Schools in Sicily.

TO : His Excellency, the

Your Excellency:

On 6 November, 1943, Lt.Col. GAYRE, Education Adviser for AMG, wrote to the Archbishop of Mazara del Vallo stating that Church Schools would not be under the Provveditore agli Studi, but that he hoped a joint committee representing the provveditori and the Church authorities could be formed to regulate programs and examinations for Church Schools. This, he stated, would result in giving to Church school certificates the same validity as those of other schools.

The aforesaid letter was an attempt, in the absence of a Ministry of Education and any Italian Government organization to supervise Church schools, to prevent students from losing a year of schooling, and to encourage schools to open.

It was later agreed, between Lt.Col. SMITH, Director of Education, and the Minister of Public Instruction, that Lt.Col. GAYRE's letter should be considered as binding insofar as recognition of work done in 1943-44 was concerned, but that for the school year 1944-45 and thereafter the matter was one for decision by the Minister.

It is the policy of the Education Subcommission and of the Allied Commission to consider actions taken under Military Government as provisional, not permanent, and to give the Italian Government a free hand in Italian Government Territory to the fullest extent compatible with the war effort. In no sense, therefore, should Lt.Col. GAYRE's letter be considered as in anyway limiting the Italian Government's freedom of action in regard to the present or future control and recognition of Church schools.



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



In a recent conference with H.R. De Ruggero, Ministero of Public Instruction, it was decided to abandon the compulsory use of the revised Libri di Stato in the elementary public schools from Florence on to the North. They will continue to be printed and sold wherever there is a demand for them but they will have to compete with texts privately produced on the open market. This decision was motivated by the desire to return to the Pre Fascist traditions of liberal education and to develop private initiative and enterprise in the composition and publication of school texts.

The rights of the Church regarding the religious texts was of course discussed in connection with this new plan. As you know, there have been religious sections in the revised Libri di Stato which have been in compulsory use up till now and a way must be found so that religious texts will continue to be used when the use of the Libri di Stato ceases to be compulsory. In order that this Subcommission may be informed of the most suitable manner whereby this purpose may be achieved, I beg you to designate a representative with whom I may confer.

I wish to give you at the present time my personal assurance that all the rights of the Church will be safeguarded and its wishes respected in ANC Territory. The Minister of Public Instruction has promised to approach the Church on the same matter; for although the territory in which the new plan will be realized will be at first under our complete jurisdiction, it will pass in time under the jurisdiction of the Italian Government and we wish the transition to entail the slightest possible changes.

As I do not intend to implement our plan until the matter of religious texts is settled to the complete satisfaction of the Church, I would greatly appreciate the prompt designation of your representative.

I recall with great pleasure our recent meeting.

1. This office has received an appeal from the Mother Superior of the Istituto Sacro Cuore, Naples, for assistance to rebuild a part of the school. They have appealed to the Mother General at Rome for aid but have been told that there are no funds available.
2. It has been my observation during personal visits in this region that the schools conducted by the various Catholic Orders rate high in most particulars and should, therefore, be encouraged, if possible.
3. I have discussed this matter with the former Regional Education Officer of Region One and we are in agreement that this a matter which should be handled on a national scale rather than on a regional basis. Perhaps it would be possible for the Mother General at Rome to arrange for a loan to cover all such cases through the Education Subcommission.
4. This office would appreciate any information on this subject as to policy or procedure.

TO : The Minister of National Education.

1. Your Excellency asks me to comment upon certain letters written by my predecessor, Colonel GAYRE, to S. Ecc.za il Vescovo di Mazara del Vallo during the days of Allied Military Government in Sicily. Whatever specific grant of authority was intended in these letters, the authorization was not unrelated to an expressed expectation and an obvious realization.

2. The expressed expectation was that full collaboration would be achieved between the Archbishop and the provincial Provveditore agli Studi. This expectation has not been fulfilled.

3. The realization was that Allied Military Government was only substituting for an Italian sovereignty. We could not have made, if we would, a provincial accommodation into a national policy; and we would not have made, if we could, a temporary grant of collaborative power into a right of permanent autonomy.

4. The logic of events has, meantime, superseded both hermeneutics and dialectics. A broadly based Italian Government has already come into being and is now in energetic possession of educational initiative which at the time of the letters we possessed in Sicily.

5. This early and proper eventuation in the domain of sovereignty should carry with it responsible freedom for the government to determine its own educational policy, subject to due respect for preexisting rights. It is felt that if the work of the schools authorized by Colonel GAYRE's aforementioned letters be fully recognized for the present academic year, 1943-44, with all rights of the students safeguarded, the determination of a permanent policy toward such schools may be properly left as a part of the government's larger effort to find a fruitful policy with reference to the entire educational enterprise of a reviving Italy.

