1. The transfer of secondary school teachers is a huge task usually carried solely by the Ministry. For this summer I feel that the Ministry will swamp itself with unnecessary work unless it makes a special disposition of the matter.
2. Within provinces in Italian government territory I suggest that the Minister delegate to the P.a.s. the power to transfer secondary teachers in cases where the secondary teacher and the preside of the school to which he wishes to transfer are in agreement. All other cases of transfer should come to the Ministry as usual.
3. I am sure that failure to delegate in this respect would result in confusion and would effectively prevent a preside from developing an efficient and well balanced faculty.

(In the past a great many of these appointments were filled by

insegnanti from Sicily. This resulted in many qualified Eolie Islands insegnanti being unable ever to obtain employment.)

(6) The transfer of the kindergarten, Lipari, at present occupying very indifferent premises, to much more suitable accommodation recently acquired by a legacy.

2. Any further information you may require can be given by Prof. Sabella Conti Eller Vaincher, by whom this letter is being delivered to you.

3. If introduced, the above enumerated measures would, I am convinced, be of lasting benefit to the cause of education in these backward islands. Your approval, I therefore confidently venture to request.

SUBJECT: Finance relationships.

TO : Lt.Col. Jordan, Region I, A.C.C. HQ

1. Education is in a different situation than other division in that there is not a regional administrative office. Two instructional inspectors were appointed according to Italian law one of whom is now deceased.
2. The Italian regional finance office unjustly refused to honor their expense accounts.
3. The main point a issue is whether or not Allied Control Commission can help in making wise decisions as to financial matters affecting education.
4. I believe the present channels are acceptable but believe that the regional Italian finance should consult with persons in the regional education office on exceptional items. It is inconceivable that a clerk in a finance office could adjudicate marginal items. The present provveditore are nearly all new to their posts and operate without any advice from their Minister. Therefore, they are bound to err. I know that their budgets were not consistent before March 30 even so far as items included are concerned.
5. The education situation does not involve the prestige of the High Commissioner nor do I think that any large sums are involved. The realities of the education situation should however, be considered in the re-planning of procedures.

1. After receiving communications and representatives from Col. Yeo I went to Messina and met with the Provveditore agli Studi to discuss the Eolian situation.

We came to agreements on all matters concerned. These are summarized:

- a) All schools established by Allied Military Government should be recognized.
- b) All appointments made by Allied Military Government should be recognized except where teachers were given di ruolo status. In such cases I do not feel that we can insist since I gave no authority to do this to anyone. At the same time we should raise no objection if the Ministry should wish to honor all decrees.
- c) The Provveditore and I agreed to make parallel recommendations to our higher authorities.
- d) Readjustments can be made as needed next year.

2. I believe the Provveditore is forwarding copies of the decrees to the Ministry. If you need them I can send my copies.

3. The schools there should be visited by national inspectors this school year in order that adjustments should be made for next year.

4. The secondary school for the islands should ultimately become comprehensive in nature. The Ministry should consider the establishment of a unique secondary school for the islands. It is well that the Avviamento school was suppressed.

5. The Technical School programs are being prepared rapidly, but are not yet ready. These you will probably want to print for yourself, and I'll try to have a duplicate manuscript for you.

