1) Instructional programs in Japanese Province are progressing fairly rapidly. 54 schools of 74 commence have been opened and are functioning, 52 other courses will open as soon as S.S. completed Vetting.

Plans have been made to open fields and supplementary schools Sept. 1 professional education has been started.

2) All schools are functioning normally in Japanese Province. The school year is being completed. The examination program for students who wish to enter Port University has been developed by the Provincial Board of Education. The present Board University, Tohoku, Miyagi, Niigata and Yamagata provinces were either closed for several months or still up these provinces were closed for summer vacation. This gives past students extensive additional time of preparation before Sept. 1 time for reorganizing school programs before Sept. 1

3) Schools as soon as possible to schools of Japanese and English instruction. 4) Schools for opening sessions also in the Japanese Province in Tottori, Yamaguchi and Hyogo. 5) New established temporary in Tottori. Request you send all information to that office.

INTRODUCTION

During the month of February the Education Division of Abruzzi-Marche conducted two inspection tours of the Provveditorati in the Region.

In the early part of February Dott. Pietro MEZZETTI, Civilian Education Specialist, inspected the Provveditorati of Ancona, Ascoli, Macerata, and Pesaro submitting to the Regional Education Officer a brief report on the functioning of each.

Major CARLETON W. WASHBURN, Director of Education Subcommission, Allied Commission, accompanied by the Regional Education Officer and the Civilian Education Specialist visited schools and Provveditorati in all provinces in Abruzzi-Marche, except Teramo, where the Provveditore has been on a month's leave of absence.

ITEM OF INTEREST

Major CARLETON W. WASHBURN, Director of Education Subcommission made a tour of Abruzzi-Marche Region with the Regional Education Officer and the Civilian Education Specialist Feb. 20 to 24, 1945.

Provveditorati and many types of schools were visited.

A few interesting incidents are herein related:

a) A visit to several technical and industrial schools revealed that they had a below average attendance - equipped to handle many more students than were actually enrolled. Outstanding was the fact that exercises showed static and rather antiquated methods of procedure.

b) At the newly established "Educatorio Provinciale" of Ascoli we found that a number of Fascist text books, intact with pictures of "il Duce" were still being used.

c) At the "R. Scuola di Magistero Professionale per la Donna" of L'Aquila a teacher gave us one of the best Fascist salutes ever given both upon entering and leaving the class room.

d) At the University of Camerino we set through a large portion of the oral examinations in Botany which were in session to a large number of first year Botany students. Seriousness of effort and some excellent preparation on the part of students were evident. Also an atmosphere of real interest existed on the part of professors participating.

e) At the Fine Arts School of Urbino and the Fine Arts School of Macerata the usefulness of both schools was demonstrated through the practical projects created by the students attending.

f) In a small rural school of Macerata Province we found the teacher using the new text books with about one to every two or three students. The attendance was good.

The visit of Major WASHBURNE was planned to have as its main objective the purpose of coordinating the work of the Education Subcommission with that of the Regional Education Division and the Provveditore agli Studi.

The main topics discussed with each Provveditore were:

- a) Program for text book distribution to each province.
- b) Paper requirements for printing of sufficient "quaderni" for present needs.
- c) "Gioventu' Italiana" activities -- future status in relation to Italian education.
- d) Development of "Boy and Girl Scout" activities through the two newly established Italian scout associations.
- e) Requisitioning and opening of schools.
- f) Essential materials needed to keep schools functioning, such as books etc. which were either taken by the Germans or by others, or destroyed in the war process.
- g) School Lunches Program -- more emphasis on the part which the public school must play in order to make the program of wider scope.

UNIVERSITIES

The attached statistical report shows the general situation of the three universities in Marche Region: Camerino, Macerata, and Urbino universities.

Each university inaugurated the 1944-45 academic year in February.

a) University of Camerino: 8th Army troops occupied the University of Camerino during part of January and until February 18, 1945.

The school has started its academic year with a considerable enrollment increase.

A "Sezione Straordinaria" of examinations (Feb. 15-28) was held for the benefit of students not able to take the fall examinations.

b) University of Macerata: The University of Macerata is still occupied by 8th Army troops. The university is holding classes at the "Pinacoteca Comunale" (Communal library).

Some of the more essential text books have been moved from the university library to the "Pinacoteca" for normal functioning of the school.

c) University of Urbino: The University of Urbino is not occupied by troops.

It is now functioning; however, its attendance is limited to students of Urbino only, since travel to Urbino is rather difficult.

"Esami di concorso" for the school of "Magistero" will begin in the early part of March, since of the 350 openings only 113 applications were received.

SCHOOL LUNCHES

The Regional Supply Office has furnished the following data on the number of children receiving school lunches in the eight provinces of Abruzzi-Marche Region:

TEACHER SALARIES

The economic situation of the teaching personnel is at the lowest ebb possible.

A teacher "supplente" (replacement) receives L. 1475 per month; a teacher "di ruolo" receives L. 1700 per month. The above figures are self explanatory - it is evident that many teachers cannot live of honest labor alone and that their enthusiasm for the profession cannot be at its best!

REQUISITIONING

The release of school buildings throughout region on the part of military authorities, both Allied and Italian, has not changed since the last month's report.