6. It is to be hoped that a policy may be found which if not wholly satisfactory to all parties will not be too unsatisfactory to any.

1. Complying with the wish expressed by the Bishop's Court of Mazzara del Vallo, I send you a copy of the report drawn on 16 February 1944 by the Consultive Commission for the Church-Schools. Col. Gayre, in his letter speaks only of equipollence of certificates of studies. According to the report it could appear, on the contrary, that the equipollence concerns certificates and titles of studies of Church-Schools and that the pupils of such schools may obtain the passage to State-schools.

This Office attaches a great importance to the fact that it is not this the sense which is to be drawn from the text of above said report and of transcribed letter. No Allied Military Government's disposition has been issued either to modify or abrogate the law of 9 May 1942 No 86, also because many of the pupils who frequent Church-Schools are unprovided of the titles of promotion or admission prescribed by dispositions now in force.

This Office believes that either by facts nor by law any equipollence of studies and examinations is to be drawn from the report attached and that while expecting the dispositions requested to the Education Ministry, no renewal must be made to the dispositions now in force.

However during this school-year this office has granted some pupils of Church-schools the passage to the correspondent class of State-schools, conforming with Art.131 of Royal Decree 4-5-1925 No.65 on condition that he be provided of the title of promotion, ~~abilitato~~ and access for the frequency of the class to which he was to ~~accedere~~.



5. These reports are summarized.

- a: That Education Subcommission has endeavoured to pursue a policy of scrupulous fairness to the Catholic Church and has approved by eminent Church authorities on the ground, including Cardinal L. Vitrano of Palermo, the Archbishop Ballo of Messina del Valle, Father Giacomo of the Society of Jesus, and Cardinal Ascalesi of Naples (a single incident in Sicily which disturbed certain church authorities was settled to their own satisfaction.)
- b. That this policy was accepted and has been and is being furthered by British and American officers with identity of viewpoint as touching the educational rights of the Church in a predominantly Catholic country, and with common determination to observe these rights defined by the prevailing treaty and concordat.
- c. That the change of education leadership from Lt. Col. Gayre (B) to Lt. Col. T.V. Smith (A) has not changed the policy or the direction of effort accepted by both and furthered by them both in entire accord.
- 14d. That there is no justification for discrimination between the policies of American and British education officers and that there is no ground for apprehension regarding our policy toward the Church in Italian education under Allied Military Government. I regard the insinuations that the policy of one of my Subcommissions is affected by the nationality of its Chief or members with regret and resentment. All responsible members of the A.C.C. work together as an Allied Team. That is their task and that is what they strive to do.

SUBJECT : Conference with Bishop Carroll and Mr. Mohler.

TO : Regional Commissioner.

1. In reviewing church-state relations shortly before he left, Lt. Col. Charles Poletti, then RAO, asked me to put in written form for our files a report on my conference with Bishop Carroll and Mr. Mohler. I am complying with this request with apologies for my tardiness.

2. The Bishop was introduced to me as a representative of the Vatican. Mr. Mohler was introduced as secretary of the American Bishop's Welfare Conference. The latter took no part in the conference apart from the usual friendly interchanges at the beginning.

Since these two functionaries called on me at the behest of the RAO and at the time when the Head of the Subcommission was visiting the Region, I arranged to show them every courtesy and to have Lt. Col. Gavre in the conference. After the usual pleasantries Bishop Carroll opened the discussion of church affairs by stating that he believed that ANG was "attempting to set up an anti-fascist government". This puzzled us both but he elicited by objecting to the appointment of Onofeo as Rettore at Napoli (which appointment was not made by Lt. Col. Gavre) and other liberal sounding activities. The Bishop stated that (a) no non-catholic should be appointed to a public office such as the Napoli post and (b) that there were no educational affairs in which the Church should not be consulted.

Later the matter of replacements of faculty members at University professors of permanent status. At this point the Bishop interjected "and replaced them with Communists." He also mentioned several names of supposed communists which included two of the best-known socialists in Palermo. One of these persons, Ferretti, had not been appointed by ANG. One of these persons, Ferretti, had not been appointed by ANG." The Bishop also discussed the matter of programs of study proposed by ANG. He objected to anticlerical influences. We explained our policy of neutrality as evidenced by the fact that we withdrew Part II of the program of the elementary school, because it was susceptible to an ant-clerical interpretation. The Bishop then indicated that we should recognize that for all of us, the next enemy would be Communism.

Personally, I took no part in the first half of the discussion. I interposed an objection at the point when he stated that a non-catholic should not hold public office by pointing out that the reservation of freedom of religion was a mandate to ANG.