1. Your letter of 21 March regarding school fees was discussed with Cuomo 27 March. He is completely in accord with your recommendation and so are we. We agreed that it was too late for action this year, but Cuomo agreed to try to work out the new plan for next year.
2. Lt. Col. Smith suggested that Patronato Scolastico be not taken up with the Minister until our own recommendations were clear. The Youth Commission, which includes the rector of the University of Naples, the Provveditori of Naples, a representative of the Cardinal and presidi and teachers of all types of schools, felt that the Palermo plan was: (a) much too cumbersome - "elephantine"; (b) so comprehensive as to leave no room for more democratically organized Youth groups in each school. A committee of the Commission is preparing a simplified plan incorporating the essentials of the Palermo plan and providing for coordination with local committees on youth problems. This will be sent to you on completion and submitted to Cuomo. It is the feeling here that we should get the matter set up this spring for full operation when schools open in the fall.
3. The Minister says there is no "Commissario of Education" in Sicily and he does not want one. The continuing of our decrees has been approved by him; so there should not be too much need for reference of details by Provveditori to the Minister; when contact is needed he does not want an intermediary Italian official.
4. Please push IRES on Sillabario. We have not the paper or means of printing here for Sicily and Calabria and you should be able to get newsprint there for spring printing. We have ordered all materials sent to Palermo for summer printing. We will send transfer sheets immediately on hearing from you, but they must be used within 15-20 days of being prepared. We will fly them to you as soon as you give the word. The new sillabario is excellent and very good looking. Cuomo is delighted with it. Copies will be sent to you next week - they are not yet bound.
5. The Magistrale program is being slightly revised, with good new material on pedagogy and philosophy added. Proofs will be rushed to you in about

ten days. Cuomo has approved and wants them distributed in his territory as a guide for balance of this year.

6. Cuomo has approved the Commission for Programs for Technical Schools. These are essential, I find, because under the Bottai plan technical schools change from a 4-4 basis to a 3-4 basis this year. To preserve the eight year course, which Cuomo and the Istituti Tecnici earnestly desire, we must provide a 3-5 organization. It can be done quite simply by preserving intact (with minor revisions) the last four years of the old course, and adding, below, a preparatory year for children who have completed the Media Inferiore. Here, the provveditore gave a crazy order, lacking a program, putting graduates of the Media Inferiore in the second class of the tecnico superiore. The new program will avoid this confusion. Manuscript is being prepared by one of the best commissions we have had, and will be ready in a few days. Either a duplicate manuscript or first proofs will be rushed to you. Our Palermo commission failed to do anything about this except prepare the supplementary mimeographed outlines for technical courses, and we were too ignorant to recognize the need.

7. It is possible that I'll send Pratt to Palermo with the Sillabario transfer sheets (Carta Umida per trasporto). In that case you can discuss the teacher education program with him. Glad you're thinking about it. Do you want to see the too-idealistic program I drafted?

8. Presidi are not the naturals for starting youth activities. Our Youth Commission was hand picked and is functioning admirably and presidi are falling in line.

9. I suggested to Cuomo the integration of the training of pre-school teachers with that of elementary teachers as an ultimate policy, in accordance with your suggestion. He fully agreed. But it can't really be done till the Magistrale program is pretty completely reorganized. Gosh, that has been terrible. Our new program moves forward as far as is possible under present immediate conditions, but only in the field of pedagogy, etc. Basically, the Magistrale is still an attenuated ginasio-Liceo classico.

10. I don't understand your problem (para 6, 20 March) on teachers who have passed concorso and do not have posts. What action do you want or recommend?

11. Personally I am in sympathy with the Provveditore in Palermo regarding purification taxes. This matter, however, should be considered and decided upon by Cuomo. It will be brought to his attention at the next session with him.

12. Thank you for the promemoria on physical education and the review by Barreal. They will be read with interest.

13. Cuomo promises a decree on council of discipline and scholastic council next Tuesday.

14. Cuomo approves omission of "Libreria dello Stato" from our new texts. You may omit from balance of your series. We are exiting from all of ours.
15. Cuomo agrees that our present series of books will have to be the only series for the Scholastic year 1944-45. No new decree is needed since the monopoly extends to January and no new books will be approved.
16. Beba wants to know why you don't write - is eager for news of you. Alec is now a major working in the hospital. Vera is in a French school. Beba works in Red Cross but is not well - anemias and headaches.
17. Capt. Filros has been added to our staff and is getting broken in.
18. T.V. is simply swell. Does a perfect job. It's a privilege to work under him.
19. Pratt is happy now; finishing text book job, spending four days a week in Avellino Province; beginning work on survey of Italian education. Excellent man.
20. Good luck and best wishes to you. See you here in a couple of weeks. Cordial greetings.

