1. We are now in process of attempting to obtain from the U.S. the most urgently needed technical books and scholarly periodicals for universities and libraries of Italy. Our first list is compiled, including all requests from Toscana south.

2. A second list, including the northern regions, should go off at once.

3. Will you please notify the large libraries, Universities, and technical institutes in your Region that requests received at this Hq after 10 July will not be included in our requisition. They should get their requests in immediately.

4. While requests for scientific and technical apparatus to replace things stolen or destroyed during the war, have much less chance of being filled in the near future, these, too, should be sent in promptly so that we can at least get things in motion toward securing them.