The blatant statement about Communism prompted me to state to the Bishop that he was proposing a policy contrary to the achievement of our main objective-a lasting peace. I also pointed out that his accusation should not hold public office by pointing out that the reservation of freedom of religion was a mandate to ANG.

My interpretation of the conference is as follows: to the extent that Bishop Carroll was representing his higher authority (a matter open to question) we can conclude that the Church is seeking political cover utterly regardless of its effect on world peace. The position taken was the most dangerous threat to our policies that I have encountered in military government since it was entirely contrary in every respect to the principles of democracy.

SUBJECT: Education and the Catholic Church.

TO : A.P.H.Q. Military Government Section.

1. Reference is made to your letters MSG 250 dated 19th and 21st February 1944.

2. A comprehensive report on the activities of the Educational Division and Sub-Commission from September 1943 to February 1944 is attached. This contains the list of personnel requested. Lt. Colonel T.V. SMITH has now assumed the direction in succession to Lt. Colonel G.H. GAYRE.

3. Copies of Plans of Study for teachers are also attached. These have been fully discussed before publication, with representatives of the Church and are in conformity with their recommendations.

4. Touching the specific points raised in your letter of 19 February:

a. Religious teaching in schools continues unchanged. The only teaching reforms which have been made in material are those involving the elimination of fascism.

b. New text books are in conformity with Catholic principles. It was found unnecessary to change, add to or subtract from any of the religious teaching contained in the old books. Books are being forwarded to you on publication, in accordance with your previous request.

c. Without the aid of a complete survey of the religious principles of teachers, a formidable task which has not been undertaken, the attitude of teachers to the Church or to religion in general cannot be stated with any accuracy. However, the proportion of teachers replaced is small, and therefore the general body of teachers may be assumed to hold the same religious beliefs as they did before the Allied Occupation.

5. The points in your letter of 21st February are answered below:

a. The curricula remain essentially unaltered. The teaching of fascism has been prohibited, and from the text books have been excised such things as the glorification of fascism and Mussolini, references to Alcyonaria and the Empire generally, the glorification of war, and similar items essentially of fascist teaching.

b. No courses have been eliminated in the schools. In the universities the three chairs of Diritto Corporativo, Storia e Dottrina del Fascismo and Cultura Militare have been abolished.

c. No new courses have been instituted in the schools. In the Universities the Faculty of Letters at Messina University, which was abolished in 1924 has been re-instituted, and an Institute of Social Anthropology, attached to the Faculty of Letters has been created at Palermo University.

g. No modification has been ordered or suggested in religious courses.

g. The local educational committees, many of which include priests, have worked closely in all educational matters with the Allied Officials engaged in the work.

6. It would seem that the apparent unseasiness of the Apostolic Delegate and the Holy See are the result of inaccurate information, and it may be apposite to record that the warmest expressions of approval of the work of the educational officers of this organization have frequently been made by such people as Cardinal Levitano of Palermo, the Arch-bishop Bello of Nasara del Valle, who is especially concerned with education in his arch-diocese; Father Alfonso of the Society of Jesus, who is the head of an important school in Palermo, and whose advice was constantly used in the preparation of Plans of Study; and Cardinal Arcivescovi of Naples.

1.- Acknowledgements are hereby made and thanks recorded for your report (dated 29 February 1944) as to the previous policy of this subcommission in regard to religion in the Italian schools and as to its method of liquidating administrative incidents.

2.- There can be no just perturbation on the part of this Subcommission as to the course which concluded the incident in Sicily to which reference is made. Your own attitude and the official action of the subcommission has been so manifestly correct that the record may well be allowed to speak as it has spoken, the final word; and your present is now become our continuing policy.

3.- It is not as though our educational effort had started, could start, *de novo* with either State or Church. We found a State defeated but a Church triumphant in the schools through a Treaty and Concordat Concluded with that now defeated state. To extirpate the doctrines of the State from the Schools but to respect the privileged position of the Church in the schools was the indication of our double duty. In a situation so ambiguous it is providential that we did not make serious mistakes. It was hardly ours to presume upon matters of the highest international Policy. In this premise we were soldiers, not philosophers; and in this practice administrators, not evaluators. As judgmental success was beyond our power, so error of judgment is outside our deserts. In operation we were not even privileged to remark the narrowing of religious essence to what in all three of our great allied lands (not to mention China as the fourth) would by a

great majority of our citizens be regarded as doctrinaire rather than sacrosanct and what would in the United States at least would offend both the deepest constitutional credo, that of separation of church and state, and the highest moral credo, that of toleration as between utter equals of all competing theological creeds.