With reference to Memorandum No 44 14/XII/43, and the paragraph referring to school taxes, it may have been well advised that the question was not treated too precipitously in the first place, but it is suggested that our position be revised for the scholastic year 1944-45:

The exemptions for "famiglie numerose" existed not so much to ensure an education for all children as to encourage the production of more children for that educational melting-pot which existed "for the moulding of individual personality into that of the State which is wider and more elevated". No means test was applied in these cases; the political value of the family on demographic grounds was the deciding factor. On the other hand an only child was excluded from full exemption of school taxes for "merit" (i.e. average marks 80% in exams), and enjoyed instead only half exemption.

These demographic exemptions and discriminations should be abolished.

The means test which is applied when exemption is granted for merit or for children of soldiers recalled to the colours is the certificate of "non possidenza". This is quite arbitrary and unjust, for whilst even the smallest property owner is thus barred from exemption from school taxes for his children (unless he had produced a "famiglia numerosa"), a his own can obtain the certi-

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These demographic exemptions and discriminations should be abolished.

The means test which is applied when exemption is granted for merit or for children of soldiers recalled to the colours is the certificate of 'non possidenza'. This is quite arbitrary and unjust, for whilst even the smallest property owner is thus barred from exemption from school taxes for his children (unless he had produced a "famiglia numerosa"), a his own can obtain the certificate and the consequent exemptions.

Exemption from taxes for Avviamento Schools should continue, and a new means test should be applied in the other secondary schools. This should be such that any child might frequent any State school up to the age fixed by law for compulsory education.

For further information on school taxes and exemptions therefrom see Lieut Beard's report dated 6th January 1944.

1. Your letter referring to matters mentioned in our January report is received. Glad you liked it.
2. Am enclosing a second copy of the order in which I listed new titles as approved and as confiscated.
3. The distaccata schools greatly aggravated the church-state conflict. Furthermore, the wording of our decree did not specify whether the presence of a non-public school would or would not affect the establishment of a public school (distaccata). The issue of free education was, therefore, involved.
4. I should like to add that I feel distaccata schools to be unsound in principle. New schools should have been independent. Further, I feel sure that no new schools should have been started in Sicily by ACP. The establishment of authorized non-public schools was a part of a mistaken policy.
5. I now must face the matter of obtaining recognition, authorization and parification of several new schools in Agrigento, Ragusa and Trapani provinces. How can this be done?
6. Shall ask for authorization to go to Lt. Col. Smith's conference at once. I believe such a meeting will be very advantageous.

1. The activative of Region 5 raises the issue of your continuance in Sicily Region.
2. Region 5 will consist of the province of Foggia and the compartments of Abruzzi and Marche. Of these, Foggia alone at present is under Region 5 control.
3. Foggia has been, until now, under Region 4. A provincial director of education, Major Birt, has been at work under the Regional Director of Region 4 and has selected a Provveditore, opened schools, and generally proceeded in accordance with Hq. Policies. He knows the field well and is vigorously at work.
4. The Education Subcommission recognizes that, particularly in this transition period a change of leadership in Sicily Region would be hazardous.
To remove you from control of your nine provinces and put you into one would not adequately use your ability and experience. A new man in Sicily could not do your work. A man is already in Foggia doing a first rate job.
5. The Education Subcommission has therefore recommended that you continue as Chief of the Education Division in Sicily Region and that Major Birt be made Regional Director of Education in Region 5.
6. This recommendation has been made to the R.C.A.C. in Region 5. He expressed liking and admiration for you and regret at not having you with him, but he concurred in the advisability of the above plan from the standpoint of general administrative efficiency.
7. It is hoped that you will see the desirability of this plan and will not be personally disappointed. On the personal side, you have much more satisfactory conditions of living than you could have in Foggia Province; also you have wide scope for your ability.
8. You will of course let us know if you have strong personal feelings in the matter.

