The following paragraphs relating to the Education SubCommission are quoted from a letter dated Dec. 20, 1944 from the Library of Congress:

"Major Washburne's proposal for procuring books for educational institutions in Italy. This question has been under discussion. We do not feel that the Library can undertake such a project. We do feel, however, that the more appropriate channel for assistance is the State Department and we have referred the matter to it for its consideration. A carbon of our letter to State is enclosed. State advises it is possible that some action can be taken on the matter in the near future. We will keep you posted of any developments."

"American publications for Italy. Nothing stirring here that we know of. However, Mr. Washburne has today taken the oath of office as Assistant Secretary of State for Cultural Relations and Publicity, and he has in his hands a memorandum on this subject. Let's hope that something may eventuate. Actually, however, it seems to me (personally) that strong representations on this matter ought to come up through the Theatre Command to the appropriate agency in Washington."

"Orders for the Sub-Commission on Education. You ask us whether we can procure certain periodicals and forward them. Most of the items which you list are weekly or monthly publications. It would not, therefore, be possible for us to place subscriptions on a monthly basis. However, there are two alternatives: (1) we could, where possible, send discards from the duplicate exchange collection on these titles costing nothing, or (2) we can place annual subscriptions, billing the Sub-Com. for reimbursement, and assemble the material here on ship in monthly."

"Captain Villa. We are sending you under separate cover a number of reprints of Professor Firelli's article in the Physiological Zoology. Will you please see that the Professor receives them?"

"Max Ascoli. Major Washburne has written to Max Ascoli in New York asking him to send us some books for us to send to you for Major Washburne. We are forwarding them to you through State Department in several packages, but we have told Ascoli that we have no direct route to you and suggest that he send them directly to Washburne."

Dear Mr. Parsons:

The enclosed from Mr. Rollier is self-explanatory.

Italy's lack of foreign exchange is seriously hampering the resumption of scientific work. Not only the Politecnico in Milan but all universities are facing the grave problem of getting into contact with recent research. They can pay in Italian money for the periodicals, but Italian lire have no foreign exchange value. The only immediate hope lies in some form of credit - either individuals, as suggested by Rollier, or publishers, or societies. If through one of these means, the periodicals could be sent, with agreement by the university to pay for them when normal commercial channels are open, this particular problem would be solved.

Any assistance you can give in the matter will mean much to science in Italy.

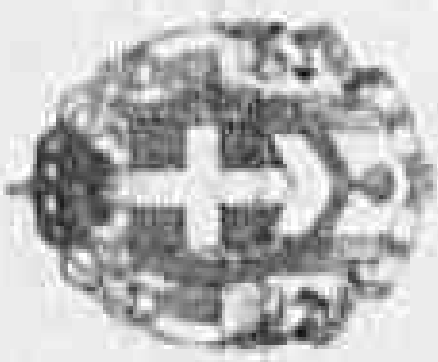

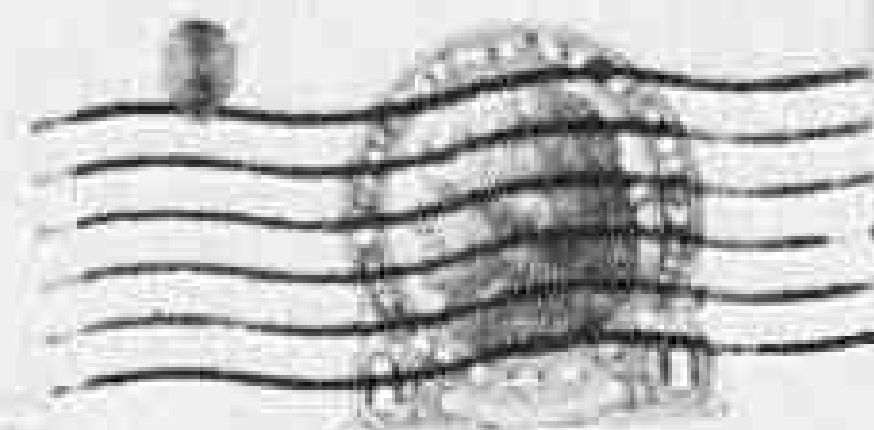

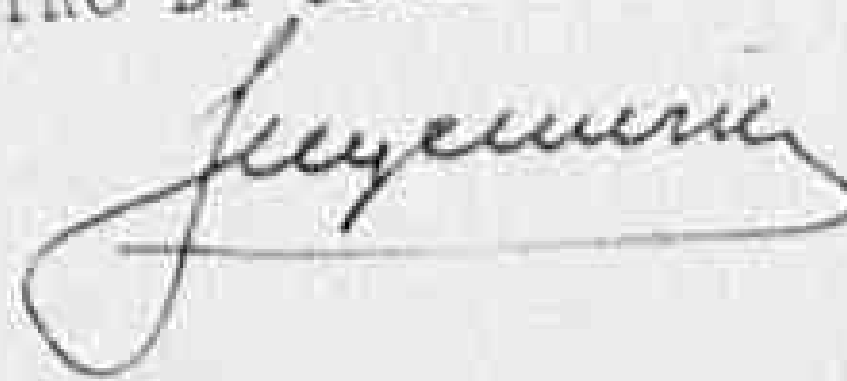

Dear Carleton Washburne:

I appreciate your letter of February 19th regarding reprints of Dr. Tirelli's article. On November 29th John L. Noland, chief of the exchange and gift division of the Library of Congress wrote me as follows:

"We have received through our Foreign Representative, a letter addressed to Captain Vella from Professor Mario Tirelli asking our assistance in furnishing Professor Tirelli with reprints of his article published in the Physiological Zoology.

