1. Your letter of 2 February R5/518/130/4 is referenced.

2. Providing proper arrangements are made for the children to have the meal at the school or some other suitable place in the vicinity of the school there is no objection to E.C.A. or other properly established kitchen preparing and serving the meal.

3. Agreement with the Prefect of the Province of the arrangement would be necessary in these circumstances and for the drawing of supplies by R.C.A.

4. Your para 2 is noted but the extension outside the present scope is not yet contemplated.

5. As complete returns are not forthcoming from Regions, the extent of the supply commitment cannot yet be gauged. The following scale will be adopted until further notice.

23 grams Dehydrated Soap)
28 grams Dried Vegetables) Per meal per day

6. This scale will operate whether the meal is provided at the school or from other sources.

7. The scheme may be operated in communes or provinces in which the conditions laid down in AGO/43-1/FOOD of 25 October 1944 are observed. Progressive numbers are to be communicated to this Sub-Commission.

Reference your letter of 17 January.

1. The transfer of territory from Military Government to Italian Government in no way affects the school lunch program. It goes right on as before.

2. The effect of transfer in general is not a loss of responsibility by the Regional Education Officer, but a loss of direct authority. His interest, supervision, and responsibility remain essentially unchanged. The effect is:

- (a) Short cutting channels of communication - the provveditori, rectors, etc., may and should communicate directly with the Ministry of Public Instruction and receive direct orders from him. On all really important matters, and particularly matters of policy, copies of such communications and orders should be sent to the Regional Education Officer, and, where matters covering more than one Region are concerned, to the Education Subcommission.
- (b) Substituting advice for orders. If the advice is not taken, and is considered sufficiently important, the REO can report the matter to the Education Subcommission which will ask the Minister to issue an order to the school official concerned.

3. As you can see this does not modify the procedures regarding school lunches.

1. The questions raised by you and the Education Officer regarding school lunches have been discussed by the Food sub-commission and the Education sub-commission.

2. Both agree that the exact method of approving quantities of food requested (i.e., approved by the Directorate or an Allied officer) is a matter for Regional decision. The essential thing is to know that food delivered actually gets to the children. To be sure of this a certificate from the simulaco as indicated in the form sent with AB/6.18/AGO of 27 October is the simplest and most direct means. Any request for school lunches must be based on schedules from a competent Italian official showing how many children are to be fed and that means of preparing and serving the food have been worked out. Beyond this essential, detailed procedures may be developed regionally.



A. SEPARATION FOR CHILDREN OF MINERS WORKING IN THE FIELD OF MARENTA
AND SALONE SO AGNI

The General Direc. for the Mining and Chemical Industry "COOPERATIVA" ordered to the "National Institution for Religious and Moral Assistance of workers" the constitution of "winter schools for children of miners" starting from 1st December 1944, to 31 March 1945.

The infant-school should shelter about 1.000 children in L'Aquila and about 400 children in the zone arche-Romagna.

We specify the following localities where the infant schools will be instituted:

- 1) L'AQUILA (ABRUZZO)
- 2) MOLISE (ABRUZZO)
- 3) MARCHE (ANCONA)
- 4) CALABRIA (REGGIO)
- 5) PUGLIA (TRAPANI)
- 6) SICILIA (PALERMO)

It is necessary to supply with urgent speed the food stuffs needed for a refectory, indispensable to the infant-schools.

Given the present, the paucity of the above mentioned institution, we ask the Authorities of A.C. to give us the necessary allocations for a daily soup, which will be distributed to the 1.400 children.

We enclose the quantity of food-stuffs, daily and monthly needed.

2. Your attention is especially called to para. 3 of the letter. The present machinery for carrying out the instructions for feeding of school children seemed to be cumbersome and result in the placing of the approval of the Sindaco's figures on the shoulder of an officer who has no opportunity to determine whether the figures recited are dependable.
3. It is felt that a great deal of simplification could be provided which would place the responsibility to check the Sindaco's certification upon the S.E.P.R.A.L.