1. On the hand-over to the Badoglio Government please note that direct action relative to such matters as misbehaviour or non-compliance with orders by scholastic officials will cease.
2. In case any corrective action becomes necessary in respect of scholastic officials you should make a report to the Director, Education Subcommittee, who will take the necessary steps with the Badoglio Government.
3. This will not preclude informal, persuasive action by you which may achieve the desired result unofficially.

5. So far I have been unable to locate mats for taking an impression of other books being printed here; but I am still in search of them. If I find them it will save you from having to have the books composed and proof read; but it does not look very promising.

1. The use of the Catania sillabario cannot be permitted for the following reasons:

- a. Several authors and publishers in Sicily asked authorization to publish a sillabario and were refused on the ground that we had decided to use the revised Libro del Stato exclusively. It would be a gross injustice to those who were law-abiding if we were to give a monopoly to a firm which defied our decree.
- b. A similar situation has arisen in Region 3. The enclosed letter shows how it is being dealt with. A reverse procedure in Region 1 would be unjust and unwise.
- c. The Catania sillabario is a very inferior one - 55 pages instead of 128, no color, poor paper, very poor method, practically nothing but drill on letters and words, only two brief stories. An extremely poor piece of work.
- d. The price (35 to 37 lira) is exorbitantly high.
- e. Cuomo has agreed to our sillabario. We do not want to ask his approval of the Catania sillabario.

2. We can print the revised Libro del Stato sillabario, 128 pages, four colors, by offset process, at cover price not higher than 25 lira, probably about 20 lira.

3. If you or we can locate 32 sheets of "carta humida per trasporto" we can fly complete cliches, (or whatever the offset sheets are called) to Palermo and IRES can print direct. We should have these cliches ready within ten days, maybe less.

4. Will you immediately have Beard or Barresi, with help of Sgt.

-2-

Seattini, scour Palermo for 32 sheets of "carta humida per trasporto" for four color offset of 128 page book. Cable me your results. If you find the material, rush it here by air.

5. I am making similar search here. If we locate the material before hearing from you we will cable you.

6. If both of us fail to find the "carta humida" and can find no substitute, you may have to substitute zinc plate drawings, black and white, for the colored pictures. These drawings can be made by tracing the colored pictures. Another possible alternative would be for us to print your sillabario here and ship to Palermo. To do this we would have to have you ship back to us the Poligrafico del Stato paper. I very much hope these alternatives will not be necessary.

7. The Poligrafico paper should be reserved for Silabario, not used for other text books. Get additional newsprint from PWB as indicated in my last letter to you - have the RCOAO order PWB to deliver 37 or more rolls to you - he has full authority.

8. The fifth grade sussidarii are largely in type and proof has been corrected. But we do not yet have the necessary cuts. We are having difficulty finding zinc. I wanted to send you complete page proofs, illustrated. But in view of your urgent need I will try to get off to you within two or three days, galley proofs and a marked copy of the old text book showing which illustrations we are using - we have reduced the number to a minimum because of zinc shortage and to save cost. If you have no zinc shortage and wish to include some illustrations which we have omitted you are free to do so.

9. To date we have not received the fifth reader proofs. Hope they are on the way.

10. Payment for newsprint and poligrafica paper should be made to Amfa, Palermo and record sent here. Do not collect 20 lira for newsprint - await word from me as to price printers should pay. It will be closer to 6 lira, as we shall arrange partial subsidy if Washington or Algiers sets price too high. Poligrafica paper should be sold at 8 lira.

11. We are not publishing the text books for centri rurali - the books for centri rurali will be used in all schools.

Please give it to him for his information and that of the Cardinal of Palermo, etc; so that they may see that we have gone much farther than they requested and have prepared a program which not only does not imply any antagonism to the Church but actively supports the religious phase of education.

That just to give her the chance to make a living for her and family. The writer lately had a letter from his sister in which she informed him that in Sicily only rich people and people who have recommendations could get jobs.

