1. In a conference yesterday the Provveditore agli Studi stated that last week he delivered all the schede required by G.O. 35 to the Provincial Commission.
2. He has also given to the Provincial Commission recommendations made by an internal consultative committee concerning all presidi, directors and inspectors.
3. Who was unable to get in touch with me, Major Palmieri or the head of the Commission? The former, I saw several times around the hotel and I was in my office during the time he was in Torino. If the latter, he is as near to me as he is to his telephone. Since his is a provincial commission, I have only dealt through the Provincial Commissioner concerning Epuration. He and I have had several conferences, telephone conversations, and correspondence about this subject and since I know he is in constant contact with this committee, I am somewhat at a loss to understand the Major's report.
4. I know also that the head of the Commission knows that Epuration is proceeding among the higher institutes of learning because the Provincial Commissioner has informed him about the procedure and that his commission was not to judge such personnel.
5. Again, I repeat, that I think Epuration in Turin is proceeding satisfactorily. This morning, I am recommending to the Provincial Commissioner that he approve the recommendation of the Provveditore that 68 of 109 presidi, directors and inspectors categorically suspended by the C.L.N. be reinstated.
6. The problem in this Region is not one of suspending personnel but largely that of reviewing the suspensions already made by the C.L.N. Suspensions have been made in a very sweeping manner.

3. Major Palmieri wondered how an education section under GO 35 could be operating in Torino without knowledge of the general commission, and suggested that you see Prof. Guis, president of the commission and clarify the situation to him.
