Subject: Loss of Personal Effects.

AMC

1. On 16 or 17 Oct 44 Signor Guido CRUDELI, proceeded to CAGLIARI, SARDINIA, on the orders of this H.Q., to take up a post as architect attached to the Superintendency of Monuments there.

2. Between LIPTORIO airport, ROME, and NAMUR, a handbag weighing about 30 pounds belonging to Signor CRUDELI was lost. This handbag contained personal effects and all efforts to trace it have failed. A trunk which was forwarded to Signor CRUDELI by this H.Q. immediately after his departure from Rome was delivered to CAGLIARI practically empty of its contents. It had been broken open, and as a result Signor CRUDELI lost, besides a further and considerable amount of clothing, draughting equipment which is absolutely necessary for his profession and which he cannot afford in present circumstances to replace.

3. Through the generosity of an E.M' at this H.Q. a small present of clothing was sent to Signor CRUDELI to relieve his immediate needs. Unfortunately there is nothing more which this H.Q. can do. It would be appreciated therefore if the Ministry could consider the possibility of affording Signor CRUDELI some further compensation towards the loss which he has suffered both of essential draughting equipment and personal effects.

ROMA

Son dolente di dover comunicare a codesta Commissione Alleata che il viaggio da Roma a Cagliari (Sardegna), da loro gentilmente predisposto e concessomi, c' stato veramente disastroso per il mio bagaglio.

Partito da Roma, aeroporto Littorio, con uno dei loro apparecchi, la mia valigia, contenente cose di prima necessita', deposta a custodia di chi ne verifico' il peso (31 kg. circa), fu lasciata a terra e comunque smarrita non mi fu piu' possibile riaverla a Napoli. Spero ancora che sia rintracciata dai militari Alleati in servizio sra all'aeroporto di Napoli come a quello di Elmas (Sardegna) ai quali mi rivolsi per le necessarie ricerche.

Dal mio bagaglio, lasciato nel loro ufficio di Via Molise n. 2, il giorno che precedette la mia partenza 17 ottobre o.a., non ebbi piu' notizia finche' ieri, 9 novembre o.a., avvertito telefonicamente dell'arrivo in Cagliari via Roma 57 presso la Commissione Alleata m'affrettai a raggiungere tale ufficio dove ebbi tutti gli aiuti di cui, per esperienza, non potevo dubitare: Il Capitano WAESTAFF, membro di detta Commissione, dopo essersi intrattenuto cordialmente con me, mi permise di trasportare il tutto, quattro casse di libri ed un baule, con un autocarro militare alleato, agli uffici della Soprintendenza ai Monumenti.

Avareggiato in precedenza dalla recente perdita della valigia lascio immaginare la mia maraviglia quando, aiutato dai due custodi della Soprintendenza, constatai che le serrature del baule erano saltate e che tutto quasi il contenuto era asportato.

Immediatamente ne avvertii il Capitano WAESTAFF, dopo la Pubblica Sicurezza ed ora lo comunico a loro, pur dispiacendomi, con un elenco che possa mettere in evidenza la mia attuale situazione che, momentaneamente, ritengo irrimediabile, Mi auguro che s'interessino al mio caso quali uomini abituati a risolvere praticamente e a superare molte difficulta', molto meglio di quallo che non facciamo noi italiani, e non tralasceranno di aiutarmi nel modo che piu' converra'. 2343

Contemporaneamente noi mandiamo un'altra lettera al R.C., SARDEGNA Region, sollecitando il suo intervento; ed e' inoltre probabile che il Sergente Lucia, che era prima in questo ufficio e che ha ricevuto dagli Stati Uniti dei piccoli invii di vestiario usato, trovera' fra essi alcuni capi che possono essere per Lei temporaneamente utili.

E' veramente un peccato che l'inizio della Sua carriera professionale sia cominciato con così cattivi auspici, ma credo che si puo' aver fiducia che Ella riuscira' a superare i gravi inconvenienti e difficoltà presenti e che raggiungera' con il migliore successo lo scopo della sua missione. 2337

Subject: Baggage lost by Italian official.

To : MC, Sardica Region.

1. This letter concerns Arch. Guido Crudelli, who arrived in SANREMO 17 or 18 Oct 44 to assume a post as architect with the Superintendent of Monuments at CAGLIARI (Via Indipendenza 75 tel. 2491). Complying with the request of the Ministry of Public Instruction this office took the steps necessary to facilitate Crudelli's arrival and the forwarding of his baggage.