In Macerata, Ancona, Pesaro, and Fano the greatest majority of schools are occupied by Allied troops. In Ascoli and Teramo a large number of schools are occupied by Italian troops.

In Fescara, the Provveditore agli Studi has been able to get the release of more premises and reports that on March 1st all schools will be functioning regularly.

Wherever schools are requisitioned Provveditori have opened schools in improvised quarters. The Provveditori of Ancona, Macerata, and Pesaro have been very successful in finding temporary premises, and recently also the Provveditore of Pescara.

EPURATION

School epuration proceedings in this Region are about completed. The Hearing Committees (advisory to the R.E.O.) have helped immensely toward the defascistization of the Italian schools. However, in order to give to the work done its full value it is necessary that the Committees provided by DLL 159 be named as soon as possible.

The Provincial Commissioner of Pesaro Province reports that action on further epuration of teaching personnel cannot be carried out because lacking the necessary legal tools (General Order No.35 and DLL 159) which permit the suspension of state employees.

The Ministry of Public Instruction dismissed the Provveditore agli Studi of L'Aquila without first consulting with the Education Subcommission and the Regional Education Officer. (It had been agreed in writing by the Minister that he would consult with the Education Subcommission before taking dismissal steps against any Provveditore agli Studi appointed by the Education Division).

Provveditore agli Studi of L'Aquila, Prof. Cleto CROSTA, is alleged to have been "Ante Marcia" - a qualification which he received because he was a member of the "combattenti" (World War I veterans) - but actually inscribed in the party as of 1923, and to have held various positions in Fascist school associations.

Item of interest: Dismissal of said Provveditore was instigated by the National Committee of Liberation and by the "Associazione Partigiani d'Italia". The latter in its denunciation letter suggested that Prof. CROSTA be dismissed for the above reasons and that in his place be named the ex Provveditore agli Studi of L'Aquila, Avvocato Guido MESTICA. Guido MESTICA is the author of several volumes on Fascism. The most important and most descriptive are: 1) "Incontro con la Cultura", 2) "Diarario Eroico", and 3) "la Cultura Fascista". He was also a member of the Federal Fascist Council, and "Fiduciario of the Istituto di Cultura Fascista" !!

Upon request from the R.E.O. the dismissal was temporarily canceled, giving both the Provveditore and the R.E.O. the opportunity to submit a statement in regard to the existing situation. The Ministry of Public Instruction has now submitted the epuration practice to this office and has agreed that the action of dismissal previously taken was not in accord with existing policy.

TEXT BOOKS

Wholesale distribution of text books will take place during the first two weeks of March.

TRANSPORTATION

Provveditori agli Studi in Italian Government territory although they may have a car at their disposal cannot make full use of it because the budget allotment

for this purpose by the Ministry of Public Instruction has been sufficient only for one or two short trips.

STATISTICAL REPORT

The Statistical Report for the month is complete. It includes the school situation of all provinces in region.

It has been attentively compiled. Its accuracy is quite reliable since this is the fourth such report requested by each Provveditore agli Studi giving time for collection of data even from the remotest zones of each province.

Pesaro Province is now functioning almost to normality. All elementary schools wherever possible are open. Secondary schools opened February 15 in localities where the Provveditore was able to locate needed premises. The statistical report from Pesaro has shown continuous progress in the opening of schools, however, it is incomplete particularly as it relates to attendance and number of teachers on the job. This will affect somewhat the total picture rendered in the statistical data attached.

CONCLUSION

The best school situation yet noticed in Region may be reported for this month and the next. All elementary and secondary schools, where at all possible, are functioning in both cities and rural districts throughout Abruzzi-Marche.

The distribution to all schools of the new text books during the first part of March will eliminate the use of purged and not purged Fascist text books which are still in circulation.

RECOMMENDATIONS

That the Epuration Committees described in DLL 159 be named immediately for each province where the Epuration Decree has been implemented.

That General Order No. 35 be implemented for Pesaro Province.

INTRODUCTION

During the first week of January 1945 the Regional Education Officer attended the periodical Education Subcommission Meeting which was held at Florence.

In January the Regional Education Officer made two complete tours of the Abruzzi-Marche Region checking the functioning of Provveditorati and of schools. On both tours he was accompanied by the Regional Civilian Education Specialist.

An unusually heavy snow precipitation throughout the Region hampered communications and caused the closing of many schools. In the provinces of l'Aquila, Ascoli, Chieti, and Pesca-ra the Provveditori closed schools for periods ranging from a few days to several weeks.

PESARO PROVINCE

The new Provveditore agli Studi for Pesaro Province, Prof. ARMANDO FERRI, imported for the job from Littoria Province, (17 Jan. 1945), was introduced to his new task of reopening the Pesaro schools. The R.E.O. and the Civilian Education Specialist spent several days with him visiting the important school centers of the Province.

During the first ten days on the job Provveditore FERRI¹⁹⁴

accomplished the following:

- Item of Interest: a) Named a committee to study the school situation in Pesaro city. The committee, composed of the Prefect, Sindaco, and three parents achieved immediately its paramount objective - that of finding premises for both elementary and secondary schools in Pesaro city. (See chart No.1)
- b) Moved the offices of the Provveditorato from Fermignano to Pesaro city.
- c) Completed the "graduatoria" of "supplenti" teachers. (Ex-Provveditore DONINI began the "graduatoria", and opened a large number of elementary schools throughout the Province - he resigned for health reasons).

