SUBJECT: Strength of Education Sub-Commission.

TO : The Administrative Director.

Lord STANS_GATE,

1. General MACFARLANE's order transferring Major T.G. BERGIN from Education to Public Relations leaves a functional gap in Education which requires repair as soon as possible. Major BERGIN was Director of Universities and Cultural Societies.

2. Since Education is overstrength American, it is suggested that Major BERGIN be replaced by a British officer with as high rank as possible whose special qualifications are in the field of the Higher Learning rather than in the secondary school field.

3. Major BERGIN's loss represents much more than a functional displacement. He was a cultural catalyst of a rare order. His loss presents, therefore, proper occasion for pressing to get, if possible, civilian educators (not charged against our ceiling), educators of such eminence as to honor and inspire Italy.

4. Such men are intended, for instance, on the British side as Sir Gilbert Murray or Professor Lindsay, Master of Balliol.

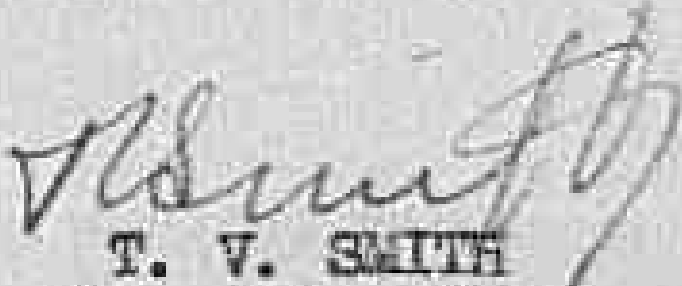
5. On the American side a more specific recommendation can be given, as a "trial balloon":

(1) CHARLES E. MERRIAM. Emeritus Professor of Political Science, University of Chicago; Vice-Chairman, National Resources Committee; one of the three men commissioned by President ROOSEVELT to recommend Reorganization of the United States Government; member Herbert Hoover on Social Change; President, Spellman Fund (Rockefeller endowment for Social Sciences); Former Alderman, Chicago City Council. Mr. Merriam is author of many books and particularly of an encyclopaedic survey of Education in the Western World, a volume to each great country with an evaluative volume at the end written by Merriam himself. This work with his wide political and educational experience constitutes him probably the wisest Elder Statesman on Education in the United States. Moreover, he is at home in Italy having been assigned here to bolster Italian morale during dark days of the First World War. While he is about 67 years old, he is entirely active and might well be available for service. He knows the Catholic Church well and respects it as the mighty influence it is. He is an adviser of men of power and learning whose own spiritual home has been the

universities of many lands (his doctorate is from Germany). His services would be invaluable in the Higher Learning in Italy, and his presence would itself be a symbol of the potentiality we recognize and work to free in Italy.

6. If the way for civilian aid to education could be opened by such eminent names as Murray and Merriman, there is available an imposing list of eminent civilian talent from the States and an equally imposing list could be gathered from the United Kingdom.
