Declassified E.O. 12356 Section 3.3/NND No. 785016 PLA YGROUNDS OBJECTS:1) To take out of the streets the children of the poor people who are left now to themselves with nor moral nor material assistance. 2) to bring them gradually to consider life in the right light of honesty moral and phisycal health, citygenship social brotherhood, duties and rights. 3) To educate them to love the family their country and all men, to respect the other people's rights, the laws of their country, laws habit and religions of other countries, to educate them to knoledge and work. L) Finally to give them such an education that allows them to lead a loyal life and to provide them with good advices that will help them to become good citizens. These educative objects will try to be reached quite apart from any political or religious tendency. INDISPENSABLE CONDITIONS TO THE LIFE OF THE PLAYGROUNDS 1) areas where to entertain the children 2) distribution of light lunches (also in the poorest form) to the 3) furnishing the playgrounds of the following facilities a) W.C. b) drinking water 4) furnishing the playgrounds of gymnastic equ pment and of some c) some showers games : balls, uprights for jumping, basketball game, rumble ball, shuttle cock and "tamburrelli", gymnastic rack, deck tennis, cricket, thick ropes for tug of war, thin ropes for jumping, cross bar (balancing), seesaws. 5) books for children and adolescents 6) copybooks, pencils, white and coloured chalks, some blackboards, some tables, some chairs. 7)Stationary g)first aid set 9)a barber CHILDREN AGE from 8 until 14 SFX For the moment only boys KIND OF CHILDREN All but preferibly children of poor people INSTRUCTORS Chosen between people who really know children psycology, who dont belong to any political party in whose character religious tendency is not too preminent. Between those who have (son) 6 of humour, enthusiasm and are free from faulse proudness. Choose joung, goodlooking, educated people, whose thaughts and deeds are the ones of a citizen who knows his duties and whose morality is just based on the principles that we considre as objects that should be reached by the children. As it is dsirable that the children see in their instructor the perfect type of citizen that they should imitate and follow his ideas and deeds must obtain the child's faith and his attractivness the child's simpathy. Therefore the choice of the instructors should

The instructors will have to know thouroughly their arguments. Specialists in diffe nt subjects who want to come and speak to the SPECIALISTS boys will be invited to the playgrounds to talk to the boys about their particular field of interest. These specialists must be choosen between people with communicative with a spontaneous capacity of teaching and willing to teach trough discussion more then through a conference. OPENING TIME OF THE PLAYCROUNDS THE playgrounds will be open from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. with an interval for lunch time. PLAYGROUNDS ORGANIZATION Promoting Committee Director of Playgrounds 1 instructor for each group 1 secretary with administrative functions, able to replace one of the instructors if absent. Children will be divided in patrols and goupes. One patrol of younger boys (from 9 to 11 years of age) will be formed by 6 to 12 boys plus a patrol leader One patrol of older boys (from 11 to 14 years of age) will be formed by 10 to 15 boys plus a patrol leader. 3 patrols will form agroup under th directions of an instructor. Boys will be free to form their patrol. The patrol leader will be elected. 3 groups will form a company PATHOL LEADERS Patrol lenders will be elected by the patrol but their Prefer a boy who smiles election must be approved by the when he has lost, who accepts gladly every task who shows interest and initiative. Prefer a boy with character to a boy who has only physical and moral capacities. Without them suspe ting it we must propose ourselves to make them apt to be leaders. We must always remember that boys will become adults and their future temperament will be always connected with their formation of char cter. We must pretendrequire that they should be respected by their boys but we must let them be aware of the duties and the greater responsabilities that their position as leaders implys. Develop in all boys but particularly in leaders sense of responsability. Following a very successful experiment of Boy Scout of England and U.S.A. we will encourage each boy to choose a brother between the older boys. A young boy will more easily confide himself with another 205 boy and will be able to receive simpathy and protection, whereas the 205 older boy will be enterestd in the material and spiritual activities of the young boy and will be able to follow him dayli. To have a younger brother will lead him to a good conduct and to set the good exam-This observance will be particularly useful in case of orphans or of those children who don't-have-a-happy are not happy in their family. We will perhaps be able to extend this observance to "sister" when also girls will be accepted in the playgrouns and if we will find the type of temperament.