SCHOOL LUNCHES

The attached statistical report, on chart No.3, shows that more communes in Region have taken advantage of the school lunches during the month of January.

The figures submitted by the Provveditori agli Studi, however, do not correspond with those submitted by the Regional Supply Office. The following figures were taken from the most recent reports of the Supply Section:

The above totals represent advanced requests of communes, whereas, the Provveditori have submitted the number of children which are actually receiving the lunches - information which may also not be up to date.

The Provveditori of Region report 50 communes being served with a total of 3706 children receiving school lunches.

GLASS FOR SCHOOLS

The glass survey to determine the amount of glass needed to replace broken windows of school buildings has been completed in seven⁽¹⁾ of the eight provinces of Abruzzi-Marche Region.

The glass requirements are as follows:

TEXT BOOKS

Elementary School text books have arrived and are on sale at important "librerie" of most provinces in Region.

Item of Interest: The Provveditore agli Studi of Macerata (on the job!) denounced two "librerie" for selling the new text books at 20 lire above established price. The Questura confiscated over 300 volumes. Meanwhile, a request by the R.E.O. released the confiscated books to the Provveditorato for immediate sale.

SCHOOL PROGRAMS

School personnel throughout Region is commenting most favorably the new school programs. Particularly well prepared are considered those for the elementary schools.

REQUISITIONING OF SCHOOLS

The situation created in Macerata and Ancona during ¹⁹⁴² the month of December 1944 by the Army requisitioning all schools has not eased.

This criminal act was not attributed (with certainty) to student action, yet at a moment when glass is not available, particularly for schools, poor student leadership caused the incident.

CIVILIAN EDUCATION SPECIALIST

Dott. PIETRO MEZZETTI has toured the Region with the R.E.O. to carry out his principal task of coordinating the work of Provveditori in A.M.G. territory. He has been of invaluable help in solving many problems having the experience, good judgment, and thorough knowledge of school laws and procedures.

MONTHLY STATISTICAL REPORT

Provveditori agli Studi have submitted the most accurate data yet received by this office on the school situation of the entire Region. (Charts No.2 and 3).

In the Statistical Report all eight provinces in Region are included.

Pesaro province will submit more complete data as more schools open; however, no figures were given on present status of secondary schools as to enrollment and number of teachers on the job, since they are not yet functioning.

All data given in this report has been compiled with calculating machine for accuracy!

CONCLUSION

Schools are open and functioning according to physical possibilities and efficiency of school personnel available.

In many provinces children are attending classes sporadically for lack of proper winter clothing.

Presidi, professors, teachers speak of the deficiencies of the Italian Education System. They are eager

to learn of the progress made by other countries in this field. The demand for imported literature on the subject is great.

Item of Interest: In mud and snow a young elementary school teacher hiked from Fano to Fermignano (approximately 35 Km) to ask the Provveditore for a teaching position - her qualifications were good and was placed accordingly. (The R.E.O. gave her transportation back to Fano). There are people in Italy who still want to work!

Since many zones have been completely isolated from Provincial headquarters, because of heavy snows, it is difficult to have "last minute" accurate information on the total situation.

RECOMMENDATION

That the Civilian Education Specialist be given the responsibility of carrying on the Regional Education Division's work when Allied personnel is withdrawn for service in Northern Regions.

PATRONATO SCOLASTICO

In Ascoli and in Pescara the Provveditori have re-organized the "Patronato Scolastico".

In both these provinces the "Patronato" is supporting the promotion of the school lunches project. In Ascoli it has taken an individual interest in the acquisition and distribution of "quaderni". (The Provveditore of Pescara reports that he has organized the "Patronato", but has not yet received instructions from the Ministry of Public Instruction).

BOY SCOUTS

The first Boy Scouts troop in Region has been established at Macerata. The Provveditore was elected president of the organization committee.

STUDENT STRIKES

At Chieti secondary school students held several demonstrations requesting the Provveditore agli Studi to close schools during the cold weather. The Provveditore with the assistance of the Prefect and the "Questura" stood fast. (Chieti schools all have glass and some of them are heated; therefore, they were not closed. The Provveditore, however, when the real need arose closed several schools according to Ministerial directive, but he did not heed to student pressure).

Item of Interest: On January 8th through 12th students of Teramo secondary schools went on strike asking that schools be closed during the cold weather. Since the Teramo schools all have glass and are partially heated the Provveditore in conference with the Prefect and professors agreed that it was not sufficiently cold to warrant the closing of all schools. The Provveditore notified the students of the action taken. The students refused to accept and kept up their demonstration. On January 11th at 19,30 two infernal machines exploded causing considerable damage to two schools:

a) The Convito-Liceo, breaking almost all windows and damaging fixtures.

b) The Istituto Magistrale, breaking part of its glass and also window fixtures.

INTRODUCTION

During the month of December the Regional Education Officer made three tours of Abruzzi-Marche Region. Dott. Pietro Mezzetti, Regional Civilian Specialist in Education, accompanied by the Regional Education Officer on one tour was introduced to the problems facing the schools in both Italian Government and Allied Military Government territory.

The Provveditore agli Studi of Teramo Province was replaced with Professor Mario FERRARA former Provveditore agli Studi of Campobasso as per request of R.E.O. Provveditore FERRARA has taken a good hold of the difficult administrative situation which had developed in this Province after the appointment of an inefficient school official.

