1. Some time ago Dr. Ludovico Upjohn suggested to the Minister of Public Instruction that a bibliography be prepared of all scientific publications issued since 1940 in Italy, Britain, and the United States, and that these bibliographies be interchanged and serve as a basis for interchange of the publications themselves.

2. A letter from the Minister now informs me that his commission has now completed the first group of bibliographies, and he asks how we are progressing on the American and British side.

3. I confess that I had forgotten this proposal completely -- another officer took minutes on that meeting with the Minister and failed to make a minute of this proposal. Consequently, I have taken no action.

4. Could we get the Library of Congress or the American Library Association to prepare such a bibliography, promising the British and Italian bibliographies in exchange? Will you follow this through, or do you want me to do so?

If a publisher wants to publish the verse form, it's none of our business; but I think we should go ahead anyway on the prose edition. Miss Rombo tells us that, as might be expected, the verse contains a good many words outside most children's vocabularies.

Receipt is acknowledged of the request for publications from the Biblioteca Centrale R. University of Padua, Engineering faculty.

I enclose requests from the National Library in Naples. The ALS forwarded through me comments and questions of various institutions from which the National Library had requested publications and I suggested to it that it write direct responses for forwarding by us. Since these are requests and offers of exchange rather than requests for donations, I am turning them over to you to forward or handle, rather than combining them with the great number of requests being cleared through the Minister's committee and Stohlman.

2. Senior Scholastic is of no use for our purpose, being a news magazine for high school students. I have only run through a couple of copies, but I find them valueless for the Bulletin.
3. These particular issues of Parents are not very rich in material for teachers, etc. However, there is a good article beginning on p.25 of the March, 1945, issue, and one you may want to consider beginning on p.36. In the April, 1945 issue, beginning on p.30, there is an article addressed to parents but with a point of view important to teachers. It should be seriously considered.
4. I am sending you my personal copy of Progressive Education for May, 1945. Please return it. The article beginning on p.30 is an excellent illustration of how children study a foreign culture in good American schools and should be valuable. The short article on the University of Illinois is a good antidote for too much on the elementary level - page 34.
5. I am also sending you my personal copy of "The Instructor" for June, 1945, which please return. I have copyright release for it, but articles must show source. The ones beginning on the following pages are significant and practical for elementary school teachers: 10, 11, 14, 17, 22, 28, 29. They should be spread out through several bulletins so as not to concentrate too much on practical articles for elementary teachers in a single issue of the Bulletin.

Ref. 534/7 of 27 April from Albanian Minister of Public Instruction.

1. The Minister of Public Instruction in Albania evidently does not realize that the American school system is very much decentralized, that there is no common program for all secondary schools, and that the program of each individual secondary school in the United States has its own special characteristics. There are literally many thousands of different programs; so the Minister's request for programs of all secondary schools in the United States cannot be met.

2. There is, however, a basic similarity among many secondary school programs. We shall therefore write immediately to the United States for several fairly typical samples. These will be sent to you as soon as received, for forwarding to the Albanian Minister.

Monograph By Endicott To Be Used In Italian School

The U.S. Information service soon will publish and distribute to schools throughout Italy 20,000 copies of a monograph on vocational and educational guidance written by Dr. Frank Endicott, director of placement at Northwestern.

The monograph, which will be printed in translation, was written by Dr. Endicott upon request of Lt. Col. Carleton W. Washburne, director of education at the Allied Commission Headquarters in Italy. From 1935 to 1941 Lt. Col. Washburne was a member of the Summer Session faculty of the School of Education at Northwestern.

In a letter to Dr. Endicott, Lt. Col. Washburne expressed appreciation of the booklet and stated that it is "what Italy needs." He added that he will recommend it to M. Monod, director of secondary education in France, for use in 200 French schools that are being modernized. Washburne stated that M. Monod recognizes that guidance is essential to the success of the new program.

Dear Mrs. Murray:

It is unfortunate that there was a misunderstanding regarding New York University's letter regarding Fellowships.

You did not, until just now, give us a copy of the letter. Miss Rombo understood you to say that it was an offer of Fellowship to Italy, rather than a general statement that foreign fellowships were available. This led to my stating the matter over-positively to the Minister.

As to the publicity release: Each Subcommittee is required to submit to the Vice President a weekly SITREP telling of important matters discussed with the Minister. I merely reported to the Vice President, in accordance with this obligation, that I had discussed New York University's offer, (as I understood it) with the Minister. That SITREP was evidently used for the published statement.

I would suggest that if any matter that you ask me to discuss with the Minister is to be treated as confidential, you so indicate, and that when such matter is based on a letter you give me a copy of the letter or its pertinent passages.

I'm sorry if this situation caused you any embarrassment.
