L'attività è in continuo sviluppo, ed alla statura ed apparenza delle opere dei dirigenti, in massima parte vecchi scout, si contrappone la assoluta mancanza di materiali per campeggi e scoutisti in genere, per cui con quel poco di cui i reparti dispongono non si è in grado di applicare in pieno il metodo scoutistico e conseguentemente attirare tra le nostre file una larga massa di giovani.

Gli ostacoli che si oppongono ad un maggiore sviluppo del movimento scoutistico in Sicilia in questi sono: mancanza di materiali per

bilità assoluta di procurarsene in commercio.

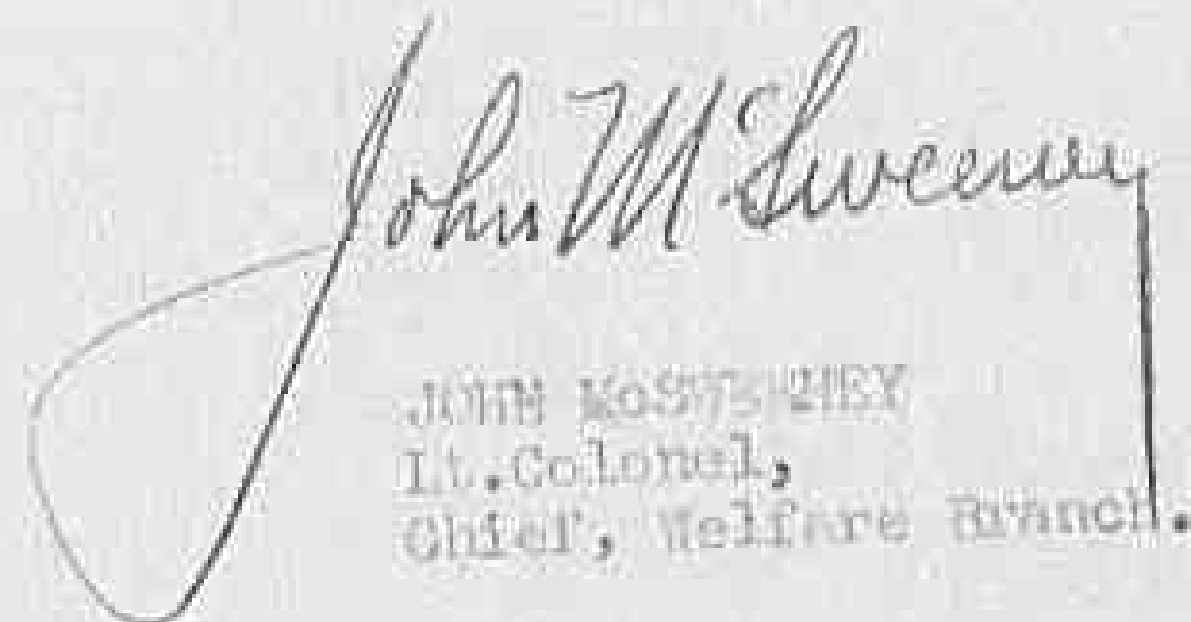

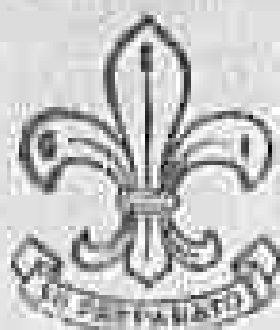

The Girls' Association are having a hard time federating, but I think they'll sign their constitution in my office tomorrow.

I'll take up with the Federation the question of the Girl Scout leaders from UNKRA and get an official invitation. The trip of those from Switzerland has been delayed, and they may not come until October, since if they come now they could only stay three weeks.

Thank you for sending the package of literature. It has not yet come.

Have a good vacation. And come and see me when you get back.

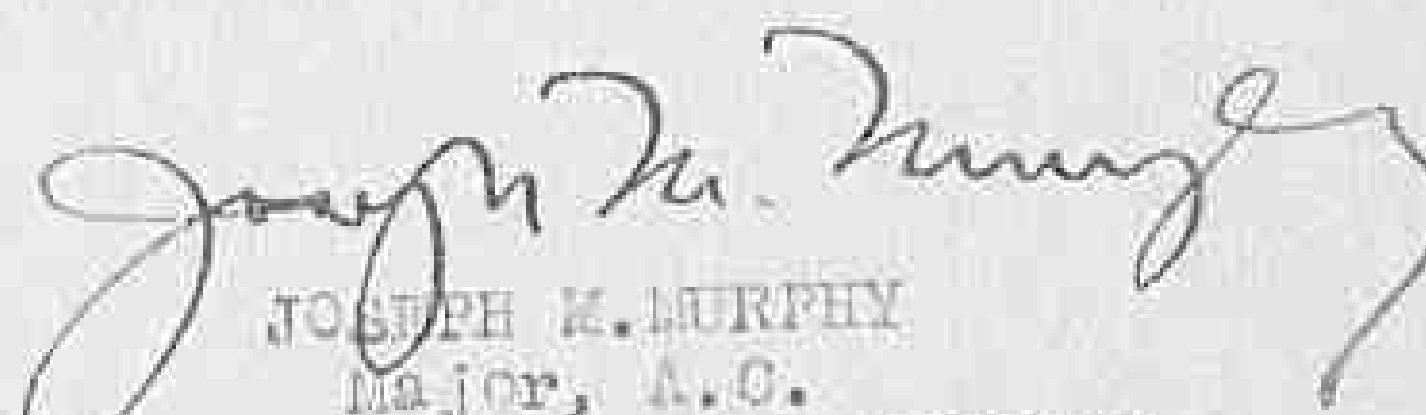
1. A request has been received for 100 badges for the increasing number of boys in the Corpo Nazionale Esploratori.

