SUBJECT: Damage to Monument.

TO : II, Army Air Forces, MTO.

1. Through the diligence of an RAF unit this HQ has received word of accidental damage - apparently from a recent bomb explosion - to the disused but very distinguished 13th-century Romanesque Church of San Leonardo, west of MANFREDI^NA.

2. The matter has been referred to the Direction General of Antiquities and Fine Arts in the Italian Ministry of Public Instruction. They will no doubt issue appropriate instructions to their Superintendent of Monuments for that area, Prof Francesco GATTINI, of the Castello Svevo, BARI.

3. While there can be no question of Allied responsibility for the damage or the repairs, it would be a handsome act of good will if all possible aid could be lent, either in provision of transport or of other facilities for inspection and remedy of the damage.

4. Your cooperation with the Italian authorities in any requests they may present will be appreciated both by them and by this headquarters.

3. While there can be no question of Allied responsibility for the damage or the repairs, it would be a handsome act of good will if all possible aid could be lent, either in provision of transport or of other facilities for inspection and remedy of the damage.

2. Your promptness in adding further information is indeed commendable. The church of San Leopardo is one of the gems of the Foggia plains, and your interest has enabled us, on behalf of the Allies, to send word immediately to the responsible Italian authorities.

3. A misinterpretation, on our part, of your symbol "4/5 miles" as meaning four-fifths of one mile caused us to suggest S. Maria di Siponto. The unfortunate church in question is of even greater value.

1. Reference: our 20181/5/MFAA of 25 Aug 45.

2. The RAF unit who first gave us the information have made further examination at our request. They now report that the church in question is S. Leonardo, and that one of the less important side-chapels appears to have collapsed against the exquisite north portal, without however appearing to have damaged the portal itself.

3. It would soon advisable to have a detailed examination and report made as soon as possible, especially in view of the previously weakened condition of the remains of this fine church when we inspected it on 4 May 1944.

SUBJECT: Damage to Monument near
MANFREDONIA.

1. It has been brought to our attention that a chapel 1 or 2 Km west of Manfredonia (Prov. Foggia) is reported by a farmer to have been damaged two or three weeks ago by an accidentally discharged stick of bombs.

2. A very cursory examination by personnel of the RAF reveals that a side chapel on the north wall of the church has collapsed, causing damage to a carved portal.

3. It occurs to us that the building referred to might be the church of S.Maria di Siponto.

4. This information is passed to you for your information and for such action as may be possible. We, of course, no longer have any personnel in that territory.

To : H.Q. Allied Commission, Subcommission for Monuments,

It is brought to your notice that a building some 4/5 miles west of Manfredonia and believed to have been a commandery of a knightly order, has sustained damage. This is reported by a farmer living in the building to have been caused by a stick of bombs dropping in the vicinity some two weeks ago.

2. A very cursory examination reveals that a side chapel on the north wall of the church has collapsed causing damage to a singularly beautiful carved portal probably of the 13th Century.

3. It is not known whether this information has already come to your knowledge or to that of any agents which you may have in this area, but, in case it has not, opportunity is taken to report it in this letter.
