà, dell'anno scolastico.

SUBJECT: Official Orders.

SUBJECT: Division of Fine Arts and Education
TO : Commanding Officer, EQ, Region 3, AMG

1. The head of the Section of Education and Fine Arts reported to Headquarters, Region 3, AMG on 19 October 1943 coming from the Island of Ischia where he had been temporary C.A.C.

* * * * *

6. All schools and the University were found closed. The following steps were taken toward the future reopening of schools:

(a) Requests were sent to SCAO's asking them to furnish detailed information on the physical condition of all schools in their areas on the extent to which they can be repaired and whether or not occupied by troops or refugees.

(b) Letter was written to AMG Headquarters, Sicily, asking for latest information on steps necessary for the reopening of schools.

(c) Numerous conferences were held with the Provveditore agli Studi and his assistant of Naples Province with reference to the reopening of schools, the instructional staff's and existing text-books.

(d) Some fifteen text-books were requested from the Provveditore agli Studi for examination to determine how much Fascist doctrine they contained.

(e) Due to the shortage of school buildings because of damage and occupation, the question of holding eventual classes in shifts has been considered, and because of the lack of text-books, the teaching of some classes orally has been discussed.

(f) Permission was granted to elementary and secondary schools and to the University of Naples to hold necessary preliminary examinations as soon as possible.

103.

(g) Permission was given to elementary rural schools to open if buildings and instructors were available, provided all courses could be taught orally.

(h) Instructions were given for all private schools desiring to reopen to furnish complete details in writing in order that they might be considered individually.

(i) Permission was granted for purely religious schools to reopen if building permitted.

(j) The date of 1 January 1944 has been set as a goal for the reopening of elementary and secondary schools.

7. Several projects for seasons of opera, symphonic concerts and other musical entertainment have been investigated and approval if theaters are available (because of their cultural and moral benefits).

8. The following recommendations are made:

(a) That the head of the Section of Education and Fine Arts arrive in any occupied area at the earliest possible moment.

(b) That due to the difficulties outlined in paragraph 4, it would seem that in the future occupation of any city like Naples, it is of urgent necessity that a close liaison exist between the authorities requisitioning buildings for the quartering of troops and the head of the Section of Fine Arts, and that a list of historical monuments which cannot be requisitioned be compiled for their guidance,

(c) That because of the divergence of the subjects of Education and Fine Arts, that this section be divided and a head provided for each department.

(d) That SCACO's be provided with an officer who can devote his entire time to the duties of securing the needed information for the head of the Section of Education.

1. Paper:

- a. Get release from PWB (Capt. Piscop) of paper for finishing the printing of school programs - 12,000 copies of Part 2, Elementary; 3000 copies of Lower Secondary; and 1000 copies of Upper Secondary programs. (See sample attached)
- b. Locating book paper. Attached memo shows amount, size, and quality. Substitute where necessary. Capt. Jordan Piscop, PWB, has blocked all paper, but has agreed to release that needed for the text books. His office has inventory of all paper stocks. He will assign a man in his office to go over the inventory with Rafaello Albano, who is being assigned to you by G.Pandolfi (Via Antonio Siccone, 15 - Residence, Pinzzo Leonardo, 4, Volmero, Naples Apt.9). Through the inventory, locate the deposite you want, then accompany Albano to the actual places and get paper counted out and wrapped ready to be called for. It may be necessary to get PWB to order stores opened for this purpose, and to go find proprietors in their homes and take them to the stores.
- c. Shipment of paper. Through AMG Transport Officer (Capt. Shove) or through the Camp Commandant (Lt.Col.Richards) get trucks to pick up paper and deliver to port. Get exact directions as to place for delivery from Maj. K.H.Pinnis, Fr Freight Transport Office, FBS, or his sergeant. Notify the sergeant of two changes in the order form I left there. (1°) I miscalculated the weight - check with Piscop and see if it should not be 50 tons instead of 5 tons and make the corresponding correction (It is 500 quintals - how many tons is that?) (2°) Change consignee: I made it Hq AMG Palermo; it should be Sicily Region, AMG, Palermo, Attention Major G.R.Koopman, Director of Education, phone 15697, ext.32, at present but possibly by the time the paper gets there he may have moved to 15555 or to 17115.
- d. Finance. (1) Present plan: Paper will be shipped to AMG, Sicily Region for storage and distribution to printers. Printers will pay for paper as they withdraw it, remitting in "circular check" on Bank of Italy. This will be forwarded by AMG Sicily to AMG Hq Naples, which in turn will pay it to vendor. (2) If objection is raised to the present plan (due to war risk involved in ~~and~~ payment) contact Civilian Supply, HqAMG (or ADC) and get them to buy the paper outright here, ship as in 1c above, and get reimbursement as Region 1-Sicily releases paper to printers. (No contacts have been made regarding this alternative).

- e. Price of paper: Paper should not cost more than 18 lire per kilo; but be guided in setting a maximum price by Capt. Piscop. WIRE me if possible as soon as price is set and paper located - ad ress HAGEN, Education Adviser. If seller holds out for too high a price, threaten requisition; I'm not sure you can carry out your threat, but try to if necessary.
- f. Possible additional source of paper: Randolfi tells me that when armistice was signed many carloads of paper were in transit. He suggests that inquiries be made of the appropriate railroad official in Naples; Bari; Taranto; and Reggio Calabria to see if they have any cars of paper on their sidings. This is a good hunch for Piscop to follow through even if you find the paper you need. We'll need a lot more ourselves for books in Regions 3 and 4.

