Dear Mr. Lydenberg:

Thank you for your letter of 10 March.

The Societa' Italiana per l'Organizzazione Internazionale is known to Mr. HODGE of USIS (OWI) with whom I have discussed your letter. He considers it a serious and worthy enterprise.

Both he and I agree, however, that this request and all other requests for books should clear through the Education Subcommittee and the Minister of Public Instruction. Mr. HODGE will attempt to get a copy of the list which was sent to you and will give it to me.

The Minister, on my recommendation, has appointed a small commission to examine and systematize all such requests. That commission now has a sizable collection of requests from universities and libraries, is consolidating them and is getting ready a global request for us to send to you. We shall try to have the request of the Societa' Italiana per l'Organizzazione Internazionale incorporated therein.

In general, the USIS (OWI) and the Education Subcommittee are coordinating their work in such matters by making the Education Subcommittee responsible for determining needs in Italy and USIS responsible for trying to supply these needs from America. Our offices are across the street from each other, and Mr. HODGE and I have lunch together once a week and conferences between times whenever necessary.

It is our suggestion that any requests that come to you from Italy from sources other than USIS and the Education Subcommittee, be referred back to us for recommendation, as you have done in this last case.

Dear Major Washburne:

Do you happen to know anything about the Società Italiana per L'Organizzazione Internazionale with its home in Rome on the Palazzetto di Venezia?

Miss Ruth Savord of the Council on Foreign Relations passed on to us an appeal her office has received from this society together with a 4-page single-spaced list of books they want. This is evidently an omnibus gathering, probably noted from such sources as Foreign Affairs. No indication of selection. Their letter gives no word as to what other books they have, how these would fit in with other sources, no indication of what they plan to do with them except to remember that they say the Società has been founded by a group of students of international problems, its purpose to develop a spirit of friendly cooperation and "In view of this general purpose the Society will accomplish researches on the various problems of international law, politics and economics, attend to the publication of books and periodical reviews, organize lectures and meetings and promote an efficient intercourse between Italian and foreign circles interested in the above problems."

Granted we had money to buy every one of the books here listed (which I hasten to assure you is far from the fact facing us) it seems to us that the first question we have to settle is whether this Società is the best place for the books we are able to buy. Would it be better to give the books to this organization, or to turn them over to some existing library where they would be used not only by members of the Società but also by other students?
