1. Dr. Gottfried Lang informs us that he was the Director of the Istituto Storico Austriaco in Rome, and resided in its premises in the Viale Giulia, Viale Bruno Buozzi, 111.
2. He informs us further that these premises are in the custody of the Swiss Legation, which has stated that he may resume his residence and studies there if there is no objection from the Allied Commission.
3. He also informs us that the Minister of Foreign Affairs has given its consent.
4. The Allied Commission has no objection to the return of Dr. Lang to the above named premises if the Swiss Legation is agreeable.
5. It should be understood, however, that this in no way involves relinquishment by the Swiss of protection of this property nor in any way prejudices its future disposition.

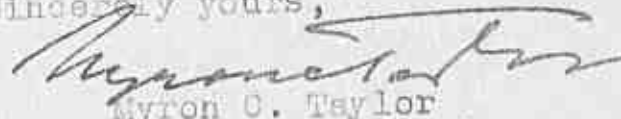

SUBJECT : Work of Education Subcommittee

TO : The Representative of USSR to AC
Attention - Major General Kouznetsov

Referring to informal conference of 1 December.

1. In Italian Government Territory the Education Subcommittee does not attempt to supervise the Italian Ministry of Public Instruction in any way. In newly transferred territory, however, it takes such action as seems necessary to keep moving without interruption the machinery which had been set up for opening the schools. Otherwise its functions are to help the Italian Government in the acquisition of materials from the United States for publishing the Italian Government's text-books; help in getting Allied troops out of school buildings; obtaining transportation, electricity, etc., for the schools, etc.

2. In Military Government Territory, the Education Subcommittee coordinates the work of its Education Officers with that of the Minister in Italian Government Territory. It therefore consults the Minister on all matters of policy, on all major appointments of personnel, etc. and it acts in a liaison capacity in effecting transfers of teachers and professors between Italian and Military Government Territory.

3. The work and policies of the Education Subcommittee are more fully set forth in the enclosed statement.