4.- If defence be needed for your, our, course, it could hardly be defence against censure from responsible Catholic sources; for, to repeat we have accorded maximum deference to all but the maximum monopoly accorded Catholicism by fascism. (We even went beyond the Lateran Treaty and the Concordat in the matter of permitting the opening new church schools in Sicily). Our right flank is thus secure from attack by the Right. It has the momentary safety of surrender to the Catholic-Fascist Pact and Concordat of 1929. It is our left flank which is in dialectical peril, and all the more so because our Center was fixed by historic accident rather than by original judgment. If, however, the Italian people were present to will into being a spiritual force pressing upon education from as far to our British-American Left as the present spiritual pressure is to our Right, let our defence be ready, and be indeed the same demurser of correctness as now; that in Italy we were soldiers obeying orders, leaving politics to statesmen and religion to God.

1.- Queries coming to you from Washington and the Vatican indicate a misapprehension as to fact and a misunderstanding as to the policy and attitude of the Education Subcommission in regard to religious education in the schools. Since the origin of the distorted rumors was, in all probability, an episode in Sicily with which I was directly concerned, and which took place when you were not there, I am presenting herein a full statement of the facts of the case.

2.- When I came to Sicily early in October, 1943, Lt. Col. Gayre, then Adviser in Education for A.I.C.C., asked me to take charge of the preparation of courses of study and instructions to teachers (known here as "programs") for the elementary and secondary schools, and the examination and revision of the text books.

We agreed that this work should be done by competent Italians under our supervision, that it should be confined largely to the elimination of fascism and anti-Ally propaganda, and that no changes would be made in regard to religious instructions.

3.- A Commission in Palermo had already been appointed by Lt. Col. Poletti on Col. Gayre's recommendation to advise on educational matters. Lt. Col. Gayre made some slight additions to this commission and we used it as a commission for the preparation of the new "Programs" for all occupied Italy. The Provveditore agli Studi in Palermo was chairman, the Cardinal had one or two representatives on the commission; the Chief Inspector of Elementary Schools was a member; the other members were, for the most part, professors of the various secondary school subjects. This Commission was asked to go through last year's "programs" and to revise them so as to eliminate fascism and propaganda against the Allies. It was also suggested that they might make

some improvements. The Commission met frequently and produced the series of programs which we have published and distributed to teachers throughout occupied Italy.

4.- The Commission was so predominantly composed of people in the field of secondary education that a special subcommittee was organized to work on the elementary program. This was headed by the Chief Inspector of Elementary Schools, and included two elementary school Directors and a class room teacher, all selected by him. This subcommittee prepared the basic elementary school program which has been published and distributed.

5.- From the beginning, however, it was evident that on neither the Commission as a whole nor the elementary subcommittee was there anyone familiar with modern psychology and pedagogy. It seemed undesirable not to give to teachers, particularly in the elementary school, an opportunity to move forward a little in the direction of a democratic and modern type of education; yet the Commission's programs were rigid, over-academic and compulsory and would prevent any teacher or school from using modern psychology in his work.

It was, therefore, decided, while the Commission was still at work, to try to add some element of democratic and scientific thinking to the Commission.

The one man in Palermo who was expert in this field was Dr. Gino Feretti, the Professor of Pedagogy and Psychology in the University of Palermo. He was a man of such eminent scholarship that, despite his anti-fascism, he had been kept in his post through the fascist regime. With the consent of the chairman of the Commission he was retained as a consultant.

6.- Feretti's ideas clashed so violently with those of other members of the Commission that it proved impractical to have him continue to meet with them. It was therefore suggested that he write a supplementary pamphlet on "Advice for Modernizing the Elementary School". The minutes of the commission show that this proposal was heartily endorsed.

7.- Feretti, being notoriously anticlerical, was instructed to write nothing about religion in his pamphlet, but to deal exclusively with the pedagogy and psychology of a modern school program.

8.- Feretti's pamphlet was published separately, as planned, but distributed to Provveditori throughout Sicily for redistribution to all elementary teachers with the basic programs prepared by the Commission and Subcommittee.

9.- A representative of the Cardinal, on reading Feretti's pamphlet felt that it was anti-religious in tone; that when Feretti spoke of the knowledge of science as doing away with superstition it was a covert attack on the Church; and so on. He and his associates made a violent protest to Lt.Col.Gayre against the pamphlet being distributed under our auspices.

10.- In the Program for the lower secondary schools the word "facoltativa" (elective) was printed after the caption "Religion". This was because, according to the Lateran Pact and common practice, any student could absent himself from religious instruction on request of his parents.