The need for glass and fuel for schools is wide-spread throughout the Region. However, schools will not close. They will function during the winter months closing only in those localities where heating is impossible and where no other premises are available.

DEFASCISM

The A.M.G. Hearing Committees for suspended school personnel were dissolved in the Provinces of l'Aquila, Chieti, Pescara, and Teramo effective 7 December 1944.

The above action left approximately one-hundred suspended school employees' cases pending, awaiting decision by Italian Government Epuration Committees to be established as per DLL 159.

PURGING OF SCHOOL LIBRARIES

During this month a new drive got under way in the confiscation and purging of textbooks and of other Fascist literature in school libraries. Provveditori agli Studi report that the renewed effort has had some success.

REQUISITIONING

In the cities of Macerata and Ancona all schools but one in each city, including the offices of the Provveditorato, have been requisitioned by 8th Army units.

In Macerata city the Provveditore agli Studi through the cooperation of Presidi, Sindaco, and Prefect was able to reopen all schools on a full schedule - he utilized convents, orphanages, churches, and religious institutions for temporary school premises.

The Provveditore of Ancona was less fortunate. The Liceo Ginnasio, Istituto Magistrale, and Istituto Tecnico Nautico of Ancona were forced to close. In this city schools are functioning at reduced schedule and in two shifts.

All schools are requisitioned at Pesaro, Fano, and Camerino - (The University of Camerino was not occupied).

The University of Macerata, recently occupied by Allied troops, has found a way to carry on its work. Classes will begin as scheduled on January 10, 1945 (The Universities of Camerino and Urbino will also open on the same date).

SCHOOL LUNCHES

The School Lunches Project is not moving along satisfactorily. Poorer Communes find it difficult to finance the project.

The American Red Cross has cooperated in developing community interest in planning for the serving of school lunches - particularly in the Province of Chieti.

SCHOOL PROGRAMS

The new School Programs sent to the Regional Education Officer by the Education Subcommission have been distributed according to the attached chart.

PESARO PROVINCE

The Provveditore agli Studi was requested to move the offices of the Provveditorato from Fermignano to Pesaro city by 8 January 1944, in order to be in closer contact with all Provincial Headquarters.

Approximately 50 per cent of the Asili and Elementary schools are open.

All Secondary schools are closed. Examinations will be held from January 4 - 10, 1945, and schools will open 15 February 1945.

To date 67 teachers have been suspended for political reasons in this province.

Lt. Col. Nichols former Provincial Commissioner for Ancona-Pesaro Provinces asked Major G.R. Koopman to investigate activities at the University of Urbino. Major Koopman has submitted a brief report of his findings to the R.E.O.

ITEMS OF INTEREST

The Provveditore agli Studi of Chieti Province has experimented with the idea of raising funds for school reconstruction purposes. He originated and started the "Giornata della Scuola" in the two communes of Castelfrentano and Fossacessio - in the former £10,000 were collected and in the latter £24,000. The success achieved in these two communes has encouraged the Provveditore to promote the project throughout the Province. The "Giornata della Scuola" will begin January 15 and will end March 31, 1945.

In Ascoli Piceno the American Red Cross representative and the R.E.O. promoted the reorganization of a newly established "Educatorio Provinciale" housing about 180 poor children attending schools at Ascoli. Conferences were held with the Prefect, Provveditore, and other city officials - it was decided upon an organization managed by a community-wide committee, rather than a private "ente", composed of representatives from school, provincial administration, and E.C.A. (Ente Comunale Assistenza).

The University of Urbino is offering language courses (English and Slavic languages) to adults at evening classes and an Italian course for Allied troops.

Students of the Istituto Tecnico Commerciale of L'Aquila went on strike several times this month asking that their Preside, who has been justly suspended for political reasons, be permitted to direct the School for the year 1944-1945. The same students several months ago petitioned for the suspension of the same Preside!

MONTHLY STATISTICAL REPORT

The attached statistical report of December is more complete and accurate than that submitted for the month of November.

All eight provinces of Abruzzi-Marche Region are represented.

The lack of data on present status of Secondary school personnel and students in Pesaro Province will slightly affect the totals under "Present Enrollment" and "Number of teachers now teaching."

The total number of "Schede Personali" submitted by teachers in Pesaro Province will be affected also by the procedure adopted by LT. Col. Nichols, P.C. of Pesaro (without consulting with R.E.O.) in requiring that all teachers submit a "scheda".

CONCLUSION

The great amount of snow which has fallen in the Region during the last week of 1944 will affect school functioning greatly. The month of January will tell!

Schools have closed for Christmas holidays and will reopen on 7 January 1945.

Generally the school situation is promising. The Provveditori are at their job carrying on their tasks in earnest - often faced by most difficult barriers.

RECOMMENDATION

The Italian Government must be urged to establish Epuration Committees as per DLL 159 as soon as possible to decide the cases of suspended school personnel in Provinces recently passed to Italian Government jurisdiction.

The use of Dott. MEZZETTI's ability, knowledge of the Italian school system, experience as a Provveditore agli Studi, and as Regional Inspector will be of great value to the education program in the Region.