1. Reference is made to letter ACC/43-1/FOOD, Subject: Feeding of School Children, To: Regional Commissioners for the attention of Supply Officers, dated 25 October 1944; letter ED/6.18/ACC, Education Subcommission Policy Directive No.2, Subject: School lunches, dated 27 October 1944; and to Southern Region and Naples, Zone Headquarters discussions of these letters and related problems.

2. On instructions from the Naples Zone Commissioner facts and figures were gathered for the Commune of Naples which brought forth the following questions:

- a. Few kitchens or other facilities for preparing the food and practically no equipment for serving it, raising the question in the minds of school officials as to the extent of their commitment on this requirement.
- b. Double sessions are the case in most Naples elementary schools. Some pupils attend classes on M - W - F, others on T - Th - S, while morning or afternoon sessions care for others. One case of four shifts per day has been reported from Salerno. The physical problem of handling and checking these groups so that each child will secure a daily ration causes some concern.
- c. School population figures of the Provveditorato and of the Sindaco do not agree.
- d. The "need" element must be assumed, particularly as serving a lunch to all kindergarten and elementary school children was a national practice prior to the war.

3. The requirement that the Regional Education Officer or an officer delegated by the Regional Commissioner approve individual requests, throws a responsibility for issued material on the shoulders of an officer who has no way of checking the amounts.

4. As the primary objective is to place prepared food before these children at the earliest possible moment, it is the sentiment of the Zone that figures supplied by the Provveditore agli Studi of the Provinces shall be considered official, that by some means or other the food can be prepared and served by the school people without pinning them too closely, exact facts, and that a block allotment of food to a central and responsible provincial official would reduce supervision to a point commensurate with the available local A.C. personnel.

5. Pending changes in existing instructions, the Naples Zone is collecting the required information.

1. In response to the inquiry of the C & S, the file of instructions regarding school lunches is attached hereto, as follows:

- a) - Policy Directive to RC'S
- b) - Form for letter from RC to PC'S
- c) - Form for letter from PC to Prefect - English & Italian
- d) - Form for letter from Prefect to Sindaco - English & Italian
- e) - Form for Sindaco to fill out requesting lunches
- f) - Letter from Regional Education Officer to Provveditore giving necessary information for his cooperation in the program - English & Italian.

2. While the series of forms may give an appearance of complexity, they actually simplify, for RC'S, PC'S, and Prefects, the procedure of getting word to the local sindaci as to filling out of the request for lunches. The Food Sub-commission must know that each sindaco who will receive the food has made provision for its being served, and for how many children. Once these facts are known, distribution is automatic.

Reference your ACC/43-1/FOOD of 16 October.

1. We have had no indication of Prefects in the Southern Region opposing the serving of school lunches, which are a long-established institution in kindergartens and elementary schools of Italy. We shall be glad to have specific knowledge as to what prefect or prefects are said to be opposed. The regional Commissioner in Sicily, however, sees serious difficulties in implementing the policy there at present.
2. The press quotation to the effect that children would be furnished soup and vegetables "in addition to six lbs of American dehydrated food each month" was a direct misquotation. Steps are being taken to have it corrected.
3. Since the fall term of the schools is just now opening, and requests to purchase as to the number of children to be served have just gone out in Lazio-Umbria; and since, further, such requests have not yet gone out in other regions pending clarification of policy, it is impossible to give you the precise information you request in paragraph 6.
4. Now that the policy is clear that where we certify need, and availability of means for storing and serving, at least a bowl of soup per day can be given to each child, our Regional Education Officers will proceed to gather the necessary data in Military Government Territory, and Prefects will be invited to do so in Italian Government Territory. These data will be submitted, with corroboration, through regional supply officers.
5. Estimates of needs for January, 1945, are necessarily very rough at present. It is believed, however, that the over-all picture, assuming all Italy to be liberated by January, is not far from the totals indicated in my Memorandum to Major PARKER of 10 October. At least, I believe these figures should be used for safety in inventing.