The Cardinal's representative, however, feared that "facoltativa" might be interpreted as meaning that it was elective on the part of the school as to whether Religion should be offered at all. He was much perturbed .

11.- General Mc Sherry had sent me up to the peninsula to take the first steps toward opening schools in all occupied territory, shortly before these protests were made. Lt.Col.Gayre, therefore, asked the Cardinal's representatives to wait till my return for a decision on what to do and meanwhile agreed to stop further distribution of the programs concerned in Sicily and to stop the printing of them in other regions. He immediately carried out his agreement. I assume, however, that it was in the interim between that conference and my return a few days later that protests went to Washington and the Vatican.

12.- On my return we held two conference with the Cardinal's representatives. The decision, in which they fully concurred, was as follows:

- a) Feretti's pamphlet would be withdrawn from circulation insofar as undistributed copies remained in the hands of Provveditori agli Studi. All agreed that a demand on each teacher to give back the copy he might have would give undue emphasis to the pamphlet.

The pamphlet would not be published in other regions.

- b) A notice would be sent to all Provveditori agli Studi calling their attention to the fact that the Lateran Pact must be complied with and religious education offered in all schools.

- c) Printings of the program for the lower secondary schools in other regions would avoid the use of the word "facoltativa" in relation to religious instruction.

These agreements were promptly put into effect.

13.- The whole matter closed amicably, with agreement on everyone's part, and the incident was considered closed.

14.- In Naples a new Commission was formed to write a pamphlet on "Advice for Modernizing the Elementary School". On this we were careful to invite the Cardinal's Secretary to sit. He himself wrote the part on religious education, which was given the first place in the program; and he passed on every detail of the remaining parts. He expressed warm appreciation of our cooperation. The new pamphlet has just now been published in this region and sent to other regions for reprinting and distribution.

15.- An examination of all programs will show that religious education, in accordance with the provisions of the Lateran Pact and the courses worked out by the Catholic Church, has been included, from the beginning, in the programs of all schools.

16.- The religious education in the text books has not been changed at all. The new series reprints this part of the old series exactly as it was last year. Unfortunately it has been impossible to reproduce many of the illustrations, lack of original photographs and plates and other prime materials having necessitated the elimination of half-tones from all parts of the books. But the typed material remains intact.

17.- It has been the policy of the Education Subcommission from the beginning to keep hands off on all matters of religious education, to maintain the status quo ante, and to work as harmoniously and cooperatively as possible with the Church.

Except for the momentary episode described herein, our relations with Church officials have been entirely friendly and cordial. Even in this episode, personal relations were friendly and cooperative on both sides.

1. Reference is made to this Section letter of 19 February calling for a report for Washington following inquiries raised with the State Department by the Apostolic Delegate.

2. In addition to the cable which formed the background for the above letter, a further cable has now been received from General Willdring on the general subject of the Educational system in Sicily and Southern Italy. This cable states that the State Department now request a comprehensive report on the developments in the educational field under AMG in Sicily and Southern Italy since our occupation of these areas.

The cable states that in addition to any general information and the specific data already requested (which was summarized in this Section letter of 19 Feb.) the State Department is particularly interested in knowing:

- a) To what extent it has been necessary to ~~raise~~ the curricula in order to eliminate Fascist teachings and characteristics.
- b) What courses it has been necessary to eliminate altogether.
- c) What course, if any, have been introduced.
- d) What modification, if any, has occurred in religious courses.
- e) To what extent the advice of the local educational committee has been followed in establishing new curricula for the schools.

3. It is emphasised that all the above requested information is to relate to the elementary, secondary and higher educational institutions. It is further stated that changes in such personnel from time to time should also be furnished as they occur.

4. In the light of the above, will you please prepare the comprehensive report now called for and indicate by cable when it can be expected to be ready.

The Bishop of Mazara last week sent his representative to the Provveditore Agli Studi of Trapani for a conference regarding a letter he produced from Lt. Col. Gates, A.A.G., dated 6 November 1943. A copy of the minutes of their conference is herewith attached for your consideration.

I am advised by Sig. Genna, the Prefect's confidential advisor, that this letter seems to have been written without a full knowledge of the Italian school law, and that the Provveditore Agli Studi is under some embarrassment by its being in the hands of the Bishop. I had never received a copy of this letter and hence knew nothing of the controversy. However I am in sympathy with supporting the regular school authorities to the full extent of Italian law. Exceptions generally make bad precedents.



