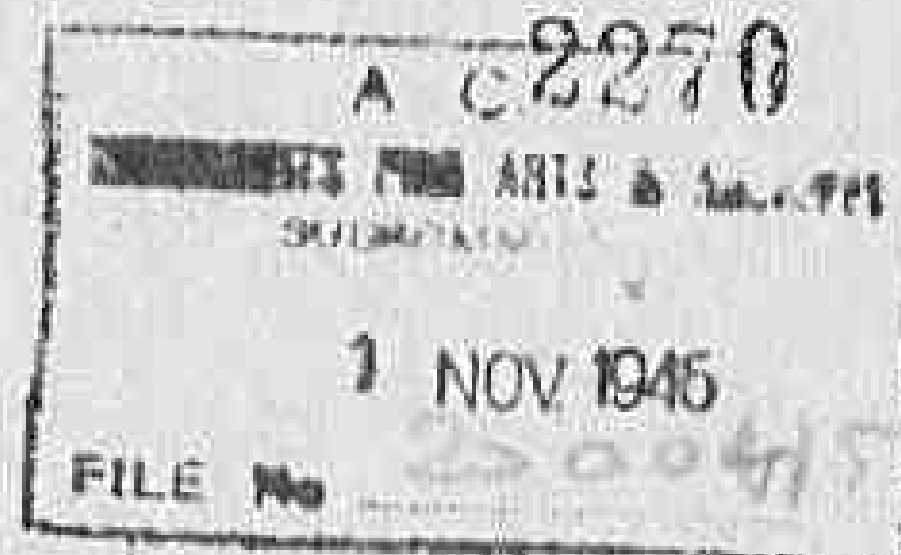

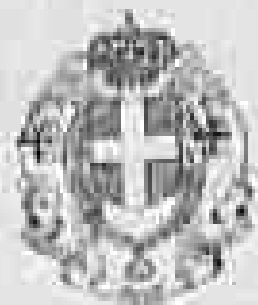

1. Military Travel Authorizations are no longer required for travel from Italy, and their issue has ceased. No further action will be taken at this Headquarters with regard to outstanding applications.

2. Allied Force Permits are still required for travel from Italy to Austria. Letter AC/14425/PS, dated 30 June, 1945, as amended by letter dated 14 July, 1945, refers, copies to you.

3. Allied Expeditionary Force Permits are required for travel from Italy to U.S., British or French zones of occupation in Germany.

4. Travel to Austria and Germany will only be permitted if the journeys are in the direct interests of the Allied Administration.

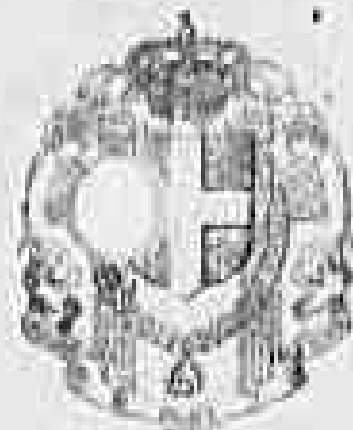

- c. Business in connection with the return of the German Libraries to Rome, another matter of immediate Allied concern.

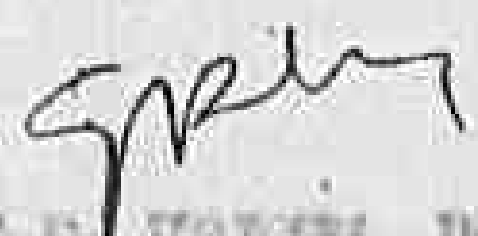

I have the honour to submit to you the following matter.

Mr. Erik Sjoqvist, Director of the Swedish Institute for Classical Studies in Rome, a Swedish State institution, would like to go to Sweden for urgent service reasons. I would be very grateful if, through your kind intervention, the following facilities could be granted Mr. Sjoqvist:

1. an exit permit from Italy (if necessary);
2. a return visa to Italy;
3. a seat in an Allied plane Rome-London (or Paris) and return;
4. the necessary British and French visas, also for the return journey. Mr. Sjoqvist is bearer of a Swedish service passport No. 353, issued by the Swedish Ministry of Foreign Affairs on June 18th 1940.

Mr. Sjoqvist's primary aim is to contact the Board of his Institute and specially its President, H.R.H. The Crown Prince of Sweden, for planning the reorganization of the activity of the Institute which during the war has been considerably reduced. His presence in Rome at that time is of great importance not only for the Institute which he is directing alone, but also for other official tasks. His activity as executive member of the Association to the Memory of Keats and Shelley and as caretaker of its real estate and library is known to the Chairman of the Association, Sir Noel Charles.