Prof. EZIO OFFICIO, Preside (Comendato) Liceo Gimnasio di Ascoli has been appointed Provveditore agli Studi (Reggente) for Ascoli-Piceno Province on Nov. 25, 1944. Provveditore OFFICIO is well qualified to hold the position of Provveditore.

REQUISITIONING OF SCHOOLS

In both Marche and Abruzzi many schools have been requisitioned recently by 8th Army units. In most centers requisitioning has not been promiscuous.

In Macerata, however, all schools including the Provveditorato agli Studi, with the exception of the "Scuola d'Arte" to which the Provveditorato moved were requisitioned.

The University of Macerata was completely occupied by 8th Army. Unless other premises are found for the school's administration offices the University will be forced to remain closed for the duration of the occupation.

8th Army agreed that the library halls of the University where many valuable books are stacked will not be used as dormitories, that if the University officials so desire they will be given ample time to move the books to a safer storage place.

SCHOOL LUNCHES

A statistical report on the number of communes and the children in Region taking advantage of the School Lunches Program is not yet available.

The Prefects, Sindaci, Provveditori agli Studi, other school personnel concerned, and the Provincial Supply Officers report that some interest has been shown and that specific information will soon be known.

Many communes throughout the Region reply that they lack the facilities for preparing and serving of the lunches. They are also not very enthusiastic over the taste of this type of dehydrated food, lacking, furthermore, salt and olive

oil or other fats to improve the taste!

PESCARO PROVINCE

The first news from Pescaro Province on the progress made by the Provveditore agli Studi in the reopening of schools is encouraging. (Statistical date is not yet available).

Many elementary schools have opened wherever possible. All "scuole medie" are closed and will reopen with the new year.

To date the Provveditore agli Studi has suspended 35 school employees for political reasons.

The purging and confiscation of text books is in progress.

The Hearing Committee established for the epuration of the staff of the University of Urbino will do also the work for the public schools. The Committee is now functioning.

CONCLUSION

During the month of November the schools of the Region functioned at top efficiency in direct ratio to the many limitations facing the administrative force and the

teachers in the field.

The deficiencies existing in the Italian school system on teacher selection have been enhanced by the thousands of "supplenti" who request that they be given a position without possessing the necessary qualifications, and use all the "pull" that they can muster in order to be assigned a "sede". Hundreds of teachers who are not fit to teach are employed for varied reasons without the proper qualifications for teaching.

Political parties are beginning to take an interest in the public schools.

A marked interest has been shown particularly by the Communist Party through its "Alto Commissario Provinciale Aggiunto per l'Educazione". (The "Alto Commissario" in each of the following provinces is a member of the Communist Party: Ancona, Aquila, Ascoli, Chieti, Macerata, Pescara, and Teramo).

In the four provinces recently passed to Italian Government the "Alto Commissario" has contacted with marked emphasis the Provveditori agli Studi. The "Alto Commissario" of Chieti has begun to suspend public school teachers. The "Alto Commissario" of Ascoli and Macerata have tried to put pressure on the Provveditore agli Studi. All in all there are definite trends of political infiltration into a rather susceptible and easy target - the Italian public school!

I. ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOLS

A. INTRODUCTION

In Abruzzi-Marche region the provinces of L'Aquila, Chieti, Pescara, and Teramo were turned over to the jurisdiction of the Italian Government on October 15, 1944.

The job of reopening the schools, purging of textbooks, and declassification of personnel, is about completed in these provinces.

In the northern provinces of L'Aquila, Amone, and Pescara the reopening of all schools is a more herculean task because 8th Army units have occupied many school buildings which they may retain for the entire winter. The Army is also attempting to requisition school buildings in the provinces of Teramo and Ascoli for use as winter rest camps.

The provinces of Amone and Teramo are under 8th Army jurisdiction. The Provincial Commissioner for both provinces has asked the Education Officer to begin work in these provinces as soon as possible.

I. MILITARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOLS

A. INTRODUCTION

In Abruzzi-Marche Region the provinces of L'Aquila, Chieti, Pescara, and Teramo were turned over to the jurisdiction of the Italian Government on October 15, 1944.

The job of reopening the schools, bringing of textbooks, and declassification of personnel is about completed in these provinces.

In the northern provinces of Foggia, Avellino, and Potenza the re-opening of all schools is a more burdensome task because the Army tanks have occupied many school buildings which they may retain for the entire winter. The Army is also attempting to requisition school buildings in the provinces of Pescara and Isernia for use as winter rest camps.

The provinces of Avellino and Potenza are under 8th Army jurisdiction. The Provincial Commissioner for both provinces has asked the Education Division to begin work in these provinces as soon as possible.

A. A.M.G. Education Personnel

1. Major Charles J. Birt, Regional Education Officer, Marche-Abruzzi Region, was reassigned for duty. He left Sept. 26, 1944.

2. 2nd Lieutenant John P. Simoni was appointed Regional Education Officer as of Sept. 29, 1944.

B. General Information

3. In all provinces of Marche-Abruzzi Region (Aquila, Ancona, Ascoli, Chieti, Macerata, Pescara, and Teramo) the "Provveditorato" is functioning and schools are reopening.

4. The "Provveditore agli Studi" of Pescara, Luigi Polacchi, was dismissed Sept. 13, 1944, (appointed 4 August 44), according to Educational Directive No.2, Appendix A, Par.1-t. He had been a very active propagandist for the "Istituto di Cultura Fascista".