3. Information is requested on the present state of scout materials available for boys and leaders which may be placed in the hands of Naples leaders.

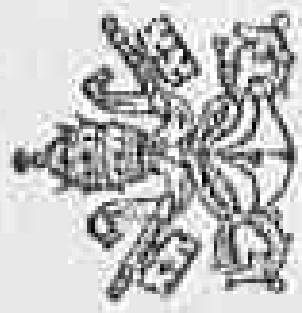
4. Manuals have not been made available locally.

1. Appropos of your visit of this date, it is proposed that a conference be held in Naples during the week of 3-9 December of the Italian personnel in charge of Boy Scout work, or whatever the local designation of such activities may be, for determining the present status of the work and course of action which may be encouraged by this Zone of the Allied Commission.

2. It is desired that the person or persons at the national headquarters for this work, in Rome, be present to outline, coordinate and give approval to existing efforts.

3. It is requested that after determining the sentiment in Rome toward this suggestion, this office be advised as to names and addresses of personnel who should be invited to attend the proposed gathering.

4. It is the intention of this office to propose to the Naples committee in charge of scouting that a demonstration by local youth be staged during the course of the meeting.

5. There is no objection on the part of this office to scouting's executive personnel from contiguous territory attending the conference but because of understandable difficulties, responsibility for their care and transportation cannot be assumed.

SUBJECT: Scouting.

TO : H. Turner, War Services Tower Crew.

1. This Subcommission desires to thank you for your interest in the right direction for Italian youth organizations and to congratulate you upon service to the cause.

2. We have ourselves done some organization in Naples; and though we felt no sense of competition when the Church started its own scout organization to supersede our initiative, we continued in agreement with the Minister of Public Instruction in support of a scout movement independent of party or crowd. With the reduction in our staff, however, coincident with the extension of responsibilities Northward, we are being obliged to neglect this important field in behalf of educational affairs more pressing even if not more important.

3. We have asked for such uniform from the States as the National Scouting Organizations could furnish us; but as yet we have received no assurance, nor are we likely to get more than a token gift.

4. Foreseeing little that we can directly do in the near future to aid, we wish to encourage spontaneous groups, the Church, and the Ministry of Public Instruction to push the work along as far and fast as possible. A little variety will not hurt, and too much energy will not be expended in behalf of Italian youth.

Funds to rehabilitate school buildings in Foggia have been approved totaling 493,000 liras. Funds for operation of Media and Superiore schools have been approved for 1,274,280 liras. Few school buildings in Campobasso Province have been destroyed. Funds will be required for reconstruction.

DISTRIBUTION OF THE BOYS AND GIRLS

3234 text books and 1033 quaterni have been delivered to school children. A similar number has been delivered to Campobasso. These books are sent by Municipal Sub-Commission.

ADMINISTRATION

A summary of school attendance in Foggia Province shows 40500 pupils attending elementary schools and 5700 attending Media and Superiore.

In Campobasso Elementary schools are being ^{opened} in Provincial area and plans are being discussed to open schools in 8th Army area.

Media and Superiore schools in Campobasso are not to open until all Elementary schools are operative.

VETTING PROGRAMS

Practically all suspended teachers have been vetted in Foggia Province.

In Campobasso vetting is being done by U.S.S.A.

BUILDINGS AND OPERATING EXPENSES

Funds to rehabilitate school buildings in Foggia have been approved totaling 693,000 liras. Funds for operation of Media and Superiore schools have been approved for 1,274,296 liras. New school buildings in Campobasso Province have been destroyed. Funds will be required for reconditioning.

DISTRIBUTION OF TEXT BOOKS AND QUADERNI

3834 text books and 1055 quaderni have been delivered to school children. A similar number has been delivered to Campobasso. These books are sent by Educational Sub-Commission.

PASSES FOR UNIVERSITY STUDENTS

Campobasso educational officers is making plans with Naples University authorities to permit students to take their required examinations. In Foggia plans are being arranged with P.I.O. and Bari University officials.

SCHOOL VACATION

Schools will close July 31 and open October 1, 1944.

SCHOOL HEALTH

Vaccination and diphtheria inoculations are being planned. Lectures by teachers to parents and pupils on malarial control and sanitation have been started in Foggia Province.

SCHOOL AND SPORT CLUBS FOR YOUTH

Plans for such groups have been formulated in Foggia Province. Six applications have been received. Three approved they will be supervised by teachers.