Declassified E.O. 12356 Section 3.3/NND No. 785016 PROGRAM OF ACTIVITIES AND SUBJECTS TO BE TREATED 1) political and religious arguments have not to be treated; we must avoid that political propag nda has any effect on the children. We must prevent that the boys have religious discussions. Boys will be helped and encouraged to be faithful to their religion 2) Sportive activities such as competitions games: run races, jumping tug of war, gymnastic rack, cross bar (balancing) relay races, rollerskating, basketball, baseball, deck tennis, cricket, seesaw, rumble ball ecc. Instructors should be phisically fit and should possess some phisycal ability or quality that could be a hint to the children. Prefer games to exercises, try to raise compettition encourage choruses during singing, Remember that the object in view is a proportional harmonic and healthy development of the childrens phisic. 3) Observation of games rules. 4) Medical gymnastic for undervelopped children Helioterapic cure. 6) Preparatory activities for out of doors life: how to put up a tent, build a fire, cook out of doors, compuss bearing in the epen, on the country, in a wood, in the daylight, in the night, path finding, semaphor, morse code, winds directions, marine's compass, valuation of distances, star gazing, knots, young explorers stick. First aid instruction 7) Out of doors activities: campings. Organize compings in group, hikes, train trips. Proportion the initiatives to the children's temperament, to the climate. Choose proper leaders. 3) Dramatics 9) Chorus singing lo) Develop interest towards wood and art craft. Do not obstacolate spontaneous preferences. Encourage suggest but de-net-erganise leave the organization to the children. Internal higyen: explain the effects of some food or some beverages on the human body. Avoid description of illnesses. Teach very briefly the digestion, blood circulation, bespiration ecc. Organize visits to factories, to courts and jails, hospitals Municipii sewers, ecc. 23) Inculcate in the children faith in the people and in the future of their country. See that promise by the Authorities are kept, whenever you suspect that promises cannot be kept do not speak about them to the boys. 24) Loyalty and faith: should br taught mostly by setting example. Call often different boy to direct a patrol during the playground time. Show faith in children's deeds. Give many individual and patrol tasks. Illustrate tasks with immagination. Stimulate sense of responsability in the children. 25) Altruism: You can stimulate altruism through telling stories about the sacrifices of great men, inventors, explorers. Whynever you tell stories to the boys be sure that they have understood. and observe the reaction. Teach the boys never to accept money for a good turn. They may receive money if it is directed to the organization as in this case nobody will avail of it indimidually. 26) Faith in himself: to be devellopped especially in patrol or group leaders. Give individual tasks but related to the temperament of the boy, require sometimes also impossible things. 27) Courtesy and respect: the fundamental courtesy is the one of men towards women but inculcate also courtesy towards every one with no distinction. Educate the boys to respect elderly people, sick people, unhappy people. Teach them to love and protect animals, Teach them to respect laws. Boys will participate if possible in the works for the preparation and the maintenance of the playgrounds. The Oromoting Committe will work out a monthly program the group a weekly programm, the patrol a daily programm. Always stimulate spirit of competition among patrols and groups 203 Lists will be kept by instructors and by the Committee. Fach patrol will choose a distinctive name. The programm will consist in sports games, craft ecc. Meetings of patrol leaders, group leaders or instructors will be encouraged. Each group will be encouraged to make his own newspaper. It will be suggested to the boys to try to collect a Book exchange library, to take part in conferences to organize hikes performances

festvals and excursions.

## BADGES AND PUNISHMENTS

Badges must be given by the leaders but must be conceded for free decision by the young people themselves. Badges will be worn on the chest. The punishments will be determined by the Council of the Badged which will judge in public assembly. The boy who must be judged will have the right to clarify his position and defend himself. (All this can be a serious game and an instructive work.

The punishment will consist either in some of blame announced to the culprit in the presence of all the boys of the playground or in the exclusion for a certain period of time from participation in the work or the game that he prefers.

it would be advisable to start this activity with first one playground in order to train and experiment with the pedagogical ca pacities

of the instructors.

## METHOD

1) Every form of compulsion should be abolished.

2)Stimulate encourage help the boys initiative .
3)Keep in mind that boys have a preference for fantastic and adventures
Use it in showing programs tasks ecc.

4)Be respectful towards children. 5)Give them sense of responsability.

6) Deal with them as seriuosly and sincerely as with grownups.