2. His baggage is the subject of this letter. Writing to his office from CAGLIARI on 10 Nov 44 Arch. Crudelli reports that in the course of his move he lost (a) the handbag which he was carrying at the beginning of the trip (which he made by air) and (b) virtually all the contents of a trunk which followed by surface and sea transport and had been broken into before delivery to him at the AC. Hq. In CAGLIARI, 9 Nov 44. In consequence he has lost almost all his drafting equipment necessary to his profession. Personal wardrobe and certain

3. It appears from his letter of 10 Nov 44 that Crudelli has already advised AC authorities at CAGLIARI of these facts, and taken such steps as might lead to the recovery of the clothing etc. removed from his trunk. As to the handbag he himself has filed a claim at MAPES and MMUS, and we attach copy of a letter we are sending to MMUS.

4. This office is aware that Crudelli's position is no different from that of thousands who have, for example, been bombed out in many parts of Europe and Asia. Still it is clear that the inconvenience arising from his losses can only adversely affect the work the Ministry sent him to SARDIGLIA to do for the benefit of the State as a whole and especially of SARDIGLIA itself. For this and other reasons this office, which knows of nothing it can do here to help matters in a practical way, requests that Crudelli's needs be favorably considered by any agencies at CAGLIARI who are officially in position to re-outfit him until either he recovers his lost property or, little by little, is able to acquire other through his own purchases.

Subject: Lost Baggage.

To : Commanding General, MATS, A.P.O. 512, U.S. Army.

1. On 17 Oct 44, Arch. Guido Crudeli, proceeding from ROMA on orders of the Allied Commission to CAGLIARI (Sardinia) to assume an official post under the Italian Ministry of Public Instruction with the CAGLIARI Superintendency of Monuments, lost a suitcase in the first leg of his journey - ROMA-NAPLES by Allied air transport.

2. The manifest of the flight (No. 554, ship No. 8694), as consulted in the baggage office, LITTORIO AIRPORT, includes Arch. Crudeli and the piece of baggage in question, a small suitcase weighing 30 pounds.

3. According to his testimony the bag, after being weighed in at LITTORIO AIRPORT, was placed where the other passengers were placing their baggage, but Arch. Crudeli's bag did not appear among the others when the plane was unloaded at NAPLES. Thereupon the NAPLES port phoned the LITTORIO office and was assured that the bag would follow by the next sailing and would then be routed to CAGLIARI. Up to 10 Nov 44, Arch. Crudeli, who had also asked the help of the airport at ROMA (Sardinia), had not received the suitcase.

4. This office realizes that the military air transport service assumes no responsibility for passengers' baggage, but none the less requests that anything reasonably possible be done to trace the lost suitcase for Arch. Crudeli.

5. Any report sent to this HQ. will be forwarded to Arch. Crudeli, whose address in CAGLIARI is Piazza Indipendenza 7 (tel. 2491).

Subject: Baggage of Guido Crudeli.

To H.Q., A.C., Attention Sub-Commission for Monuments Fine  
Arts and Archives.

On or about 18 October 1944 the above named arrived by  
air at Cagliari.

On the air trip he lost a case of his clothes and on  
17 October 1944, (your letter reference 20004/50/MFAA) 4 boxes  
cardboard and 1 parcel were despatched by S.S. Onsel. The baggage  
arrived Cagliari on 8th November. It was taken to A.C. Headquarters  
at once and handed over to the R.R.C.C. and on 9th November Sig.  
G. Crudeli was informed. He collected the baggage for this  
Headquarters and reported that his trunks had been opened, that  
most of the contents had been stolen.

Captain Wagstaff went with him to the Port Military  
Authority and the Port Police and a search was made of the ship  
but nothing was ever found. This Headquarters enclosed a claim  
by the above. The unfortunate man now possesses no clothing at  
all. Can you help in the matter?



Arch. Guido CRUDELI, travelling by air to CAGLIARI on orders of the Allied Commission, left his suitcase at the LITTORIO Airport the morning of his departure (16 or 17 October 1944), following the instructions of the official who weighed-in his baggage. The suitcase was put with the baggage of other people who were about to take the same plane. When the plane landed at NAPLES, Arch. CRUDELI's suitcase was not to be found. The Allied Airport officials sent a telephone call to ROME and promised that his baggage would be sent over to him at CAGLIARI. Up to 26 October the suitcase had not reached Arch. CRUDELI.

The suitcase contained: a man's suit, shoes, sheets, pyjamas, toilet articles, certain books and personal documents, among them one by which Arch. CRUDELI was appointed to his present post with the Superintendency of Monuments at CAGLIARI.