5. Colangelo Silvio, Ex-Provveditore of Ancona, was appointed "Provveditore agli Studi" for Pescara Sept. 13, but before he took office a report showed that he was "Sciarpa Littorio"; therefore, he was suspended immediately.

6. During the absence of a "Provveditore" for the Province of Pescara the responsibility for the reopening of schools was given to the 1st Secretary of the "Provveditorato".

7. Attempts were made to locate a capable and politically acceptable individual qualified for the position of "Provveditore agli Studi" for Pescara Province, but having exhausted all local possibilities the Education Subcommission was called upon to furnish a "Provveditore".

8. Neither the Education Subcommission or the Ministry of Public Instructions had available immediately a suitable person for the position as "Provveditore agli Studi" for Pescara Province. The Education Officer is considering se-¹⁶⁴

veral candidates one of which may successfully fill the vacancy.

9. In Chieti Province the difficulty over the appointment of the Provincial Hearing Committee with the Prefect and the "Comitato di Liberazione" was settled. The "Provveditore" named the Committee.

10. The vetting of teaching personnel is about completed in all provinces. The Provincial Hearing Committee is now functioning in the Provinces of Ascoli, Chieti, Pescara, and Teramo.

11. The elementary and secondary schools have opened in the following provinces:

a; Teramo Province - Opened Sept. 16, 1944.

b; Ascoli Province - Opened Sept. 25, 1944.

12. Text-books and school programs are needed for all provinces in Marche-Abruzzi Region. The "Provveditori" will encourage all personnel to use imagination until books etc. are available.

13. Eighth Army Rear asked Education Officer to begin work in Pesaro Province. Work will begin the coming week.

1. Work in connection with the opening of elementary schools in the area of Catanduanes jointly controlled by Region 4 and 8th Army was started about the 1st of May. Since that time the schools in 54 of the 152 communes of the province have been authorized to function, and those in 59 other communes have been opened since 1944, pending final report on authority by the P.G.S., as of June 1st, 1944, and for the months of June and July. The schools in 11 communes, namely: S. Angelo de Lucca, Macapatan, Samal, Tuguegarao, and Villanueva, have opened, pending final report on authority by the P.G.S., as of June 1st, 1944, and for the months of June and July. The schools in 11 communes, Pangan, Castel S. Lorenzo, Sibonga, Sibonga, and Villanueva are not open for military reasons as of the date of this report.

2. 6. Suspended personnel are not paid, but 1/3 of the stipend is granted to needy families under the provisions of Italian law.

7. Instructions have been issued to the Provveditore and Directors to whom he has delegated the power to nominate supplenti, to use refugee teachers in the localities where they are available rather than requesting the return of teachers from other provinces.

8. In a number of cases school personnel have been authorized to accept employment by ACC and detached from school duties for the balance of this year, particularly where their services were their services were not required in view of closed schools.

9. Texts and quaderni which have been made available by ACC head-quarters are in the possession of distribution. Ink, chalk, pencils and other necessary school materials are exceeding difficult to obtain and sources of these materials in other towns must be found. 13. An investigation has been made into the possible use of the worthwhile activities carried on by "Dopplevoro" in previous times, and some interesting material has been developed. 14. Former physical education instructors under the O.I.J. who have been vetted were transferred to the teaching staff. A program of physical education and adult recreation is in process of planning for the province.

15. Many of the conditions which would be required for operation at home are impossible to obtain at the present time, but C.A.O.'s and army officials generally have been most helpful in obtaining school-rooms, in arranging for estimates of necessary repairs, and in getting funds to realize the responsibilities which devolve upon them under Italian law in connection with provisions and maintenance of school buildings.

I. INTRODUCTION

1. In Region 5 the "Provveditorato" is now functioning and is working toward the re-opening of all public schools not later than Oct. 1, in the following Provinces : Aquile, Ancone, Ascoli-Piceno, Chieti, Lacerata, Pescara and Teramo.

2. The following are the "Provveditori agli Studi" (Regenti) for each province :

- a) AQUILA Cleto Crosta (Ex-Provveditore of Foggia)
- b) ANCONA Rocco Fedele (Preside Liceo Scientifico, Ancona)
- c) ASCOLI Pietro Mezzetti (Inspector General, Ministry of Ed.)
- d) CHIETI Giuseppe Russo (1st Secretary-Prov., Chieti)
- e) LACERATA Giuseppe Borgiani (Provveditore, Macerata)
- f) PESCARA Luigi Polacchi (Prof. of Letters, Pescara)
- g) TERAMO Antonio Di Giuseppe (Prof. of Letters, Teramo)

3. The most damaged provinces are those of Pescara, Ancona and Chieti. Work in Ancona Province can be carried on only below the established line of circulation. 90% of all schools are occupied by either military units or refugees. The schools in all other provinces can readily be placed into working order and according to "Provveditori" this job is well underway.

4. The Education Officers were fortunate to have temporary transportation available to cover this large area. Without transportation the education job in Region 5 could be done ! We hope for the best in the future.

II. VETTING

1. In all provinces the vetting of school personnel is well on the way to completion. Available data at this time received from several provinces show that the following number (not final) of school officials and teachers have been suspended according to instructions given in Educational Directive No.2 - Appendix "A" :

A.O.C. record cards will be forwarded on all suspended personnel and duplicate lists kept by the Regional Education Officer and "Provveditore".