The Library of Congress will be pleased to forward to Professor Tirelli, reprints of his article, should you have copies available which you wish to send him. I am advised that he is communicating directly with you, but, as there may be some delay in the transmission of correspondence, we shall be pleased to be advised of the action we should take in connection with his request."

I replied on December 5th as you can see herewith. So far as I know the reprints are moving forward to Dr. Tirelli through these channels and I hope they have reached him or will do so in the near future. You may well be interested in the first paragraph of the letter I received from Dr. Tirelli earlier in the fall.

"After 4 years of a terrible war, finally the postal connections between Italy and America are renewed. I am alive, but suffered pains and the loss of considerable material goods and also of scientific material: F.I. of a complete book, on the physiology of the silkworm (egg, caterpillar, pupa and imago) that I was printing in a typography destroyed by the bombs. And all Italy is quite destroyed. The Germans accomplished much barbarities; but now I hope that the situation - nevertheless the sacrifices of the population are yet considerable - will return little by little to the normality."

I trust that you are finding your work stimulating and know that with all that is to be done in Italy you must be usefully engaged. Marjorie Allee joins me in sending our cordial good wishes.

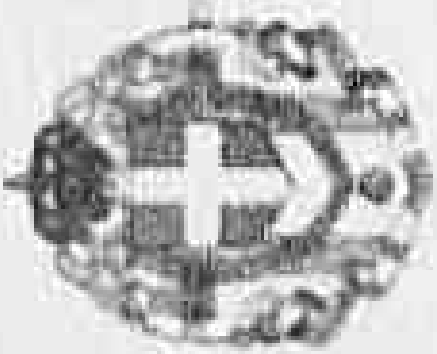

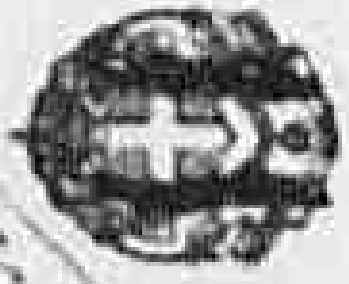

1. Recent visits made by the Minister of Public Instruction and the Acting Director of the Education Subcommittee, AC, to several universities, and communications received from others have convinced us of the imperative need for recent scientific and technical publications and for subscriptions to leading scholarly, scientific, and technical periodicals back-dated to January, 1942.
2. Scientific laboratories and technical shops have in large measure been either destroyed or looted. Replacement of essential equipment is necessary if scientific work and technical training are to be resumed in Italy.
3. The extreme poverty and shortage of foreign exchange make normal purchase of such publication and equipment by the Italian Government impossible. It is therefore requested that American foundations, organizations and individuals be appealed to for aid.
4. The Minister and the Education Subcommittee are circulating universities, libraries and technical institutions throughout liberated Italy asking for lists, with priorities, of the most urgently needed books, periodicals, scientific apparatus and technical equipment - in the case of the apparatus and equipment only essential articles previously owned and subsequently destroyed or looted are to be listed. On the basis of returns precise lists of needs will be prepared for liberated Italy and estimates for occupied Northern Italy.
5. Books and periodicals may be shipped through the Library of Congress to Mr. Sanchez, its representative in Italy, who is attached to the Education Subcommittee. Equipment may be shipped direct to the Allied Commission, for the Education Subcommittee, which will arrange for warehousing, transportation and distribution.

Dear Carl :

Requests keep coming to me for books and periodicals for universities and scientific institutions. Lack of foreign exchange - plus great poverty - makes it impossible for the Italian Government to buy them. I am sure you were on a committee that was considering this need and ways of meeting it. How can I get action?

I have written to the Library of Congress, with the approval of the Minister of Public Instruction and at the suggestion of Sanchez, Library of Congress representative here, suggesting a kind of barter plan, whereby the Library of Congress would set up a fund for buying books in Italy and the Ministry here would set up a corresponding fund for buying books in America. Then without any interchange of cash, each would, from its fund, buy the books desired by the other and send them. I hope this plan will work, but even if it does, it's not enough: (a) because the number of Italian books needed by the Library of Congress is probably much less than number of American books and periodicals needed by Italy; and (b) because Italy can't afford, even in its own like, to pay for what it needs.

I'm sure there are foundations and groups in America which would be willing to help. And I am reasonably sure that you are already active in the matter. How can we get together? All Italian universities, libraries, and learned societies come within my jurisdiction as Acting Director of the Education Subcommittee of the Allied Control Commission. And I am in constant contact with the Minister of Public Instruction. So whatever plans you have could be implemented here by me. If you are not the person in charge of this work in the United States, I know you are in close touch with him and can bring us together.

If possible, it would like to have not only a current subscription but back files from January 1, 1941.
5. Would it be possible for you to send this as a gift? If not, would you explore the possibility of getting it paid for you by the Rockefeller Foundation or some other organization?
6. Your cooperation will be a contribution both to science and to the reconstruction of this tragically devastated country.