Specially in regard of the time factor it would be highly desirable if Mr. Sjoqvist could get a seat in an Allied plane.

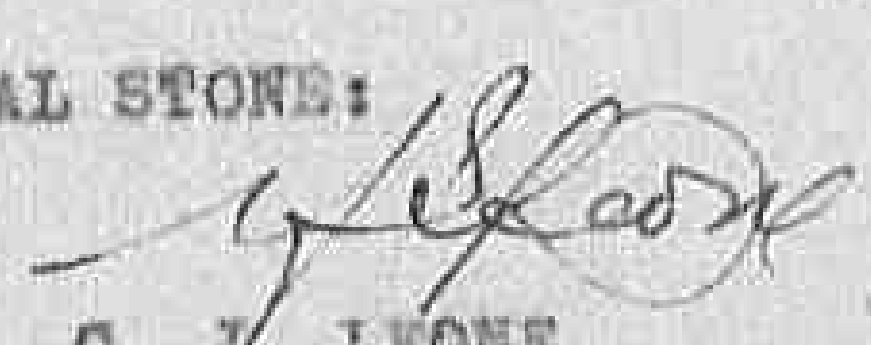

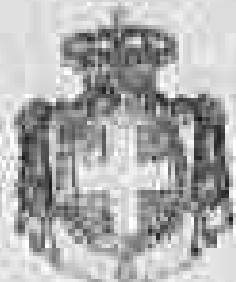

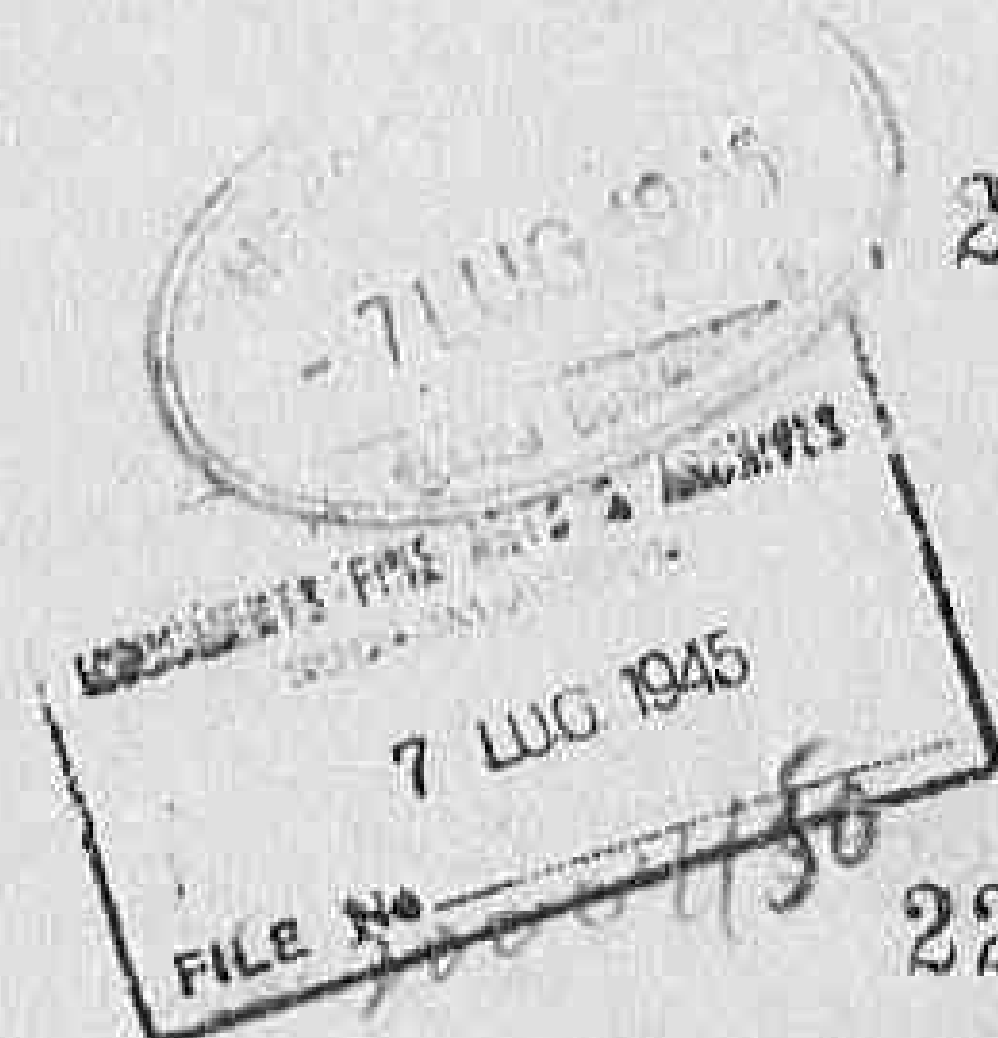

MOVEMENTS DIVISION - ROAD - MEMORANDUM No. 2

Movement of Traffic into and out of AMG Territory

1. In accordance with agreement with H.Q. 1st Army Group this instruction is issued to govern the movement of Civilian M.T. carrying civilian traffic from Italian Government Territory to AMG Area and from AMG Area to Italian Government Territory.
2. Traffic from Italian Government Territory to AMG Territory.
The only competent authority to despatch Civilian M.T. from Italian Government Territory is ENAC. Any vehicle proceeding to Army Area will be in possession of ENAC trip ticket and where necessary, AC authority on the form prescribed in Movements Division, Roads Memo No. 1. POL For Special Civilian Representatives

1. It has been brought to our attention by the newly established Northern Regions that more and more travellers from the South are calling on them for supplies of P.O.L. to enable them to continue their journeys and return home. In most cases such travellers claim to be on official business for either AO or the Italian Government, without being in possession of any document to prove their statement, and either present coupons issued in the South or have no coupons at all.

2. In view of the Supply position in the North where, at the present stage, it is not possible to obtain or distribute all the Petrol required even for minimum local needs, such additional calls are most embarrassing since, if met, they represent an additional, and in most cases unnecessary, drain on inadequate local resources badly needed to maintain essential skeleton services.

3. In order to counter this situation the Italian Government has agreed to print a special series of Travellers' Coupon which will be issued only by Liquid Fuels Division of the Ministry Industry and Commerce. The Ministry will only give their approval to absolutely essential journeys and will require full justification in writing from each individual applicant. It is expected, moreover, that their screening is likely to be very severe since they themselves will be called on to make available to the North a sufficient supply of Petrol to cover the value of special coupons issued.

4. The above arrangement is being announced by the Italian Government by Press and Radio. It is being brought to the attention of all Sub-Commissioners since it may be necessary to approve journeys of representatives engaged on AO business but where travel by AO transport is not a practical proposition.

5. In order to get supplies of special coupons to meet cases applications must be sent by Sub-Commissions to Ministry of Industry and Commerce.

