SUBJECT: Repair project to monuments.

TO : SOAO AMG 13 Corps.

1. We have received a copy of Capt Enthoven's detailed report WM/MPA/rpt of 26 Nov 45, addressed to you for attention of your G III.
2. In view of the probability of our losing Capt Enthoven, and thus all field representation, we would particularly appreciate it if we could be kept further informed, from time to time, of the approval of the projects recommended in the reference report. All are felt to be worthy ones, with the degrees of priority indicated by Capt Enthoven.
3. It is particularly noted that the position of AMG 13 Corps, as trustee of the territory and responsible for normal - as against wartime - governmental functions, brings within its scope such work as would normally be required of any intelligent government to preserve from heavy deterioration such outstanding cultural and financial assets as the great mosaic pavements of the Duomo at Grado.
4. If works like these can be performed while at the same time providing needed employment for workers who would otherwise be unemployed, the result will be a record of enlightened management for which not only Venezia Giulia but indeed the whole civilized world will be abundantly grateful.
5. The instance of Grado is cited because it is perhaps the outstanding one. In the other places cited by Capt Enthoven the same practical consideration applies: that through the expenditure of a relatively modest sum the people may assure the preservation of assets worth many times the outlay.

SUBJECT: Projects for Repairs to War-damaged Monuments
VENEZIA GIULIA
TO : S.C.A.O. 13 Corps., attn G.III

As MFAA Field Officer the undersigned inspected various war-damaged monuments 13 and 15-21 November 1945. The following Report is an amplification of the statement with regard to repair projects dated 20 Nov. 45, handed to Public Works, G.III and the Superintendency of Monuments, Trieste. Major Richardson, Public Works, expressed readiness to authorize work of monumental importance not strictly urgent first aid where materials allocation would allow, in order to give useful employment. In cert in instances therefore second projects have been submitted including work of continuing restoration held up by the war period.

At Pola, urgent housing is receiving first priority for roofing tiles, cement and glass, all of which have to be brought by ship.

PROJECT TO RESTORE THE MOSAIC ON THE FLOOR IN THE CATHEDRAL OF GRADO (TRIST)

The Cathedral of Grado, built in the 6th century by Bishop Elia and dedicated to the venetian Santis Ermenegonda and Fortunato, presents a really great interest for its mosaics on the floor, famous in the whole world for their antiquity, being among the first of the christian era; for the pureness and perfection of their geometric designs, and for the dedicatory inscriptions of the personages who 1400 years ago contributed their money to the construction of the Cathedral.

During the war 1940-45 the Cathedral of Grado was reinforced with walls of supporting to the ^{arches} ~~walls~~ walls that now it's necessary to demolish, to re-pristinate the church in its original conditions. Besides that, some extents of mosaic have been covered with layers of sand and cement; the floor of the church has been in the end covered with a thick layer of sand.

The long period of forsaking, the want of mending specially during the last phases of the war, and the necessity to demolish the cement layers of protection, impose now a speedy intervention, necessary especially in the Chapel of the Treasure and in the zone of the central aisle near the principal entrance, where the worn out produced by the continuous transit of the believers, has augmented the devastation of the pavement.

We allege however a project of restoration of this pavement for a total of L. 6.660.155,-- making present:

- 1) that about the 50% of the sum above-mentioned refers to the restoration of the zones of the ancient mosaic and to the reinforcement of the periphere-ric parts.
- 2) that the remaining 50 % refers to the rebuilding of the pavement in mosaic of later epoch (18th-19th centuries and to the completing of the intermediate zones.

3) that the preventive excludes, for now, as it's natural, the eventual new discoveries of ancient mosaics that should come to light under the more recent pavement.

The project concerns in first place the demolition of the walls of supporting to the ^{bowls} bows; and in a second time, the restoration of the mosaic, this operation comprehends a very accurate sketch of the mosaics, then sticking on linen, the pulling up, cleaning, and then replacing, upon opportune cement underbottom and fixing - layer made with brick powder and special materials.

We put in evidence that the present project requires an absolutely least quantity of construction materials, and that in a few quintals of cement and a few cubic metres of pebbles and sand for the building of the under - bottom. The greatest part of the preventive concerns the work of worker specialised in mosaic restoration, as results clear reading the paragraphes of the enclosed preventive.
