SUBJECT : Equipment of Naval Training School,
Siracusa.

7 February 1945

TO : Minister of Public Instruction.

1. About 1 December you communicated to us that while the Naval Training School at Siracusa had been derequisitioned, its shop equipment remained in Allied possession.

2. This Headquarters has had an investigation made, and has received the attached report.

3. Since no inventory was made at the time of either the requisitioning or derequisitioning of the building, and since so many different units occupied it, it is impossible to try to trace the equipment without more precise information.

4. If Your Excellency will have the authorities list with precision the equipment that is missing, an effort will be made to obtain information regarding it. It must be admitted, however, that not much hope can be held out under the circumstances for locating and restoring the missing items. This is much regretted.

SUBJECT: Deregistration Naval Training School Equipment

1. Reference is made to your letter EC/7A/412/AC regarding the above subject, dated 4 December 1944.

2. An investigation has been made by the Provincial Commissioners, Eastern Sicily, of the equipment reported to be missing from the Syracuse Naval Training School. The building was requisitioned on 14 July 1943, deregquisitioned on 14 September 1944, and was taken over by the L. Gav Stanaris del Porta, Syracuse. It appears that no inventory of the equipment was made when the school was requisitioned and that no check was made when the premises were vacated.

3. Since no further record of the equipment is available in Sicily, it may be necessary to make inquiry of the organisations which previously occupied the building. Previous Town Lancers of the Syracuse area have left no written record of these units, which have all left Sicily. However, inquiry among personnel stationed for a long time in Syracuse reveals that the premises were first used by the Fort Base, thereafter by H. 55 Area, and in particular by an Anti-Tank Battalion of the Gordon Highlanders, and were thereafter occupied by the following, in order: H. 70 Garrison, H. 71 Garrison and Det. H. 56 Area (last occupant).

1. Reference is made to your letter ED/7A/412/AC regarding the above subject, dated 1 December 1944.

2. An investigation has been made by the Provincial Commissioner, Eastern Sicily, of the equipment reported to be missing from the Syracuse Naval Training School. The building was requisitioned on 14 July 1943, derequisitioned on 14 September 1944, and was taken over by the R. Capitaneria del Porto, Syracuse. 3. Since no further record of the equipment is available in Sicily, it may be necessary to make inquiry of the organizations which previously occupied the building. However, inquiry among personnel stationed for a long time in Syracuse reveals that the premises were first used by the Fort Base, thereafter by HQ 55 Area, and in particular by an Anti-Tank Battalion of the Gordon Highlanders, and were thereafter occupied by the following, in order: HQ 70 Garrison, HQ 71 Garrison and Det. HQ 56 Area (last occupant).

1. The Minister of Public Instruction has requested our help in clearing the following lower technical schools for naval training from Allied Occupation:

- (a) Brindisi - almost totally requisitioned, including equipment.
- (b) Mola di Bari - totally requisitioned, including equipment and shops.
- (c) Molfetta (Bari Province) - totally occupied.
- (d) Barletta (Bari Province) - partially occupied, including part of furnishing and material.
- (e) Manfredonia (Foggia Province) - all of building and part of equipment requisitioned.

2. Will you ask the appropriate Provincial Commissioners to investigate:

- (a) Whether all of these occupations and requisitions are essential to the war effort;
- (b) Whether certain of the schools and their equipment could be made partially available for school use;
- (c) Whether any of the schools, with equipment, could be completely cleared.

3. Please let me know the results of the investigation and any action taken pursuant thereto.



Major Koenigman reports, 9 Oct. 1944.

It was agreed that the Liceo Garibaldi, Palermo,
a large & important school where building was
destroyed, should move and the Ente Colony agree
off the Via Libertà, Palermo, when troops moved
out. High Commission was asked to recognize Ente
building for this purpose, and agreed. Later, politi-
cians got him to withdraw. Rambelli and Albergani
backed by Romano, then got agreement (verbal?)
High Commission. But 1 Sept. '44 Capt. Pini said
no need to go to Palermo. The government opposed
it and insisted to remain named for school use.
It continued to remain named for school use.