1. I am convinced that we should take up with Signor Cuomo the whole question of church education. The schools and colleges fall into 3 categories:

I. Seminaries, etc. - These are completely independent of the State and are not a subject of discussion.

II. Parochial Church Schools - These remain as they are - and are not subject to discussion.

III. New free Church Schools - and here is the problem.

2. When the invasion took place the church authorities state that both General Alexander and Lord Rennell stated they could open Church Schools. The Cardinal Archbishop of Palermo, Lavitrano, is insistent on this point. I think there is little doubt that such permission was granted, as it is hardly likely that either General was aware that free church schools had not existed in Italy before.

3. My policy has therefore been to permit the continuance of these Church Schools, and all I have done is to try and regularize the position by stating that in every province or archdiocese, whichever is the more convenient unit, the Provveditore agli Studi and the Bishop should set up a joint commission of 2 from either party. The purpose of this commission was merely to regulate the subjects and the general standards of education and it was not given complete control (so far as the Provveditore's representatives are concerned) of the schools. They remain free church schools without state support. But the standard must be regulated so that the children can receive such certificates as are necessary in Italy to pass from school to school and school to University.

4. I believe any other policy will be unwise. First, we would place the GOC in an extremely awkward position. Secondly any attitude which could be interpreted as either antagonistic to religion or denying religious freedom would be serious. In this matter I have had in mind the serious dimensions of Roman Catholic elements in the U.S.A., where I presume they are about 30% of the whole. Furthermore, although the Catholic body is quite small in England, great sympathy would be felt for the Church by the English and other Churches or elements of them. As a consequence it has not been my policy to arouse such a general conflict.

5. Personally I feel that Signor Cuomo would be equally unwise to precipitate so serious an issue by attempting to abolish these schools. In reality he cannot do so without consulting the Control Commission first as they have been set up by Allied Military Government.

6. Therefore I should be inclined to suggest that Signor Cuomo should either agree to accept such schools as have been set up (several such are in Mazara ~~deVallo~~) and regularize their relations on the basis of their acknowledged independence under AMG conditions, or else before any precipitate action is taken he should set up a commission to come to a decision. This ought to consist of in equal parts, the Ministry of Education, the church and this office. I suggest 2 of each.

7. I think that all the grave aspects of the case should be pressed upon Cuomo since what he does here will be likely to have a very adverse interpretation in England and America unless he is extremely careful.

8. Personally I regret that such a difficult problem has been left by me unsolved owing to my departure in the next few days. But of course. ~~I was not in~~
~~the first place of my creation in any case.~~

9. I am attaching a document presented to me by the Diocese of Mazara as the basis of their contentions in this matter. Article 5 of this is virtually a statement of the Commission which already exists and which I set up as a means of regularizing the situation which I found already existing before my arrival.



In pursuance of the orders imparted by the Allied Military Government with a note of October 20th 1943, Ref: N° 8879, to day February 16th 1944 at eleven o' clock a.m., met the Commission for the Parish Schools of the Diocese of Mazara del Vallo.

R. Can.Prof. Vincenzo Regina, R.Can. G.Battista Criscuoli, delegates of the Bishop of Mazara del Vallo, Dr. Andrea Genna, Head of the Scuole Medie prof. Piazza Antonino Elementary School Inspector attended.

The Commission examined the orders imparted by the Allied Military Government about the scholastic vacations the regulations for ^{final} school-reports, and the examinations during the scholastic year 1943/44 and agreed in adopting for Parish Schools the same orders imparted for State Schools.

The Commission read the note sent by the Allied Military Government on November 6th 1943 Ref. 8600 B/ED in which it is fixed the legal character of Parish Schools and the public legality of the certificates issued by them.

- I. Referring further to my ECA/42/N/280 of 31 Jan 44 :
2. A communication was received in this office yesterday indicating that the Archbishop of Reggio declines to admit the validity of the regulations issued to him from this H.Q. (over Lt. Col. McCaffrey's signature) on 18 Dec last, in reference to Church Seminaries.
 3. These regulations covered syllabuses and text-books used in Seminaries, but for non-religious subjects only.
 4. It appears the S.C.A.O., Reggio, made the mistake (not envisaged by this office) of sending the instructions to the Archbishop via the Provveditore.
 5. I enclose copies of the correspondence received yesterday in this office from Reggio, and of my replies.
 6. It will be seen that the Archbishop of Reggio refuses, by implication, to take any action in the matter of text-books.
 7. As is pointed out in the attached letter to our H.Q. at Reggio, no other ecclesiastical authority in the Region has raised objections to our conditions.
 8. In this context, may I quote a passage from my report (ECA/42/53) of 9 Dec 43, section 3 (a) (iii) : -

" The Church

There is a feeling at Crotone that the church in some parts is politically suspect. The Archbishop at Cosenza is said to be reliable, but reports say that the Bishop at Catanzaro is unreliable, and Churchmen in Reggio are said to be directly supporting Fascist movements (I cannot vouch for any of this)."