This is a big injustice for his sister; she not only is an orphan of the first World War, but is the sister of a Prisoner of War who actually works for the Victory of the Allies and is unfortunately unable to give her any help.

The writer very often heard that justice had been restored in Sicily by the Allies; then why don't they give to his sister the chance to make a living for her and the family?

To Major Washburne:

In reply^{ing} to your Memorandum for Lt. Col. Gayre and Major Koopman we have adopted the corresponding paragraph numbers of your Memorandum in the following:

- 1. Sillabario. It has been decided to abolish the monopoly for the Sillabario in Region I.* So it will not be necessary for you to send us proofs, except "per conoscenza".
- 2. We are printing in colour wherever it is possible.
- 3. Enclosed copy of Bellotti's price breakdown for 3rd reader, also your basic breakdown. The extra ^B lire on the price of the Third Reader was added, as, with the uncertainty of the price of paper, we didn't know whether some later reader might cost something out of proportion to fifteen lire. Bellotti is holding the 10,000 lire in a separate account to be used to offset any such eventuality. The 30% discount on the cover price covers the distributors' as well as the retailers' remuneration. As cabled to you, P.W.B. quotes 20 lire the kilo as the price of newsprint to other than strictly military publications.
- 4. We are particularly anxious for proofs of the 5th Class subsidiary books, as Ando will be able to start printing these.
- 5. Proofs of the 5th Class reader are due on the 3rd and will be despatched to you immediately ~~if~~ they are ready.

** The Sillabario printed in
Crown can then be sold legally
in Region I. It is considered
an adequate text book for the first class.
Proofs is prepared immediately when
called.*

6. The binding thread cannot be used in the machines (according to Bellotti) as it is too hairy, but it is priced so low that it will be more economical to use this and handsew, than comb the black market for smoother binding cords. A draft from Bellotti (whom we are using as a deposit) to D'Andrea will follow.

7. Whilst the elimination of I.R.E.S. would be highly desirable, such action would raise protests as we are not the only ones using this press, and the procedure would not be easy.

8. We have decided to use the Poligrafico dello Stato paper to print the Third Sussidiario and the Fifth Reader, and to charge Bellotti 6 lire the kilo for it. There is no question ^{that this} ~~about its~~ _{is} being State paper; and the Italian State debts will surely be dealt with by the Italian Government? To whom should payment for paper be made - Poligrafico paper and newsprint? We have told ~~in~~ the printers they will have to pay for newsprint by weight of the rolls and not according to the amount of usable paper in the rolls.

9. & 10. (see 6 above)

II. The newsprint has been handed over by P.W.B. Seventeen rolls of this you yourself "borrowed", two we "borrowed" later, and two were "borrowed" by Economics and Supplies. As stated in our cable, these are 500 lb. net 700 kg. rolls, many of them considerably spoiled, and quite insufficient for all the printing in hand. About 12,000 kilograms of paper will still be needed to complete an issue

1. The paper was received in Palermo and acknowledged by cable on 28 December by Capt. Altherr of the PWB there. There were 150 rolls of which 37 were for you. PWB, Naples, (Capt. Piscop) stated and states that these 37 rolls were for the printing of our text books. He, however, wrote and said this to me and told me to get the paper when it reached Palermo. We both assumed PWB there would take our word for it. I have asked PWB here to send a letter by air courier today to the CO, PWB, Palermo, confirming these instructions. So you should be able immediately to get your paper.

2. I will investigate the cord situation at once and if I can find cord here will send it by COL. Gayre Thursday.

3. I know the Silibario paper belonged to the state. The vendor, however, says the Italian government owed him the equivalent value for printing. My plan is to get the paper (I'm taking the rest of it for use here), get payment from printers, and then unscramble the thing with the Badoglio government as to whom to pay. There is something to be said for outright confiscation of the paper to reduce cost of school books; but since the printers sell for profit we'd be criticized for giving them free paper. How about charging them the pre-inflation price?