1. Your letter APO/4 18/403 of Oct. 12 is reference.
2. According to memo passed to Major Parker, on 10 Oct. there are less than 20,000 children who are receiving, or entitled to receive supplementary lunches. Also Major Parker was informed verbally that professors in Southern Region were opposed to the scheme and that it would not be implemented.
3. This is completely at variance with the report in the Stars & Stripes of 10th Oct. that "between three and four million children...." went back to their studies...." and that they would be provided with a bowl of soup and a plate of vegetables each day "in addition to six pounds of American dehydrated food each month".
4. Such statements and reports bear no relation to facts and give a totally false impression to the public as to the capacity of supplies to meet the apparent commitments. Repercussions have already set in.
5. The supply situation is such that it is necessary for the Food Sub-Commission to know its definite commitments before a general policy can be adopted.
6. Will you please indicate, precisely, the number of children at present attending schools at which arrangements for the preparation and the service of a meal is complete, by regions, also an estimate, under similar arrangements, for 1st Jan. 1945.
7. The Food Sub-Commission reserves the right to vary the present supplementary meals according to the commitment and the supply situation.

1. This is to confirm our conversation of 17 October.
 2. It is agreed that dried soup and Ancofor as possible dried vegetables, will be furnished to all Kindergarten and elementary school children in Italy for school lunches where the following conditions are met:
 - (a) Availability of the Ancofor is obtained through:
 - 1 - That a need exists
 - 2 - That facilities are available for preparation and serving of the food.
 - (b) Approval is given by the Regional Production Officer
 - (c) Request is made to the Food Subsistence by the Regional Supply Officer.
 3. It is understood that Ancofor as supplies are available the amount of dried soup and dried vegetables to be allotted will be 3 lb each per child per month; but that if supplies are insufficient to meet the demand on this basis the quantity may be reduced; no reduction below 1½ lb of dried soup per child per month is, however, contemplated due being enough to give each child a bowl of soup per day.
 4. For your information I attach hereto the forms used in London and Rome-Albano. For other regions these will be modified to provide for possible reduction in quantities.
 5. If this letter conforms with your understanding of our verbal agreement will you please initial and return the attached copy.

1. The following paragraphs set forth the procedures approved by the Regional Supply Officer and the Regional Education Officer for supplying lunches to schools.

2. The Food Subcommission has made available to the Regional Supply Officer dried soup and dried vegetables for sale to the communes for lunches for children in kindergartens (auiti) and elementary schools, allowing 1.4 kilos of each per child per month.

3. The Provincial Commissioner is requested to take the following steps :

a) Sign the enclosed letter to the Prefect and deliver it to him, together with the instructions for signature, sent herewith (there are enough for all communes).

b) Transmit to the Regional Education Officer the completed requests of the signatures as they come in from the Prefect.

4. The Regional Education Officer will approve ~~the~~ requests and send them to the Regional Supply Officer.

5. The Regional Supply Officer will then have the soup and vegetables, in the quantities requested, distributed to the communes through S.P.R.M.I. and Consorzii Agrarii, like other food supplies, and will collect payment in the same manner.

Subject : School lunches.

1. The need for school lunches during the summer session in schools in devastated sections of Region 4 and other Regions is urgent, the school children being badly undernourished.

2. It is proposed that 3 lb. of dried soup and 3 lb. of dried vegetables per child per month be allowed in each community where the Education Officer testifies that a need exists and that facilities for storage and preparation are available.

3. It is further proposed that payment be charged against the prefect of the province concerned, and that his approval of the programs be obtained in each instance.

4. Total amounts needed for each province will be estimated on receipt from you of approval of policy in general, preferably accompanied by your estimate of tonnage available for July, August and September.

5. In VIIth Army area, similar provisions were made and programs presumably in effect in communities where need is greatest in that area.

1. The Regional Education Officer reports that the textbook situation is well in hand with 75,000 old Elementary textbooks distributed and a large number of notebooks distributed at cost price.

2. He further reports that many children are not attending school because there is no room for them in the schoolbuildings at present available.

3. A scheme for the provision of meals for school children has been drawn up by the Welfare Section but, regrettably this has not been approved by the Regional Commissioner. It is possible that lack of food may discourage some of the children from attending school but no direct evidence to this effect is available.

4. There is certainly no evidence that lack of clothing is preventing any children in this region from attending school.