9. It will be seen that O i/c Education at Reggio reads into the Archbishop's words a refusal to admit of any secular interference with any type of Church-controlled education. I do not think this is an accurate interpretation. I read the words as referring only to specific ecclesiastical training.

10. I am taking no further action in this matter until I hear from you.

Ho ricevuto dal Capitano Harrison una copia della lettera che Lei ha mandata il 18 gennaio al Provveditore sull'oggetto dei Seminari.

Inutile dire che non abbiamo voluto far niente contro il Concordato, e devo quindi spiegare il caso esattamente.

Visitando un Seminario a Potenza nel mese di Dicembre scorso trovai che si usavano libri di testo Fascisti nella parte leica dell'istruzione. I libri contenevano anche ritratti e lodi di Mussolini.

Era soltanto per questa causa che abbiamo deciso di raccomandare i cambiamenti indicati nella lettera ECA/42/70 di data 18 Dic.43 e poi modificati nella lettera ECA/42/E/280 in data 23 Gennaio 44. Devo aggiungere che facendo così volevamo evitare la possibilità che nemici della Chiesa dicessero con malevolenza pubblicamente che la Chiesa usava sempre i libri e i metodi fascisti.

I nostri rapporti con la Chiesa sono sempre stati ottimi. In una lettera del mese scorso al Capitano Harrison sullo stesso oggetto dei Seminari io scrissi: "Le prego assicurare l'Arcivescovo che la sua cooperazione benevola in queste questioni ci aiuterà molto."

Naturalmente non userò nessuna pressione in queste cose. Lei mi permetterà però di mandare una copia della Sua lettera allo Stato Maggiore Alleato a Napoli per informazione.

1. Refer your HGH/1011/2014 of 8 Feb:

2. The matter is agreed to be a delicate one, and
your suspension of action in the circumstances is approved.3. It is *probable* that the Archbishop's intransigence
was accentuated by his receiving the instructions from the Prov-
veditore, who of course represents the Italian State and not
Allied Military Government. In any future communication with the
Archbishop he should be dealt with direct?4. No other ecclesiastical authority in the Region has
raised objections to our conditions.5. For your own information, no action was originally
contemplated by this H.G. in the matter of Church Seminaries until
a chance visit to a seminary in Potenza revealed that Fascist
text-books, complete with portraits of Mussolini, remained in full
use. The explanation given for this was (a) that they were last
year's text-books (b) that the Seminaries had previously been forced
to use them by the State.6. Point 5 (b) above is difficult to reconcile with your
Archbishop's statement that the State has never been allowed to
interfere in any way with the running of the Seminaries.7. A full account of the matter is being forwarded to
higher authority.8. Meanwhile you are asked to take no action beyond the
forwarding of one copy of the enclosed letter to the Archbishop.

1. I have just been through the matter of church relations again; once with R.C.A.O. and Cpt. Newfelt privately and again with R.C.A.O., deputy Monsignor DE Leo and Fr. Gliozzi.

2. Everything seems to be harmonious.

3. Am giving Lt. Col. POLETTI a memo on the conference with Monsignor Carroll and Mr. Mehlner at his request.

4. The problems in Agrigento province have all been settled harmoniously.

5. The S.C.A.O of Trapani has ordered the public school open at Campobello and says it will stay open. He has, however, given the Archbishop space in the public buildings of Castelvetrano. I expect an eruption over this affair.

6. The differing conditions in the two provinces is due to the policies of the two archbishops concerned.

Church Seminaries.

I. With reference to the above, copy of a letter written by Arcivescovo of Reggio to the Provveditore is attached. This letter is in reply to a letter from the Provveditore communicating to him the terms of ECA/42/70 regarding the opening of Seminaries.

It is apparent that the Arcivescovo declines in principle to admit of any secular interference whatsoever with church seminaries, colleges, and schools, resting on Art. 39 of the Concordat between Italy and the Holy See which establishes the absolute sovereignty of the church over all such educational institutions.

It would seem that the Concordat still remains in force, although there is a new secular authority in the shape of AMG, as that authority has never repudiated the Concordat.

2. The two seminaries here in Reggio, the Seminario Regionale Pontificio, and the Seminario Arcivescovile, are now open, but the Arcivescovo has only complied with the provisions of ECA/42/70 to the extent of furnishing a list of the teachers (all of whom are priests), and in giving the assurance contained in the last para. of his letter.

3. No further action has been taken by this HQ. in view of the extreme delicacy of the matter affecting as it does the relations between AMG and the Holy See, and of the fact that it is essentially a matter of higher policy on which a ruling is required.