4. Price on newsprint has not been definitely set. You should if possible get PWB to set it there. I'm trying to find someone to set it here. When either of us gets a price he should cable the other.

5. Please send me your figures for determining the 16 lira price on the third reader. Also a copy of Bolletti's cost analysis - my copy has disappeared.

6. I'll write you shortly on the other points - I'm working on them.

7. Col. Gayre will be with you the end of this week. I'll give him full notes and he can reach decisions with you. It is impossible for me to go to Palerac in the near future.

8. Beba writes that you were kind and dear to them - a true friend. I appreciate this very much. Awfully glad they got off.

1.- It is reported that the Provveditore of Agrigento has opened a school at MARO where a school already exists in connection with the local seminary. The seminary school, it is reported, sent an application, some time ago, to the A.M.G. for "parification" of the school which complies with the requisite conditions. This application has not reached this office and is reported to have been blocked by the Provveditore. The new school at MARO is further reported to be taking students from the old schools, illegally without examination or diploma.

2.- It is reported that plans are being made for the opening of a school at Camarata where a private school already exists.

3.- Neither of the schools mentioned have been inspected by this office, but if their standard is as reported, it would seem that the school opened or projected by the Provveditore are not necessary.

SUBJECT: Progress of publications.

TO : C.W. WASHBURNE

1. Sillabario

a) The IRES press reports that most of the material required for printing the Class I "Sillabario" was destroyed during a fire in their establishment. In particular the lithograph blocks for printing that part of the book which was in block—that is to say the essential blocks—are missing.

b) They could reproduce the book by photographic method as they have the colour breakdowns for photographing. The film they have is not particularly suitable for this purpose; nor have they got sufficient photographic material to print the book unless it is considerably cut. The cost for printing a small quantity of "Sillabario" by this method would be excessive.

c) Older versions of the Class I Sillabario exist, but the lithographs etc... are not available in Palermo.

d) It is suggested that if the lithograph blocks could be found in Naples the sillabari be printed there.

2. Paper.

a) The paper for the sillabari has arrived in moderate condition. Sergt. Strazzini has drawn our attention to the fact that this paper bears the label of the Istituto Poligrafico dello Stato, which would mean that the paper was already state property. Payment should not be made until this matter has been investigated and we have been informed.

b) We are still awaiting the arrival of the 37 rolls of manuscript. It would be appreciated

if you would confirm the price quoted verbally of Lit.6 Kg and also inform us to whom this should be paid.

3. Other Material

- a) Bellotti reports that he has no thread left for binding and will have to resort to wire clips. The local market price of binding thread is Lit. 1000 per 200 gram. reel.
- b) Ink here costs 300 lire the Kilogram, this too might be more reasonably purchased in Naples.

4. Advice

I think it advisable that you fly, here and help make decisions on all matters of publications.

Prefects are ordered to furnish the necessary fare for transportation.

2. The decree seems to Capt. Geyer and me impossible of execution in many regions because inter-regional travel is, I believe, forbidden by the AMG. Within Sicily, however, there should be no difficulty about conforming. Possibility of travel from Sicily to other parts of liberated Italy should be investigated by you (through Public Safety and Transportation), and some sort of directive should go either from you to provveditori or from the RCAG to prefects, or both, indicating what the possibilities are, or the fact that there is no opportunity to travel from Sicily to other regions at present.

SUBJECT : Secondary School Program

TO : Provveditore agli Studi-Palermo

1. I have examined the programs for the secondary schools prepared by our commission. I find that these programs revert to a system of school organization abandoned several years ago.
2. It is the policy of the Allied Military Government to make no changes in the Italian governmental and educational system except those necessary for the elimination of Fascism. In all other respects we wish to maintain the system as it has existed in recent years. Any changes in this system should be made by the Italian Government after it is established in Rome.
3. The changing of the program of the Istituto Magistrale, etc. from a system of three years inferior and five years superior to four years inferior and four years superior does not appear to be necessary for the elimination of Fascism and is therefore contrary to our policy. The changing of the program of the ginnasio inferiore and superiore and liceo classico from a total of eight years to a total of nine years does not appear to be necessary for the elimination of Fascism and is therefore contrary to our policy.
4. Our Commission was asked to rewrite the program of the schools in such a way as to eliminate Fascism. It was neither directed nor authorized to change the general system of school organization.
5. The program we are preparing is not for Sicily alone but for all liberated parts of Italy under the Allied Military Government. The Provveditori of Sicily, therefore, are not empowered to vote in favor of or against a general change of the system of school organization for all

liberated Italy.