2. Since the "Scheda Personale" form has been found incomplete and inadequate for the vetting of school personnel the following information was requested be added to the "Scheda" by each person vetted:

- a) Record of books written.
- b) Written or compiled articles or books, etc., on Fascism or against the Allies.
- c) Present membership in political parties.
- d) Statement giving date of oath or membership to the Fascist Republican Government.

3. In the provinces of Teramo, Ascoli, and Macerata an unusual number of "presidi" and other school officials were found to have taken the oath of allegiance to the Fascist Republican Government. Under the Italian law decree published in "Gazzetta Ufficiale N°41", Suspension is required of all teachers taking this oath. If applied it would mean suspension of entire teaching body in some of these provinces. There is definite evidence the oath was taken under duress.

4. The rapid and continuous shifting of T.S.S. units in this area creates a vetting situation which makes it difficult to get immediate, complete, and accurate reports on each individual "Scheda". For this reason the total vetting job for the Region may be delayed of several weeks.

5. The Italian decree on vetting of all government employees approved for immediate application by Brigadier Lush and received by all "Provveditorati" has created a contrasting situation with the Educational Directive No. 2 "A". Since Brigadier Lush's statement does not specifically annul Art. 25 of the decree this Education Office will continue to use Educational Directive No. 2 "A" until the situation has been cleared.

III. PURGING OF TEXT BOOKS

1. The "Provveditore" of each province has carried out all instructions regarding the purging of Fascist literature and text books. Each Prefect has issued the requested decree on the confiscation of Fascist books. 3. The Regional Commissioner has approved the Price List of Secondary school text books Your Ref. 4/ED/2.9 - letter of 21 August 1944. Copies are being sent to all "Provveditorii" for distribution to book dealers in provinces.

IV. ORGANIZATION OF SCHOOLS

1. The decree on the transfer of provincial education instructors (GIL) to the regular school program has been issued by the Prefect of each province in this Region. The "Provveditorii" are now occupied in the vetting and classification of these instructors.
2. Hearing Commissions for suspended personnel have been established and are ready to function in the provinces of Teramo, Ascoli, Macerata, Ancona, Aquila and Pescara. These Commissions were appointed before the de-fascistization decree of July 29, 1944, was issued by the Italian Government. This decree was called to our attention, August 28.

Since a Hearing Commission was not yet set up at Chieti, the Prefect of Chieti has decided to await clarification on Brig. Lush's statement before he takes action.

3. Examination session will begin on Sept. 1 in the Provinces of Chieti, Teramo and Ascoli-Piceno with classes opening on Sept. 18. In the provinces of Pescara, Aquila, Macerata and Ancona examination will start on Sept. 15, and classes will open on Oct. 2, 1944.
4. Co-operation has been offered by the American Red Cross Regional Director and Field Personnel in the planning and carrying out of immunization and school lunch programs. As soon as the major job of re-opening the schools is finished the above tasks will be next on our organization schedule.

5. The shifting of military units in several of the provinces may hold up momentarily the re-opening of schools since most available school buildings are used by troops and the uncertainty of requisitioning and the ~~de~~quisitioning prevents definite planning for making the schools available.

V. FINANCE

1. Back payment of school personnel will be based upon the Regional Finance Officer's circular R 5.512/D/1 of 12 August 1944.
2. "Provveditori egli Studi" of all provinces are submitting either yearly or quarterly budgets on required finance forms provided by and according to requests of each Provincial Finance Officer.

VI. MISCELLANEOUS

1. An outline of working procedures was prepared for the attention of Provincial Commissioners and the use of all "Provveditori". The working procedures compiled by the Education Officers are a result of many weeks of field work dictated by experiences and based upon specific needs which have arisen. (copy attached)

2. The Rector of the University of Lacerata and the Camerino University were interviewed and reports on the standing of each institution were submitted with letter of 25 August 1944 to the Education Sub-Commission. We are awaiting further instructions.

3. The "Provveditore egli Studi" of Aquila on his first inspection tour of the province discovered serious irregularities in the administrative records of examinations and abilitation degrees of the "Istituto Magistrale Paricato" of Sulmona, Aquila Province, given the years 1942-43, 1943-44. He confiscated all school registers, and upon examining the Education Officer having seen Art. 96 of the R.D. 5.5.1925, N° 653

opening the schools is finished the above tasks will be next on our organization schedule.

5. The shifting of military units in several of the provinces may hold up momentarily the re-opening of schools since most available school buildings are used by troops and the uncertainty of requisitioning and the ~~de~~quisitioning prevents definite planning for making the schools available.

V. FINANCE

1. Back payment of school personnel will be based upon the Regional Finance Officer's circular R 5.512/D/1 of 12 August 1944.
2. "Provveditori agli Studi" of 211 provinces are submitting either yearly or quarterly budgets on required finance forms provided by and according to requests of each Provincial Finance Officer.