(Liquid Fuels Div.) Rome, in duplicate, showing itinerary and reason for the journey, type and plate number of car, number of circulation permit and any other relevant details. The application must also include a statement to the effect that the Sub-Commission interested accepts full responsibility for screening and considers the journey of an essential nature. The Ministry will advise when the coupons may be picked up. Such journeys should be planned well in

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advance to avoid delay.

6. P.O.L. for Italian Government Ministerial use in the North is also dealt with by the Inter Ministerial Petroleum Committee, to whom all applicants should be referred, on similar lines. No individual allocations can be made by this HQ and no individual requests will be received on behalf of particular Ministries or individuals.

7. Supplies for contractors and others in the North, regularly employed by or working for Sub-Commissions, should be bid for through the competent AMG officer in the territory where they reside and will count against allocations made direct to North-arm Regions.

1. Persons leaving Italy (including Sicily and Sardinia) for destinations ~~abroad~~ ~~must be in possession of Military Travel~~ Authorisations with the exception of those referred to in paragraph 2.

2. The persons referred to below may leave Italy without Military Travel Authorisations:

(a) A person who is travelling by direct means (i.e. not transiting other territories on the way) to:

Malta, Gibraltar and other territories to which British visa regulations apply.

Egypt.

Provided such person is in possession of a visa as applicable (Egyptian visas are granted in Italy by British Consulates).

3. A person requiring a Military Travel Authorisation will make application for such authorisation to the agencies indicated:-

4. Application forms for Military Travel Authorisations will be completed in duplicate. They will be typewritten or written in ink in block capitals where no typewriter is available. Two full faces and two profile photographs of passport size must be attached to the forms as indicated thereon.

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5. An agency receiving an application will satisfy itself as to the identity of the applicant and as to the reasons for the proposed journey, and will ensure that the application forms are fully and properly completed. It will note in the "Remarks" section on the back of the forms (or attach a report as may be necessary) any information available locally concerning applicant, and it will add any comments of its own. Otherwise the forms will be endorsed "Nothing known against" (Nulla Osta). The receiving agency will then countersign the forms and append its office stamp.

6. A Military Travel Authorisation is an authorisation to leave Italian territory. It does not authorise entry into the country of intended destination whose visa requirements must be met.

7. Application forms completed by persons in the category referred to in paragraph 5 (c), will be forwarded to Headquarters, Allied Commission (Public Safety Sub-Commission) through the channels indicated :-