6. You are therefore requested to appoint a small subcommission to revise the program of the large commission, bringing it into the framework of the system of educational organization which existed last year. This Commission will submit its program to me at the earliest possible date so that it can be distributed to the Schools immediately after their opening.
7. Please submit to me immediately
 - a- The names of the members of the subcommission to make this revision.
 - b- The date and place of their first meeting.
 - c- The date on which you will expect them to complete their work.

Per le susposte ragioni questa Presidenza fa vivi voti affinché i diplomati dagli istituti nautici abbiano, senza decorrenza di tempo dal conseguimento del diploma, accesso alla facoltà di ingegneria navale senza prove di esami integrativi, ripristinando con ciò quanto era consentito dalle leggi vigenti anteriormente all'anno 1922.

In appoggio al voto di questa Presidenza si fa presente che il fatto è di vitale importanza, in quanto si assicura l'avvenire agli studenti che per avventura non potessero abbracciare la carriera marittima per sopravvenuti difetti fisici incompatibili colla vita del mare.

OGGETTO: Accesso alle Università dei diplomati degli Istituti Tecnici Industriali

Anteriormente all'ordinamento scolastico disposto con R.D.L. 31-10-23 n. 2523 (prima, dunque, dell'avvento del fascismo) ai licenziati degli Istituti Industriali era concessa senza esami, ma solo in base al parere favorevole del Senato accademico, l'ammissione ai politecnici ed alle Scuole d'Ingegneria navale.

Per effetto del richiamato R.D.L. del 1921 e dello ordinamento attuato con la legge 15/6/1931, n. 889 ai licenziati predetti venne inibito l'accesso ai ~~politecnici~~ politecnici e scuole d'ingegneria, mentre rimase consentito l'accesso ad altre facoltà fra le quali quella di economia e commercio.

L'assurdità di un tale provvedimento è troppo palese perchè si debba sprecare tempo per dimostrarla.

Non vi ha dubbio, infatti, che ai licenziati degli Istituti Industriali potevano essere aperte le porte dell'Università solo per accedere alle facoltà di ingegneria e limitatamente a quelle sezioni di indirizzo corrispondente ai diplomi conseguiti.

In base al deprecato ordinamento disposto dal governo fascista a seguito della pubblicazione della carta della scuola - il corso di studi per gli Istituti Industriali veniva ridotto da otto a sette anni epperò si

consentiva, previo esame di ammissione e dopo un anno del conseguimento del diploma, l'accesso alle facoltà di ingegneria.

Le Autorità Alleate hanno giustamente ordinato la soppressione delle scuole media di marca fascista e la ricostituzione degli Istituti tecnici inferiori: conseguentemente il corso di studi rimarrà dalla durata di otto anni.

- a) i giovani che hanno frequentato il corso inferiore - previo esame,

- c) i licenziati della Scuola di Avviamento.

Questi ultimi, però, dopo avere frequentato un anno di corso preparatorio.