Ho ricevuto la Sua ~~prima~~^{pro} del 12 c.m. N°102 relativa alla riapertura dei Seminari ed all'insegnamento che in essi viene impartito.

Non posso fare a meno di rilevare che la comunicazione in essa contenuta mi ha non poco sorpreso. Giacchè il Concordato stipulato fra la Santa Sede e l'Italia stabilisce che "le Università, i Seminari maggiori e minori, sia diocesano sia interdiocesani sia regionali, le accademie, i collegi e gli altri istituti cattolici per la formazione e la cultura degli ecclesiastici continueranno a dipendere unicamente dalla S.Sede senza alcuna ingerenza delle autorità scolastiche del Regno" (art.39).

Devo, pertanto, pensare che le Autorità Alleate nel prendere la decisione che Ella mi comunica non abbiano tenuta presente la norma concordataria di cui sopra - e la cosa è del tutto spiegabile - anche perchè la lesione da parte loro del Concordato in uno dei suoi articoli più importanti nel quale è implicito, come presupposto giuridico, un principio di diritto pubblico ecclesiastico relativamente alla sovranità della Chiesa ed alla sua indipendenza nella disciplina del Clero e dei Seminari, non troverebbe, non dico una giustificazione, ma una qualsiasi plausibile spiegazione.

E', inoltre, da rilevare che i programmi di studio per tutti i Seminari sono stati direttamente fissati e imposti dalla S.Sede. Pertanto, nel caso che si ritenesse necessaria una modifica dei medesimi, bisognerebbe rivolgersi alla stessa Autorità dalla quale furono emanati; nè ciò riuscirebbe impossibile agli Alleati, dal momento che hanno una rappresentanza diplomatica presso il Vaticano.

Devo, per altro, rilevare che nei suddetti programmi non figurano né l'economia, né la cultura militare, né quella fascista; ed è superfluo notare che qualsiasi materia militare esula dai medesimi.

Refoe your letter of 21 Jan 44 on above subject :

I. For your information, the following is a description of what has been done to date in Region 2 with regard to Church Seminaries.

- a) No special steps were taken until mid-December, when I visited a Church-Seminary in Potenza with the SCAO, and found that Fascist text-books were being used without attempt at expurgation.
- b) I therefore circularized all SCAOs, and requested them to inform me how many Seminaries were open in their Provinces, and what authority was claimed for their opening; also to issue to all Seminaries detailed instructions regarding syllabuses and text-books for all non-religious subjects so as to bring them into line with State Schools. I emphasised that no details were required of specifically religious instruction.
- c) The requests in b) have been carried out. I now have a list of all Seminaries in the Region, with details of each, and the relevant instructions have been issued to all and have been or are being carried out.
- d) I have treated the matter as diplomatically as possible, and I have no reason whatever to believe that there have been any unfavourable reactions from the Church. It seemed to me, however, essential that all teaching-establishments should be brought into line at least over the question of Fascist text-books.

I. Attached is a copy of a letter from the Educational Adviser on the relationship ^{between} Church Schools and Provveditori.

2. To the best of my knowledge all Church Schools in Region II are "parificate". On the other hand there exist Church Seminaries (for the training of Priests) which appear to be in quite a different category, and in regard to them it might be desirable to have a discussion with the Church on ways and means, on the lines indicated in the Educational Adviser's letter.

3. I understand that you have a Cardinal in Region III, with whom the matter might be discussed. Would you care to take the matter up with him ? There is no Cardinal in Region II, and I feel it would be unwise to tackle such a matter on any lower level. ~~Would you be good enough to let me know the results?~~

4. It may be that it will be decided that Church Seminaries are on quite a different footing from Church Schools, but it might be well to discuss the matter ^{formally} before arriving at a decision.

With reference to our previous conversation,
we have the honour to confirm what we said.
1.- Church Schools are not under the control of the Provveditor. Nevertheless we hope that you might satisfactorily collaborate with them. (We hope also that later on Church Authorities will appoint a Director who may come in contact with us as the Provveditor used to do).
2.- Now that our schools have been re-opened, we are glad to see that you held the same opinion as us about freedom of thought. It is only on that base that we may build up a new world better than that we are now sweeping away.
3.- It is our intention that the Provveditor might collaborate with the nearest Archdiocese in order to form a commission opt to regulate the programs a the regulations for the examinations in Church Schools.

All this will establish the same educational level in Church Schools as well as in State Schools. With the result that the certificates issued by our schools will have the same value as those of other schools. It is our intention that this commission might not act as a vigilance committee on the examinations.