VI. MISCELLANEOUS

1. An outline of working procedures was prepared for the attention of Provincial Commissioners and the use of all "Provveditori". The working procedures compiled by the Education Officers are a result of many weeks of field work dictated by experiences and based upon specific needs which have arisen. (copy attached)
2. The Rector of the University of Macerata and the Cenerino University were interviewed and reports on the standing of each institution were submitted with letter of 25 August 1944 to the Education Sub-Commission. We are awaiting further instructions.
3. The "Provveditore agli Studi" of Aquileia on his first inspection tour of the province discovered serious irregularities in the administration of schools ~~and services of the Provinces of the Isonzo, Friuli, Gori, Udine, Gorizia, Trieste, Venezia Giulia, and Trentino-Alto Adige~~. He contacted all regional authorities and upon presentation of the Education Officer having such Act. 96 of the R.D.S. 5.1925, M.653 approved a decree which provides for the following :
 - a) The withdrawal from the Istituto Magistrale of its recognized standing status. Continuing until such time as conditions are corrected.
 - b) Annulment of all final examinations given the years 1942-43, 1943-44.
 - c) Authorization to the "Provveditore" to establish a special session for the years 1942-43, 1943-44 for all students.
4. 2nd Lieutenant John F. Simoni was assigned to Region 5 as Education Officer, assistant to Major Charles J. Birt, Regional Education Officer. He is carrying out his assignments in a most satisfactory manner.

VII. RECOMMENDATION

1. This Office recommends that a Regional Education Inspector be appointed in this Region for the following reasons :
 - a) To supervise the work of each "Provveditore agli Studi".
 - b) To assure the execution of Educational Directives.
 - c) To assure co-ordination of effort and policy between provinces in the Region and prepare for time Italian Government will assume responsibility.

2. For this position is recommended the appointment of Dr. Mezzetti Pietro - Grade 5, now "Provveditore agli Studi" for Ascoli and previously General Inspector for the Ministry of Education - a man capable to handle the difficult task of bringing unity into Regional Education work.

VIII. CONCLUSION

1. The main tasks of defascistization, purging of Fascist literature and text books, and the preparation of school buildings for the opening of all schools by October 2 is well underway in every province now open in Region 5.
2. The Provincial Commissioners throughout the Region have co-operated fully and have given their efficient assistance toward the fulfillment of our objectives. Lacking Provincial Education Officers they have encouraged their staff to work with us in every way possible. Even in localities where military necessity is paramount the Provincial Commissioners have realized the importance of the task assigned the Education Officers in Second Phases operations and have facilitated immensely their work within Army areas.

Poggia Province. During the first half of the month Poggia Province was under Region 4. The Provincial Education Officer, Major Charlton J. Birt, operating under general instructions from this office, was very active and effective. On 10 February he toured the province with the Provveditorate agli studi, inspecting schools, conferring with school officials, and discussing school building problems with each G.A.O. He arranged for the Sindaco to attend a conference with him and each local school director in regard to repair of buildings or the finding of substitute locations. By 21 February about 14,263 elementary school children out of 30,000 were provided for in one way or another, and the balance, it was anticipated, would be in school by 1 March.

In opening elementary schools Major Birt resorted to many expedients. He used motion picture theaters, church sacristies, monasteries, Club-halls, houses of teachers, stores, even unused street cars. He took vigorous action toward putting buildings requisitioned by troops, and when this was impossible, got permission and trucks to move school equipment to substitute locations.

He made a detailed survey of the total situation, the personnel needs, etc., and took action toward meeting each problem. He took steps toward early opening of secondary schools.

In general, he followed through on all the Region 4 directives for opening schools, and showed remarkable initiative and executive ability in implementing them.

As a consequence, when it came time to arrange to turn Poggia Province over to Region 5, the Region 4 Education Officer conferred with the R.O., Region 5, recommending strongly that Major Birt be made Regional Education Officer for Region 5.

The R.C. Region 5 issued an order on 21 February putting this into effect.

2. Programs. The "programs", or courses of study and instructions to teachers, for elementary, lower secondary, and those of the four types of upper secondary schools were printed for Region 4 during February and are ready for immediate distribution to teachers in each province as it is taken over.

3. Text-books. The publishing of a series of non-fascist elementary school text-books has been a joint enterprise of all regions concerned and the AOC-AIS Education Subcommission. It has been a very large undertaking involving: a) the preparation of manuscripts by a committee of Italians under AOC supervision; b) the locating and transporting of prime materials - paper, ink, glue, binding thread, nito, matting paper, etc.; c) the printing and binding of about 200,000 books; d) the distribution of these books.

In Sicily we are at stage (d) for three of the ten books of the series, at stage (a) for the rest. In Naples we are at stage (c). We are printing in Naples books to be used in part of Region 2, all of Regions 3, 5 and 6, and parts of Regions 4 and 5. Nets for reprinting in Rome are being made from type in Naples so that if we find prime materials and a press in Rome printing can proceed immediately for Rome city and province and provinces north and east, including the northern part of Region 5 and, ultimately, Region 3.

To play safe on prime materials requisitions for paper, ink, etc. for Rome are being prepared and forwarded.

The contributions of Region 4 to this common enterprise have been two, to date: a) Region 4 has given the services of its Education Officer - and recently his deputy, Capt. Willis Brett - to head up and coordinate the entire undertaking; b) Region 4 has contributed a much needed truck and driver to handle the movement of paper, etc.

As of 29 February all books were either partly or completely set in type, and a considerable supply of paper, etc. was in the hands of three printers. It is anticipated that during the month of March an initial printing of all or nearly all books will be completed.