Ciò premesso questa Presidenza si permette di sottoporre agli esami della S.V.I. e del Governo Alleato la proposta di consentire ai licenziati degli Istituti Industriali la ammissione ai Politecnici, alle Scuole di Ingegneria navale e alle facoltà di Ingegneria delle RR. Università così come praticavasi prima dell'avvento del fascismo (e cioè prima dell'applicazione del R.D.L. 31-10-1923 n. 2523) in base al solo parere favorevole del Senato accademico ovvero, più opportunamente, in base alle votazioni conseguite agli esami di abilitazione tecnica industriale (non meno di 7/10 per materia). e sempre quando abbiano ottenuto dal Consiglio dei Professori la dichiarazione di attitudine a proseguire gli studi. -

Dovrà, ovviamente, darsi maggiore cura alla cultura letteraria e storica degli allievi mentre, per quel che riguarda l'insegnamento scientifico, si ravvisa l'opportunità di insegnare la matematica con metodo rigoroso e razionale abituando gli allievi al metodo analitico per l'algebra e al metodo sintetico per la geometria nonché alla discussione delle soluzioni delle equazioni algebriche e

trigonometriche; all'impiego del metodo per assurdo e del principio della dualità nei problemi geometrici; d'insegnare con carattere unitario la fisica, la chimica e le scienze naturali preoccupandosi di fare discendere lo studio dei fenomeni dalle leggi fondamentali che i giovani già conoscono per averle verificate sperimentalmente e di cui hanno visto l'immensa portata attraverso le applicazioni tecniche, privilegio che i giovani che hanno seguito altri ordini di studio non hanno.

It is, therefore, DECREED that

any Provveditore upon satisfying himself as the authenticity of the evidence presented by a school that it, or any of its classes, was, in fact, given legal recognition by the then existing Ministry of Education in the spring or summer of 1943, shall recognize said school or class as "parificate" just as if official notification had been duly received from the then Minister of Education.



MEMORANDUM

In order that the minds of youth might have been impressed since their boyhood by the ideals of Fascism, the late Regime had created a vast reformation of the School pompously called the "Carta della Scuola" (School Charter). Such a reformation was carried out only for the first three forms of the Inferior Course, called "Scuola Media", but it is conscientious to state that it did not please either families or teachers, who were compelled to accept it like all other provisions of the late Regime.

Just a few days ago, the Reformation was abolished by the Headquarters of the Allied Forces (Secular Section), ordering that the old systems to be followed and the Schools reopened on December 1st next.

The reopening of the Schools concerns complicated and important questions, both general and particular to the State Schools in Jonia. Such questions are briefly dealt as follows.

GENERAL QUESTIONS

The most important is the one relating to programs and text-books.

As regards programs a temporary revision may be done, thus suppressing all that refers to the work of the late Regime.

The programs of the following subjects should be revised in a particular way.

HISTORY - Fascist Culture should be suppressed; its program from 1918 onwards modified.

PHILOSOPHY - The whole program should be modified.

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As regards programs a temporary revision may be done, thus suppressing all that refers to the work of the late Regime.

The programs of the following subjects should be revised in a particular way.

HISTORY - Fascist Culture should be suppressed; its program from 1918 downwards modified.

PHILOSOPHY - The whole program should be modified.

GEOGRAPHY - The arguments regarding its political and economical parts should be modified.

CHEMISTRY and MICROBIOLOGY - All that concerns self-sufficiency should be suppressed.

PUBLIC LAW - All that concerns fascist laws should be suppressed.

PRIVATE LAW - Programs should be dealt with according to the old Civil and Commercial Codes of 1865.

POLITICAL ECONOMY - The sound traditional principles of Economy should be retaken and the passages concerning corporativism and self-sufficiency should be suppressed.

MILITARY CULTURE and PUEBICULTURE - The whole programs should be modified.

TEXT-BOOKS - The other important question is the one relating to text-books. Of course it is impossible to prepare the necessary text-books in time, not would it be convenient to do so, for it is better to wait the definitive drawing of programs.

In the meantime each Headmaster together with the competent teachers might be advised to examine the text-books, suppressing them once for all or, whether possible, tearing only those pages which are no longer sensible (this may be done especially for Anthologies). Still, all pupils should show their books to be examined. For some subjects, during the scolastic year 1943-44, each teacher will dictate some notes, controlled by the headmaster.

LIBRARY - Revision of the books.