2; Offices.

- a. Location. Try British Council Institute. If impossible to obtain in spite of fact that lease was property of British Foreign Office which asked Col. Gayre to take it over, see Lt. Col. Richards about space. Get space sufficient for at least four officers and four clerks - a suite of two or more rooms.
- b. Furniture. Get desks and chairs for above personnel and extra chairs and table. Typewriter and typewriter table and chair. Filing cabinet; waste basket; electric heater; window glass. Get telephone connected - preferably two.
- c. If possible get car assigned to division - two desired - with drivers.
- d. Employ or get army personnel as follows:
 - 1 good interpreter (see Geyer)
 - 1 able typist who knows English as well as Italian - or at least well enough to read illegible English manuscript on and to speak English well (Geyer has a few leads).
 - 1 file clerk and office assistant
 - 1 receptionist with enough personality and intelligence to sift out callers and handle minor problems.
- e. Try to find a good billet for Gayre and Major Sherwood, if possible with facilities for a mess of about six persons. If necessary we would pay rent to get a good place, but naturally prefer a place rent-free if equally good. If successful in finding a suitable billet-mess, take steps toward engaging a GOOD cook. If satisfactory billets ~~are~~ found; get good temporary billet for me; first, as I'll be here about Dec. 29, and then for Sherwood and Gayre, who will probably come between Jan. 5 and Jan. 15

Upon arrival at this Hq. on 3 December, I was asked by the then C of S, Col. Ashley, to report immediately to Major Gardner for duty. This I did and discovered that Major Gardner had not only done a good deal of the spade work towards getting the schools in operation but also had a good insight into the several educational problems of the region. Major Gardner requested me to take over the educational problems of his office here-tofore handled by him. In connection with this he made available to me the services of an American sergeant (Sgt. Mathes) who had been designated to assist Major Gardner with educational problems. Sgt. Mathes has had several years teaching experience, a Master's Degree from Harvard, and a command of the Italian language. With this background and with the training he received from Major Gardner, Sgt. Mathes has been of great help to me.

This the only region, operating or contemplated, in which education and fine arts operate as one section. From the outset this situation has proved a disadvantage, notwithstanding the fine cooperation of Major Gardner and the help he has been able and willing to extend to me on several problems. The small office which Major Gardner and I occupy together with two sergeants, was formerly a bathroom, and is totally incapable of handling the staff necessary for an efficient operation. In addition, the fact that education is not regarded as a separate division makes it impossible for me to get permanent transportation and other services necessary for a real attack upon the educational problems of the region. Due to the change in the top-side command of Region 3, a change which was in progress before my arrival and just now effected, I was advised that it would be inappropriate for Major Gardner and me to make any recommendations for a division of the office into two separate divisions. I am hoping that it will shortly be possible to effect this.

On the positive side, I can report that my two weeks in Naples have been intensely busy and interesting. We keep the same long hours as you in Palermo and there is considerable traffic moving in and out of our "bathroom." Of this activity the highlights are as follows:

a. Prof. Camarosano, R. Prov. Agli Studi of Naples' Province, has been removed from office because of alleged fascist activities and replaced by F. Scaglione, a recommendation of Cuomo and of local pressure groups. This action was initiated by the front office here before my arrival and just recently effected. In the other two Provinces of Region 3 (Avellino and Benevento) the old Provveditori have been confirmed and the decision seems wise in each instance.

b. Three times weekly (oftener if necessary) the Provveditore of Naples' Province and his assistant come to our office for a


conference. In the last ten days we have called in for conference the Provveditore, Ispettore Capo, and Segretario Capo of Avellino and Benevento Provinces and have discussed with them the problems attendant upon the opening of schools. In both Avellino and Benevento Provinces it seems certain that schools facilities for about 90% of the children can be provided on January 1, the date set for the opening of schools in this region. In Naples Province the situation is not so fortunate because of the great concentration of troops here and the continuing influx of additional units. Major Gardner has been putting up a tremendous fight on the requisitioning problem - but the situation seems almost certain to remain serious for some time to come. Meanwhile, we are encouraging the Naples officials to take all steps possible to improvise facilities in order that the children may be removed from the streets and get back to some sort of school.

c. The office has received a considerable number of requests from private schools and these have been facilitated. I, personally, am examining the Schede of all personnel, thanks to the tutelage of Major Raffs.

d. I have made contact with the University of Naples and have located several individuals there and elsewhere for you to consider as possible assistants.

e. In regard to your several requests to act for you HQ., I have accomplished little except as mentioned above in (d). There has been no time to get out and around, what with my lack of transportation, and for other reasons which Major Washburne understands.

f. With the stabilization of existing confusion that seems likely to result from Col. Kraege's assumption of command I feel certain that the time is near when the educational office will be able to function on a higher level of efficiency. We need, as suggested in the foregoing, a separate office with sufficient space for a second officer (?) and at least two assistants, and we need sufficient status, as a working division, to command the necessary auxiliary services without having to beg them from some other division.