7 Oct. 44 R.C. Unity called back to High Commission
and agreed that if other suitable temporary
resolution cannot be found, solution might occupy
agreement with (the Colonization) without involving
structural changes after three months original duration is
reconstructed, government plans & publications are being
produced. (This cable commanded after 7 Oct. 1944
that on 15 Sept. Minister of Agriculture ordered project
of organization building representatives by Koguma for price guarantee
"by which building remains to have 2000 pupils. Please continue
to Ministry Education and Agriculture to make presentation under a project")

1. ACC are very anxious that all Schools and Universities should revert to their normal use as soon as possible. It is reported that several buildings of the University at CATANIA are still occupied by troops.

2. The buildings of this University which are particularly desired as soon as possible are:-

- (a) The Palazzo, which normally housed the library, secretariat, Rector's Offices and the Schools of Law, appears to be used by the British YMCA, with the exception of the library and secretariat.
- (b) The Botanical Gardens are reported to be used by Welfare Services, 56 Area, and are being used at the present time as a billet for only 12 ORs.

3. Please arrange for this matter to be examined with a view to alternative accommodation being found for troops occupying these buildings.

SUBJECT: De-requisitioning of University of CATANIA.

TO : Headquarters, Allied Armies in Italy.

1. Although a year has passed since the commencement of the Sicilian invasion, the University of CATANIA, the first Italian University to re-open under Allied auspices, is still seriously hampered in its activities by the occupancy of its premises by our troops.
2. (a) The Palazzo which normally housed the library, secretariat, Rector's offices, and the schools of Law and of Letters, is used by the British YMCA, with the sole exceptions of the library and secretariat (the former is without chairs).
(b) The Botanical Gardens and their buildings are now in the hands of the Army Welfare Services, 56 Area. On latest inspection, the building of the Botanical Gardens much needed for scientific work, was used as a billet for twelve soldiers.
3. Now that the Allied garrison in Sicily has been much reduced it is probably possible, although perhaps inconvenient, to find alternative accommodation for these two welfare organisations. While hesitating to disturb the amenities of Allied troops the resuscitation of education is a responsibility of this Commission and I therefore would ask that the University be de-requisitioned as soon as possible, in any case before 1st September so that it may be made ready for the new term.

SUBJECT : Dorequisitioning of Catania University.

1. While in Region I recently I visited Catania University as you know both the Minister of Public Instruction and our higher authorities are exercised about the matter.

2. I found that the Palazzo normally housed the library, Secretariat, Rector's Offices, and schools of law and letters. At present only the library and Secretariat are available and the library is without chairs. The remainder of the building is used by the Y.M.C.A. (British). The Botanical gardens and its building is in the hands of the Army Welfare Services 56 Area. When I was there 12 soldiers were using the building as a billet. However, a truck was being unloaded and I found that they proposed to set up a welfare library and lounges.

3. The situation is a disgrace to Allied Arms and should be corrected. The town has many over-lapping services and if that were not so other buildings should be used for welfare purposes. In short, my estimate is that there is no excuse for any use of the University at this stage of our occupation. Certainly all Commands should be interested in encouraging the best in the Italian Culture.

4. I reported the situation to Lt.Col. Giles of our local Command. He called Brigadier Cripps hoping to forestall the re-occupation of the Botanical gardens. The Brigadier would not act whereupon we concluded that we could only take it to District 3 or higher far solution.

5. Since it has already been referred to ACC HQ. by Region I, I am giving a copy of this to Lt.Col. T.V. Smith, Director of Education, with the recommendation that he take action through liaison channels.

6. Am ^{sorrry} to have missed seeing you while in Region I. You will find my written report to you in your files. I stand ready to take any action here that you indicate.

SUBJECT: Non-Educational Occupancy of Schools and
other Buildings of Cultural Importance.


TO : Colonel Sears, I.B.S.

1. The occupancy of university and school buildings by the armed forces was inevitable and necessary in the earlier phases of our occupation of this island. However, since 1 December 1943 when universities and schools were reopened, military occupancy of some of these buildings has handicapped the Italian educational program. The head of your Real Estate Division has agreed in principle but, like my Divisions, has been unable to make much progress because of the lack of a definitive directive.

2. The Allied Cause would be furthered if you would issue a directive to the effect that where possible all such buildings should be vacated as soon as practicable.

3. The military control of the Teatro Massimo is a special case. Its functions should be gradually transferred to civilian responsibility under the general supervision of our Division of Education which represents the appropriate Italian Ministry.

4. Will you please let me know what can be done to solve this problem. I shall be glad to have appropriate officers review this situation with you in detail if you would like additional information.
